### NOTIFICATION-2

**Subject:- Assessment scheme for declaration of results of Class XII in West Asian Countries**

#### 1. BACKGROUND

Due to the prevailing extraordinary circumstances in West Asian countries (Bahrain, Iran, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the UAE.), conducting Class XII Board Examinations as scheduled had become infeasible. In line with its commitment to ensuring student welfare and educational security, CBSE had taken the following decisions vide circular no. CBSE/CE/SPPS/2026/2 dated 13<sup>th</sup> March, 2026 to support learners affected by ongoing international geopolitical challenges:-

- All examinations of Class XII scheduled from 16.03.2026 to 10.04.2026 stand cancelled.
- Examinations which were earlier postponed vide circular dated 01.03.2026, 03.03.2026, 05.03.2026, 07.03.2026 and 09.03.2026 shall also stand cancelled.

It was also informed that the mode of declaration of results for Class XII candidates in these countries will be notified separately in due course.

#### 2. PREPRATION OF AN OBJECTIVE ASSESSMENT SCHEME

Board examinations for Class XII were scheduled from 17.02.2026 to 10.04.2026. Examinations scheduled up to 28.02.2026 were conducted successfully before conducting examinations became infeasible:-

Ensuring the declaration of valid, reliable, fair, and unbiased results for students under the present circumstances is an exceptionally challenging task. Any results derived through approximation methods cannot fully match those produced from an actual examination. Nevertheless, the assessment policy must uphold the principles of fairness, reliability, validity, impartiality, and transparency for all students. It should also be procedurally sound, drawing upon adequate, credible, and dependable information about students' performance. Only then can the policyenable objective and precise conclusions regarding the achievement of individual students.

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In subjects where examinations have been conducted, actual performance in the examination may be taken into account for declaration of results. However, in subjects, where examinations have not been conducted, for making a reliable and valid scheme, it is necessary to go through the various cases based on the completion or otherwise of conduct of examinations. By studying data of the students, the following cases have been identified:-

1. Students who appeared in all registered subjects
2. Students who appeared in 4 registered subjects
3. Students who appeared in 3 registered subjects
4. Students who appeared in 2 registered subjects
5. Students who appeared in 1 registered subject
6. Students whose all(5) examinations are pending
7. Students whose all(6) examinations are pending
8. Candidates of 2025 or earlier registered only in 01 subject under Compartment Category.

Based on the presently prevailing situation and the number of examinations conducted as well as the admission schedule in Higher Education Institutions across the globe, results can only be declared in a manner by adopting an alternate mechanism which could provide the most accurate assessment of the students under the current circumstances.

### **3. EXITING PROCEDURE FOR ASSESSMENT OF STUDENTS**

In class-XII, there are two components to the assessment. First component is Practical/Internal Assessment and Second component is theory examinations. Bifurcation of marks in Theory and Practical/Internal Assessment (I.A.) in various subjects is as follows: -

The students are assessed out of maximum 100 marks for each subject. As per the policy of the Board, 20/30/40/50/70 marks are for Practical/Internal Assessment and 80/70/60/50/30 marks are for theory examinations conducted by the Board. *a*

## 5. ALERNATIVE ASSESSMENT POLICY

**The following Alternative Scheme has been formulated: -**

- (a) **Students who appeared in all registered subjects:-**The result of such students will be declared based on their performance in the examinations as they have appeared in all of their registered subjects.
- (b) **Candidates of 2025 or earlier registered in 01 subject under Compartment Category:-**
- i. If these students have appeared in 01 registered subject, their result will be declared based on their performance in the examination.
  - ii. If examination is not conducted, an opportunity will be given to them to appear in the supplementary examinations to be held in July, 2026.
- (c). **Students whose 1, 2 ,3, 4, 5, and 6 examinations are left:-**
- General**
- i. In this category, assessment will be made based on maximum marks assigned to theory paper and to the Practical/I.A.
  - ii. Assessment in Board will be based on the assessment done by the schools. Schools conduct assessment generally three times in a year in the form of quarterly assessment, half yearly assessment and one or more Pre-Board assessments.
- Assessment of the subjects with 80 and 70 theory marks**
- iii. In subjects where maximum theory marks are 80 or 70, schools will provide the performance of the students to the Board in quarterly examination, in half yearly examination and in **final Pre-Board examination**. Best of the three marks will be taken into account for calculating result. Marks awarded in theory out of 80 or 70 are to be uploaded by the school on the online system to be provided by the CBSE.
- Assessment of the subjects with 60/50 and 30 theory marks**
- iv. In the subjects where maximum theory marks are 60, 50 and 30, school will provide the performance of the students to the Board in **final Pre-Board examination only**. These marks will be taken into account for calculating the final result.
  - v. In these subjects, if student was "Absent" in the Final Pre-Board Examination then Pre-Board marks which was conducted prior to the Final Pre-Board Examinations will be provided by the schools to the Board. Marks awarded in theory out of 60, 50 and 30 are to be uploaded.
- (d). Students from these countries who have changed their examination centre to some other country including India, their result will be declared based on their performance in the examinations.
- (e). At the time of preparation of results, if any other suitable action is required to be taken, the same will be decided by the Competent Authority of the Board and implemented for declaration of result.

- (f). Internal assessment/ Practical is a yearlong exercise and it has already been completed and performance of the students have already been uploaded by the schools. Accordingly, there will be no change in the IA/Practical marks.
- (g). Decision of the Competent Authority of the Board shall be final and bounding.
- (h). Result of these students shall be declared alongwith rest of the students.

**6. ASSISTANCE TO THE SCHOOLS FOR UPLOADING OF THE MARKS**

CBSE will provide a platform to the schools for upload of the marks alongwith the schedule shortly.

**7. Schedule for uploading of Marks -**

All schools are requested to upload in marks within schedule to ensure timely declaration of result. Schools will also upload correct marks as once uploaded the same will not be changed.

**8. SAFE KEEPING OF RECORDS**

All the schools will seal the records of the result of all the examinations including Answer books of all the assessments as mentioned above under the signature of the Principal and Vice Principal and will keep the record in safe custody of the Principal of the school for subsequent verification by the Board.

**9. VERIFICATION OF RECORDS BY CBSE**

CBSE may call the records to verify the performance of the students to ensure the correctness and fairness of the uploaded performance.

**10. ACTION AGAINST NON-COMPLIANCE**

In cases where the school deliberately indulges in practices that are not consistent with fair, unbiased and objective practices of assessment, CBSE reserves the right to cancel such results and to take action against the school. Schools are expected to upload performance of the student without any bias or any favour to any student.

**11. DATA ONCE UPLOADED WILL BE FINAL**

Schools are expected to be doubly sure about the correctness of the performance uploaded. No request for correction of marks because of wrong entry or mistake of any sort shall be considered. Hence, due care should be taken while uploading marks on part of schools.

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## **12. CANDIDATE NOT APPEARED IN EXAMINATIONS CONDUCTED**

If any candidate has not appeared in any of the examinations conducted by the Board till 28.03.2026, such student will be marked "Absent" in the concerned subject/ examination and result will be declared accordingly as per Examination Bye-Laws.

## **13. DECLARATION OF RESULTS**

CBSE will declare the results as per rule 59 of the Examination Bye-Laws of the Board.

## **14. BOARDS POLICY FOR QUALIFYING CLASS-XII EXAMINATION**

In case, any student is not able to meet the qualifying criterion, he/she will be placed in "Essential Repeat" or "Compartment" Category as per Boards policy.

## **15. POLICY OF PROVIDING PHOTOCOPY AND THEREAFTER VERIFICATION/ RE-EVALUATION**

As assessment has been done based on the assessment scheme, the facility of providing Photocopy and thereafter verification of marks/re-evaluation will be applicable only in the subjects whose examination has been conducted.

## **16. CONDUCT OF COMPARTMENT EXAMINATIONS**

After declaration of result, compartment examinations will be conducted for the students who are not able to meet the qualifying criteria in one subject and placed in compartment category if situations permit.

## **17. CHANGE OF EXAMINATION CENTRE**

Students can appear from any country where CBSE will conduct its Compartment Examinations in July, 2026.

## **18. STUDENTS NOT SATISFIED WITH THE ASSESSMENT**

Board may consider providing a fresh opportunity to students who remain dissatisfied with the assessment made according to the above scheme by conducting a fresh set of examinations in subjects whose examinations could not be conducted. This, however, would be subject to conditions being conducive for holding examinations and the feasibility of the same. If such an opportunity is afforded and availed of, the marks obtained in these examinations shall be final.

The Board is committed to safeguarding the academic interests of students while prioritizing their safety. This policy ensures that students in the affected regions are not disadvantaged in their future academic and career pursuits.
