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CBSE AN OVERVIEW

The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) is a National Board of School Education in India under the aegis of the Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India headed by Chairperson, CBSE. The Secretary (School Education and Literacy), MoE is the Controlling Authority. The Board caters to a heterogeneous category of schools from Private (Independent) to Government, Government aided, Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs), Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas (JNVs) and Central Tibetan schools affiliated in India and in other countries.

The Board has developed and expanded significantly from the year 1929 (which was then named as the 'Board of High School and Intermediate Education, Rajputana) to reach to its present status. In the year 1952, the Board was given its present name "Central Board of Secondary Education". It was in the year 1962 that the Board was reconstituted.

The Board has grown at a rapid pace over the years and its present jurisdiction stretches beyond the national geographical boundaries. From 309 schools in 1962, CBSE has now a pan-India and International presence with more than 30,618 schools affiliated in India and in other countries located in the West and the Middle East Asia, South East Asia, North East Asia, Africa and Europe.

In order to execute its functions effectively, Regional Offices have been set up by the Board in different parts of the country. To be more responsive to the affiliated schools, the Board has 18 Regional Offices & CoEs located at Ajmer, Bengaluru, Bhopal, Bhubaneswar, Chandigarh, Chennai, Dehradun, Delhi (East), Delhi (West), Guwahati, Noida, Panchkula.

Patna, Prayagraj, Pune, Thiruvananthapuram, Vijayawada and Dubai locations along with 01 ACCPD at Rae-Bareli, UP.

The CBSE Headquarter constantly monitors the activities of the Regional Offices. Although, sufficient powers have been vested within Regional Offices, issues involving policy matters are, however, referred to the Headquarter. The matters pertaining to day-to-day administration, liaison with schools, pre and post examination arrangements are all dealt with by the respective Regional Offices.

Vision & Mission

CBSE envisions a robust, vibrant and holistic school education that may engender excellence in every sphere of human endeavour. The Board is committed to provide quality education to promote intellectual, social and cultural vivacity among its learners. It works towards evolving a learning process and environment, which empowers the future citizens to become leaders in the emerging knowledge society. The Board advocates and pledges to provide a stress-free learning environment that may develop competent, confident, and enterprising citizens who promote harmony and peace.

The Board is given the mandate;

- To implement curriculum and syllabi for the purpose of Board Examinations.
- To conduct Board Examination for Secondary and Senior Secondary Schools and such other examinations as it may consider fit subject to the approval of the Controlling Authority.
- To develop standards for ensuring quality in the affiliated schools.

- To undertake professional development of teachers and organize student enrichment activities.


CBSE aims to facilitate learning for physical, emotional, social and intellectual wellbeing of students. CBSE, the pace-setting National Board of School Education in the country,

ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

1. Promotion of Life Skills and Mental Health in Schools

To promote mental health and holistic well-being in schools, CBSE encouraged the establishment of Life Skills and Wellbeing Centres. These centres are designed to integrate life skills education within the school ecosystem by engaging students, peer educators, and teachers. Schools were advised to form teams of 6 to 8 Peer Master Educators from senior classes to lead and facilitate wellness-related initiatives aligned with the ongoing CBSE Adolescents Peer Educator Program.

2. Online workshops under National Reading Day

The CBSE Reading Mission seeks to cultivate a robust reading culture across all affiliated schools nationwide. By implementing various initiatives such as the Observance of National Reading Day and Reading Week, CBSE Reading Challenge, and CBSE Budding Authors Program, the Board aims to instil a lifelong love for reading and enhance students' literacy skills for academic and personal growth.



Under 'National Reading Day', 17 Online workshops were organized in which 2503 participants participated and 5 face-to-face workshops were organized in Delhi - 107, Prayagraj - 120, Jammu - 73, Bangalore - 99, Chennai - 100 on the topic

"promote awareness among leaders about the importance of reading" in the month of March-April, 2024.



3. CBSE Science Challenge 2024-25

As part of ongoing efforts to foster curiosity, inquiry, and higher-order thinking among students, the Board has announced the CBSE Science Challenge for students in grades 8 through 10. Scheduled to take place on the CBSE platform throughout April and May 2024, this challenge aims to centre on the theme of Science, Environment, and Sustainability, encouraging participants to explore pressing scientific issues and potential solutions. **This year 11,060 participants from 1,886 schools participated in the Challenge.**

4. Promotion of Disaster Risk Reduction in Schools

CBSE released Guidelines for Teachers on Disaster Risk Reduction in Schools, aiming to integrate disaster risk reduction into the school curriculum across subjects. As part of this initiative, each subject teacher is required to allocate at least one class period per month in their regular timetable to teach a lesson related to Disaster Risk Reduction. A Handbook on 'Disaster Risk Reduction in Schools' for classes 6 to 10 was also developed by the Board. Recognizing the critical importance of DRR in

education, the Board organized webinars aimed at sensitizing schools about the integration of DRR concepts into the curriculum. These sessions, held on April 29-30, 2024, were streamed live on YouTube nationwide, providing valuable insights and resources to educators. 32672 viewers watched this programme.



5. Celebration of Bharatiya Bhasha Ustav

The Ministry of Education, Government of India, marked the birth anniversary of Mahakavi Subramania Bharati as Bharatiya Bhasha Ustav on 11th December 2023. This celebration aimed to appreciate the richness of language

diversity and foster a sense of unity within that diversity. As part of this commemoration, CBSE encouraged schools to engage in various activities that align with this theme. **17,73,269 students and 3,400 schools** participated in this Utsav.

6. Pariksha Pe Charcha 2024

The 7th edition of Pariksha Pe Charcha (PPC), an engaging event with the Hon'ble Prime Minister and students, took place at Bharat Mandapam on January 29, 2024. Schools were encouraged to register students, teachers, and parents for an online Multiple-Choice Question (MCQ) competition hosted on the government's portal from December 12, 2023, to January 12, 2024. Participants also submitted questions for possible inclusion in the interactive program. All participants received certificates signed by the Director of the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT). Additionally, 41 schools affiliated with the Board showcased their projects spanning sports, scientific innovation, space exploration, environmental preservation, artificial intelligence, and women empowerment, among other topics.



7. Join Drive against Drug Abuse: e-pledge

In an effort to combat drug abuse, the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) under the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, launched a campaign called 'Join Drive Against Drug Abuse.' Schools affiliated with CBSE were advised to participate by taking an e-pledge and actively raising awareness among students about the detrimental effects of drug abuse, in collaboration with state authorities and other stakeholders. **A total of 9,41,214 students and 2,14,348 staff members from 876 schools participated in e-Pledge.**

8. National Youth Day Celebration


'National Youth Day' was celebrated on 12th January 2024, and various activities were conducted by schools from 12th to 23rd January 2024 at the school level. **A Painting Competition involving 41,210 students from KVs, including CBSE schools, was organized on 23rd January 2024.** 13,24,871 students participated from 2,815 schools in the activities of National Youth Day Celebration.

9. Jadui Pitara - a play-based learning-teaching material tailored for children between the age group of 3-8 years and Guidelines for Balvatikas (Pre-primary Education).

CBSE disseminated **e-Jaadui Pitara**, a play-based learning resource aligned with **NCF-FS 2022**, targeting children aged 3–8 years. Schools with **Balvatikas** were encouraged to create dedicated ECCE spaces. CBSE also shared **NCERT's Guidelines for Pre-School Education**, promoting branding and visibility of early learning practices.

10. Secondary and Senior School Curriculum for the Session 2024-25 and New Textbooks by NCERT for Classes III and VI

CBSE released the annual curriculum for classes IX to XII for the academic session 2024-25 on its website.



11. Progress Report on Structured Assessment for Analysing Learning (SAFAL)–2024-25

The SAFAL project for the academic session 2024–25 saw enthusiastic participation with approximately **12,000 CBSE schools** registering for the assessment. To ensure readiness, CBSE organized intensive training programs for IT teachers. These training sessions, conducted both **in-person across 33 locations** and **virtually**, were led by CBSE officers and Master Trainers. The objective was to equip school IT nodal officers with the required understanding of SAFAL procedures—from installation of software to conduct of mock and final assessments.

To facilitate smooth execution, **three rounds of mock tests** were held across all participating schools. These trials enabled schools to test the SAFAL software, practice downloading roll lists and question papers, and uploading assessments to local servers. Additionally, a **link study** was conducted in **871 schools** in July 2024. This study aimed to ensure comparability of SAFAL 2024-25 results with the earlier SAFAL Pilot through a rigorous equating process.

The **SAFAL assessment** was conducted in two cycles. The first cycle took place in **July–August 2024**, with **8,091 schools** from India and abroad participating. Students of **Grades 5 and 8** were assessed in **English (Language), Mathematics, and EVS/Science**, with the following participation data:


In addition, a **pilot** was conducted in **August 2024** for Hindi-medium. This pilot had 41 schools, assessing approximately **500 students per participating subject and grade**.

The second cycle of SAFAL was conducted during **September–October 2024**, catering to around **890 schools**, particularly those in the **Middle East and North-East India**, where July holidays had affected participation. This cycle, too, focused on Grades 5 and 8 across the same three subjects.

For the July–August cycle, the **average scale scores** (on a scale of 100–500) across subjects and grades are as follows:

12. Progress Report: SQAAF (School Quality Assessment and Assurance Framework) – 2024

Under the SQAAF initiative, CBSE has continued to emphasize school-level quality improvement through structured assessments and capacity-building. Several orientation programmes were organized to create awareness about the framework and its implementation strategies. A significant orientation session was held from 2nd to 5th September 2024, involving 33 Principals of Sainik Schools, enabling them to align their institutional practices with SQAAF guidelines. Furthermore, 38 mentors were trained to conduct Physical Quality Reviews (PQRs) effectively, and 64 schools identified for PQR in 2024 were trained on 16th August 2024 to prepare them for the assessment process.

The Physical Quality Reviews were subsequently conducted in 64 government schools and 56 private schools, including those supported under the Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA). The reports from these reviews were shared with the respective institutions to help them identify gaps and areas for improvement.

In addition, the Fourth Mentor Connect Programme was successfully conducted in August 2024, bringing together 74 school principals to foster collaboration, mentoring, and capacity-building across schools. A comprehensive review of PQR reports from 2023 was also undertaken, analyzing data from 76 schools. This exercise helped identify recurring challenges and trends, based on which individualized feedback and improvement suggestions were provided to the concerned schools.

13. Holistic Progress Card (HPC)

The following steps were undertaken for HPC

- Feasibility workshop to assess the Holistic Progress Card (HPC) Middle Stage developed by NCERT.
- Conduct of Online Orientation Programme and PRPs on HPC Preparatory Stage in the Month of January and February, 2024
- Work on adapting the HPC Middle Stage document.



14. Celebration of International Day of Yoga (IDY) 2024

On the worldwide celebration of the International Day of Yoga (IDY) on 21st June, the Board suggested activities for affiliated schools to celebrate the day. It also shared

the 'Common Yoga Protocol' Handbook and videos prepared by the Ministry of Ayush, Government of India. Schools submitted a brief report of their activities through a designated form. **2,144 Schools, 95,164 Teachers, and 27,06,650 Students participated in**

the various activities organized under Celebration of International Day of Yoga.



15. CBSE Storytelling Competition 2024-25

CBSE announced the Storytelling Competition for the 2024-25 session, held for classes III to XII. The school-level competition began on 16th July, while the regional level was conducted from 13th to 27th August. Students enthusiastically participated across these levels. **Total 7,071 candidates registered from 2,234 schools.**



16. CBSE Reading Mission and CBSE Budding Authors Programme 2024-25

- CBSE READING CHALLENGE 2024-25** - To inculcate lifelong love of reading in students and enhancement of essential skills for their academic & personal development, it was conducted for students of classes VI to X during the month of August to September 2024. 1,50,924 students participated in year 2024-25.

- CBSE BUDDING AUTHORS PROGRAMME 2024-25** - Under this program, students expressed their imagination and ideas in the form of short stories conducted for the students of classes VI to X during the month of May to August, 2025.

Total Registration – 1,48,838 (Hindi – 22,533 and English – 1,26,305)

Total Stories submitted – 24,785 (Hindi – 3,535 and English – 21,250)

17. National Space Day

The Government of India declared 23rd August as National Space Day to commemorate the success of the Chandrayaan-3 mission. For the inaugural celebration in August 2024, the Board organized various activities themed "Touching Lives While Touching the Moon: India's Space Saga." Schools were provided a list of suggested activities and requested to upload brief reports and photographs of their celebrations. **3,715 Schools, 10,79,388 Teachers, and 9,23,652 Students participated in "Bharat on the Moon Portal".**

18. Āryabhata Ganit Challenge – 2024

The annual Āryabhata Ganit Challenge (AGC) was conducted to develop essential competencies in applying mathematics to real-life situations. The first-level question paper was uploaded on 28th August 2024. The final round for the top three students from each school was held in October, and the results will be published on the website this month. **In First Level 3,669 schools and 2,48,264 students registered and in Second Level 2,314 schools and 6,635 students participated in this activity.**

19. CBSE Science Exhibition 2024-25

Students from classes VI to XI were invited to prepare research-based science projects or exhibits on the theme "Science and Technology for a Sustainable Future." Regional rounds are ongoing, with the National Round scheduled for December 2024 in New Delhi. **2,624**

Teams (each team comprises of maximum 2 students) registered for Science Exhibition. Regional Level exhibition conducted in 32 venues in the month of November, 2024 and National level exhibition conducted from January 30, 2025 to February 1, 2025 in which 28 teams were declared National winners.

20. Veergatha 4.0

CBSE mobilized schools to participate in Veergatha 4.0. Through incessant efforts, **54,29,556 students participated, marking a 32% share of total participation and a 21% increase from last year.**

21. Amrit Kaal Story-Writing Competition

In collaboration with the National Book Trust (NBT), Ministry of Education, this story-writing competition for grades IX-XII was conducted on the Rashtriya e-Pustakalaya App from 5th to 12th October 2024. The competition aimed to inspire creativity, offering students access to a range of free books, including biographies, science fiction, and classics.

22. Webinar on Electoral Literacy

CBSE hosted a webinar on 15th October 2024 to promote electoral literacy. The event launched guidelines for establishing Electoral Literacy Clubs and Democracy Rooms in schools. **Over 5,000 students participated directly, and schools were encouraged to collaborate with local electoral authorities.**

23. Summer Camp in Schools

As part of Eco Club activities, schools were encouraged to organize summer camps on the theme "Eco Clubs for Mission Life" for one week during summer vacations. The activities began on World Environment Day (5th June), emphasizing "Land Restoration, Desertification, and Drought Resilience." **661 Schools, 57,866 Teachers and 7,29,214 Students participated in these camps.**



24. Motivational Programme on Patriotism on 7th October 2024

CBSE organized a motivational programme featuring Shri Narendra Nath Dubey, retired DIG, BSF, who shared his experiences of bravery and sacrifice. The interaction inspired **over 2,000 students** to embrace moral values, patriotism, and a sense of responsibility.



25. Interaction Programme on National Curriculum Frameworks on 25th June 2024

CBSE organized a Stakeholder Interaction Programme at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi, to assess schools' perspectives on implementing NCFFS-2022 and NCFSE-2023. **The event was attended by around 200 principals and**

teachers and was chaired by the Secretary of DoSE&L, Ministry of Education.



26. 2nd CBSE Expression Series (Academic Session 2024-25)

Under the theme “**Yuva Shakti for Viksit Bharat**,” this series invited creative entries from students in grades III to XII from 7th to 21st October 2024. Schools submitted entries via the CBSE Expression Series App, and each CBSE region selects the top ten entries in each category for National Level recognition. The shortlisting of stories for the National Level is ongoing. 4,44,340 students submitted their stories at the CBSE Expression Series App.

27. National Youth Parliament Scheme (NYPS)

The Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs organized Youth Parliament Competitions to strengthen

democratic roots, promote discipline, and familiarize students with parliamentary procedures. CBSE shared the registration link for the 4th edition of NYPS with affiliated schools and requested to sent reports of their activities. **202 schools, 1,313 teachers and 12,280 participated in Youth Parliament Competitions.**



28. Celebration of Shiksha Saptah (22nd-28th July 2024)

In commemoration of the 4th anniversary of NEP 2020, the Ministry of Education (MoE) celebrated Shiksha Saptah from 22nd to 28th July 2024. CBSE shared a detailed concept note and suggested daily activities with affiliated schools, and the Board participated in the Akhil Bhartiya Shiksha Samagam on 29th-30th July 2024.

29. National Sports Day

To mark Major Dhyan Chand's birth anniversary, the Ministry of Sports organized pan-India sports events until 31st August 2024. CBSE shared a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for celebrating National Sports Day with affiliated schools. **1,798 Schools and 12,84,616 students participated in the various sports activities organized by the schools for celebrating National Sports Day.**



30. Swachhata Pakhwada

Observed from 1st to 15th September 2024, Swachhata Pakhwada encouraged cleanliness and hygiene drives. CBSE shared an Action Plan with schools and requested reports and photos of their activities. **9,241 schools, 44,07,485 students, 3,27,025 teaching/non-teaching staff and 5,20,237 parents participated in Swachhata Pakhwada in schools.**



31. Swachhata Hi Sewa Campaign 2024

In observance of Swachh Bharat Diwas on 2nd October, CBSE encouraged schools to hold activities on cleanliness awareness. **4,693 schools and 99,71,940 students**

participated on 2nd October 2024 in the activities organized by schools on cleanliness awareness.



32. CBSE Science Challenge 2024-25

CBSE organizes Science Challenge every year for students in classes VIII to X. This year, activities were conducted from April to May 2024. A list of winners has been uploaded on the CBSE website. **7,461 Students participated in this activity.**

33. Heritage India Quiz 2024-25

CBSE organizes Heritage India Quiz as an annual activity every year. The inter-school quiz in 2024 was focused on the theme of "The conservation and restoration of cultural heritage." The theme emphasized the importance

of preserving India's rich cultural heritage, which includes ancient sites, monuments, and traditional knowledge systems. **4,092 students were registered.** Cluster round was conducted in 20 cities during the month of October-November, 2024. National Semi-final and final round was conducted in the month of January, 2025.

34. Rashtriya Ekta Diwas Celebrations

In celebration of Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel's birth anniversary on 31st October, CBSE encouraged schools to observe Rashtriya Ekta Diwas with activities like a Unity Run, Oath-taking ceremony, and Pad Pooja, highlighting the spirit of national unity. **11,55,354 students from 1,189 schools participated in the activities organized under Rashtriya Ekta Diwas Celebrations.**

35. CBSE nominations for National Awards to Teachers 2023-24

CBSE invited self-nominations from eligible Principals and teachers of private independent schools. Following a transparent selection process, six nominations were sent to the Ministry of Education, resulting in awards for **Ms. Pallavi Sharma of Mamta Model School, Delhi, and Ms. Charu Maini of DAV School, Gurugram, under the CBSE category.**



36. CBSE Games

CBSE organizes sports events for students of its affiliated schools. The sports events are organized in 23 games at Cluster/ Zonal and National Level in different age-groups for boys and girls separately. The winners of Cluster and Zonal level competitions participate at National Level competitions.

CBSE has introduced an online system for managing CBSE sports events. The participants are registered online with a unique UID for each participant, and the results are also uploaded on CBSE sports portal after the sports events. Participation certificates are given to all participants and merit certificates are given to all winners. All the certificates are given online in digital format (pdf). Medals are also given to the winners.

In session 2024-25, CBSE Games were organized in 338 venues across the country. Around 7 lakh students participated in CBSE games in 2024-25. The winners of CBSE National Games are participating in SGFI National Games and Khelo-India Program of Government of India, which shows the enthusiasm and spirit of sportsmanship being promoted by the Board.

For promoting sports in CWSN (children with special needs) students with intellectual developmental disability (IDD), the Board has organized 'CBSE Special Games for CWSN Students' on a pilot basis for Delhi in 2025.

TEACHER TRAINING

1. Empowering Educators

Signing of MoU with the ISTM, DoPT, Govt. of India-

CBSE and ISTM (Institute of Secretariat Training and Management, Dept. of Personnel & Training, Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Govt. of India) have joined hands signing an MoU in September, 2024 for conducting a 2-Days Training of Trainers (ToT) Certification Course. This course is a strategic intervention as a certification programme launched by the Board in pursuit of the NEP recommendations Para 5.15 and 5.16 for mandatory 50 Hours of continuous professional development for all teachers / head teachers. It aims to enhance the training skills of the resource persons enabling them to effectively train others. Participants gain a deeper understanding of effective teaching methodologies and strategies. The course involves the components of the Direct Trainers Skills (DTS), Design of Training (DoT) and the pedagogical aspects of the NEP 2020 together with the experiential learning theories.

Board is targeting to train 15,000 Resource Persons (RPs) who in turn would be involved in conducting CBPs to meet the training needs of 15 lakhs teachers in CBSE affiliated schools across India. The ToT is offered free of cost by the CBSE. Participants are awarded a joint e-certificate by the CBSE and ISTM. Till December 2024, 88 ToT courses have been conducted across India with 5,671 teachers trained. The ToT course is being widely acknowledged as a very successful intervention empowering educators to become effective trainers and enhancing the quality of education in their institutions.





2. Conduct of Online Training Sessions:

During the year 2024, CBSE has conducted 989 online sessions free of cost for the benefit of all teachers and schools across India and abroad. It included a wide range of topics including digital literacy and cyber security. A total of 3,23,901 teachers availed the sessions.

3. Conduct of Capacity Building Programmes in Physical mode:

The Training Unit notifies an Annual Training Calendar (ATC) which contains the topics, the training venues, duration of the programme and the tentative schedule. The Schools interested to register for such programme avail the sessions by registering online on Prashikshan Triveni Portal of the Board. During year, a total of 8,222 CBPs were held with the help of the 18 Centres of Excellence benefitting 4,05,174 teachers of the CBSE system.



4. Capacity Building Programs for the employees of the Board

Board has taken up Capacity Building Programmes offered through iGOT under Mission Karmayogi for all the Board employees.

5. Annual Training Theme: “Learning through Art Integration”

The annual training theme for the session 2024-25 was designated as “Learning through Art Integration”. Online trainings were provided on the following sub themes.

1. Learning through Art Integration-Foundational Stage
2. Learning through Art Integration-Preparatory Stage
3. Learning through Art Integration-Middle Stage
4. Learning through Art Integration-Secondary Stage

4. National Teachers Conference at Madurai

The 2-Days National Teachers' Conference was conducted successfully at Madurai on 17th and 18th October 2024. The theme of the Conference was aligned with the NEP-2020, and was titled Kala Sangam 2024 'Learning through Art Integration'. 1,043 participants from the States/UTs/Foreign Schools registered for the conference.



The conference envisaged the showcasing of best practices on the theme for which research papers were invited on pan India basis. Out of 161 research paper that were received, 9 Best papers were shortlisted for the presentation in the conference and 42 papers were selected as noteworthy research papers on various sub themes as follows:

- A. Art Integrated Learning for Mental Wellbeing
- B. Integrating Art with Languages
- C. Integrating Art with Mathematics
- D. Integrating Art with Science
- E. Integrating Art with Social Sciences
- F. Art Integrated Learning using IT
- G. Art Integration for children with special needs
- H. Art integration based Assessment



6. **School Health and Wellness Program**

Around the world, schools play a vital role in the well-being of students, families and their broader communities. Recognizing the importance of protecting and supporting adolescents' health and well-being, the Government of India (GoI) launched the School Health and Wellness Programme (SHWP) under the aegis of the Ayushman Bharat in 2018. The SHWP is a collaborative effort of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and the Ministry of Education, which aims to provide health education, health promotion, disease prevention, and improve access to health services in an integrated, systemic manner at the school level.

CBSE in partnership with the UNESCO and NCERT is supporting the implementation of the SHWP in schools affiliated to the Board. Continuing the efforts for implementing, several Master Training Programmes were conducted. Till date, more than 600 Master trainers have been trained who are implementing SHWP

in their own schools and also training other teachers. A total of 29,113 teachers have been trained by these master trainers in offline mode. This is an on-going project.





- **Youth Ideathon 2024:**

Youth Ideathon is an annual event organized by the Management & Entrepreneurship and Professional Skills Council (MEPSC) under the Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE) and Think Startup, in association with the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) for school students from Class IV-XII. • **Automotive Olympiad 2024:**

This year, NAO 2024 witnessed remarkable participation, with 527 schools and 31,287 students from India and the UAE joining the event. The Olympiad attracted students from diverse regions, including metropolitan cities,

towns, and rural areas, showcasing its inclusivity and broad appeal.

• **Structure of the Competition**

NAO 2024 was designed to foster technical proficiency, creativity, and analytical thinking through three key components:

1. AR/VR Simulation: Providing an immersive experience of advanced automotive technologies.
2. Welding Competition: Offering hands-on practice with tools and techniques in one of the Industry & critical skills.
3. Presentation: Encouraging students to research and deliver insights on topics provided by ASDC, fostering communication and analytical skills. By bridging the gap between industry and academia, NAO continues to inspire young minds, equipping them with the skills necessary to become future automotive innovators and professionals.

• **Details of Awareness Programmes/ Capacity Building Programmes conducted:**

Board has been conducting Awareness Programme and Capacity Building Programme for various Skill Courses. The programme for the Skill subjects, **Financial Markets Management, Retail, Yoga, Library & Information Science, Beauty & Wellness, Agriculture, Fashion Studies, Apparel, Early Childhood Care & Education, Textile Design, Food Production, Mass Media Studies, Front Office Operations, Business Administration, Food Nutrition & Dietetics, Banking and Insurance, Introduction to Financial Markets, Tourism, Banking, Marketing & Sales and Marketing, Salesmanship, Horticulture, Health Care, Marketing, Life Cycle of Medicine & Vaccine** were conducted in online and offline mode from 1st January 2024 to 31st December 2024. A total of 40,058 candidates participated in these programme.

CBSE EXAMINATIONS 2024: AT A GLANCE

- The entire work of the conduct of the examination is done as per Examinations Bye-Laws of the Board with help of the 17 Regional Offices across the country.
- CBSE conducted examination in 81 Subjects in Class X and 119 Subjects in Class XII.
- Approximately 40 lakhs students appeared in examinations of Class X and XII.
- Registration of students was done in Class IX and XI wherein all personal details of the candidate and subjects offered were collected through schools in online mode.
- In class X and XII, schools were shown data of their class IX and XI students and thereafter they were requested to update the same.

- Once, the lists of candidates of class X and XII was updated, based on updated data, date sheet was prepared for Class X and XII.
- 7603 schools for Class X & 7126 schools for Class XII were identified as Examination Centres for the conduct of Board examinations in 2024 examinations.

FIXATION OF CENTRES FOR CLASS X & XII BOARD'S EXAMINATIONS-2024

- The Board fixes centres for Class X & XII Examination every year immediately after completion of process of LOC after obtaining consent from the respective affiliated schools with the Board.
- The examinations of the CBSE are held only at the Centres approved by the CBSE and all the examination papers are administered simultaneously at all centres as per Indian Standard Time (I.S.T.).
- Examination centres are fixed in any school after considering the availability of appropriate facilities like bank/treasury facilities and sufficient infrastructure.
- As a matter of policy and past practices, no school is fixed as Self Centre unless no other school is located near it to fix as an examination centre.
- No candidate is allowed to appear from an examination centre to which he/she has not been allotted.

DATE SHEET FOR CLASS X & XII FOR 2024 EXAMINATIONS

- The Board prepared date sheet for Class X & XII for 2024 Examinations after considering the holidays/public holidays/examinations of other States/Competitive Examinations/ General Elections/Assembly Elections etc. and also to avoid the clashing of the Board & other examinations with each other. The Board Examinations started w.e.f. 15.02.2024 to 02.04.2024.
- The Class X Examinations were conducted for 28 days and were over on 13.03.2024. The Class XII Examinations were conducted for 47 days and accordingly these examinations were over on 02.04.2024.
- Board had provided sufficient gap between the examinations to facilitate the students.
- In Class X, CBSE conducted the examinations in 81 subjects and in Class XII in 119 subjects; total subjects for examination conducted by the CBSE in 200 subjects.
- About **40 lakhs** students appeared in Board Examinations from approx. 7603 centres for Class X & 7126 centres for Class XII across the country and 26 countries abroad.

CBSE EXAMINATIONS-2024: AT A GLANCE

- The Question Papers were prepared based on the Sample Question Papers released

by the Board in 200 Subjects. Question Papers were prepared in English and later on translated into Hindi language.

- Prior to the conduct of examinations, a webinar was conducted to sensitize the schools fixed as an examination centre and the schools sponsoring the candidates on the processes involved in examination.
- For objective evaluation, Marking Scheme of each question paper was prepared.
- 2029 for Class X & 1753 for Class XII Centre Nodal Supervisor were fixed for evaluation across the country in the year 2024 Examination.
- CBSE was providing several facilities to the Children with Special Needs (CWSN) during the conduct of the examination.
- These exemptions included 20 minutes per hour additional time, facility of scribe, questions in lieu of visual inputs, seating arrangements at ground floor, use of computers and assistive devices etc.
- CBSE was also providing facilities to students participating in National / International sports events to conduct their Board examinations at a later date if dates of journey and event coincide with the date of conduct of examinations.
- During the conduct of Board examination 2024, 8290 students of class X and 5057 students of class XII have been provided these facilities respectively.

CBSE EXAMINATIONS: PROCESS

- As per provisions of Scheme of Studies/ Examination Bye-Laws prescribed by the CBSE, Practical Examinations/Project/ Internal Assessment was conducted from 01.01.2024.
- Practical examination was conducted for the Regular and Private students.
- Regional Offices appointed External Examiners for all students of Class-XII. The internal examiners appointed by the centre superintendent from their own school teachers. In case teachers are not available in the centre school in any subject for appointment as internal examiners, teachers from nearby schools shall be appointed.
- The practical answer books supplied by the Regional Offices were used for the conduct of the practical examination. It was also to be ensured that the examiners complete all entries in practical answer books carefully and correctly.
- For Fair and smooth conduct of Practical Examinations Board had appointed External Examiners and provided facility for Uploading of Marks and group photograph of each batch during the practical examination through online portal.
- Detailed SoPs and guidelines for smooth & fair conduct of examination at centres were provided to the examination centres.
- To ensure fairness, Board appointed observers and flying squads on day of examination.





Supplementary Examinations 2024

- The Supplementary Examination for Class XII was conducted on a single day i.e. 15th July, 2024 and for Class X examinations was conducted from 15th July, 2024 to 22nd July, 2024.
- Thereafter the Result was declared on 02.08.2024 of XII and on 05.08.2024 of Class X.
- Those candidates who were not satisfied with their result they have given the opportunity for verification of marks and a facility to obtain the photocopy of their evaluated answer sheet and the re-evaluation of their answer(s).

FACILITIES TO STUDENTS STAKEHOLDERS

• Availability of documents to the students:

As soon as the result was declared, the result documents had been provided to the students in their DigiLocker. To avoid the problem of accessing the DigiLocker, this year, CBSE has provided PIN to the schools in advance

to be given to the candidates ahead of result declaration.

Further, Board has supplied printed mark sheets cum passing certificate also to the students in addition to electronic documents.

• Improvement opportunity in the Supplementary Examination:

As it is envisaged in the National Education Policy, 2020 that the students should be provided more opportunities to improve their performance, hence, Class XII students were allowed to improve their performance in 01 (one) subject in the Supplementary Examinations.

• Online Payment System (IPS) :

CBSE had developed an Online Payment System based on the norms fixed by the Board for all activities of examination for all the functionaries.

• Verification, Photocopy and Re-evaluation of Examination :

This year, the CBSE has provided facilities to the students as provided in the earlier years of getting their marks verified, obtaining photocopy and their re-evaluation.

Technology Used

- परीक्षासंगम – A Comprehensive Platform for all examination related activities pertaining

to all major stakeholders including schools, Regional Offices, and Head Office.

2. An online portal for schools to register all students of Class IX & XI including online fee payment and generation of registration cards were developed & implemented. Registration cards are also being provided to the students through DigiLocker.
3. Initially all the examination forms were obtained online through the schools for both the classes X & XII.
4. ECL-Exam Centre Locater App: A mobile app to facilitate CBSE Examinees of both Board as well competitive exams, through which they can locate their examination centres by just entering exam and roll number was developed & implemented.
5. OECMS (Online Exam Centre Management System): Comprehensive Decision Support System comprising of a portal and backend system to get real time information about centres and conduct of exams including feedback about the question paper(s), packing of answer books & dispatch information about observers etc.
6. CMTM (Confidential Material Tracking & Monitoring System) App for Board Exams: Three different Apps have been developed for electronic surveillance, tracking and monitoring. With the help of this apps, the arrangements were made to call the examination centres immediately if they were not following instructions issued by the Board.
7. In order to eradicate non genuine disbursement an Online Normative Payment System “(IPS) Integrated Payment System”. This is in consonance with Ease of Doing Business (EoDB) and Ease of Living (EoL). It has also been implemented for remuneration to all Board Exams functionaries including Centre Supdt, invigilators, support staff, evaluators etc.
8. E-Theory: An online system for answer sheets bag allocation to Chief Nodal Supervisor, answer sheets allocation to evaluators, evaluation monitoring, question wise theory marks uploading and online generation of award lists has been developed & implemented. During evaluation all the marks were uploaded directly to the website.
9. TETRA (Theory Evaluation Trend Analysis): Decision Support System based on Real Time Evaluation Monitoring: A unique portal and Decision Support System based on Real Time Evaluation Monitoring has been developed. In this system evaluation trend can be visualized, analysed and monitored. This also generates various statistical data and gives graphical visualization of evaluation related information on real time.
10. In order to further strengthen security & privacy of students data, it has been decided to introduce 6 digit Security PIN based activation for students DigiLocker accounts. After activation of DigiLocker accounts, students can access their Digital Academic Documents under the “Issued Documents” section. The student wise Security PIN file is being given in schools in their DigiLocker accounts from where schools can download and disseminate Security PIN to individual students.
11. Since DigiLocker access is not available in foreign countries, so special provision for foreign students to Access of Digital Academic Documents (Mark Sheet Cum Certificates & Migration Certificates) by students of CBSE schools located in foreign countries.
12. Centralized Admission Master Correction Portal (CAMC) module is designed and developed by CBSE to avoid such delay by which it is ensured that these corrections are addressed in shortest possible time. This will be made operational after the declaration of the result of 2024.

FACILITIES AFTER RESULT DECLARATION TO THE STUDENTS

- Once the result was declared, following opportunity are given to the students for grievance redressal and complete transparency against payment of fees:
- They can request for verification for their marks;
- Photocopies is provided, if they desire so;
- Revaluation is done;

In all the three cases if any mistake is observed, it is corrected and result is updated.

- In class XII, if any student is not able to secure 33% marks in one subject out of five opted subjects and in class X in two subjects, they are given an opportunity to appear in the Supplementary Examinations conducted in the month of July.
- For Supplementary Examinations as well, the similar processes are repeated as has been followed for the conducted of Main Examinations.

CBSE EXAMINATIONS: PROCESS (VERIFICATION OF MARKS)

- If any student is not satisfied by the Board examination result, then he/she may apply for verification of marks / rechecking of marks against payment of requisite fee.
- The verification of marks / rechecking of marks is carried out by the teachers of CBSE affiliated schools.
- In the result of verification of marks, the marks can be increased or decreased or may be still same as per declared result.

- After complete verification of marks, the revised result is provided to applicant students.

CBSE EXAMINATIONS: PROCESS (PHOTOCOPY OF ANSWER BOOK)

- If any student is not satisfied by revised result of rechecking of marks, then student may apply for obtaining photocopy of answer book with the payment of requisite fee.
- If any student wants to apply for re-evaluation of answer books after getting it photocopy, then student can apply online for re-evaluation of answer books with the requisite fee.

CBSE EXAMINATIONS: PROCESS (RE-EVALUATION OF ANSWER BOOK)

- In the re-evaluation process, the applied answer books are re-evaluated by two subject teachers.
- After re-evaluation, the marks in answer book may be changed to increase, decrease or no change.
- The revised result of applied answer books is declared and provided to applicant student.

CBSE EXAMINATIONS: PROCESS (SUPPLEMENTARY EXAMINATION)

- If any student does not secure minimum marks in any two subjects in Class X & any one subject in Class XII in Main Board Examination, then he/she may appear in Supplementary Examination conducted after result declaration of Main Examination.
- The same process is followed in conduct of examination, evaluation of answer books, result preparation and declaration of result as per main examination.

ACTIVITIES PERTAINING TO EXAMINATION 2025

- This year, CBSE had started filling of data of LOC for Class X and XII for 2025 examination well in advance i.e. on 05th September, 2024 and no extension was

given for filling of LOC data to avoid delay in process at later stage.

- CBSE had started filling of data of Registration for Class IX and XI of 2025-2026 well in advance i.e. on 18th September, 2024 and this year, no extension was given for filling of Registration data.
- CBSE had also started filling of data of Submission of examination forms by Private Students for Class-X & XII Examination-2025 well in advance i.e. on 18th September, 2024 and this year, no extension was given for filling of data.
- Various reminders were issued to all the affiliated schools to submit the LOC of Class X & XII and Registration data of Class IX & XI in due course of time.
- Doing away with the hard copy of the Migration Certificate for both classes X & XII. CBSE has decided that from the Examinations 2025 onwards, the hard copy of the Migration Certificate will not be issued to the students of Class X & XII. The same has also been informed to the UGC that digital copies of the certificates issued by the Board will be accepted for admission to institutions of higher learning.
- Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) were also issued for Timely and Accurate Submission of LOC 2025.
- This year, CBSE has decided that all the schools which would be fixed as an examination centre must have the facility of closed circuit television (CCTV) to ensure that examinations are conducted smoothly and fairly.
- Circular issued by CBSE for strict compliance with attendance requirement as per CBSE Examination Bye Laws for Board Examination Eligibility.
- A circular was issued well in time that the Practical Examinations/Project Assessment/ Internal Assessment for the session 2024-

2025 for classes X and XII for Winter Bound Schools will be conducted from 05th November, 2024 to 05th December, 2024.

- CBSE has launched various Integrated Payment System (IPS) Module for releasing payments to Centres and functionaries involved in Class X & XII Board Examinations 2024.
- This year, CBSE has issued Data Sheet for Class X and XII for Board Examinations 2025, 03 months prior before commencement of examination to make students stress free.
- A circular is also issued to all affiliated schools reiterating that Special provisions for the students participating in National/International Sports events and International Olympiads are being given special opportunities to the involved students in such activities recognized by Sports Authority of India (SAI).
- A circular was issued regarding conduct of Practical Examinations / Internal Assessment/Project for Class X/XII for the session 2024-25 which was scheduled to start w.e.f. 1st January, 2025.
- Guidelines and SOPs were issued for Practical Examination 2025.
- Online Portal was opened w.e.f. 18.12.2024 to 28.12.2024 for availing exemptions/ facilities by interested CWSN students in examinations of Class X & XII.
- A circular was also issued for fixation of CBSE affiliated schools as NIOS Exam. Centers for the conduct of Public Examinations scheduled for April / May 2025.

NDEAR emphasizes the importance of data interoperability and accessibility, creating the foundation for Sagar se Saransh. Prior to Sagar se Saransh, challenges like presence of data in silos and inaccessible information, manual data analysis and inefficiencies, limited visibility and lack of actionable insights, inconsistent reporting and difficulty in monitoring progress, hindered CBSE's ability to leverage data for informed decision-making and optimize educational experiences.

The **Vidya Samiksha Software (Sqube)** as “सागर से सारांश”, is a robust data-driven analytical platform designed to provide a bird's eye view of the CBSE ecosystem and granular insights at various operational levels. **Vidya Samiksha Software (Sqube)** “सागर से सारांश” an advanced suite of features

aimed at empowering stakeholders, including district-wise and school management group-wise 360° views of schools, enabling informed decision-making and strategic interventions. The platform provides tailored dashboards for schools, foreign institutions, and for various sister organisations such as Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) and Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti (NVS), offering detailed insights into their performance, trends, and compliance. Cutting-edge AI/ML-based predictive models enhance the platform's capabilities with “What-if” scenario analysis for dropout predictions (Classes IX to X), average marks (Classes X and XII), and other key metrics. Comprehensive examination question paper analysis, grade analysis, and theory-practical correlation for board examinations allow in-depth evaluation of academic outcomes. VSK also incorporates data forensic tools to detect malpractices, dropout and left-out trend analysis, and a correlation analysis between categorical and numerical school parameters. Enhanced geospatial tools provide road/air distance mapping and location-specific performance data, while the Historical Information Repository of Schools (HIROS) module highlights compliance violations. and permissions. The platform also tracks user activity, enabling administrators to monitor usage patterns and optimize the system for user needs.

To ensure accessibility for all users, Sqube offers open data access for specific datasets, while maintaining **secure data practices** for sensitive information. **Responsive design** guarantees a seamless user experience across devices and browsers. SCHOLARSHIP SCHEMES

To promote meritorious students from socially and economically weaker sections, the Board has the following scholarship schemes:

CENTRAL SECTOR SCHEME OF SCHOLARSHIP FOR COLLEGE & UNIVERSITY STUDENTS (CSSS), SPONSORED BY MOE

Objective: To provide financial assistance to meritorious students from poor families to meet a part of their day-to-day expenses while pursuing higher studies.

Scope: The scholarships are awarded by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, on the basis of the results of the Higher

Secondary / Class XII Board Examination. A maximum of 82,000 fresh scholarships per annum are provided for pursuing graduate/ postgraduate degrees in colleges and universities and for professional courses, such as Medical, Engineering etc.

Eligibility for Scholarship:

- i. Students who have passed Class XII of the 10+2 pattern or equivalent above the 80th percentile of successful candidates in the relevant stream from the respective Board of Examination and are pursuing a regular degree course from Colleges/Institutions recognized by AICTE and the respective Regulatory Bodies concerned;
- ii. Students with gross parental/family income up to Rs. 4.5 lakh per annum are eligible for a scholarship under the scheme. Income certificate will be required only for the fresh applicants;
- iii. For renewal of the scholarship in each year of study, besides getting at least 50% marks in the Annual Examination, maintenance of adequate attendance of at least 75%, will also be the criteria.
- iv. The Beneficiaries/Applicants must visit the National Scholarships Portal (www.scholarships.gov.in) for detailed information and to apply for the fresh/ renewal scholarships.

Rate and Duration of Scholarship (from the financial year 2022-23): The rate of scholarship is Rs.12,000/-per annum at Graduation level for first three years of College and University courses and Rs.20,000/-per annum at Post Graduation level. For detailed information about this scheme, applicants may visit the National Scholarships Portal (www.scholarships.gov.in)

Role of CBSE in CSSS: CBSE verify the genuineness of the CSSS scholarship applications of those students who have passed class-XII from the CBSE-affiliated schools, being a State Nodal Officer (S.N.O) for this

scheme. This scheme is fully sponsored by the Ministry of Education, Government of India. Hence, the financial implication is borne by the Ministry.

SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME - FOR WARD OF THE EMPLOYEES OF BOARD, i.e. C.B.S.E (SWBE)

- Class VI – VIII @ ₹700/- per month


A total of 179 scholarships have been provided for Academic Year 2023-24 to the eligible wards of the Board Employees under this scheme.




- Admission to class 6 in JNVs is made on the basis of an All India Level Selection Test called JNVST.
- The CBSE conducts this test in terms of MoU signed with NVS.
- The test consists of 80 questions carrying total 100 marks to be attempted in 120 Minutes (Mental Ability-40, Arithmetic-20, Language-20).**
- It is an OMR based MCQ type Test. Each question carries 1.25 marks.

- There is no negative marking.
- In 2024, exam was held on two phases:
 - Winter Bound- 4th November 2023
 - Summer Bound- 20th January 2024
- A total of 52,607 Candidates were registered (Boys-26,908, Girls-25,699, Transgender-2) for JNVST-WB examination held on 4th November 2023. The examination was conducted smoothly on 418 centres in 63 districts across the country. The results were prepared & handed over to the NVS vide letter dated 13-03-2024. Total Selection 3,182.

Results were handed over to the NVS vide letter dated 07-03-2024. Total selection 3,846 Candidates.

- In 2024, JNV Lateral Entry Test for Class-XI was held on 10th February 2024. Total of 75,937 candidates registered (Boys-37,902, Girls-38,035, Transgender-12) for this examination in 684 centres of 633 districts. Total Selection 4,820 candidates.

Year 2024 JNVLE-Class-XI




PARAKH Rashtriya Sarvekshan – 2024, conducted on 04.12.2024 (Wednesday)

The DoSEL Ministry of Education, Government of India had entrusted the responsibility of conducting the PARAKH Rashtriya Sarvekshan 2024 in as many as **87,619 schools of 782 Districts** of the Country to the PARAKH-NCERT in collaboration with Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) wherein the CBSE functioned as the “Assessment Test Administrator” for the Sarvekshan (Survey).

The Survey was successfully **conducted on 4th December, 2024** in all the sample schools simultaneously in **23 languages** and nearly **23 lakhs students of Grades 3, 6 & 9** students of these Schools participated in the same. It is one of the largest nationwide sample based educational surveys conducted across the country to provide structured feedback on student learning levels at District, State & National Levels. The inputs received will be used for policy planning & designing pedagogical interventions to introduce qualitative improvements and to ensure equity in learning.



Monitoring of RTI and Public Grievance Redressal


RTI - With effective monitoring and regular follow ups, the average response time to settle RTI applications has been shortened. It is ensured to best possible extent that stipulations under proactive and voluntary disclosure are implemented effectively in various units of the Board.

- **6,580 applications & 624 Appeals** were received and disposed of during the year.

- To sensitize, familiarize and educate the CPIOs/FAAs and concerned officials about the relevant provision of RTI Act, 2005 for effective discharge of duties and responsibilities, one workshop in virtual mode for all CPIOs/AAs was conducted by Media & P R Unit on 29.11.2024 at CBSE Headquarters. More than **50 officers** and staff of CBSE from various departments and **18 Regional Offices** across the country and abroad got benefited from the RTI workshop.

Public Grievances Redressal - Online and offline Grievances as registered on CPGRAMS portal related to CBSE are monitored on daily basis and forwarded/ replied within prescribed time limits. 2,550 Grievances were disposed of out of 2655 received in the calendar year 2024. With effective monitoring and regular follows ups, the average response time to settle Public Grievances has been shortened to less than 21 days.

In the calendar year **2024**, **60,000** public emails and queries were successfully addressed via the info mail to ensure effective responsiveness.

CBSE has been proactive in disseminating important information via social media platforms such as YouTube, Twitter, Facebook, and Instagram.


In 2024, a total of **446** posts were shared on these platforms to communicate significant Board decisions, activities, and updates as well observe important days and events.

STUDENT COUNSELING AND WELL-BEING ACTIVITIES

CBSE Psychological Well-Being Services

CBSE, in line with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, has actively implemented a variety of measures to promote student well-being and all-round development of students. It has introduced various strategies and programs to provide psychosocial and career counseling support at educational, psychosocial, and career levels. These initiatives include workshops and webinars focused on psychosocial support and career guidance, capacity-building programs for educators, and regional and national summits addressing critical adolescent issues, alongside other valuable student-centric activities. Key initiatives include the following:

1. CBSE Tele-Counseling Services

Celebrating 27 years since its inception, the CBSE Tele-Counseling Program continues to offer a free and voluntary psychological helpline through the toll-free number 1800 11 8004. This service is available to Class X and XII students during exam periods and result time. Delivered by school Principals and trained

Counselors on voluntary basis, the program has consistently provided essential support to students and their families, helping them manage exam pressure and offering guidance and emotional support.

In 2024, the tele-counseling service saw participation from Principals and Counselors not only from India but also from various other countries, including Nepal, Japan, the United Arab Emirates, Kuwait, Qatar, Oman, and Singapore, who volunteered to offer free pre- and post-exam counseling to Class X and XII students:

- Pre- and During Exams: 67 Counselors provided vital support.
- Post-Exam: 65 Counselors offered guidance.

IVRS Support

Additionally, the Board has established a complimentary 24/7 Interactive Voice Response System (IVRS) on toll-free number 1800 11 8004. This service included frequently asked questions (FAQs), useful information regarding exams and results, preparation tips, time management strategies, and essential contact details for CBSE offices. By combining tele-counseling and IVRS, the CBSE ensured comprehensive support for students throughout their exam journey.

Counseling through Audio-Visual Presentations: Audio-visual presentations are provided on CBSE website and YouTube on various topics for creating awareness and understanding about relevant issues concerning students as well as parents viz. Aggression, Internet Addiction Disorder, Depression, Exam Anxiety, Specific Learning Disability, Substance Use Disorder, and Life Skills.

2. Initiatives on Student Well-being/ Counseling:

A. Offline Programs:

The Offline Capacity Building Programs for School Counselors and Wellness Teachers were conducted in various Lead Collaborator schools across India in 2024. These programs took place in cities such as Lucknow, Mumbai, Gurugram, New Delhi, Jaipur, Hyderabad, Chennai, Kolkata, Guwahati, Ahmedabad, Bengaluru, Kochi, and Bhopal. Approximately **1,500** counselors and wellness teachers were trained through these programs, utilizing the Hub and Spoke Model.



B. Online Programs:

o **Three Virtual Workshops** were organized in June 2024 on career assessments, psychometric evaluations, and goal-setting.




D. 08-day online orientation workshops for Master Trainers: 200+ Counselors & Wellness Teachers from CBSE Schools were identified and enlisted during the CBPs organized by CBSE. CBSE further conducted 08-day online orientation workshops for master trainers selected through the offline CBPs for the purpose of further training of Counselors and Wellness Teachers in a hub-and-spoke model.

b) On 26th September, 2024 - CBSE hosted a workshop titled "Parenting for Students' Well-being" at Sardar Patel Vidyalaya, New Delhi, with around 150 principals from CBSE schools in Delhi/NCR in attendance. The event began with insights from Sh. Rahul Singh, Chairperson, CBSE and Sh. Himanshu Gupta, Secretary, CBSE who emphasized the evolving role of parenting and the significance of schools in providing guidance to families. Expert sessions focused on students' emotional needs, fostering open communication, and supporting students' emotional well-being equipping principals with practical strategies for enhancing student support. The workshop concluded with a Q&A session, reinforcing CBSE's commitment to holistic student development in line with the National Education Policy 2020. **(YouTube Viewership: 10,500+)**



c) On 28th August, 2024 - In collaboration with the Narcotics Control Bureau, CBSE organized the 'Say No to Drugs and Yes to Life' Campaign cum Workshop at Modern School, Vasant Vihar, New Delhi with

about 200 school principals. The program was held both offline and via live streaming on the CBSE YouTube channel, ensuring widespread participation of students, parents and teaching fraternity taken together. Attendees were engaged in informative presentations and interactive sessions that covered the causes, effects, and prevention strategies regarding drug abuse. Queries of the attendees were resolved through Interactive question-and-answer session about how supportive environments can be created for young students, empowering them to resist peer pressure and make correct choices for a healthier life. The program educated students about the dangers of drug abuse and promoted a drug-free lifestyle while providing participants with comprehensive strategies to identify, prevent, and address substance abuse effectively. **(YouTube Viewership: 52,000+)**



d) Health Campaign: CBSE, in collaboration with the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), launched an awareness campaign titled "Say Yes to Life, No to Drugs" to combat drug abuse among youth. Running from June 5th to June 26th, 2024, the campaign encouraged students, teachers, parents, and stakeholders to take an e-pledge. Schools were called to engage in activities promoting healthy living and drug awareness, such as displaying informative materials and organizing creative projects crucial to fostering a drug-free environment.



F. Peer Educator Leadership Program:

- o This flagship program aimed to empower senior students (Classes IX and XI) as peer educators to promote life skills and mental health awareness. This initiative runs year-round and involves both students and teachers, with 04 modules and 8 themes 4-day-a-week round the year sessions focusing on psychosocial well-being and leadership development. Participants include 4 senior students (2 each from classes IX and XI) and one teacher supported by School Counselors or Wellness Teachers.
- o From 16th May, 2024 to 31st December, 2024, the 130 to 171 batches of the Adolescent Peer Educator Programme were conducted via Webex. The purpose of this program was to facilitate the integration of life skills, mental health, and overall wellness as essential components of daily education in schools, while also providing a platform for empowering young minds. The Adolescent Peer Educators Leadership Program intended to enrich students' life skills, overall health, and wellness.

H. National Summit on Life Skills, Mental Health, Safety, and Well-being

01 CBSE National Adolescent Summit 2024 was organized on 20th to 21st December 2024 at National Bal Bhawan, New Delhi on the theme "Life Skills, Mental Health, Safety, and Well-being". There were over 850 participants from India and abroad, fostering dialogue and collaboration on critical adolescent issues which is aligned with the vision of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the summit provided a platform to empower students and educators, promoting holistic development.

The event featured a vibrant Health and Wellness Exhibition alongside several engaging


activities which were designed to empower students and showcase their creativity. Key highlights included a Health and Wellness Exhibition showcasing 120 innovative projects, the Yuva Sansad adolescent well-being parliament, UTSAV's creative competitions, film screenings, mentoring sessions, and the National Health & Wellness Quiz.

The event also witnessed eminent dignitaries and panelists/ field experts and personalities who exchanged ideas and insights to integrate and enhance student well-being and mental health initiatives within school eco-system. The event empowered students and educators, promoting holistic development through interactive sessions and workshops.





I. After compilation, the magazine 'Aarohan' was published on CBSE website for schools.



J. Comprehensive Survey on Counseling and Well-being Services in CBSE Schools:

CBSE conducted a survey to gather valuable insights on the availability of Counselors in CBSE Schools, their qualifications and expertise with feedback to identify areas of improvement and implement effective strategies to strengthen student support system. By understanding the current landscape and needs, the Counselors can be better equipped and ensured that every student receives the guidance and care they deserve.

CBSE seeks to strengthen counseling systems by implementing transformative changes, integrating counseling into the school framework through capacity-building initiatives, awareness campaigns, workshops, summits, and resource development to address emerging educational challenges in line with NEP 2020.

राजभाषा का प्रचार-प्रसार तथा कार्यान्वयन

केंद्रीय माध्यमिक शिक्षा बोर्ड में राजभाषा नीति का प्रभावशाली कार्यान्वयन किया जा रहा है। भारत सरकार की राजभाषा नीति के कार्यान्वयन का दायित्व हिंदी प्रकोष्ठ का है और कार्यालय के दैनिक कार्यों में हिंदी के उपयोग को बढ़ाने के लिए आवश्यक इनपुट/सहायता उपलब्ध कराता है। गृह मंत्रालय के राजभाषा विभाग द्वारा जारी राजभाषा कार्यान्वयन संबंधी सभी दिशा-निर्देशों, नीतियों का अनुपालन कराने हेतु हिंदी प्रकोष्ठ प्रयासरत है। इसके अतिरिक्त, राजभाषा अधिनियम 1963 की धारा 3(3) के अंतर्गत जारी किए जाने वाले दस्तावेज जैसे कार्यालय आदेशों/ज्ञापनों/परिपत्रों/प्रेसविज़प्तियों/प्रपत्रों आदि का अनुवाद करता है।

राजभाषा कार्यान्वयन समिति की बैठक

संघ के सरकारी प्रयोजनों के लिए हिंदी के प्रयोग को बढ़ावा देने के लिए समय-समय पर जारी किए जाने वाले अनुदेशों को कारगर ढंग से कार्यान्वित करने के लिए बोर्ड में राजभाषा कार्यान्वयन समिति का गठन किया गया है। राजभाषा कार्यान्वयन समिति की बैठक का आयोजन प्रत्येक तिमाही में किया जाता है। इस वर्ष बोर्ड में दिनांक 28.03.2024, 28.06.2024, 17.09.2024, 27.12.2024 को राजभाषा कार्यान्वयन समिति की बैठक का आयोजन अध्यक्ष, सीबीएसई की अध्यक्षता में किया गया। उक्त बैठकों में बोर्ड द्वारा किए गए राजभाषा कार्यों की समीक्षा की गई।

हिंदी कार्यशालाओं का आयोजन

राजभाषा नीति के अनुसार हिंदी के प्रति रुझान बढ़ाने हेतु बोर्ड मुख्यालय में प्रत्येक तिमाही में हिंदी कार्यशाला का आयोजन किया जाता है। इसमें भाग लेने वाले अधिकारियों/कर्मचारियों को हिंदी में काम करने के लिए प्रोत्साहित किया जाता है तथा कार्मिकों को हिंदी का कार्य साधक ज्ञान देकर

सरकारी काम काज में हिंदी का अधिक से अधिक प्रयोग करने के लिए मार्गदर्शन दिया जाता है। इस वर्ष दिनांक 07.03.2024, 21.05.2024, 27.09.2024, 27.11.2024 को हिंदी कार्यशालाओं का आयोजन किया गया।

नकद प्रोत्साहन योजना

भारत सरकार, गृहमंत्रालय, राजभाषा विभाग के निर्देशों के अनुसार, बोर्ड मुख्यालय में सरकारी काम-काज मूल रूप से हिंदी में करने के लिए प्रोत्साहन योजना लागू है। इस योजना के तहत अधिकारियों/कर्मचारियों को उनके द्वारा हिंदी में किए गए सरकारी काम-काज के आधार पर नकद पुरस्कार (पुरस्कार की राशि रु. 5,000/-, 3,000/- तथा 2,000/-) देने का प्रावधान है। इस वर्ष बोर्ड मुख्यालय के 05 कार्मिकों को यह पुरस्कार प्रदान किए गए।

राजभाषाई निरीक्षण

हिंदी टंकण प्रशिक्षण

केंद्रीय हिंदी प्रशिक्षण संस्थान, नई दिल्ली के सहयोग से बोर्ड द्वारा बोर्ड मुख्यालय तथा अधीनस्थ क्षेत्रीय कार्यालयों के कार्मिकों को केंद्रीय हिंदी प्रशिक्षण संस्थान, नई दिल्ली द्वारा चलाए जा रहे हिंदी टंकण के दीर्घकालिक/अल्पकालिक

गहन/पत्राचार प्रशिक्षण कार्यक्रम में नामित किया गया तथा प्रशिक्षण दिलाया गया।

अनुवाद संबंधी प्रशिक्षण

वर्ष 2024 में केन्द्रीय अनुवाद ब्यूरो की ओर से चलाए जा रहे अनुवाद संबंधी प्रशिक्षण में बोर्ड मुख्यालय से श्रीमती शक्ति शर्मा, वरिष्ठ अनुवाद अधिकारी को नामित किया गया व प्रशिक्षण दिलाया गया।

हिंदी दिवस व हिंदी पखवाड़ा

राजभाषा विभाग, गृह मंत्रालय, भारत सरकार तथा शिक्षा मंत्रालय के निर्देशों के अनुसार, 14 सितंबर, 2024 को संविधान सभा द्वारा हिंदी को संघ की राजभाषा स्वीकार करने के 75 वर्ष पूरे होने के उपलक्ष्य में हीरक जयंती तथा हिंदी दिवस (14 सितंबर) के अवसर पर केन्द्रीय माध्यमिक शिक्षा बोर्ड, मुख्यालय में दिनांक 14.09.2024 से 30.09.2024 तक हिंदी पखवाड़े का आयोजन किया गया।

हिंदी दिवस (14 सितंबर) के अवसर पर अध्यक्ष, सीबीएसई की ओर से बोर्ड के सभी अधिकारियों व कर्मचारियों तथा सभी अधीनस्थ क्षेत्रीय कार्यालयों में कार्यरत कार्मिकों को पूरी निष्ठा व तत्परता से राजभाषा प्रयोग संबंधी संवैधानिक दायित्वों के अनुरूप अपने दैनिक काम काज में हिंदी पर अधिकाधिक बल देने और राजभाषा के प्रचार-प्रसार एवं कार्यान्वयन के लिए निर्धारित किए गए लक्ष्यों की पूर्ति की दिशा में खैच्छिक प्रयास करने के लिए अपील जारी की गई तथा बोर्ड के सभी अधिकारियों व कर्मचारियों को "राजभाषा प्रतिज्ञा" दिलाई गई। इस दौरान शिक्षा मंत्रालय की ओर से प्राप्त माननीय गृहमंत्री जी का राजभाषा संदेश सभी कार्यालयों/एककों/अनुभागों में परिचालित एवं प्रसारित किया गया। इस दौरान 08 विभिन्न प्रतियोगिताएं (जैसे हिंदी टिप्पण एवं प्रारूप लेखन प्रतियोगिता, हिंदी शब्द अंताक्षरी प्रतियोगिता, हिंदी सुलेख/श्रुतलेख प्रतियोगिता, हिंदी कविता पाठ प्रतियोगिता, हिंदी निबंध लेखन प्रतियोगिता,

राजभाषा एवं सामान्य ज्ञान पर आधारित प्रश्नोत्तरी प्रतियोगिता, हिंदी स्लोगन प्रतियोगिता तथा हिंदी टंकण प्रतियोगिता) आयोजित की गई। इन प्रतियोगिताओं में कार्मिकों द्वारा बढ़-चढ़ कर भाग लिया गया। इन प्रतियोगिताओं के 56 विजेताओं को पुरस्कार की राशि दी गई थी तथा प्रमाणपत्र समापन समारोह के दौरान वितरित किए गए।

हिंदी गतिविधि का आयोजन

हिंदी के प्रचार-प्रसार को गति प्रदान करने के लिए इसे सामाजिक उत्तरदायित्व के साथ जोड़ते हुए राजभाषा हिंदी के आधुनिक संदर्भ में कई विशेष कार्यक्रम किए जाते हैं। इसके तहत बोर्ड मुख्यालय में विभिन्न अनुभागों द्वारा प्रत्येक तिमाही में प्रसिद्ध हिंदी साहित्यकारों, लेखकों, कवियों की पुण्यतिथि अथवा जन्म दिवस पर हिंदी गतिविधियों का आयोजन किया जाता है। बोर्ड मुख्यालय के कार्मिकों के अलावा अधीनस्थ क्षेत्रीय कार्यालयों आदि में भी हिंदी गतिविधियां आयोजित की जाती हैं। वर्ष 2024 में हिंदी गतिविधियों का आयोजन किया गया तथा इस दौरान बोर्ड मुख्यालय के कार्मिकों तथा क्षेत्रीय कार्यालयों के कार्मिकों द्वारा बढ़-चढ़कर प्रतिभागिता दर्ज की गई। कार्मिकों द्वारा हिंदी साहित्यकारों, कवियों के जीवन वृतांत, उनकी लेखन शैली, उनके द्वारा रचित विभिन्न रचनाओं/कृतियों का वाचन किया गया जिस की रिपोर्ट सीबीएसई की वेबसाइट पर अपलोड कराई गई है।
