

Background

Adolescence is a critical developmental stage characterized by rapid physical, psychological and social transitions. In today's context, adolescents face a wide range of challenges including:

- Academic pressure and mental health concerns (anxiety, depression, exam stress, self-harm risks)
- Influence of social media, cyber safety, and screen time management
- Issues relating to identity, gender sensitivity, bullying, and inclusion
- Body image concerns, unhealthy lifestyles, and rising trends of substance use
- Career uncertainty and the need for purposeful skill development

Recognizing these multidimensional challenges, the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) proposes to organize the **CBSE National Adolescent Summit 2025** as a flagship platform for dialogue and action. The Summit will bring together educators, mental health experts, policymakers, parent and student representatives and allied professionals to deliberate on strategies that strengthen adolescent wellbeing, amplify student voices, and promote safe, inclusive and empowering learning environments.

Rationale

The initiative aligns with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 focus on holistic development, socio-emotional learning and mental health awareness.

It builds on CBSE's existing Counseling and wellness initiatives including the School Health & Wellness Programme, Parenting calendar, Capacity Building Programs, podcasts, tele-counseling and the Hub & Spoke Model of School Counseling.

Objectives of the Summit

Highlight current and emerging issues faced by adolescents.

- Create awareness and strengthen mental health literacy among educators, parents, and students.
- Bring together experts from multiple domains to deliberate on actionable solutions.
- Deliberate on strategies for promoting resilience, inclusion, and safety in schools.
- Amplify adolescent voices through participatory sessions.
- To evolve a collective **National Adolescent Wellbeing Charter** for adoption and dissemination across schools.

Structure and Sessions

The one-day in-person Summit will comprise keynote sessions, plenary discussions, thematic panels, youth engagement, and a counseling showcase.

- Main Auditorium: Inaugural, Plenary, and Valedictory Sessions
- Breakaway Rooms (Round Table): Concurrent Panels and Interactive Discussions
- Foyer Area: Exhibition "Counseling in Action: Best Practices from Schools"

- **Valedictory:** Collective Commitment for Adolescent Wellbeing Presentation of recommendations and adoption of the National Adolescent Wellbeing Charter.
