Presentation by the Chairman

The Chairman made an elaborate presentation on various activities undertaken by the Board since the last meeting of the Governing Body. Important issues covered in the presentation of the Chairman were as follows:

2.1 Affiliation

The number of Schools affiliated with the Board as on 20.06.2013 was 14,255 and this number has increased to 14,679 as on 02.12.2013; as such 424 new schools have been added to the list of affiliated schools with the Board during said period.

2.2 Senior Secondary Examination (Comptt) – 2013

The Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination (Comptt), 2013 (Class XII) was conducted on 16.07.2013. 75,176 candidates appeared in this examination. Overall pass percentage was 42%.

2.3 Secondary School (Improvement of Performance) Examination- 2013

Secondary School Examination Class X (Improvement of Performance) was conducted from 16.07.2013 to 23.07.2013. 8771 candidates were registered. Overall pass percentage was 20.79%.

2.4 Summative Assessment – I (2013-14)

In Summative Assessment for class IX & X unique question papers were supplied online by ITMS to Schools for maintaining uniformity. 1.7 lakh unique question papers were supplied online to more than 13000 schools who had registered. This year CBSE is trying that the Schools are also able to create their own question papers to schools, only question banks would be provided.

2.5 Analysis of Evidence of Assessment

Schools were selected randomly by Regional Officers for validation of assessment processes on formative assessments and Co-scholastic Assessments. Overall picture is now improving. Schools with more than 50% students scoring A1 (after upgradation) in all 5 subjects are also 68 out of a total number of 11,863. Without upgradation this number is 15 only. This is a satisfactory number; however these schools are being called at CBSE for justifying their assessments.

2.6 Result analysis of class X and XII results

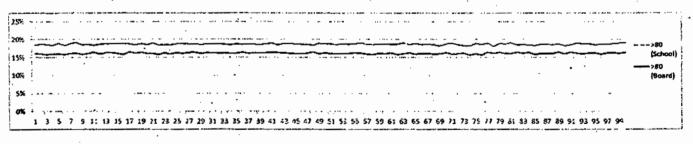
The analysis shows that there is remarkable improvement in the performance of students in class X & XII. This has also led to drastic cut in nos. of stress calls to CBSE Call Centre. The quantity as well as the quality has improved as shown below:

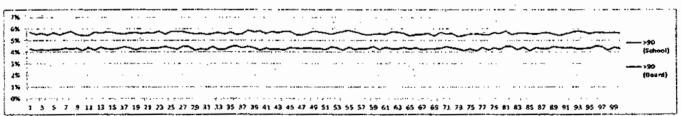

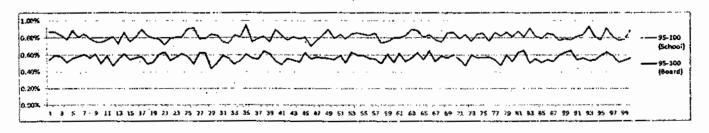

2.7 Class XII Performance Board based Vs. School based

We have two options in class X exam: Scheme 1 (school based) and scheme 2 (Board based). Performance analysis shows that the students who have undergone Scheme 1 (school based examination) in class X have done better as compared to the ones who underwent scheme 2 (Board based examination):-







2.8 2014 Examination

The preparations have begun for 2014 examination, the date sheet will be finalized by the last date of December 2013. (finalized since then)

2.9 On Screen Marking (OSM)

On Screen Marking was introduced to improve the efficiency as well as effectiveness of the evaluation of answer sheets as a pilot project in Delhi for class X main and comptt. examination. Since it was introduced first time there were certain learnings for the future. Shortage of teachers led to some delay in completion. This year Board proposes to cover all regions for Class X and also include atleast two subjects (Economics, English) in Class XII.

2.10 Joint Entrance Examination (JEE)- 2014

Offline Examination will be held on 6th April, 2014 and online Exams on 9th, 11th, 12th and 19th April, 2014. The ranks of JEE-MAIN will be decided by adding 40% weightage of normalised class XII marks. JEE (Main) will be conducted in 268 cities out of which 113 cities were added new. For online examination, this year Board has decided the dates in advance so that students can opt their dates of examination in advance. Board is trying to make even the pre-examination processes of online examination at par with offline examination. Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh & Odisha will participate for the first time in JEE (Main) this year. All formats for JEE (Main) will remain the same. As per past practice, the JEE (Main) will be used as a screening test for JEE (Advanced).

2.11 All India Pre Medical Test (UG) - 2014

The All India Pre Medical Test will be conducted on 4th May, 2014. The result for this test will be declared in the first week of June, 2014. Last year the Board conducted NEET exam but Supreme Court of India has, since then, struck down the NEET. So this year Board is conducting AIPMT again for 15% all India quota seats. Many states like Haryana, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Chandigarh, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Orissa, Manipur and Nagaland and Institutions like Armed Forces Medical College, Delhi University, Jamia

Hamdard and Banaras Hindu University are participating in this examination even for seats under their control. Chairman also informed about the important dates related to this examination. Chairman informed the house that there is no change in the pattern of the Exam.

2.12 Central Teacher Eligibility Test (CTET) - 2013 and 2014

Fourth Central Teacher Eligibility Test (CTET) was held on 28th July, 2013 in 96 cites (1301 centres, 2 centres in Dubai and Riyadh). A total of 7,76,354 candidates appeared in this test and and the pass percentage was 7.72%. Next CTET will be held on 16.02.2014 and a total of 8,22,000 have been registered for this test. Results will be declared on 21.03.2014. This year Board will conduct the paper 2 in first shift because of larger number of candidates appearing in paper 2.

2.13 JNVST 2014

The JNVST for admission in Class VI for summer bound Schools will be held on 08th Feb., 2014 for winter bound schools on 12th April, 2014; and for extreme winter bound schools on 7th June, 2014. 18 lakh candidates are expected to appear.

2.14 Proficiency Test 2013

Proficiency Test is an optional test for the students of class X. It is conducted in 5 main subjects. For 2014, the Examination will be conducted from 14th -18th April, 2014. The last date of registering online is 31st December, 2013.

2.15 Problem Solving Assessment (PSA) - 2013 and 2014.

PSA was successfully conducted for all the students in classes IX and XI in all the affiliated schools on 19th October, 2013 for winter closing schools. For other schools, it will be conducted on the 10th January, 2014. The results were not very encouraging as shown below:

Students getting less mark in PSA can appear in improvement test. Poor results in PSA above shows that teaching learning methodologies head to improve creation of critical thinking and problem solving abilities.

2.16 Assessment of Speaking and Listening Skills (ASL)

The ASL 'Pilot Project' was implemented in 112 schools in Delhi. The ASL has been extended to all the schools in class IX, X and XI.

Alternative provision to physically disabled students in place of ASL is developed. Under this, students can write a story of their own and opt for any novel for writing their reviews. Help for ASL is available on CBSE's website at CBSE ASL corner

2.17 Conducting Recruitment Examination

Last year, the Board successfully conducted the recruitment test of Scientists. Misc. Unit is established for conducting examinations like this.

2.18. Open Text Based Assessment

It is introduced under SA II of class IX and Annual Exam,2014 of class XI. Time limit has also been extended this year from 3 to 3 ½ hours. It will be extended to classes X and XII the next year. The next year will also include more subjects in class XI/XII.

2.19. Training & Empowerment

Large no. of training programmes were conducted in a very short period from June 2013 to now and a total of around 1.28 lakh participants were trained under this program. The chairman expressed satisfaction on the quality and quantity of staff trained this year. But he emphasized on more quality control and proposed that the Centre for Assessment Evaluation & Research (CAER) be entrusted to do quality assurance of training agencies.

2.21 Annual Conference of Sahodaya School Complexes- 2013

20thAnnual Conference of Sahodaya School Complexes- 2013 was held at Amritsar from 8th to 10th November, 2013. The theme of this Conference was Future Ready. All the

recommendations pertaining to this head were explained by the Chairman and proposed for acceptance and implementation.

2.22 CBSE Parents Corner

In order to bring in more participation of parents, CBSE parents corner has been started. Whatever the CBSE does will also be available to the parents and parents will get in touch with the school to know how well anything is happening in the school.

2.23 CBSE Library

The library of CBSE is got established and online interface (http://library.cbseacademic.in) is also developed in this regard.

2.24 New Electives introduced for Classes XI and XII (2013-14)

The Board has introduced the following new elective subjects in Class XI and XII (2013-14):

- Human Rights and Gender Studies
- Legal Studies
- NCC
- Theatre Studies

2.25. Introduction of Chinese language

The Board introduced Chinese language in 2011. The Board has now tied up with Hanban, China for getting assistance and expert guidance for this pilot project. Experts and teachers will come to India and assist the Board in teaching and curriculum development. Currently it includes 25 schools (5 from Delhi Govt., 5 JNVs, 5 KVs and 10 pvt. Schools). CBSE will host there experts and teachers.

2.26 Revision of Textbooks of Entrepreneurship for Class XI

The text book on Entrepreneurship is revised and already printed this year.

2.27 School Quality Accreditation & Assessment (SQAA)

As decided in the last Governing Body meeting, the SQAA will be introduced from the coming academic sessions. Schools will be given a period of 3 years to get themselves accredited.

Accredited schools will be permanently affiliated. Schools unable to make the grade will be allowed to get themselves reassessed and accredited within a period of one more year. In case they fail to do same, they will stand the chance of losing their affiliation. The process of SQAA will be made completely transparent.

Under this the assessors will be provided with some hardware (tablet) with pre loaded software. They will write their recommendations in the software and will also be able to take forward. They will the documents. of recommendations with photographs to the Board during their visit only and the same will also be uploaded on Board's website later on. The software will also be able to capture the GPS location of the schools. For supply of hardware & software a tender will be floated. About 3000 hardware devices (tablets) will be procured. The Chairman also mentioned about resistance of some of the schools to pay accreditation fee of Rs. 55,000/-. He mentioned that the Board will support such schools if they prove their inability to pay the fee based on their income/expenditure balance sheet etc. In view of reservation of certain schools to get process of assessment through private agencies, the Chairman suggested that CBSE itself may also do the process of assessment in addition to private agencies.

2.28 Gender Cards

In order to create gender sensitivity amongst the students, the Board has introduced gender cards. Training of Principals, teachers and peer educators will be conducted.

2.29 XII CBSE, Heritage India Quiz 2013

This scheme, initiated in 2001 is an inter school quiz competition to raise awareness and better understanding in the student community about Cultural Diversity in India. It is conducted in three phases. Finals of XII CBSE Heritage India Quiz will be conducted on 18th December at Delhi. As per the previous year, the CBSE is collaborating with IBN7 in this event.

2.30 National Education Day

11th November, 2013 was celebrated as National Education Day. The theme was Human Rights and Social Equality. Large no. of schools participated in the programme.

2.31 The Awakened Citizen Program

This is a unique program, developed by Swami Vivekananda Trust, Delhi for character building in India's youth. It motivates students for discharge of their responsibilities and roles as responsible citizens of this nation. The program developed by the Trust will be introduced by the CBSE in its affiliated schools. The monetary contribution of the CBSE will be limited to training component only.

2.32 CBSE - "KATHA I LOVE READING' Program 2013

Workshops are organized throughout the country for improving writing skills of students. This program aims at improving the writing skills. At the end of the year, a book will be published containing the best writing of the students.

2.33 2nd International Life Skills, Values Gender School Healthand Well Being Summit – 2013

The international summit, in collaboration with Expressions India, will be held on 17th -19th December, 2013 at Delhi. This summit is for creating a countrywide awareness regarding school safety, sanitation, nutrition etc. The program was held at cluster level before the summit. Next year the program scope will be widened and as per past year's practice, it will be held in collaboration with Expressions India, one of the agencies shortlisted by the CBSE through open process for life skills training.

2.34 National Wildlife Quiz 2013

Final event of this quiz was organized in Delhi on 4th October with the theme of "Water". The Board is collaborating with Ministry of Environment and Forests, Govt. of India under this. The purpose of this quiz is to instill a sense of concern for the natural world.

2.35 IGNITE 2013

As per past practices, this event is organized in collaboration with the National Innovation Foundation (NIF), Ahmedabad. This is a nationwide Campaign organized to enhance the

innovative spirit amongst school children. Submissions from 20836 students were received by the organization.

2.36 National Informatics Olympiad 2013-14

CBSE conducted this event in collaboration with Indian Association for Research in Computing Science (IARCS), Mumbai. The examination is held in two stages, first stage was conducted on 23rd November, 2013 and the second stage will be conducted on 18, January, 2014.

2.37 CBSE Group Mathematical Olympiad, 2013

This program is organized by CBSE every year. The aim is to strengthen and enhance the skills of students. This year it was conducted on 1st December, 2013.

2.38 IX Painting Competition on Energy Conservation 2013

CBSE is collaborating with the Ministry of Power in association with Bureau of Energy Efficiency in launching the National Awareness Campaign 2013. It is conducted in 3 stages - school, state and national level.

2.39 Vigilance Awareness Week, 2013

It was celebrated from 28th October, 2013 to 2nd November, 2013. The theme of this event was Promoting Good Governance. This year the CVC agreed to deliver a message to all the students, and the same was made available on the CBSE's website.

2.40 Vocational Education

Large no. of students are opting for vocational education after introduction of NVEQF. The target is to enroll 10% of the students by the end of next two year. Many training programme were organized to train the teachers for vocational subjects.

2.41 Public Relations Unit

890 cases under RTI Act- 2005 have been received from 1st June, 2013 to 30th November, 2013. 89 first appeals and 21 second appeals were also received.

2.42 Student Global Aptitude Index (SGAI)- 2013

The fourth edition of CBSE SGA! was conducted on 16th November, 2013 all across the globe. Approximately 1.93 lacs students appeared from 3725 schools. Next year the SGAI will be introduced even earlier so that students can use the same for consultation and subject selection in class XI.

2.43 Guidance and Counseling Centre

To help students know their aptitude and helping them to achieve the career goals which they are planning, CBSE has opened Guidance and Counseling Centre at Village Mohammadi, Distt. Lakhimpur Kheri. It is getting tremendous response. At least 50 students are visiting the centre daily for their queries related to their studies and career. Based on their findings, Board will continue this program and open such centres in other parts of the country also.

2.44 CBSE on You Tube

CBSE now has a channel on You Tube. There are more than 250 videos including short films, role plays, talks, discussions, debates, presentations or other such activities sent by the affiliated-schools on the CBSE Channel on the following themes:

- Health & Wellness
- Gender Sensitivity
- Community Outreach
- Life Skills
- Values Education
- Heritage
- Disaster Management
- Social Issues
- Environmental Issues & Concerns
- Innovative Teaching Learning Methodologies

2.45 CBSE- i

The CBSE – I has reached Class XII for foreign schools. This year (2013-14) the first batch of CBSE-I students will pass only class XII. It has also been started in India upto class III. The Board has initiated Training of teachers under CBSE-i, online and offline. For this 2 day training programs were conducted in March and April in Chennai and Delhi. Training was conducted

outside India also and online training was also organized for the same purpose. CBSE has written to AIU & UGC. Board is trying that the students do not face problems in getting college admissions. For this, delegations will also be sent to the major universities of the world. (Cambridge, Oxford, Harvard, Ivy League Universities)

2.46 CAER (Centre for Assessment Evaluation and Research)

With the objective to develop a culture of objective and systematic assessments the CAER was established under PPP mode. In a research study, the CAER found that there is lack of consistency in evaluation. An international conference on evaluation will be organized in the next financial year. CAER will also be requested to train the paper setting for various examination conducted by the Board.

The Chairman shared with the house a comprehensive analysis of performance of schools in class X. He showed the last 6 years' data in this regard. He said that the schools will be able to access the data. He further said that we are trying to capture the entire data of 2007 onwards for analysis, and in a short time we should be able to make this accessible.

3 The Chairman concluded the presentation and invited comments for approval of the house on the presentation as well as current agenda items.

Dr. Shyama Chona, Former Principal, DPS, R.K. Puram, New Delhi supported all issues in the presentation. She also raised the issue that most of the newspapers carry the news of annual function celebration, thanks giving etc only. Since CBSE is doing marvelous work, it should be exposed to the media. She also said that most of the stakeholders don't know how much work is happening in CBSE. She further suggested that we can form a small group which can work on the publicity of the work being done by CBSE or schools.

Shri K. P. Gopalkrishna, Chairman & Principal, National Public School Bangalore congratulated for various initiatives outlined in the presentation. However, he advised against the publicity.

Sh. Dinesh Kumar, Joint Commissioner, suggested that schools can take the initiatives for sharing the information.

Smt. Ameeta Mullah Wattal, Principal, Springdales School, Delhi applauded the work being done by CBSE. She appreciated the Assessment of Speaking and Listening (ASL) skills project and informed

that she had noticed a remarkable improvement in the students learning the language.

Smt. Ameeta Mullah Wattal, Principal, Springdales School, Delhi said that huge amount of data with regard to documentation is already maintained by our teachers, it is possible for schools to manage ASL also.

Shri K. P. Gopalkrishna, Chairman & Principal, National Public School said that the load of work related to CBSE was too much there should be some option to reduce it. Teachers are spending most of their time to prepare their tasks.

Chairman replied that the Board has introduced a scheme of CCE coordinators who will be paid a token honorarium of Rs. 2000/- per month to do the job.

Smt. Ameeta Mullah Wattal, Principal, Springdales School, Delhi wanted to know how we can apply for this honorarium process.

Chairman replied that the schools need to only inform the Board with all the relevant details.

Dr. Sadhana Parashar, Director (ART&I) replied that it is known that teachers' work has increased but the centre (CAER) is working for easy implementation of CCE scheme and the check list may be in place to reduce time and efforts.

With these comments and clarifications the house applauded the presentation and approved various proposals in the presentation. Discussion on the individual agenda item was taken thereafter.

Discussion on Agenda items:

ITEM I TO CONFIRM THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOARD HELD ON 28th JUNE, 2013.

The Chairman, CBSE apprised the members of the Minutes of the meeting of the Governing Body of the Board held on 28th June, 2013 and after detailed deliberations, the House confirmed the Minutes of the Governing Body Meeting held on 28th June, 2013.

TO RECEIVE A REPORT ON THE FOLLOW UP ACTION TAKEN ON THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY HELD ON 28th JUNE, 2013.

The Chairman informed the House that action has been taken on all the items as per resolution passed by the Governing Body in its last meeting held on 28th June, 2013 and most of the action taken reports were also displayed in the presentation. The members deliberated on the action taken on the last meeting of the Governing Body Meeting held on 28th June, 2013 in detail. The Chairman informed that Ms. Sarita Manuja has been appointed as Director, CAER since then. The members noted the follow up action taken on the minutes of the last meeting and approved the same.

TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 8THOCTOBER, 2013.

The Chairman apprised the house of the recommendations of the meeting of the Finance Committee held on 08.10.2013 and informed that the Board has hired premises from LIC for opening of 9th Regional Office at Trivandrum. He also informed that the Regional Office was scheduled to be inaugurated on 21.12.2013 and invited all the members to the opening ceremony. In Item No. XXII recruitment of staff in accreditation unit, the item was approved with the correction of typographic mistake in the selection committee as 'Director (ART&I)' in place of Director (Voc). The recommendation of the committee on personnel matters was approved with the modification to upgrade 02 posts of JE to AE.

With the above, the minutes of the Finance Committee meeting held on 08.10.2013 were approved.

TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 18THOCTOBER, 2013

While informing the house about the recommendations of the Finance Committee held on 18.10.2013, the Chairman also informed that in order to addresss to the problem of schools located in middle east, an office was proposed to be opened at an appropriate place in middle east. One more office for the schools located in far East is also proposed in Delhi/Guwahati.

With the applauses, the minutes of the Finance Committee meeting held on 18.10.2013 were approved.

ITEM V TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE OF THE ALL INDIA PRE-MEDICAL/PRE-DENTAL ENTRANCE TEST HELD ON 22ND OCTOBER, 2013

Shri Joseph Emmanuel, OSD, AIPMT presented the recommendations of Advisory Committee of AIPMT. The All India Pre-Dental/Pre-Dental Entrance Test for admission in MBBS/BDS courses under 15% seats was conducted by the CBSE for the year 1988 till the year 2012. NEET was conducted in 2013. Now, under the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, AIPMT will be conducted again. Sh. Joseph also apprised the house on the requests received from many states for inclusion in AIPMT and for using the merit list of AIPMT 2014.

The house, after detailed deliberations approved the minutes of the Advisory Committee of AIPMT.

TO REPORT THE RECONSTITUTION OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE OF ALL INDIA PRE-MEDICAL/PRE-DENTAL ENTRANCE TEST

Shri Joseph Emmanuel, Joint Secretary (OSD), AIPMT apprised the House about the recommendations of the AIPMT Advisory Committee. He informed the House that the Advisory committee of AIPMT was reconstituted in 2012. The Supreme Court of India has struck the NEET, so CBSE has to again conduct of AIPMT.

The Committee has been reconstituted as follows:-

- 3. A Representative of the Medical Council of India

- 8. A Representative from each participating State State Representative
- 9. The Chairman, CBSE
- 10. Secretary, CBSE
- 11. The Controller of Examinations of the Project

The house approved the reconstitution of the Advisory Committee.

TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE EXAMINATION COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 25THNOVEMBER, 2013

The Controller of Examination, CBSE apprised the members about the recommendations of the Examination Committee held on 25.11.2013. The House resolved to approve the recommendations of the Examination Committee held on 10th April, 2013.

She also explained special provisions for differently abled candidates appearing in various examinations. She also informed that there is no certified Master Training Programme. Under this, training will be conducted in three phases. Towards the end, Master Trainers will train teachers of schools on behalf of CBSE.

Shri D.K. Bhawsar, Dy. Educational Advisor, MHRD wanted to know whether the CBSE is doing the work of publication also.

Director (ART &I) informed that the CBSE publishes about 100 books every year and the demand is also increasing regularly.

After detailed discussions, the House approved the minutes of the Curriculum Committee held on 29th November, 2013 with the recommendations that the CBSE may also publish books on Physical Education and Home Science for class XI and XII.

Sh. U.C.Bodh, DS, Affiliation, CBSE apprised the House of the recommendations of the Affiliation Committee held on 06.12.2013. Many members of the Governing Body, proposed that in place of granting extension in service the awardee teachers/Principals should superannuate at the age of 65. After detailed deliberations, the Governing Body agreed to the proposal.

The Competent Authority of the Board has constituted a Committee consisting of the following members to examine various issues as per the terms of reference indicated below:-

- 1. Sh. P.I. Sabu, Director, Regional Office, CBSE, Delhi.
- 2. Sh. S. Anandan, Deputy Secretary to the GOI, Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers, New Delhi.
- 3. Sh. S.P. Rana, Joint Secretary (A&L), CBSE, Delhi.
- 4. Sh. G.P. Sharma, IAFA, CBSE, Delhi.

The terms of the reference for the committee are as under:-

- 1. Fixation of senionty of PCO/FMOs and Technical cadre personnel etc. in the general cadre of Junior Assistant / Junior Assistant (Computer).
- 2. Formation of Engineering Cadre for providing promotional avenues to the Engineers.
- 3. Formation of Vocational Education cadre.

After examination of the records placed before the Committee and detailed discussions, the observations and recommendations of the Committee are as under-

1. Technical cadre and Franking Machine Operator/Photocopier Operator (FMO/PCO)

The Governing Body of the Board in its meeting held on 16th November, 2011, approved the proposal for en-cadrement of Technical personnel working in the Maintenance Unit at the appropriate level in accordance with the instructions of Govt. of India and subject to fulfilment of the conditions of the Recruitment Rules of the respective posts.

The Finance Committee of the Board in its meeting held on 1st February, 2012 also approved the proposal of en-cadrement of the post of Photocopier/Franking Machine Operators (PCO/FMO) with the general cadre of Junior Assistants in the grade pay of Rs. 1900/- so that they may get further promotion in general cadre subject to fixation of Seniority as per GOI guidelines. The Committee observes that there are nine (09) technical persons working in the Maintenance Unit seeking further promotional avenues and 22 persons are working as PCO/FMO in the Board.

The Committee further observes that the nature of duties of Junior Assistant being totally different, encadreing/merging of Franking Machine Operator/Photocopier Operator or Technical cadre (Electrician, Mason, Plumber, Carpenter, Lift Operator, Wireman and Telephone Operator) with the cadre of Junior Assistant may not be in public interest and the organization will also be deprived of the expertise of the technical cadre. Further the Committee has also been informed that the Board has also received representations from

the employees in the main cadre against the encadrement as it would adversely affect their promotional avenues.

The committee after considering the position cited above, recommends as under: -

- (i) The decision of merger of the cadre of FMO/PCO and Technical staff with the main cadre may be reviewed.
- (II) Promotional avenues in their own cadre in respect of the above said post on personal basis in the following may be provided:-

ESTABLISHMENT OF ACCREDITATION UNIT AT CBSE, HEADQUARTERS AND SANCTION OF STAFF FOR ACCREDITATION UNIT.

CBSE has completed the pilot phase of accreditation exercise in which the process of accreditation with the help of agencies and peer assessors. The Board is in the process of fine tuning the process of accreditation on the basis of learning gained from the pilot. The Board has received some feedback about the functioning of agencies and therefore there is an imminent need of more stringent monitoring of agencies empanelled for accreditation. Effective monitoring will ensure complete transparency in the proceedings of agencies. The number of agencies would also grow in view of number of affiliated schools. The proposal that the accreditation of schools will be made compulsory and the extension of accreditation will be done every three years makes it is imperative to establish an accreditation unit at CBSE headquarters.

To start with the following officers and staff may be sanctioned for accreditation unit. The unit shall function under Director (ART&I)

The Finance Committee agreed to the proposal of the CBSE in view of the functional necessity and also desired to get the work done expeditiously.

ITEM VIII

To report action taken with regard to the change of nomenclatures of the post of Assistant Librarian/Deputy Librarian/Librarian

The Committee deliberated on the issue and resolved to change of nomenclature of Assistant Librarian to Deputy Director/Assistant Librarian. However the committee decided to drop the proposal for cadre creation.

ITEM IX

To consider exemption from payment of late fee charged / to be charged on account of late submission of online application for extension of Provisional Affiliation

The Committee discussed the issue at length and decided to waive off the late fee in respect of those schools who had applied for permanent affiliation before their current extension of affiliation became due.

The Committee also resolved that in modification of the Board's earlier decision, the fee from the schools who submit late applications for extension may now be charged @ Rs.10000/-per month amount subject to a maximum celing of Rs.50000/-.

ITEM X To consider the opening of Sub-Regional office for the Foreign schools affiliated to the Board

(i) The members in the Finance Committee appreciated the proposal of the CBSE for opening of the Sub-Regional office at Dubai for the Foreign Schools located in Middle East Asian countries and affiliated to the Board. The proposal was approved also by the Committee.

The Committee underscored the importance of required clearances from other authorities also.

(ii) The Finance Committee also approved the proposal of the CBSE for opening of the Sub-Regional office for the Foreign Schools located in South East Asian countries and affiliated to the Board. The Committee however, resolved to operate the office from New Delhi.

ITEM XI To consider relaxation in the regular service for the promotion to the post of Assistant, Superintendent, Section Officer and Assistant Secretary.

The Committee discussed the issue in detail and in view of acute shortage of staff at Regional Officers resolved to grant one time relaxation in residency period as only one time measure so that vacant posts of Asst. Supdts, Section Officers and Asstt. Secretaries could be filled up at Regional Officers.

The Committee also resolved that this relaxation also will be applicable to the applicants who join at Regional Offices outside Delhi where vacancies are existing and are ready to serve for a minimum period of two years at that station. The Committee also made it clear that it would not be quoted as precedence.

ITEM XII Training of teachers of the schools affiliated to CBSE on Assessment of Educational Achievements of students under Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation by International Association for the Evaluation of Educational Achievement (IEA).

The Finance Committee deliberated on the proposal in detail. It was observed that financial implications appeared on the higher side. Moreover, it was ruled out to make an advance payment of such a huge amount to an external agency. Taking into consideration all relevant aspects, the Finance Committee agreed upon to take up two (2) workshops on pilot basis with 40 participants (Principals of the schools), one each for North Zone and South Zone.

ITEM XIII To consider absorption of CTSA staff in the CBSE.

After deliberating on the issue in detail the Finance Committee approved the proposal.

ITEM XIV To consider outsourcing of the staff for support services. After deliberating on the issue in detail the Finance Committee approved the proposal.

ITEM XV To consider the revision of rates of remuneration to moderators for JEE (Main) – 2013 onwards.

Memorandum of Understanding

Central Board of Secondary Education located at 17-Rouse Avenue, New Delhi 110002 (here in after referred to as CBSE which term or expression, unless it be contrary to the context or meaning hereof, shall mean and include its successors and permitted assigns) and represented by Chairman and MassCoMedia having its registered office at A 94-3, Sector 58, Noida – 201 301, Uttar Pradesh.

Whereas Central Board of Secondary Education is the premier agency in the area of school education in India

Whereas MassCoMedia is a reputed Institute in the field of Films, Television and Media Arts Education and

CONVINCED of the necessity of a lasting and effective cooperation in the interest of both parties; and

BELIEVING that such cooperation would serve the common interests and contribute to the enhancement of the field of teaching and training of Mass Media Studies;

VIEWING to enhance skill sets of students of CBSE in creative processes and to impart better understanding of media, graphic expression, crystallization of thought and capturing and presentation of thoughts visually, the parties have come together to train the 11th and 12th standard students of the CBSE Board in Media Studies;

HAVE reached the following understanding:

ARTICLE I

OBJECTIVES

The Parties, subject to the terms of this Memorandum of Understanding and the laws, rules, regulations from time to time in force, agree to strengthen, promote and develop cooperation in teaching and training of Mass Media Studies and exchange of information with regard to the same and MassCoMedia will act as consultant to CBSE to enhance quality education in the field of Media and Entertainment.

ARTICLE II

AREAS OF COOPERATION

- a) Workshops on Media Studies for students. MassCoMedia will conduct two day workshops cum Industry Interface Programme at its location for about three hours each day for CBSE students of classes XI and XII. The batches could be up to 70 students each for such workshop. The workshops will include exposure to studio shooting and other related practical media activities.
- b) Training of Teachers. Teachers' training for TV, media, and radio with a duration of 5 days.
- c) A seminar on Media Studies will be put up in 4 schools. This will be a two hours seminar and the students from media will be asked to write a report on this event, which can be published on the CBSE web site. The topics for the seminar could be the ones related to journalism and current topics that are political, heritage, social, sports, safety and environment. The students will get a first-hand experience in writing reports and articles professionally, with the help of teachers at MassCoMedia without any cost bearing.
- d) MassCoMedia will cover four subject areas i.e. Cinema, Television, Radio and Internet.
- e) MassCoMedia will develop
 - (a) A module for industry interface of students
 - (b) Training material including audio-visual training material
 - (c) Practical training and testing material for teachers
- f) CBSE will launch an initiative for an open short film competition to all the schools, which matter, for the courses. MassCoMedia will sponsor cash prizes on this competition and also help the students to get in touch with media studies. CBSE will organize a national level event in Delhi with 40 schools and 400 students studying Mass Media Studies in collaboration with MassCoMedia.
- g) Each student successfully completing the two year 'Mass Media Studies Elective will-receive appropriate certification issued jointly by CBSE and MassCoMedia.
- h) Each student successfully completing the 2-year 'Mass Media Studies will be entitled entry into second semester of the diploma course being conducted at MassCoMedia

subject to availability of seats and MassCoMedia other admission requirements as applicable to all aspiring students

ARTICLE III

JOINT WORKING COMMITTEE

- 1. The Parties will establish Joint Working Committee (hereinafter referred to as the "Joint Working Committee") to review the implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding between the two parties.
- 2. The Joint Working Committee will consider ways and means to promote the aforesaid objectives and to ensure the proper coordination and implementation of its decisions and/or recommendations. The Joint Working Committee will also review the progress of the implementation of all understandings concluded between the two Parties within the framework of this Memorandum of Understanding, and take steps to ensure the active and speedy implementation of the understandings.
- 3. The Joint Working Group will be chaired on behalf of MassCoMedia, by a senior official of MassCoMedia and on behalf of the CBSE, by a senior official of the CBSE with participation by other relevant agencies of both parties as appropriate.
- 4. The Joint Working Committee will meet once every six months
- 5. The Joint Working Committee will meet at_place and on_a date convenient to and decided upon by the Parties.
- 6. The composition and procedure of the Joint Working Committee will be jointly decided upon by the Parties.
- 7. The decisions and other conclusions of the Joint Working Committee will be reflected in the agreed minutes of the meeting and the Parties will take appropriate steps to implement these decisions and conclusions.

ARTICLE IV

IMPLEMENTATION

In the implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding, the Parties shall arrange the details of any activity to be carried.

ARTICLE V

FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS

- 1. The entire expenditure for the conduct of various activities shall be borne by MassCoMedia.
- 2. Notwithstanding anything in paragraph 1 above, expenses for organizing the meetings of the Joint Working Committee shall be borne by the Party hosting the meetings.

ARTICLE VI

PARTICIPATION OF A THIRD PARTY

Either Party may invite the participation of a third Party on the joint activities and/or programmes being carried out under this Memorandum of Understanding upon the prior written consent of the other Party. In carrying out such joint activities and/or programmes, the Parties shall ensure that the third Party shall comply with the provisions of this Memorandum of Understanding.

ARTICLE VII

PROTECTION OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

The protection of intellectual property rights shall be enforced in conformity with the
respective laws, rules, regulations of the Parties. The use of the name, logo and/or
official emblem of any of the Parties on any publication, document and/or paper is
prohibited without the prior written approval by either Party.

ARTICLE VIII

CONFIDENTIALITY

- Each Party shall undertake to observe the confidentiality and secrecy of documents, information and other data received or supplied to the other Party during the period of the implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding or any other agreements made pursuant to this Memorandum of Understanding. Either Party is not allowed to disclose any confidential information without the written consent from the other Party, and otherwise should bear the corresponding legal responsibility.
- 2. Both Parties agree that the provisions of this Article shall be binding between the Parties notwithstanding the termination of this Memorandum of Understanding.

ARTICLE IX

SUSPENSION

Each Party reserves the right for reasons of national security, national interest, public order or public health to suspend temporarily, either in whole or in part, the implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding by giving three months in advance notice without bearing any responsibility. Suspension shall take effect immediately after written notification has been given to the other Party.

ARTICLE X

REVISION, MODIFICATION AND AMENDMENT

- 1. Either Party may request in writing a revision, modification or amendment of all or any part of this Memorandum of Understanding.
- 2. Any revision, modification or amendment agreed to by the Parties shall be reduced into writing and shall form part of this memorandum of Understanding.
- 3. Such revision, modification or amendment shall come into force on such date as may be determined by the Parties.
- 4. Any revision, modification or amendment shall not prejudice the rights and obligations arising from or based on this Memorandum of Understanding before or up to the date of such revision, modification or amendment.

ARTICLE XI

SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

Any difference of dispute between the Parties concerning the interpretation and/or implementation and/or application of any of the provisions of this memorandum of Understanding shall be settled amicably through mutual consultation or negotiations between the Parties, either Party should not seek the intervention of any third party or organization. This MoU shall be governed in accordance with the laws of India and the Courts of Delhi shall be Courts with competent jurisdiction.

ARTICLE XII

ENTRY INTO FORCE, DURATION AND TERMINATION

- 1. This Memorandum of Understanding shall come into force on the date of signing and shall remain in force for a period of five (5) years.
- 2. Notwithstanding anything in this Article, either Party may terminate this Memorandum of Understanding by notifying the other Party of its intention to terminate this memorandum of Understanding by a notice in writing, at least three (3) months prior to its intention to do so.
- 3. The termination of this Memorandum of Understanding shall not affect the implementation of on-going activities and/or programmes which have been agreed upon before the date of the termination of this memorandum of Understanding.

Please find below a proposal for the participation of IEA in a project for training the Teachers of schools affiliated to CBSE in Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE).

IEA is an international organization with more than 50 years' experience in conducting large-scale comparative studies of educational achievement and other aspects of education. During this time, we have developed the expertise and technology necessary in every stage of an educational assessment program. This proposal adapts the experience and knowledge of IEA and its staff to the needs expressed in our communications. However, we are aware of the need for a local partner who would ensure that our international expertise is applied in an adequate and relevant way for the Indian context.

About IEA

The International Association for the Evaluation of Educational Achievement (IEA) is an independent, international cooperative of national research institutions and governmental research agencies.

Through its comparative research and assessment projects, IEA aims to:

- Provide international benchmarks that may assist policy-makers in identifying the comparative strength and weaknesses of their educational systems
- Provide high-quality data that will increase policy-makers understanding of key school- and non-school-based factors that influence teaching and learning
- Provide high-quality data which will serve as a resource for identifying areas of concern and action, and for preparing and evaluating educational reforms
- Develop and improve educational systems capacity to engage in national strategies for educational monitoring and improvement
- Contribute to development of the world-wide community of researchers in educational evaluation

Since its inception in 1958, IEA has conducted more than 23 research studies of cross-national achievement. The regular cycle of studies encompasses learning in basic school subjects. Examples are the Trends in Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS 1995, TIMSS 1999, TIMSS 2003, TIMSS 2007, TIMSS 2011) and the Progress in International Reading Literacy Studies (PIRLS 2001, PIRLS 2006, PIRLS 2011). CIVED, ICCS 2009), Information Technology in Education (SITES-M1, SITES-M2, SITES 2006), and Early Childhood Education.

IEA studies are an important data source for those working to enhance students learning at the international, national and local levels. By reporting on a wide range of topics and subject matters, the studies contribute to a deep understanding of educational processes within individual countries, and across a broad international context. In addition, the cycle of studies provides countries with an opportunity to measure progress in educational achievement. The cycle of studies also enables monitoring of changes in the implementation of educational policy and identification of new issues relevant to reform effort.

In addition to conducting these studies, IEA has engaged in extensive training on the use of its databases. IEA has formed the Research and Analysis Unit (RandA) and has hired doctoral level staff that is dedicated to conducting research and supporting analysis with IEA data.

IEA's role in this project can be defined as design, training and certification. This proposal is organized in these two sections. The proposal also points out the areas in which we consider necessary to rely on a local partner.

Training and Certification

An approximate number of 480,000 [an average of 40 teachers per school] Teachers will be trained using a cascade model, with IEA staff and associates training Principals and Assessment Coordinators (AC) for each of the schools affiliated to CBSE. In turn, ACs will train their school Teachers. The whole process will be carried out as follows:

- a) IEA will design the content, materials and procedures for all training levels, that is:
 - i. Principals
 - ii. ACs
 - iii. Teachers
- b) IEA staff and associates will deliver the trainings for *Principals and ACs* as per structures and procedures established by IEA.
- c) IEA will design tests and procedures for certifying qualified Trainers at following levels:
 - i. Principals
 - ii. ACs
- d) IEA will evaluate and award certificates to Assessment Coordinators.
- e) IEA will be responsible for quality control for both training delivery and certification at all levels.

Base content and materials for the training program

This section contains a proposal for the topics to be delivered at the two levels of training. In



general, all workshops have two main objectives:

- To get participants to understand the concepts and procedures of an educational assessment program in the context of the CCE scheme.
- To leverage participants' essential skills needed to transfer knowledge and skills to adult learners in an effective and interactive manner.

To reach these objectives:

- Principals will attend a 3 [three] day workshop.
- ACs will attend an 11 [eleven] day workshop.

The workshop for Principals will cover an overview of the main concepts and definitions related to educational assessment in general, and the CCE in particular. The advantages of the CCE approach and the challenges it imposes will be discussed and practical examples will be analyzed. Then, the contents of the CEE documentation (e.g. Circular CBSE 39/40/2009, Teachers' Manual on CEE, Trainers Manual on CEE) will be reviewed in the context of the training program; and finally, the model and procedures of this training program will be thoroughly explained.

For the ACs, the workshop will be organized into three main modules: "Educational assessment. Main concepts and definitions", "Producing a set of guidelines for test administration procedures", and "Analyzing data from an educational assessment program".

The first module will start with an introduction covering an overview of key concepts and procedures involved in educational assessments and in CCE. Then, it will concentrate on the development of achievement tests, including the production of an assessment framework, item writing, pretesting items, and the production of a final test. The second part of this module will focus on concepts and theoretical underpinnings necessary for implementing the *Training for Trainers* approach to the CCE scheme, and for evaluating the results of the training process.

The next module will focus on producing a set of guidelines for test administration (manual). This includes, but is not limited to the procedures related to designing and piloting the guidelines, defining the role of the test administrator, and reviewing examples of other manuals and similar documents that have been used in a variety of contexts.

The second part of this module will concentrate on further development and improvement of participant's competencies necessary for applying the *Training for Trainers* approach to CCE in a classroom setting.

Finally, the third module will review different techniques and strategies for analyzing the data produced by educational assessments (item-level data and factors associated to achievement) and different opportunities for using the results. A part of this workshop will be dedicated to a series of practical sessions in which participants will deliver short presentations on selected topics.

A detailed list of the topics to be covered in the ACs' workshop is as follows. However, we are aware that the final agenda might be modified to meet the specific objectives set for the trainings at the different levels, as well as the particular needs of the different participants.

Content and materials for the trainings at different levels

As mentioned before, the training program includes trainings at three levels. For, ACs, the content will be delivered as described above. Emphasis will be given to the development of documentation for strategic planning (i.e. assessment framework and guidelines for test administration), and to the application of the Training for Trainers approach in CCE. They would be prepared to lead, review, support and guide the CCE in their schools. This is important as they will also be the resource persons for the next level of training – the school teachers.

At the next level are the school principals who would be sensitized as to the need and methods of CCE such that they are able to effective monitor the quality and guide the implementation of CCE in their schools.

For the last level, though not a part of this proposal, the Teachers, training would be conducted by ACs, under the overall supervision and directions of CBSE. However, IEA, together with the help of associate institutions, carry out sample supervision & audits.

Procedures for delivering trainings at different levels

As mentioned before, IEA, together with its associates, will be responsible for delivering training to Principals and ACs only. However, IEA will provide the materials and design the content for trainings at all levels. It will also arrange to oversee and audit trainings of Teachers, delivered by ACs on a sampling basis, thus ensuring adherence to quality parameters right through.

Workshops at the *Principals level* are designed to take three days; ACs level shall be of 11 days duration. Workshops may be conducted by associate institutions / bodies under the overall mandate and supervision of IEA.

Finally, workshops at *Teachers* level are recommended to be delivered in 3-day sessions and be conducted by the ACs under the directions and supervision of CBSE. IEA and its associate institutions will conduct sample audits in consultation with CBSE and provide course correction, wherever required.

Procedures for certifying ACs / Trainers at all levels

Certification process of the ACs, will consist of a written test. The test will contemplate the evaluation of the skills needed to successfully replicate the training and lead and guide CCE implementation within their schools.

For Teacher level workshops, the testing & certification process will include a theoretical written

There will be no tests or certification for Principals level. Certificates of participation shall be awarded to those, who attend all three days of training.

IEA will design the procedures, develop the instruments (e.g. tests), establish the criteria necessary for certifying Teachers and ensure the quality of the whole process at all levels. It will arrange to certify ACs, and teachers.

Quality Control & Certification

IEA will ensure the quality of testing administration and certification processes carried out by its staff or associates through two main methods. First, by conducting reliability procedures; and second, by conducting sample quality control visits throughout the roll out phase of the project.

Special emphasis will be given to security of information. IEA will produce documents with test security guidelines for test administrators. Additionally, the design of the tests will include features to ensure test security, for example multiple booklets with a rotated design.

Regarding the quality control visits IEA and its associate staff and institutions will visit and observe actual training sessions on sampling basis, discuss unexpected issues and experiences and establish preventive and corrective measures for keeping quality to the maximum standard.

Budgets

The overall budget for these activities is as below:

There would be a total of 600 workshops, 300 each for Principals and Assessment Coordinators, conducted in 8 [eight] locations across India.

COMMITTEE REPORT ON FUNDING FOR HIGHER STUDIES IN R/O CBSE EMPLOYEES

A committee consisting of (i) Sh. M C Sharma, the Controller of Examination (ii) Sh M Laxminarayan, Former Joint Secretary, G.O.I., (iii) Sh. S.P. Rana, Joint Secretary and (iv) Sh G.P. Sharma, I.A.F.A. was constituted vide orders dated 22.07.2013 of the competent authority to chart out a detailed policy about training reserve in different cadres & policy of choosing the eligible candidates for Funding for higher studies in r/o Board's employees. The committee was also given the matter related to funding for PGDM course pursued by Sh. Ajay Mishra, Deputy Secretary, CBSE for its recommendations.

In this connection, the committee held its meeting in office on 19.08.13 and 27.08.2013 and discussed various aspects revolving around the issue. Subsequently, the committee members gathered in the chamber of the Controller of Examination on 03.10.2013 at 3.00p.m. and deliberated on the issue at length to reach at a conclusive framework of the scheme for funding for higher studies in r/o employees and to finalize the issue of funding for the course PGDM in r/o Sh. Ajay Mishra, Deputy Secretary. The major points and manifestations of the committee meeting are as under:

The Board is in a state of constant expansion with induction of a lot of fresh staff in the recent times. Presently, the Board has approx 1013 employees on its rolls and the requirement of polishing of the professional skills of existing staff and new entrants need emphasis for gaining quality output and trained manpower in order to improve the functioning of the Board and delivery of its services to the public.

While exploring the provisions of Govt of India and other organizations with regard to funding of courses for higher studies in r/o Govt. employees, it is important to state that the <u>full funding of higher studies for employees of central Govt is not available anywhere in Central Govt. Provisions</u> and it will ordinarily be met by the Govt. servant except in exceptional circumstance. However:-

- The provision of grant of study allowance exists in All India Services under Study leave regulations, 1960 for studies in foreign countries (F/"1"). However, No study allowance shall be paid during study leave for course of study in India. Cost of fees for study: "A member of the Service granted study leave shall ordinarily be required to meet the cost of fees paid for the study but in exceptional cases the Government may sanction the grant of such fees:
 - Provided that in no case shall the cost of fees be paid to a member of the Service, who is in receipt of scholarship or stipend, or who is permitted to receive or retain, in addition to his leave salary, any remuneration in respect of part-time employment, if the quantum of the stipend or scholarship or remuneration from part-time employment is equal to or more than the amount of fees payable
 - of stipend or remuneration in respect of part-time employment is less than the fees payable, the member of the service may be sanctioned the amount equivalent to the difference between the quantum of such scholarship or stipend or remuneration in respect of part-time employment and the fees.

- Under another scheme of Govt. of India (F/"2") Distance & E-Learning Programmes for Government Employees (DELPGE) for Masters/PG/PG Diploma Programs, certificate programs etc. has the following provision of fee payments/reimbursement:-
 - The employees enrolling for the courses under this Programme i) will pay the required course fees to IGNOU. The amount so paid shall be re-imbursed to the employee on his/her successful completion of the course by IGNOU.
 - Employees failing to complete the course in the time limits (ii) and / or with the minimum qualifying grades prescribed by IGNOU shall not be eligible for any reimbursement.
 - Reimbursement for the Masters programme is available to (iii) an employee only once in his/her career.
 - The participants are eligible to enrol for only one programme at (iv) a time under this program.
 - Under another scheme of Tamil Nadu Government (F/"3"):allowance shall be granted for the period spent in prosecuting a definite course of study at the institutions recognised by Government along with certain following conditions. Besides it has been given that study allowance will be equal to held of full daily allowance to which the Government servant would have been entitled under rules regulating his travelling allowance if he were on tour to place of study. The period of study allowance will not exceed 24 months in all.

It is further pertinent to mention that the F.C. in its meeting held on 19.03.2008 and subsequently the Governing Body in its meeting held on 30.06.2008 (copy enclosed) has ratified the proposal of sanction of Tuition Fee amounting to Rs. 3,02,000/- in r/o Sh. Vineet Joshi, the then Secretary, CBSE (now Hon'ble Chairman) for three years part time MBA. In the minutes of G.B. (Refer A enclosed), the committee also approved that the Board may extend the funding for up to maximum two officials/officers of the Board in a year, who are interested in pursuing MBA at IIM, Lucknow (Noida Campus) and lIFT, Delhi However, the official or officer concerned has to seek admission in these institutes on his own as per the criteria prescribed for selection by these institutes.

The matter regarding funding for PGDM course in r/o Sh Ajay Mishra, Deputy Secretary was subsequently referred to Finance Committee and it has now resolved by the F.C. that this agenda item may be presented again with detailed policy about training reserve in different cadres & policy of choosing the eligible candidate. The existing case will be considered under the detailed policy.

In view of all above facts and circumstances in the background of available Government provisions on the matter and also taking into consideration the need of providing assistance to employees in order to enhance their professional skills and gair Page 2 of &

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quality output of Board's assignments, the need of structuring a transparent yet effective policy of funding of higher studies gains ground. The Committee therefore recommends the following guidelines for funding of courses:-

- i) This scheme will be entitled "CBSE Study Scheme".
- ii) This scheme will only be available for part time / distance learning Masters/PG/ PG Diploma programme/PhD from recognized Universities under UGC / Distance Education Council/AICTE/DEC.
- This will be open for all regular confirmed Official/Officers working in the Board who had rendered at least 05 year of satisfactory services in the Board and should have at least 05 years' service tenure.
- iv) The official or officer concerned has to seek admission in the university on his own as per the criteria prescribed for selection by this university.
- v) The employee will have to obtain prior permission for admission in such courses from the Board.
- vi) The admission will be taken by the individual at his own expenses and the reimbursement will be made on satisfactory completion of course with minimum qualifying grades/percentage and within the time limits prescribed by the University.
- vii) The courses proposed to be pursued should strictly be relevant for the functioning of the Board and it should be insured that the intended studies will enhance the quality of the delivery of the services of the Board to its various stakeholders.
- viii) For part time courses, the university/institute in which the course are to be pursued should have been those established by Govt of India and located in the National Capital Territory of Delhi or Gurgaon/Noida for CBSE, Delhi employees. Further, the institution should be in urban agglomeration for employees of Regional Offices of the Board.
- ix) Reimbursement will be available to an employee only once in his/her career.
- x) Study leave will not be permissible under this scheme.
- The scheme will also be available for employees who pursue the course under this scheme on Extra Ordinary Leave. However, grant of leave will be subject to approval of the competent authority depending upon merit/importance of the case which can also be regretted in office interest.
- xii) An employee who has come on deputation/ foreign service or is going on deputation/Foreign Service at the time of pursuing the course will not be allowed to avail the scheme from the Board.

- ceiling for reimbursement: The Board will reimburse only 90% of the tuition fees subject to the maximum of Rs. 5,00,000/- out of total tuition fees as incurred by an employee. Other fees, if any will have to be borne by the individual.
- xiv) A maximum of 05 employees will be considered in a financial year for the scheme. The selection of such employees will be done as per recommendation of a committee comprising of 03 members of the level of Joint Secretary & above.
- Every employee, who has been permitted to purse higher studies under this scheme, shall have to execute beforehand a bond that either he/she will not resign from the services of the Board or will not serve on deputation post for a minimum period of 03 years from the date of completion of the course otherwise he will have to refund the entire amount with interest thereon @GPF rates, as applicable in lump sum to the Board.
- xvi) The decision of the competent authority of the Board after the scrutiny by the Committee shall be final and binding to all the applicants of the scheme.
- xvii) The Committee also suggest that similar scheme of other institutions / Boards may also be explored for review.

The case of funding of course of PGDM in r/o Sh. Ajay Mishra, Deputy Secretary may be settled after implementation of the scheme.

Further, the Committee is also of the opinion that the matter of short time trainings/limited days workshops related to training may be taken up by the Recruitment Wing of the Board time to time with training departments of the Government of India depending upon the requirement of polishing / grooming the professional skills of staff of a Unit concerned.

Soon after the commencement of the meeting, the Chairman, CBSE had to leave for attending a meeting in MHRD hence, the remaining session was chaired by the Controller of Examinations, CBSE.

The Controller of Examinations, CBSE requested all the participants to introduce themselves. Thereafter, with the permission of the Chair, the Joint Secretary (OSD) took up the agenda items for consideration of the Committee.

ITEM - I TO CONFIRM THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE HELD ON 22.08.2012

Minutes of the meeting of the Advisory Committee held on 22.08.2012 were circulated vide letter No. F.12/CBSE/NEET/2012 dated 10.09.2012 to all the members of the Committee. The comments received from the members were incorporated in the Information Bulletin of NEET-UG, 2013. The minutes were also placed before the Governing Body of the Board at its meeting held on 26th September, 2012 and the Governing Body has also approved the minutes of the Advisory Committee. Hence the Committee resolved that the minutes may be taken as confirmed.

TO RECEIVE A REPORT ON THE FOLLOW-UP ACTIONS TAKEN ON THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE HELD ON 22.08.2012.

The Advisory Committee noted that the action taken on the minutes of the last meeting of the Advisory Committee held on 22.08.2012 as per details placed before it and unanimously resolved to approve the same.

ITEM-III TO REPORT THE CONDUCT OF NEET-UG 2013.

The Advisory Committee noted the detailed report on the conduct of the National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test –UG, 2013. The Committee expressed satisfaction for the smooth and fair conduct of examination and resolved that the actions taken by the CBSE be approved and recorded.

ITEM-IV TO REPORT THE DEVELOPMENT AFTER CONDUCT OF NEET-UG, 2013 FOR REVIVAL OF AIPMT IN THE YEAR 2014 AS SINGLE STAGE EXAMINATION

The Advisory Committee observed that the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has quashed NEET introduced through notifications issued by the Medical Council of India and Dental Council of India. The Review Petitions against the orders passed by the Supreme Court are still under consideration and no further orders are received till date. The Committee further observed that in the absence of a decision on NEET, there is an urgency to revive AIPMT for filling up of seats under 15% All India Quota in Government Medical Colleges in the academic session 2014-15. The date of conduct of Medical Entrance Examination fixed by CBSE is 1st Sunday of May and the schedule of inviting applications is 1st December of the previous year upto 31st January of the year of conduct of examination.

The Committee also observed that the proposal for conduct of AIPMT in the year 2014 with certain changes has also been concurred by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India vide letter no.V.11025/35/2012/MEP-1 dated 19th September, 2013.

The Advisory Committee after deliberations resolved to approve the proposal for conduct of AIPMT in the year 2014 with the following changes in its pattern:

- AIPMT 2014 may be kept as a single stage examination with 180 questions equally divided into the subjects Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology.
- 2. The AIPMT 2014 may be conducted in English and Hindi only as per pattern of AIPMT 2012.
- 3. The syllabus of NEET-UG may be adopted for AIPMT 2014.
- 4. AIPMT 2014 may be conducted on 1st Sunday of May, 2014, i.e., 4th May, 2014.

The Committee further resolved that the Chairman, CBSE may take appropriate action for filing application in the Supreme Court for getting approval on the above.

ITEM-V TO CONSIDER REQUESTS RECEIVED FROM AFMC, DELHI UNIVERSITY, JAMIA HAMDARD AND FEW STATE GOVERNMENTS TO USE THE MERIT LIST OF AIPMT 2014

The Advisory Committee noted that CBSE was conducting AIPMT exclusively for admission to 15% All India quota seats in Government Medical Colleges. Subsequently, with the quashing of NEET, AFMC, Delhi University, Jamia Hamdard

and few State Governments have expressed their desire to join in AIPMT for use of merit list for admission in their medical colleges in the session 2014-15. So far, the written request for use of result of AIPMT 2014 has been received from the DGAFMS, Ministry of Defence and Jamia Hamdard and others have intimated verbally.

Dr. D.K. Bhawsar, Deputy Educational Advisor, MHRD suggested that for reducing the financial burden on CBSE, State Governments, Universities and Medical Institutions using the result of AIPMT may be charged for the same.

The Controller of Examinations, CBSE clarified that CBSE is in a position to meet the expenses of conducting AIPMT from the revenue generated out of examination fee. However, it is not feasible to charge fee from the State Governments, Universities and Medical Institutions for providing the result as they may also have to incur expenses for conducting counseling and admissions. Further, as per policy of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India more and more State Governments and Institutions be encouraged to join in the Common Entrance Examination for bringing fairness, transparency and efficiency in medical education.

Shri Shikhar Ranjan, Law Officer, Medical Council of India raised a point whether CBSE is in a position to share counseling expenses of States and Institutions using the result of AIPMT.

The Controller of Examinations, CBSE clarified that meeting the counseling expenses of States and Institutions is not possible for the CBSE and for the said purpose, the concerned may charge fee directly from the students.

The Committee after deliberations resolved that the requests of State Governments, Universities and Medical Institutions for use of result of AIPMT-2014 may be acceded to with a condition that the CBSE will not bear any counseling expenses.

ITEM - VI TO CONSIDER THE DRAFT INFORMATION BULLETIN, APPLICATION FORM AND SCHEDULE FOR AIPMT-2014

The Advisory Committee resolved to approve the schedule of conduct of AIPMT 2014 as placed before it. Further, the Committee resolved that all members and other stake holders may be given 10 days period from the date of circulation of minutes for submitting comments on the Information Bulletin, Application Form and Schedule for AIPMT 2014.

Shri Henry Baa, Deputy Registrar, Faculty of Medical Sciences, Delhi University suggested that details of States and Universities participating in AIPMT may be provided in the Information Bulletin as well as website of CBSE.

The Controller of Examinations, CBSE clarified that incorporating the details of participating States and Medical Institutions are possible only when they intimate CBSE in writing about their participation with details, such as, name and address of Nodal Officer, Website Address, E-mail Address, telephone numbers, etc. in advance.

Further, the Advisory Committee authorized the Chairman, CBSE to finalize the Information Bulletin of AIPMT – 2014 after considering the feedback received from all members and other stakeholders within the stipulated time period of 10 days.

ITEM - VII TO CONSIDER THE LIST OF CITIES FOR FIXATION OF CENTRES OF ALL INDIA PRE-MEDICAL/PRE-DENTAL ENTRANCE TEST - 2014

The Controller of Examinations, CBSE explained that AIPMT usually conducted in State Capitals. However, due to increase in the number of registered candidates from some States few more cities were added. There are demands from cities such as Kota, Rajasthan, Calicut, Kerala for conducting the examination.

The Committee observed that the details of States and Institutions joining AIPMT are not known at this stage, hence, after deliberations approved that the Chairman, CBSE may be authorized to take appropriate decisions for fixation of cities for successful conduct of examination.

ITEM - VIII TO CONSIDER VARIOUS ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF ALL INDIA PRE-MEDICAL/PRE-DENTAL ENTRANCE TEST - 2014

The Advisory Committee observed that for the smooth and fair conduct of the AIPMT 2014, CBSE has to make all preparations such as appointment of Item Writers, Moderators and other supporting staff, appointment of City Coordinators, Observers and other supporting staff and fixation of Examination Centres and Appointment of Centre Superintendents and supporting staff, etc.

Dr. D.K. Bhawsar, Deputy Educational Advisor, MHRD wanted to know the mechanism of CBSE for maintaining the secrecy and confidentiality of question papers setting.

The Controller of Examinations, CBSE explained the detailed procedure involved in appointing item writers, moderators and the method of performing their tasks by ensuring confidentiality and secrecy.

The Advisory Committee after deliberations resolved to authorize the Chairman, CBSE to take appropriate decisions for fair and successful conduct of examination.

ITEM – IX TO CONSIDER PROPOSAL FOR PREVENTION OF UNFAIR MEANS PRACTICES IN AIPMT - 2014

The Controller of Examinations apprised the Committee that the conduct of fair Medical Entrance Examination is a big challenge as the number of seats is available for MBBS course is less. There is a tendency among candidates to use unfair practices to get admission in MBBS course. He has also explained the elaborate arrangement made by CBSE for ensuring fair conduct of AIPMT as well as the provisions available in the Information Bulletin for handling unfair means cases.

The Advisory Committee after deliberations resolved that apart from the actions taken by the Board for medical entrance examination 2013, the Chairman, CBSE may also be authorized to take any other steps that may ensure fair and smooth conduct of AIPMT 2014.

The Meeting thereafter ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

The Members were informed that as there was not much difference between the earlier resolution and the opinion of the Committee which met on 11.7.2013, the decision has been implemented w.e.f. 2014 Class IX examination and has been circulated vide Circular dated 08.08.2013, copy of which is placed at Annexure I please.

The Members were informed that references have also been received from schools/parents to consider students participating in sports events at the cluster and zonal levels organized by the Board at par with those participating at national level organized by recognized federations/CBSE/SGFI and such students may also be given one more chance for appearing in SA 1, as each year the CBSE inter school Sports & Games competitions begin in the month of August and are held till December/January.

The Committee, after deliberations, resolved as under:

- i) recorded the decision and action taken by the Board making appearance in Summative Assessments mandatory and fixing minimum percentage of marks for qualifying the Summative Assessments; and
- ii) to include participating in sports activities at cluster and zonal levels organized by CBSE at par with participation at national level; and
- iii) in view of (ii) above to permit the schools to give one more chance to appear in SA 1 upto 31st October for Classes IX & X to those students participating in sports activities at cluster and zonal levels organized by CBSE.

ITEM IV: TO CONSIDER RESTRICTING UPSCALING IN SCHOLASTIC SUBJECTS BY VIRTUE OF MARKS OBTAINED IN CO-SCHOLASTIC AREAS/ACTIVITIES BY ABOUT 5% OF CANDIDATES SPONSORED BY A SCHOOL FOR CLASS X EXAMINATION

The Members were informed that the Examination Committee which had met on 14.1.2013 vide Item V had resolved to restrict upscaling in Scholastic subjects by virtue of marks obtained in Co-scholastic areas/activities as per the following criteria:

The Members were informed that as the sub-Committee did not find favour with the scheme, the Board took a decision not to implement the revised scheme approved in the earlier Meeting of the Examination Committee held on 14th January, 2013. The said Committee had further opined that the present upgradation policy be continued for 2014 examination also. Accordingly, it has been suggested that the status quo be maintained for 2014 and onwards examinations.

The Members were further informed that Board has compiled list of such schools who have awarded a perfect 10 CGPA to more than 50% of their candidates, which is annexed as Annexure 2. The Members were further informed that Board has decided to review the schools through various strategies such as field visits, submission of best practices, using the institutions as venue, inviting the other schools to the venue and sending mentors for verification of the Evidence of Assessment.

The Committee resolved as under:

- i) recorded the decision taken by the Board with regard to the continuance of the existing upgradation policy for 2014 and onwards examinations;
- ii) recorded the action being taken by the Board to review the schools who have awarded a perfect 10 CGPA to more than 50% of their candidates through

various strategies such as field visits, submission of best practices, using the institutions as venue, inviting the other schools to the venue and sending mentors for verification of the Evidence of Assessment; and

a Committee be constituted by the Board to look into the records of the schools whose candidates have secured 10 CGPA without Upgradation and with Upgradation, look into their teaching methodology, assessment criteria and techniques etc. and suggest remedial measures, if required.

Alternatively, it was also opined that a meeting of such schools be called to hear them in order to present their evidence of assessment and if it found that their evidence of assessment is not satisfactory, appropriate counseling be done.

ITEM V: TO CONSIDER THE REQUESTS FROM THREE CANDIDATES WHO HAD APPEARED FOR CLASS XII EXAMINATION IN 2013 FROM CAMBRIDGE INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL, INDORE, MP UNDER PRIVATE CATEGORY TO RE-APPEAR AS REGULAR CANDIDATES IN 2014 IN RELAXATION OF RULE 12(ii) OF THE EXAMINATION BYELAWS

The Members were apprised that Cambridge International School, Indore, MP has been disaffiliated vide Affiliation Branch letter No. CBSE/AFF/1030120/2013/567252 dated 05.6.2013 with immediate effect. The school has also been directed not to admit students in Class IX w.e.f. 1.4.2013 onwards under CBSE pattern. However the present students of Class IX to XII have been allowed to appear in the examinations in 2013 and 2014.

The Members were further apprised that as per the resolution of the Result Committee held on 21.5.2013, the candidates of class XII sponsored by the school have been treated as Private Candidates as the school could not produce the record to prove that the candidates had attended the school regularly.

The Members were also informed that out of the candidates of Class XII who had appeared for the examination in 2013, only 03 candidates viz Masters Parth Sharma, Aniket Chavan and Raj Kumar Jai Singh have taken re-admission in Shri Krishna Public School, Tilak Nagar, Indore, MP and J J Public School, Indore, MP in the session 2013-14 and have requested to consider their request for reappearing as regular candidates as stated by their parent(s).

The Members were apprised that as per Rule 12(ii) of the Examination Byelaws "All India/Delhi Senior School Certificate Examination and Secondary School Examination is open to such regular candidates who has not passed equivalent Examination from this Board or equivalent or higher examination of any other Board or University. However, All India/Delhi Senior School Certificate Examination will be open to such regular candidates who have passed equivalent Examination from this Board and will reappear with the vocational subjects."

The Committee considered the requests of the above three candidates received through their respective schools to permit them to appear as regular candidates from Shri Krishna Public School, Tilak Nagar, Indore and J J Public School, Indore for the Class XII examination in 2014 in relaxation of Rule 12(ii) of the Examination Byelaws.

On the basis of recommendation of the Committee constituted by the Board and after going into the details of the case, requests from the schools and parents and after detailed deliberations in order to safeguard the interest and future career of the students, the Committee resolved to:

- a) permit the said schools to regularize the admission of the three students to enable them to appear as Regular Candidates in 2014 in relaxation of Rule 12(ii) of the Examination Byelaws subject to the condition that:
- I. Regional Office, Ajmer will take an Affidavit from the parent(s) duly attested by the 1st Class Magistrate to the effect that—
- A. s/he has no objection for cancellation of her/his ward's result/marks already declared/obtained for the AISSCE 2013:
- B. s/he will surrender the Original certificate, Marks Statement and Migration Certificate etc. already received by her/his ward from CBSE for cancellation;
- C. her/his ward will fulfill the eligibility criteria in the present school, as laid down in the Examination Byelaws of the Board, to become eligible for appearing as fresh regular candidate in AISSCE, 2014;
- D. I will accept the marks/result which my ward will obtain in AISSCE, 2014 and will not make any claim for restoration of her/his previous marks/result and under no circumstances will create any litigation in this regard against the Board.
- II. Regional Office, Ajmer will take a letter from the present schools concerned for regularization of the admission of the said student(s) in Class XII in the session 2013-2014;
- b) The schools shall ensure that the students fulfill the requirements, as stipulated in the Examination Byelaws, for appearing in the examination;
- c) The decision shall not be quoted as a precedent; and
- d) Regional Office, Ajmer will ensure that necessary action in the matter is taken at their level.

ITEM VI: TO CONSIDER AMENDMENTS IN THE RULES OF THE EXAMINATION BYELAWS

The Members were informed that based on discussions at various forums including a Committee constituted by the Board for differently abled candidates and the need, amendments in the rules of the Examination Byelaws were required. The Members were informed that The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Bill, 2012 is underway and may include the following disabilities when made an Act, which are not a part of the present PWD Act, 1995 –

Autism Spectrum Disorder
Chronic neurological conditions
Deafblindness
tiemophilia
Intellectural Disability
Multiple Dystrophy
Multiple Slerosis
Specific Learning Disabilities
Speeach & Language Disability
Thalassemia
Multiple Disability

An issue was also raised about the authority who is authorised to issue a certificate for the Learning Disabled child. The Members were informed that Circular dated 8.4.2011 has been issued by the Board specifying the authorities whose certificates could be accepted by the schools, copy of which is annexed as Annexure 2. Another issue raised was permitting an adult prompter to Autistic students instead of an amanuensis/scribe keeping in view their special need which only can be understood by an adult prompter. Issues were also raised with regard to special provisions for differently abled candidates appearing under CBSE i

The Members deliberated on the need of the same and resolved as under:

- i) the word 'Amanuensis' be replaced with the word 'Scribe' as it is a general term used by the differently abled tratemity in Rules 24(i), 25 and 72 of the Examination Byelaws;
- ii) the word Blind be replaced with the word 'Visually Impaired' in the Examination Byelaws Rules 23, 24, 25, 46 and 72 and for all practical purposes.

However, the question papers meant for Visually Impaired candidates will only be administered for blind candidates as per their definition in the existing PWD Act, 1995;

- as the Board presently only has provision of permitting an amanuensis even to Autistic candidates, an adult prompter be allowed to Autistic candidates and Examination Byelaws rules 24(i), 25 and 72 be amended. Also the matter be referred to a Committee to develop the detailed criteria for functioning as an Adult Prompter;
- iv) as regards inclusion of other categories of disabilities, it resolved to await the passing of The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Bill, 2012;
- v) except the above amendments, other facilities as existing for CBSE shall continue; and
- vi) it resolved to amend Rules 36.1(iv)(c), 67 and 68 of the Examination byelaws to read as under -

ITEM VII: TO CONSIDER THE REQUEST RECEIVED FROM MINISTRY OF DEFENCE(NAVY) TO COUNTERSIGN THE TRANSFER CERTIFICATES FOR STUDENTS STUYDING IN NAVY CHILDREN SCHOOLS AND AMENDMENT IN NOTE BELOW THE FORMAT OF TRANSFER CERTIFICATE(ANNEXURE I) OF THE EXAMINATION BYELAWS

The Members were informed that letter No. ED/6237/AFFL dated 07.11.2013 had been received from Commander A K Sharma, Joint Director, Naval Education(NES), Ministry of Defence(Navy), Directorate of Naval Education, West Block – V, Wing II, New Delhi – 66 requesting that the powers for countersignature of Transfer Certificates for students studying in Navy Children Schools be vested with NES authorities appointed at their eight Navy Children Schools at Delhi, Mumbai, Goa, Karwar, Kochi, Arrakkonnam, Visakhapatnam and Port Blair which are headed not below the rank of Captain (equivalent to Colonel) in order to mitigate the problems faced by naval personnel, as has been done for Army Welfare Education Society(AWES). Directorate of Naval Education has further stated that there are 08 Navy Children Schools functioning under the aegis of Navy Education Society at various states in India having more than 15000 students on their roll. Every year approx.. 25-30% of students move from one station to another on account of their parents transfer. They have further stated that as observed most of the time when parents forward

transfer certificate of their child to RO of CBSE for countersignature, it gets misplaced in transit or get unnecessary delayed in reaching back to the parents hence the request.

The Members were informed that as per the information available on the Board's website 07 Navy Children Schools and 02 Navy Public Schools are affiliated with the Board situated in the places listed above.

The Committee opined that acceding to the request will reduce the time taken for getting the Transfer Certificates countersigned

The Committee resolved to accede to the request of Ministry of Defence(Navy) and also to amend the Note below the Format of Transfer Certificate(Annexure I) of the Examination Byelaws to read as under:

Existing Note

Transfer certificate should be issued only under the signatures of the regular. Principal/Vice Principal and it should be counter-signed by an officer not below rank of District Inspector Schools/Deputy Director of Education/Education Officer Education Deptt. of the State/Union Territory concerned. In case of a student migrating from one CBSE affiliated school to another CBSE affiliated school the transfer certificate of a previous school of such a student may be countersigned by the Regional Officer of the Board or the Asstt. Commissioner of the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan or the Deputy Director, Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti in India or an officer of the Board at the Head Quarters and by the Secretary/Attache/Cultural Attache or equivalent officer of the Embassy/High Commission of India in the concerned country in respect of students studying in an affiliated school of the CBSE situated outside the country. Army Welfare Education Society has also been authorised to countersian the Transfer Certificate issued schools managed by them. The student shall not

ITEM VIII: TO CONSIDER THE REQUEST RECEIVED FROM MASTER AAYUDH YASHLAHA ROLL NO. 1676947/2013 TO APPEAR IN THE SUBJECT OF BIOLOGY AS AN ADDITIONAL SUBJECT IN RELAXATION OF RULE 19(v) OF THE EXAMINATION BYELAWS

The Members were apprised that as per Rule 43(ii) of the Examination Byelaws "A candidate who has obtained minimum Grade D in at least five subjects (excluding the 6th additional subject) under Scholastic Area A as per the Scheme of Studies and a Qualifying Certificate/Gradesheet cum Certificate of Performance at the Secondary School Examination/passed the Senior School Certificate Examination of the Board may offer an additional subject as a private candidate provided the additional subject is provided in the Scheme of Studies and is offered within six years of passing the examination of the Board. No exemption from time limit will be given after six years. Facility to appear in additional subject will be available at the main examination only."

The Members were also apprised of Rule 19(v) of the Examination Byelaws according to which "Private candidates shall not be allowed to offer such subjects for the examination which involve practical work except in the case of candidates who had failed earlier and who had put in a regular course of study at an institution affiliated to the Board in the previous academic year. However notwithstanding this condition, female candidates may offer Home Science with practical."

The Committee considered the request dated 02.11.2013 received from Master Aayudh Yashlaha who has passed the Class XII examination in 2013 against Roll No. 1676947 to appear for the additional subject Biology as he is desirous of going in for the medical profession.

The Members were informed that as per Rule 43(ii) Master Aayudh Yashlaha is eligible to appear in the additional subject within six years of passing the examination however, as per Rule 19(v) he is not eligible to take a subject involving practical component.

The Committee considered the request of Master Aayudh Yashlaha in view of the fact that he is now desirous of taking up medical profession as his career and to safeguard his future. It was also stated that the curriculum in the subject of Physical Education needed review. After deliberations, the Committee resolved as under:

i) that Master Aayudh Yashlaha be permitted to appear in Biology as an additional subject in the 2014 examination in relaxation of Rule 19(v) of the Examination Byelaws subject to submission of 6 weeks practical performance

certificate from an affiliated school of the Board, as the subject of Biology also has practical component; and

- because of globalisation candidates passing out with one set of combination say Humanities desire to go in for medical or engineering courses for which they did not have the required subjects in Class XII, a Committee be constituted to:
 - (a) to examine the issue of permitting the pass out candidates to appear in the subjects in which they have not appeared earlier, even the subjects having practical/project component alternatively all the fine subject repeating the languages;
 - (b) look into the curriculum aspect of the subject Physical Education so as to deter students from just opting for the subject to increase their overall percentage of marks which is very crucial for admission in higher courses. It was also resolved that though as a policy Board does not prescribe books of private publishers, therefore, the textbooks be developed to facilitate the uniform transaction of curriculum in the subject Physical Education;
 - (c) to also examine the issue of permitting candidates to appear for Improvement of Performance in July the same year.

TITEM IX: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN PERMITTING MASTER KARAN DHINGRA, ROLL NO.2682553/2012 FOR APPEARING IN MATHEMATICS AS AN ADDITIONAL SUBJECT AT THE COMPARTMENTAL EXAMINATION HELD ON 16TH JULY,2013 IN RELAXATION OF RULE 43(i) OF THE EXAMINATION BYELAWS

The Members were informed that letter dated 25.6.2013 had been received from Dr. Sangeeta Chopra Dhingra, Senior Scientist, Pusa, New Delhi seeking permission for her son Master Karan Dhingra, Roll No.2682553/2012 for appearing in Mathematics as an additional subject at the Comptt. Examination to be held on 16th July, 2013. The Members were also informed that as per Examination Bye Laws Rule 43(i) a candidate can offer an additional subject within six year of passing the examination and can appear only in the Main examination. However, keeping in view the career of the candidate the Board permitted him to appear in Mathematics as an additional subject in July, 2013 as a special case in relaxation of Rule 43(i) of the Examination Byelaws.

The Committee ratified the decision taken by the Board.

ITEM X: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN PERMITTING MASTER ANMOL GROVER TO APPEAR IN THE 6th SUBJECT UNDER IMPROVEMENT CATEGORY ALONGWITH THE COMPARTMENTAL CANDIDATES IN JULY,2013 IN RELAXATION OF RULE 44.1(v) OF THE EXAMINATION BYE LAWS

The Members were apprised that letter dated 15.7.2013 had been received from the Director, Venkateshwar International School, Sector-10, Dwarka, New Delhi-110075 stating

that Master Anmol Grover appeared in Class XII 2013 and passed his class XII Examination with Physical Education as 5th subject but due to medical reasons he could not appear in Maths paper. It was further stated that qualifying the subject Mathematics is a mandatory requirement for taking admission in B.Tech (Computer Science) under sports quota.

The Members were apprised that as per Rule 44.1(v) candidates appearing in six subjects at the Senior School Certificate Examination having been declared pass by virtue of securing pass marks in five subjects as per Rule 40.1(iv) may appear in the failing main subject at the Comptt. Examination to be held in July the same year provided he/she had appeared in the examination held in March in the said subject. Keeping in view the career of the candidate the Board permitted him to appear in July 2013 for improving his performance in the subject of Mathematics as a special case under the Improvement of Performance category.

The Committee ratified the decision taken by the Board.

As the fresh female private candidates under Delhi Region and all the failure/compartmental/Improvement candidates appeared in 2013 or before and who will appear in 2014 examination would not have done the Project Work of 20 marks, such candidates will be permitted to appear for the theory examination consisting of 80 marks as per the Senior School Curriculum prescribed for 2014 examination and the theory marks obtained by these candidates out of 80 will be computed to be out of 100 through Computer Programming at the time of finalization of result.

2. Charging of practical fee

As is being done in the subjects of Accountancy and Business Studies having project work of 20 marks, in the subject of History also practical fee has been charged from the candidates offering the subject

3. Appointment of External Examiner to assess the project work and remuneration therefor

As is being done in the subjects of Accountancy and Business Studies having project work of 20 marks, the project work in the subject of History will also be got evaluated by an External as well as an Internal Examiner. The External Examiner will be paid remuneration @Rs.3.50p per candidate as is being paid to the External Examiner in the subjects of Accountancy and Business Studies

4. Declaration of result combining the marks obtained in theory as well as in project out of maximum 100 marks

Also as is being done in the subjects of Accountancy and Business Studies, result of regular candidates in the subject of History will also be declared combining the marks obtained in theory as well as project to be out of maximum 100 marks.

The Committee ratified the above decisions taken by the Board.

ITEM XVI: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN PERMITTING JAWAHAR NAVODAYA VIDYALAYA, MUNDALI, CUTTACK, ODISHA TO CONDUCT FA 4 AND SA2 OF CLASS IX AND ENROL KM SAUMYA SUCHARITA NAYAK, A CANCER PATIENT, IN CLASS X IN THE SESSION 2013-14 IN THE EVENT OF HER QUALIFYING CLASS IX

The Members were informed that Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya, Mundali, Cuttack, Odisha vide letter dated 26.8.2013 had stated that Km. Saumya Sucharita Nayak was under treatment at Tata Memorial Centre, Mumbai for Cancer hence could not undertake the FA4 and SA2 of Class IX and had reported for continuing of studies in August, 2013 by which time FA 1 & 2 of Class X had already been conducted in the school. The school sought guidelines from the Board.

The Members were further apprised of the resolution of the Examination Committee which had met on 10.4.2013 in the case relating to carry over of SA marks in respect of two students of Class IX of Delhi Public School, R K Puram, New Delhi suffering from Cancer/a mysterious disease wherein it was resolved that in case of such requests for circumstances beyond control, the schools be directed to conduct the EIOP for SA 2 and the marks obtained in the EIOP assessment be uploaded instead of permitting the school to upload the marks obtained in SA 1 for SA 2 also.

The Committee was informed that in consonance with the above resolution of the Examination Committee, following decisions had been taken in respect of Km. Saumya:

- o) for FA 4 and SA2 of Class IX the school has been directed to conduct the Assessments and award the marks converted into Grade; and
- b) in view of the medical condition of the student the school has been permitted to enroll her in Class X in the event of her qualifying Class IX
- c) As FA 1 and 2 of Class X had already been conducted by the schools, the school has been directed to conduct the same in respect of this student.

The Committee ratified the above decision taken by the Board.

ITEM XVII: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN CONDONING SHORTAGE IN ATTENDANCE IN RESPECT OF KM. ANU BINOJ A STUDENT OF CLASS XII, 2014 OF MATER DEI SCHOOL, NEW DELHI, SUFFERING FROM ABDOMINAL TUBERCULOSIS IN RELAXATION OF RULE 14(i) OF THE EXAMINATION BYELAWS

The Members were informed that request had been received from the Principal, Mater Dei School, New Delhi stating that Km. Anu Binoy has been suffering from Abdominal Tuberculosis since 2011. Though she has passed Class XI her attendance in Class XII will be less than that required for appearing for the examination. As per Rule 14(ii) of the Examination Byelaws attendance in respect of candidates suffering from TB can be condoned below 60% however as per Rule 14(i) of the Examination Byelaws the request shall have to be received in February, 2014. As Km Anu Binoy was not likely to have attendance more than 50%, the request was considered in the month of August, 2013 only in relaxation on Rule 14(i) of the Examination Byelaws.

The Committee ratified the above decision taken by the Board.

ITEM XVIII: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN CONDONING SHORTAGE IN ATTENDANCE IN RESPECT OF MASTER BRIJESH KUMAR SINGH A STUDENT OF CLASS X OF N P BOYS SEC. SCHOOL, MANDIR MARG, DELHI IN RELAXATION OF RULE 14 OF THE EXAMINATION BYELAWS

The Members were informed that Master Brijesh Kumar Singh was a student of Class X/2013 of NP Boys Sr. Sec. School, Mandir Marg, New Delhi. His name was struck off from the school record due to long absence and creating indiscipline in the school and the information was sent to the Board. As an inquiry is pending against him in FIR No. 143/12, the Principal Magistrate, JJB – 1. Kingsway Camp vide his orders of 12.2.2013 directed the school to re-admit him in the class he was studying at the time when his name was struck off and his involvement in the present inquiry should not be treated as disqualification for his further studies as per JJ Act. Though the school complied with the directions it did not send any information to the Board, due to which the result of the candidate was not declared. Later on in July the school approached the Board for declaration of his result. All his FAs and SAs had been taken on record by the school. He had around 50% attendance in the school. His result has been declared in relaxation of Rule 14 of the Examination Byelaws.

The Committee ratified the above decision taken by the Board.

ADDL. ITEM 1: TO CONSIDER ISSUES RELATED TO PROVIDING OF SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR THE STUDENTS STUDYING UNDER CBSE I CURRICULUM AND CONDUCT OF THE CLASS XII EXAMINATION UNDER THE CURRICULUM

Director(ART & I) placed before the Committee the following issues:

I. To consider and approve the special provisions for differently abled candidates appearing in various examinations conducted under CBSE and CBSE-i

Director (Arti) informed the house that in accordance with the Government of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment Department of Disability guidelines vide OM F. No. 16-110/2003-DD.III dated 26.02.2013 the following instructions are proposed to be considered and approved regarding differently abled candidates during the conduct of CBSE and CBSE-i Examination:-

- 1. The differently abled candidates may be given compensatory time of 50 minutes in each paper of CBSE and CBSE-i Examination for differently abled candidates who are making use of scribe/amanuensis. All the candidates with disability not availing the facility of scribe may also be allowed compensatory time of 50 minutes.
- 2. The facility of scribe/amanuensis may be allowed to any person who has disability of 40% of more if so desired by the person.
- 3. The candidate may be permitted for opting of his own scribe/amanuensis or may be provided by the Centre Superintendent on his/her request. Such candidates are advised to request the centre superintendent for amanuensis one day before the examination in between 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM.
- There will be no criteria for educational qualification, age etc. for the scribe/ amanuensis.
- Proper seating arrangement preferably at ground floor should be made prior to the commencement of Examination to avoid confusion.
- 6. The time of giving the question paper, should be marked accurately and timely supply of question paper meant for visually impaired candidates, should be ensured.
- 7. There should also be flexibility in accommodating any change in scribe/reader/lab assistant in case of emergency. The candidates should also be allowed to take more than one scribe/reader for writing different papers especially for language.

In addition to this it is also proposed that the near relatives of the candidate may be permitted to be present in the examination hall only for the purpose of motivation and support to the candidate

II. CBSE-i Examination

A. To consider and approve the assessment structure and Report Card/Mark Statement-cum-Certificate in respect of students of Class XII appearing first time under CBSE-i Curriculum in Examination 2014.

The format of assessment structure and Report Card/Mark Statement-cum-Certificate in respect of students of Class XII were tabled in the house. The following three schools have registered candidates for appearing in Class XII examination 2014, which is being conducted for first time under CBSE-i Curriculum:-

- 01. M.E.S. Indian School, Doha-Qatar
- 02. Shanti Niketan Indian School, Doha-Qatar
- 03. Alpha Private School, Ras Al Khaimah, UAE

B. To approve evaluation of Answer Scripts of

Class X/XII

The Board proposed that the Answer Scripts of Class X students will be evaluated in schools itself and the Answer Scripts of Class XII students will be called at Delhi, India for evaluation. The procedure being followed regarding evaluation of Answer Scripts' will be adhered.

C. To approve custodians for the confidential material (Class X/XII question papers) and mode of delivery of Question Papers for Examination 2014

The Board proposed that the Head/Centre Superintendent of respective Examination Centres may be considered as custodians of the confidential materials. The question papers for Class X will be sent to examination centres through Integrated Test Management System (ITMS) software. The confidential material for Class XII will be dispatched through Embassy/post to examination centres.

D. To approve appointment of observers for CBSE-i Class X/XII Examination 2014

The Board proposed to appoint CBSE officials and senior school principals of CBSE affiliated schools as observers to supervise the conduct of Class X/XII CBSE-i Examination/PAT 2014.

E. To approve finalisation of Date Sheet for CBSE-i Class X/XII Examination as well as PAT 2014.

The Board proposed to hold the CBSE-i Class X/XII Examinations 2014 in the month of March/April 2014 and PAT in the month of February 2014. It has also been proposed to hold the above examination in a row (without any gap) and finish all scheduled papers in 5-6 days time period.

F. To consider and approve the chances for appearing in compartment examination for class XII

The Board proposed that a candidate placed in compartment at the CBSE-i Senior School Certificate Examination may reappear at the compartmental examination for three subsequent attempts. Compartmental examination that a student can take up for improvement are:

- First Chance: Compartment examination in July the same year
- o Second Chance: in March/April next year with the regular students
- Third Chance: Compartment examination in July of next year

G. To consider and approve provision of External Examiners for the practical examinations in class XII

The Board proposed that the subject teachers from the other CBSE-i/ CBSE schools from the local country be made the external examiners for the practical based subjects of CBSE-i.

The Committee after deliberating on the issues resolved that the

- i) provisions as contained in the Examination Byelaws for differently abled candidates for CBSE continue except that an adult prompter be allowed to Autistic candidates and issues advised by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment may be examined by a Committee to be constituted by the Board; and
- ii) as regards the provisions for CBSE i the Chapter pertaining to CBSE i included in the Examination Byelaws be reviewed and he above provisions be also included in the same.

The meeting then ended with a Vote of Thanks to the Chair.

At the outset, Director (Arti) welcomed all the members to the meeting and requested to introduce them. After the introduction, Director (Arti) thanked the conveners for their support to CBSE despite of their busy schedules. Chairman, CBSE also welcomed members to the meeting and informed the house about some activities have taken place since the last meeting held on June 26, 2013. Director (Arti) then, with the permission of chair, started proceedings of the house by discussing various sections.

OPENING REMARKS

The discussion focused on the following aspects:

Section I: Confirmation of the minutes of the meeting held on June 26, 2013

Section II: Action Taken Report

Section III: Academic Initiatives

Section IV: Current Agenda Items

While giving an overview of CBSE, Director (Arti) outlined major decisions, activities and initiatives taken by the Board since the last Curriculum Committee meeting held on June 26, 2013.

Section I

Confirmation of the minutes of the meeting held on June 26, 2013

Agenda Item: 1

To confirm the minutes of the meeting held on June 26, 2013

The minutes of the meeting of the Curriculum Committee which was held on June 26, 2013 were circulated among all the members of the Curriculum Committee. No comments were received. The house unanimously confirmed the minutes.

Section II

Action Taken Report on the agenda items_discussed in the previous meeting held on June 26, 2013

The Director (Arti) elaborated on the action taken with respect to the agenda items of the last Curriculum Committee meeting as follows:

Agenda Item: 2 - Action Taken Report

2.1 To report on the analysis of the results of schools at grade 10 which have awarded 10 CGPA in all the five subjects based on analyses of assessment data

Director (Arti) told the house that there are 68 schools that have awarded 10 CGPA to more than 50 percent of their students. The assessment data has been analyzed by CBSE in-house and reports have been submitted. There is an agenda item regarding the proposed measures to deal with these schools.

2.2 To report on the constitution of an Advisory Committee on trainings conducted by CBSE

Director (Arti) informed the house that in view of growing number of trainings and number of empaneled agencies, the Board has constituted advisory committee on trainings which have eminent experts from government and non-government sectors. The committee has recommended the following measures

- Streamlining of training programmes by the agencies
- Implementation of CCE in the schools
- . Ensuring quality training programmes from the agencies

Assessment and accreditation of the agencies by CAER

2.3 To report on the setting up of a mechanism at CBSE to collect feedback of training programmes conducted through empanelled agencies and the Board using multiple methods

Director (Arti) shared with the house that the CBSE has empanelled agencies to conduct training programmes on behalf of CBSE. To keep a check on the quality of the training programmes conducted by these agencies, observers are being deputed by CBSE who send a detailed report to the CBSE. However, in order to doubly ensure the quality of trainings imparted by these agencies, the Board has entrusted the responsibility of assessing and accrediting these agencies to the Centre for Assessment, Evaluation and Research which is an independent body set up by Board under PPP mode with a non-profit charitable wing of Pearson Foundation.

2.4 To report on operationalizing the National Institute of Professional Development and its Regional Centers of the Board

Director (Arti) reported that the plot of land for the National Institute of Professional Development and for three of the Regional Centres have been allotted by various state governments. Director (Arti) invited suggestions on the functioning and running of these centres from the members.

2.5 To report on the provision of online support mechanism to schools and students

Director (Arti) informed that the Board has institutionalized an online support mechanism for school and students. However, very few mails have been received so far. This may be due to lack of awareness in schools and students about this facility.

2.6 To report on the pilot project for Co-scholastic assessment tool with World Kids

Director (Arti) shared with the house that WorldKids Foundation has developed a unique Assessment Tool in conjunction with expert educationists, counsellors, and psychologists using a series of multiple-choice questions to assess students in co-scholastic areas as per CBSE guidelines. WorldKids will develop multiple choice questionnaires for the students. A film has also been uploaded on you-tube channel. The Board has identified 55 schools for this pilot.

2.7 To report on the organization of 20th Annual National conference of *Sahodaya* School Complexes at *Amritsar*

Director (Arti) informed the house that the organization of 20th National Annual Sahoadya Conference on the theme of 'Future Ready Schools' was a great success. More than 800 participants from across the country participated in the Conference.

Chairman, CBSE also informed the house that the issues related to school education on themes selected in annual Sahodaya Conferences need frequent and elaborate discussions and therefore, it is proposed that from now on the National Conference of Sahodaya School Complexes will be held bi-annually. The next two being at Raipur and Kochi.

Director (Arti) then discussed the recommendations and resolution of the conference. The conference highlighted the need of continuous professional development of teachers head teachers, parents and students using multiple agencies and committed individuals/group of individuals in online and interactive mode. Additionally, Sahodaya School Complexes can also be empanelled with CBSE for training. Individuals and teams have also been allowed to be empanelled.

Chairman, CBSE shared with the house that there has been a feedback from various quarters that the Board should take up Values Education up-front. The Board is planning to adopt a modal in which schools will provide separate time for dealing with Values Education. The Board will build capacity of teachers as well as produce material required for this purpose.

Director (Arti) also briefed the house that Centre for Assessment Evaluation and Research (CAER) will also be assessing and accrediting empaneled agencies. The CAER has also carried out a comparative study on design of the question papers of 25 state boards.

Dr. K.P.Chinda wanted to know the outcome of the study and whether the Board will be sharing the result of this study with the state boards or not?

It was pointed out that the result of the study was an eye-opener as it was found in one of the question papers of a renowned national board that only two questions count for the fifty per cent of the total weighting. There are many issues related to question paper design which have come to light after this study.

Chairman, CBSE informed the house that the results will be shared with the COBSE which is also working on a common design of question papers for all member boards. The result of the study will be helpful in designing a balanced design of the question paper suitable for all the boards across the country.

2.8 To report on the syllabus and textual material for NCC, Theatre Studies and Legal Studies, optional electives started from the current academic year 2013-14

Director (Arti) informed about the number of schools that have introduced new electives. The schools that have introduced NCC are 143; Theatre Studies 39; Legal Studies 149 and Human Rights and Gender Studies are 18.

2.9 To report on the visit of principals of the CBSE affiliated schools to China

The house was informed that a delegation of principals of the schools affiliated to CBSE visited China to interact with native Chinese teachers for introducing Mandarin Chinese in the schools affiliated to CBSE. The group comprised of 25 principals from KVS, NVS, Government of Delhi schools and private independent schools from across the country. Apart from interviewing the teachers, the group also studied the school education system of China by visiting schools in various provinces of China. CBSE also invited experts for realigning the curriculum and textual material from the Hanban.

2.10 To report on the omission of long reading text / novel 'Lord of Flies' by William Golding prescribed for class XII English Core subject in the CBSE Curriculum 2014 and 2015

The house was told that the Board is in the process of finalizing a novel out of three shortlisted novels. The final decision will be conveyed to schools shortly.

2.11 To report on advisory to schools for celebrating "World Ozone Day"

The house was briefed about organization of competitions such as Poster Making with a message (for class VI), Slogan Writing (for class VII) and Essay Writing (for class VIII) in schools to sensitize students about preservation of the Ozone Layer". The Sahodayas have been involved in this event. In this regard the names are received from Patiala Sahodaya School Complex and Bhubaneshwar Sahodaya School Complex.

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2.12 To report on the combined training calendar of the Board.

The details of trainings that have taken place since June 26, 2013 were tabled in the house. It was shared that a total of 6165 teachers have been trained by CBSE in CCE ad FA in the current session 2013-14.

2.13 To report on development of question banks of questions appearing in last ten years' question papers of JEE (AIEEE) and NEET-UG(AIPMT) Examinations conducted by CBSE under resources for students

The questions have been completed unit wise in Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics and Biology. A total of 2229 questions are ready for uploading on the website. The launch of this facility may take place in the month of January, 2014.

2.14 To report on the incorporation of the checklist of gender sensitive parameters to promote gender sensitivity in classroom transaction and school extra-curricular activities in the accreditation parameters and Affiliation byelaws

The approved checklist of gender sensitive parameters to promote gender sensitivity in classroom transaction and school extra-curricular activities in school monitoring systems has been incorporated in the Accreditation manual.

2.15 To report on the online 'Authentic Interactive Video Course on CCE' based on video modules in collaboration with Educational Technology and Management Academy (ETMA), Gurgaon.

The Director (Arti) informed the house that Prof. Marmar Mukopadhyaya has developed Authentic Interactive Video Course on CCE. However, the Board has invited RFP from all interested firms to select one of them for this project.

2.16 To report on the organization *Katha* for the conduct of the programme "Love Reading" aimed at promoting reading, creative writing and translation in students of the schools affiliated to CBSE

The house was informed that Katha: 'I Love Reading' project is being conducted in different schools affiliated to CBSE across the country and finals will be held at Sanskriti School, New Delhi in the month of December, 2013.

2.17 To report the launch of the innovative forum termed CBSE Student- Lokpai to address concerns of the student community

It was briefed that the Board has appointed a committee to address this issue. The committee has formulated Guidelines and Code of Conduct for the student council.

Thereafter, Director (Arti) presented before the house ATR on the items related to CBSE-i:

- 2.23 generating of Admit Cards as well as Attendance Sheets for Class X/XII Examination 2014
- 2.24 Answer Books stationery for Class X/XII Examination 2014
- 2.25 printing of Registration Cards for Class IX & XI (Academic Session 2013-14)
- 2.26 creation of Centre of Examinations for CBSE-i Class X/XII Examination 2014
- 2.27 conduction of compulsory PAT Examination for the students of CBSE-I Classes IX/X/I/II

Centre for Assessment, Evaluation and Research

Director (Arti) introduced the Director (CAER) and requested her to report items related to Centre for Assessment Evaluation and Research. Director (CAER) gave a brief introduction of Centre and the activities taken up in the recent time. The Director (CAER) shared with the house that the CAER develops research and assessment capabilities and resources for CBSE, its affiliated schools and teachers and also intends to serve as a research body for all educational boards and organizations in the country. Its work is informed by international best practices in school-based assessment, teaching techniques and high-stakes examinations. It cames out research, provides professional development programs, and publishes a variety of support materials, all with the single aim of improving student learning.

Director (CAER) also informed the house that the Centre has launched an interactive and user-friendly website with resources on school assessment, school assessment communities and discussion forums. A roundtable of principals was also organized in order to bring together diverse perspectives and practical examples of assessment practices in schools.

Ms. Lata Vaidayanathan looked forward to CAER in providing support material and rubrics for planning and assessing activities like interdisciplinary group projects, anecdotal records and recitation etc.

2.28 To report on the Item analysis and comparison of the Question Papers of two schemes i.e. Board Based and School Based Summative Assessment –II (of ten schools from each of the regional offices) held in March-2013 by the Centre for Assessment, Evaluation and Research (CAER)

Ms. Sarita Manuja, Director (CAER) informed the house that the work is under progress.

2.29 To report on the Qualitative and Quantitative evaluation of class XII question papers in case of following subjects of English, Math, Economics, History and Physics

Ms. Sarita Manuja, Director (CAER) informed that the item analysis of examination papers, marking schemes, and blueprints of both Delhi and Regional sets for five subjects have been completed and the report is under review.

2.30 To report on the analysis of CTET examination paper with respect to performance of candidates

The CTET question paper has been analysed on parameters like Reliability, Difficulty, Discrimination ability, Internal consistency. A monograph based on above information is under construction

2.30 To report on the Qualitative analysis of question papers of 25 state boards

The Centre has analysed question papers of 21 Boards of the COBSE. It has been found out that there are a number of items in many Boards in different subjects which have not been scored with integers (i.e. they are carrying 0.5, 1.5, marks etc.). The partial mark could lead to difficulties (caused by rounding to the nearest integer) in arriving at a final percentage. This could also lead to a reduction in the reliability of the results.

It is interesting to note that a board has a 20 mark question and a 30 mark question in the English examination.

This means that 50% of the paper is being assessed by two questions which raises some concern about the coverage of the entire syllabus. This in turn could reduce the validity of the final mark.

Section III

Director (Arti) reported major activities that have taken place after the last meeting of the Curriculum Committee.

Agenda Item: 3

- 1. Update on Academic initiatives
- (i) Conduct of Summative Assessment-I for Classes IX and X (Academic Session 2013-2014)

The Board has successfully conducted the Summative Assessment I for classes IX and X and approximately 13,000 schools downloaded around 0.17 million question papers through ITMS for 16 subjects.

(ii) Introduction of Open Text Based Assessment in the Summative Assessment II of Class IX and in the Annual Examination of Class XI, March, 2014 (Geography, Biology and Economics)

Director (Arti) informed the house that OTBA has been introduced in SA II for classes IX and XI. The questions will be open ended with a flexible time (3-3 ½ hours).

Ms. Lata Vaidyanathan, Principal, Modern School and Mr. L.V.Sehgal, Principal, Bal Bharti School wanted to know about the number of OTBA texts that will be there for schools to download it for Summative Assessment – Il for class IX and final examination for class XI. They also wanted to know whether the values based questions could be there for the texts or not. Mr. Sehgal also wanted to know how to further divide the 10 marks provided for OTBA.

Director (Arti) clarified that there will be only one text out of the two or three uploaded texts on the website for the schools across the country. Questions other than the uploaded ones will be put up. Questions will not be MCQs and one mark type rather they will be extrapolative and inferential type. There could be more than one part of this question, however, the total weighting will remain 10 marks.

Chairman, CBSE told the house that OTBA questions may be considered values based if they are focusing on any of the values. Though, a question paper explicitly contain only one values based question, however, there can always be some questions based on the textual material and curriculum which do not directly focus on values but there is an inherent value in them.

Ms. Vaidyanathan told the house that their school is organizing workshops to prepare sample questions on the OTBA texts provided by the Board.

Director (Arti) also stated that the Board has provided a link to CBSE ASL comer and library website. The library website has various tabs for students, parents, principals, teachers and librarians. Useful information to different stakeholders is provided on the website. The catalogue of books is also available online.

The Board has also initiated parent's corner on CBSE website.

The Board has been analyzing the 'Evidence of Assessments (EAs)' conducted at school level. Major findings of the analysis highlights that most of schools (54.76%) have only about 3-4 tasks in FA's. In Class Test/Unit Test, 24.48% schools give only 1 written task, 51.02% schools give 2 – 4 written tasks while 24.51% schools give more than 5 written tasks to the students. Listening and Speaking Skills are being tested adequately in only 19.19% schools and average in 44.22% schools through various tasks and activities but are either inadequate or not tested at all in 36.59% schools. Only 10.58% schools do group projects. Only 36.16% schools assign multi-disciplinary/trans-disciplinary projects.

Ms. Lata Vaidayanathan highlighted the need of one complete session in various training programmes conducted by the Board on interdisciplinary group projects covering the planning, execution as well as assessment of multi-disciplinary group projects. She highlighted the need of succinct, reliable and correct rubrics for the projects.

Director (Arti) requested Mrs. Radha Mahalakshmi to share with the house the progress made on development of handbook of interdisciplinary group projects for schools.

Mrs. Mahalakshmi shared with the house that the handbook is under the final phase and will be available by January, 2014. The handbook will be a compilation of interdisciplinary group projects for schools.

Ms. Vaidayanathan told the house that Sahodayas may collaborate with CBSE in this endeavour.

(iii) XIII CBSE Heritage Education and Heritage India Quiz 2013.

Director (Arti) informed the house that the finals of Heritage India Quiz, 2013 will be held on 16-17 December, 2013 in Modern School, Delhi and the Board has also tied up with AETN 18 Media Private Ltd. for its coverage.

(iv) Revision of the textbook of 'Entrepreneurship' for class XI

Director (Arti) informed the house that the Board has completed the revision of 'Entrepreneurship' Elective of Class XI, for the session 2013-14. The revised book is available at www.cbseacademic.in.

(v) National Wildlife Quiz 2013

The house was informed that the Board in collaboration with Ministry of Environment and Forests (MoEF), Government of India has initiated 'Wild Wisdom Quiz' for the students of classes VI, VII and VIII. National Finals were held in New Delhi on the 4th of October, during the Wildlife Week. The top 3 teams won a once-in-a-lifetime trip in collaboration with 'Adventure Nation' to their Snow Leopard Camp at Shivpuri (near Rishikesh).

(vi) IGNITE 2013

Director (Arti) stated that the Board has organized a Nationwide Campaign to hamess the creative and innovative spirit of school children in collaboration with National Innovation Foundation-India (NIF). It had 20,000 submissions. The winners will be facilitated by Dr.A.P.J.Abdul Kalam in a ceremony.

Thereafter, Director (Arti) presented before the house the glimpses of the following activities:

- (i) Celebration of National Education Day- 2013
- (ii) 2nd International Life Skills, Values, Gender, School Health and Well-being Summit -2013
- (iii) IX Painting Competition on Energy Conservation 2013
- (iv) National Informatics Olympiad 2013-14
- (v) Sensitization regarding challenging and satisfying career in Armed Forces
- (vi) Alternative provision for physically disabled student in place of ASL.
- (vii) Details of the training programmes conducted after June 26, 2013
- (viii) Training of teachers teaching CBSE-i
- (ix) Extension of CBSE-i to grade XII
- (x) Organization of country specific training of teachers teaching CBSE-i curriculum
- (xi) Organization of on-line training for teachers teaching CBSE-i curriculum
- (xii) Plan for the conduct of examination

Agenda Item: 4 – New Agenda items for consideration and approval

Agenda item - 4.1

To consider and approve the draft of the curriculum document 2014-15 and publication of a unified curriculum document for classes IX-X and XI-XII

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Director (Arti) informed the house that the Board publishes curriculum documents for secondary and senior secondary levels. For a particular year two different curriculum documents remain in effect, one for the classes X and XII and other (new one) for classes IX and XI. It has been noticed that schools find it difficult to comprehend that these documents refer to two consecutive sessions. Hence it is proposed that the curriculum documents from now on will contain the syllabi of both the classes IX and X for the same academic session. The same applies for senior secondary curriculum document 2014-15.

Mr. L.V.Sehgal and Ms.Lata Vaidyanathan both said that it is an absolutely worthy idea and appreciated the proposal.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.2

To consider and approve the development of subject pages in major subjects for the website

Director (Arti) stated that the Board invited student members from Kendriya Vidyalayas and Government schools run by the Delhi government for their opinion on modification of curriculum. The committees of courses in various subjects have taken into account the concerns of students while reviewing the curricula. During the meeting with student representatives, many of the students expressed their desire for developing subject pages for the website which may contain all the latest information like curriculum, previous year's question paper, sample questions and other material published by the Board. The generic resource material available for free may also be linked to these pages. The Board proposes to develop subject pages in-house in Hindi, English (Core, Elective and Functional), Mathematics, Biology, Biotechnology, Physics, Chemistry, Accountancy, Business Studies, Economics, History, Geography, Sociology, Philosophy, Psychology, Political Science, Knowledge Traditions and Practices of India, Human Rights and Gender Studies, Legal Studies, Theater Studies and NCC.

The house welcomed this move.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.3

To consider and approve development of Question Bank for supporting schools

Director (Arti) informed the house that the Board is providing options to schools regarding development of their own question paper, taking the question paper provided by the Board or mixing and matching the paper provided to make their own question paper. It has been noticed that about 70% of schools use the question papers provided by the Board.

Chairman, CBSE told the house that this was initially done to ensure the coverage of required syllabus as well as to ensure the minimum quality of the question papers. The cumculum committee of the Board had taken a decision not to provide sample question papers and blue prints. Therefore, the Board now provides the cumculum, design of the question paper and sample questions for class X. However, in view of extreme pressure from schools, parents and students, this could not be done for class XII. As assessment is an integral part of teaching, the Board proposes to provide a Bank of Questions for Summative – I and II for classes IX and X and schools will be able to generate question papers with the help of software. The provision of the Question Bank is necessary as the motivation level of teachers in urban cities like Delhi is different than that of the teachers in the remote areas of the country.

Dr. Sunita Kaushik, Additional Director, Directorate of Education, Delhi supported the idea and said that teachers specially in government schools in Chhattisgarh and Arunachal Pradesh will find it easier to develop their questions with the help of this Question Bank.

Dr. K.P.Chinda asserted that this may demotivate teachers own creativity.

Chairman, CBSE responded that this will be only for those teachers who find it difficult to develop their own questions as the option for developing their own question papers has been and will be there.

Prof. Om Vikas appreciated this move and said that this will enable teachers to develop standard questions.

Mr. M.C.Sharma, Controller of Examination shared with the house that there is an issue of ownership of question papers as schools blindly follow the question papers provided by the Board. When they will develop their own question paper with the help of the Question Bank, the ownership of that question paper will be their own.

आचार्य चाँद किरण सालूजा, दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय ने इस तथ्य की प्रशंसा की कि बोर्ड परोक्षा से मूल्यांकन की ओर बढ़ रहा है। अभी तक बच्चों के माता-पिताओं में यह धरणा बनी हुयी थी कि परीक्षा में अंक अर्जन ही शिक्षा का अंतिम उद्देश्य है। श्री सालूजा प्रश्न पत्रा के स्वरूप में आमूलचूल परितर्वन लाने की बात की तथा इस तथ्य पर बल दिया कि प्रश्न-पत्रों में सामान्य जीवन में घटित घटनाओं के आधर पर कैस स्टडी आदि भी सम्मिलत की जानी चाहिए। उन्होंने यह भी उल्लेख किया कि प्रश्न पत्रा न केवल शैक्षिक विषयों पर कैन्द्रित हो वरन उनमें सह-शैक्षिक क्षेत्रोों का भी समावेश होना चाहिए। यदि प्रश्न ऐसे होंगे जो इन दोनों महत्वपूर्ण क्षेत्रोों का समावेश करेंगे तो समाज और शिक्षा में

सह–संबंध स्थापित हो सकेगा। उन्होंने इस तथ्य पर भी बल दिया कि भारतवर्ष में प्रश्नपत्रा ही शिक्षा प(ति को निर्धरित करते हैं। यदि प्रश्न पत्रोाँ का स्तर एवं प्रकृति बदलती है तो यह शिक्षण प(ति को भी प्रभावित करेगा।

आचार्या प्रेम सिंह, द्वारा इस तथ्य को प्रकाश में लाया गया कि विद्यालय, महाविद्यालय एवं विश्वविद्यालय के विभिन्न स्तरों पर पढ़ायी जाने वाली अंर्तवस्तु में कोई अंर्तसंबंध होना चाहिए।

अध्यक्ष, सीबीएसई ने कहा कि बोर्ड इस संबंध में एक समिति गठित करेगा।

Director (Arti) asserted that text books are only a tool in the transaction of curriculum. In this rapidly changing world, the nature of knowledge is also changing continuously and it is perhaps not possible for any agency to publish the textbooks so frequently. The textbook based questions force children to mug-up the factual information from textbooks. The situation is such that in some cases around 80% of questions are knowledge based.

Ms. Lata Vaidayanathan stated that the assessment should be focused on the process rather than on product of learning. Questions based on HOTS could replace knowledge based questions.

Chairman, CBSE highlighted that the improvement in the quality of question paper can be done in a very cautions manner as there are first generation learners and the interest of these students must not suffer, otherwise, the holistic growth of society will not take place.

Shri Chand Kiran Saluja pointed out that the addition of OTBA etc. will certainly help first generation learners and modification in the level and nature of question paper should be done slowly.

Chairman, CBSE again highlighted that we must not forget the ground reality that not all the teachers are teaching properly. There are self-learners and change at the cost of them is not acceptable.

Shri L.V.Sehgal asserted that content based learning cannot be done away and 10% of OTBA is enough.

Prof. Girishwar Mishra, Department of Psychology, Delhi University said that the assessment is encouraging reproduction and nothing can be asked in examination which is out of book. We need to change the mind-set of teachers and provide flexibility in the design of question paper.

Dr. K.P.Chinda emphasized the need of countrywide workshops for question paper setters.

Chairman, CBSE told the house that a committee will assess the design of question papers. Chairman highlighted that the needs of special category students will be given due importance. The following members could be members of the Committee:

- (i) Shri Chand Kiran Saluja
- (ii) Dr. K.P.Chinda

Chairman, CBSE also requested members to volunteer for the above committee.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the development of Question Bank.

Agenda item - 4.4

To consider and approve introduction of the new academic elective on Library and Information Science for classes XI and XII from the session 2014-15

Director (Arti) informed the house that CBSE proposes to introduce Library and Information Science elective at Senior Secondary level. This will fulfill the requirement of developing necessary skills in learners to identify, locate, evaluate and use the required information efficiently. One of the important aspects of this elective is to improve the education system for Library and Information Science at school level which may be equivalent to diploma holders in Library and Information Science.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.5

To consider and approve the development of teachers' manual on visual and performing arts

Director (Arti) informed the house that though the above areas were there in the curriculum for more than 40 years but nothing has been developed in terms of material development. The Board is planning to develop manual on Visual and Performing Arts. It will help teachers to look out for exemplar activities and assessment rubrics in these areas.

Ms. Lata Vaidayanathan and Dr. Sunita Kaushik volunteered participation of their teachers in the development of this manual.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4. 6

To consider and approve revision of Grade XI text book of Biotechnology

Director (Arti) informed the house that in view of the feedback received from various schools and based on the decision of Committee of Courses some minor modifications in the curriculum have been identified. To incorporate these minor modifications, revision of biotechnology books of Grade XI will be taken up.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.7

To consider and approve Python book for Grade XII text book

Director (Arti) highlighted the point that Python is a more advanced language, however, in view of requests from schools, the provision of option between C++ and Python will be continued for two more years. A book will be developed for class_XII for 'Python'.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.8

To approve undertaking a study on the Performance analysis of students in Science in Class X for the Board based Examinations

Director (Arti) informed the house that Joint Director (Shri R.P.Singh) will conduct this study. Shri R.P.Singh briefed the house about the process of selecting the schools and collection of the answer sheets. He said that appropriate software will be used and CAER may like to extend their cooperation in this.

Director (Arti) announced that this study will be completed till January, 2014.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.9

To consider and approve setting-up of a research development cell for action research based on development of question banks, evidence of assessment and feedback received during trainings and workshops

Director (Arti) informed the house the proposed Unit will liaison with the CAER and carry out R&D work at CBSE. The following positions may initially be created at this cell.

Prof. Om Vikas highlighted the need of a Journal. The proposed R&I Unit may also bring out a journal for the CBSE.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.10

To consider and approve the development of textbooks for class XI (for the session 2015-16 and class XII (for the session 2016-17) for the elective Physical Education

Director (Arti) informed that it was highlighted in the meeting of Examination Committee of the Board held on November 25, 2013 that some schools use substandard books for this elective whereas the curriculum demands comprehensive books. As a policy also, the Board does not prescribe books of private publishers; therefore, it is proposed that above textbooks may be developed to facilitate the uniform transaction of curriculum in this elective.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.11

To consider and approve the development of support documents called 'Values across Curriculum' for classes I to X

Director (Arti) highlighted need of resource material for values education with activities on values education and proposed that a document called 'Values across Curriculum' may be developed by the CBSE for classes I to X. The document may compile fifteen interdisciplinary activities related to values education for each class. The Board can also see the material developed by Ramakrishna Mission.

Dr. Sunita Kaushik informed the house that the directorate has already been providing such activities to schools and SCERT may be involved in this project.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.12

To consider and approve setting up of the Inclusion Cell at CBSE

Chairman, CBSE shared it with the house that the establishment of the inclusion cell has been approved by the Finance Committee of the Board and cell will be dedicated to take up all the issues related to inclusion.

The following officers may be initially recruited to establish and run the proposed Inclusion Cell

Prof. Prem Singh proposed that the Board may establish an Equal Opportunity Cell and member from special category like deaf, dumb, blind and physically disabled may be included in this cell.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.13

To consider and approve the special provisions for differently abled candidates appearing in various examinations conducted under CBSE and CBSE-i

Director (Arti) informed the house that in accordance with the Government of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment Department of Disability guidelines vide OM F. No. 16-110/2003-DD.III dated 26.02.2013 the following instructions are proposed to be considered and approved regarding differently abled candidates during the conduct of CBSE and CBSE-i Examination:-

- The differently abled candidates may be given compensatory time of 50 minutes in each paper of CBSE and CBSE-i Examination for differently abled candidates who are making use of scribe/amanuensis. All the candidates with disability not availing the facility of scribe may also be allowed compensatory time of 50 minutes.
- The facility of scribe/amanuensis may be allowed to any person who has disability of 40% of more if so desired by the person.
- The candidate may be permitted for opting of his own scribe/armanuensis or may be provided by the Centre Superintendent on his/her request. Such candidates are advised to request the centre superintendent for amanuensis one day before the examination in between 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM.
- There will be no criteria for educational qualification, age etc. for the scribe/ amanuensis.
- Proper seating arrangement preferably at ground floor should be made prior to the commencement of Examination to avoid confusion.
- The time of giving the question paper, should be marked accurately and timely supply of question paper meant for visually impaired candidates, should be ensured.
- 7. There should also be flexibility in accommodating any change in scribe/reader/lab assistant in case of emergency. The candidates should also be allowed to take more than one scribe/reader for writing different papers especially for language.

In addition to this it is also proposed that the near relatives of the candidate may be permitted to be present in the examination hall only for the purpose of motivation and support to the candidate.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.14

To consider and approve various measures to address the issue of schools found to have awarded 10 CGPA in all the five subjects in grade X

Director (Arti) informed the house that the Board is planning to send committees of principals and teachers to these schools.

Chairman CBSE shared with the house that in view of lessor number of these schools, they all may be called to Delhi to present their evidence of assessment and best practices. If it is found that their evidence of assessment is not satisfactory, appropriate counseling of schools may be done.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.15

To consider and approve online payment facility initially for CENBOSEC subscription, Accreditation and Science exhibition

Board proposed to start online payment facility for the convenience of participating schools.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.16

To consider and approve online CBSE i affiliation facility

For the convenience of participating schools, Board proposes to launch online CBSE-i affiliation facility.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.17

To consider and approve building an e-Governance Analytics Platform (eGAP)

CBSE in Collaboration with C-DAC and Amrita University is building an e-Governance Analytics Platform (eGAP) which will enable schools to make parents important stakeholders in the system. With the CBSE recently announcing that schools will be rated based on sanitation indices as well, technology could come handy in including more aspects in the rating and review process.

Prof.Ujjawal Singh opined that the proposal should be carefully studied.

Members were of the opinion that any kind of ranking of schools done by any agency should not be placed at CBSE platform.

Chairman CBSE stated that CBSE, for the larger cause of the improvement in the quality of education, does not mind partnering with any likeminded, not for profit organization.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.18

To consider and approve internal e-Governance at the academic unit

In order to streamline the filing system and save paper, CBSE proposes to use following modules developed by NIC

- File Management System
- Knowledge Management System
- Collaboration and Messaging Services
- Leave Management System
- Personnel Information System

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.19

To consider and approve creation of Parent's Corner on CBSE academic website

The Parents also wish to know the various options available to their wards with respect to curricular and cocurricular areas. In view of growing concerns of parents, CBSE proposed that a dedicated corner at the website may be created for facilitating parents. The comer may contain all the latest and important information related to students which a parent would like to know.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item: 4.20

To consider and approve organization of a pilot with BiBox Innovation Labs by Evobi Automations on Complementary basis

Evobi Automations is a package to create a comprehensive unique platform which could transform imagination into real working models. The programs are in tune to the curriculum and hence make it even more interesting for the students. Evobi Automations Private Limited proposed to conduct a pilot of the BiBox Innovation lab in a maximum of 5 schools affiliated to CBSE in Delhi/NCR and 5 Schools in Hyderabad/Bangalore. This pilot will be done by the agency without any financial burden on the selected schools.

Chairman CBSE desired that some of the government schools must also be included in this project. Chairman also proposed the name of Prof.Om Vikas to be associated with this project.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.21

To consider and approve Technology Augmented Learning & Education Environment Management (TALEEM)

CBSE needs to induct ICT in education through disciplined use of ICT, OERs, social networking, Wikis and so on. CBSE proposed to carry out the following major activities:

- Promoting effective networking, efficient and secure network services for clusters of schools under each Sahodaya or geographic region using schemes such as those available through NME-ICT under the MHRD and NOFN under the universal services obligations of network providers under the MCIT.
- Development of the online TALEEM Subject Guide and TALEEM Lesson Plans for each unit of every subject. These will complement the printed and tablet delivered CBSE/NCERT text books and the various guidelines provided by the Academics and Research Wing of the CBSE. They provide education related sequences of learning activities in each lesson that is linked to rich Open Education and Multimedia Resources.
- Designing and conducting capacity building of teachers on the use of ICT in class management and managing pedagogically effective ways of conducting the learning activities.
- 4. Guiding on equipping the schools with such school management systems and practices that will help the teachers manage the classes with students engaged in study both in the school environment and over the Internet and Digital TV at home. This will also include guiding how to promote quality education delivery through laptops, tablets and smart phones.

Dr. K P Chinda appreciated this project

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.22

To consider and approve the engagement of various agencies for different academic activities

Chairman CBSE told the house that many of the agencies empanelled have been found to underreport the participation and some have even gone to the extent of outsourcing the conduct of activities/workshops. Therefore it is proposed that the collection of fee from schools should be through CBSE.

Ms. Ameeta Mulla Wattal asked about the role of observers, to which Chairman responded that every observer may not seem to perform duties assigned to her/him properly.

It is proposed that the agencies may be engaged by the Board to conduct various activities under two different modes given below.

 The fees being directly collected by the agencies and Board collecting empanelment/administration charges:

Under this mode Requests for Proposals shall be floated by the Board for empanelment of agencies and the empanelled agencies will collect fees directly from the schools and 10% of the collections will be shared with the Board with a non-refundable Empanelment fees.

b) The fees being directly collected by the Board and sharing a part of the revenue for meeting out Consultancy and implementation expenses of the agencies:

Under this mode the Board will get the services of a Trust/Society functioning as an NGO which runs on Not for Profit basis for conduct of activities of the Board. The Board will collect certain amount of fees to cover the expenses of the programme. From the receipts, the N.G.O will be paid an amount to meet out actual expenses at a reasonable rate.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item: 4.23

To consider and approve the agencies to provide comprehensive online and offline modes of learning management system for CCE

Chairman CBSE shared with the house that it will be a resource in addition to NCERT textbooks and will be available on optional basis.

An RFP in above reference had been floated six months back. All the material will be absolutely free for all the government schools and a minimal charge per child per month will be taken from rest of the schools.

The following five agencies were found eligible for providing Online/Offline LMS.

- 1. Enlive Education Pvt.Ltd. New Dethi
- 2. Olive International , Jalandhar, Punjab
- 3. Teledata Technology Solutions Limited, Chennai
- 4. Mac Millan Publishers India Ltd Gurgaon

Subsequently the Board has taken the exercise of Content validation of the LMS and SLA to be signed and will be reviewed every year.

Members said that the price is very low and agencies will move out. Chairman CBSE said only the best agencies that will be able to maintain a balance between business and philanthropy will be there in the time to come.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Training and empowerment programmes

Agenda item - 4.24

To approve the modalities of selection of effective and competent Peer Assessors for carrying out the School Quality Assessment and Accreditation Process, and also to make Accreditation process transparent and automated

The Board is planning an online assessment of peer assessors to certify them. The assessment will have MCQs from the SQAA and an exemplar case study of a school will also be given to them to assess their rating skills.

Chairman CBSE told the house that is necessary to ensure the objectivity and transparency in assessment by Peer Assessors. It will be like an open process to select a peer assessor. This will also reduce the number of allegations against peer assessors. A committee of experts will evaluate these assessments and accordingly Peer Assessors will be certified.

Prof. Om Vikas said that this will be an outcome based accreditation.

Prof. Ramachandran raised issue of covering the provisions provided in the RTE Act, 2009 by the schools.

Ms. Ameeta Mulla Wattal wanted to know within how many years of affiliation, accreditation will be done.

Chairman, CBSE informed the house that within 3 years of affiliation, accreditation will be necessary and provisions of RTE have already been covered in the process of Accreditation.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

To approve the initiation of the CBSE Certified Master Trainers' programme

The Board proposed to take up the responsibility of initiating a Certified Master Trainers' training programme to develop a cadre of Master Trainers. Under this programme, the Master Trainers from all over India representing

all the CBSE regions will be selected after proper scrutiny and will be given training. The training would be imparted in three phases:

Phase I - Training (Two-Days): In this phase training will be imparted by CBSE Officers/Resource Persons and will cover all aspects of CCE and its proper implementation.

Phase II - I follow-up (One Day): In this phase, the Master trainers will be called for a follow-up session with the Officers of CBSE after a period of about 3-4 months from Phase I. This phase will involve discussing all aspects of various reforms initiated by CBSE during the period between Phase I and II.

Phase III - II follow-up (One Day): After a period of about 3-4 months from Phase II, this phase will involve taking feedback from the Master Trainers who have been deputed as a Resource Persons/Facilitators or Observers for the various training programmes on CCE to be conducted by CBSE and/or empanelted agencies. The fee of rupees one thousand may be charged per participant per day

Agenda item - 4.29

To consider and approve appointment of 'Advisor (Training)', Heads of Regional Centers of Continuous Professional Development along with contract staff preferably from the local state for running these institutes

CBSE has decided to establish the National Institute of Continuous Professional Development for empowering teachers for improving the quality of school education at Gurgaon and its regional centres at Kakinada, Kolkata, Chandigarh, Kochi, Sitapur, Rai Barelley and Pune.

It is proposed that 'Advisor (Training)', Heads of Regional Centers of Continuous Professional Development along with contract staff preferably from the local state for running these institutes be appointed

The work profile of the Advisor (Training) will be to advise In-charges of the Regional Centres and monitor the progress related to the following activities. The Advisor (Training) may submit a quarterly report regarding the progress of work at regional training centres to Chairman, CBSE through Director (ARTI):

- 1) Preparation of a Continuous Professional Development Calendar for teachers for:
 - (i) Formative Assessments and CCE trainings
 - (ii) Subject and competency based trainings
 - (iii) Orientation trainings in the newly introduced subjects
 - (iv) Values Education, Gender Sensitivity
 - (v) Life skills and Health and Wellness Programme
 - (vi) PEC card orientation
 - (vii) Environmental Education Orientation
 - (viii) Training of Coordinators for Evidence of Assessment
 - (ix) Parent Advocacy
 - (x) Audit and Pre-accreditation Training
 - (xi) CBSE-i örientations
 - (xii) Any other training required to be taken up by the CBSE
- 2) Liaiscning and visits to schools for the following:
 - (i) Periodic inspection of schools under CBSE and CBSE-i
 - (ii) Visits to coordinators to monitor the quality of analysis of Evidence of Assessment
 - (iii) Coordinate with the existing Sahodaya Complex regarding various curricular and co-curricular activities
- 3) Development of academic material
 - (i) Preparation of Question Banks in each of the subjects for CBSE and CBSE-i
 - (ii) Development of online material such as Teacher Resources and Student Resources
- 4) Research

The aims of the research wing are to

- (i) conduct research to improve the efficiency of child-centred instructional pedagogy and school based assessment by making them more user-friendly
- (ii) contribute to the development of theory and methodology in applied educational research;
- (iii) promote research-based understandings of School based Assessment and its practice in education;
- (iv) support teachers in conducting their own action research in contexts of teaching;
- (v) work closely with the schools and teachers to find feasible solutions to their problems
- (vi) provide research training and support for teachers.

5 Any other academic activity assigned by the headquarters from time to time

Initially the Advisor (Training) may be based in Chennal and function from there as the regional centre Kochi and Kakinada are expected to start functioning soon. She/ He may visit regional/national centres as when required.

Chairman, CBSE informed the house that there Centres will work in 24X7 mode and any teacher needing assistance can approach these Centres. The proposal is already approved by the Finance Committee of the Board. The services of these centres will not be limited to schools affiliated to CBSE rather schools affiliated to State Boards or any other Board may also approach them. Centres will be made to work in a self-sustaining mode and therefore, will be required to generate their own revenue once after they become fully operational.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

To consider and approve the training calendar of trainings of Assessment of Speaking and Listening Skills (ASL)

The Board proposed to train at least two teachers, a PGT and a TGT from each school to help in professional development and assessment of speaking and listening skills-during the academic session 2013-14. The training calendar for these trainings was tabled in the house.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

CBSE-i

Agenda item - 4.33

A. To consider and approve the extension of CBSE-i curriculum to grades IV, V and VI in session 2014-15 in CBSE i affiliated schools in India

CBSE – i will be extended to grades IV, V and VI in the session 2014-15 in the CBSE i affiliated schools in India. Presently 29 schools are affiliated to CBSE i in India and running classes till grade III. The textual material for these classes is under development. Extension is required to provide for the needs of students studying in lower classes.

B. To consider and approve extension of CBSE-i Curriculum in Indian Schools

The Board has received applications from around 75 schools in India. The applications and all supporting documents sent by these schools were scrutinized by a committee, the shortlisted schools have been informed accordingly and inspection of these schools is in process.

C. To consider and approve Printing of Student's manual for CBSE-i students by floating an

Schools teaching CBSE i curriculum are continuously requesting for student's manual. Keeping in mind their constant request the Board decided to float an RFP so that printing of student's manual may be taken up.

D. To consider and approve revision of CBSE – i curriculum for classes i to V

It is essential to revise CSBE – i curriculum for classes I to V especially in subjects like Visual and Performing art where modification is required.

E. To consider and approve formation of committee of courses for CBSE *i* subjects and at Primary level.

As the CBSE-i curriculum was initially developed in the year 2010, separate Committee of Courses are now needed to continuously update and review curricula in different subjects offered under this curriculum. It is proposed that separate committees may be formed at primary level while subject wise committees may be formed at middle and senior level.

Director (Arti) invited suggestions from the house whether to assign the work of CBSE – i curriculum to the committees doing the work of CBSE main.

Prof. Chand Kiran Saluja was of the view that different committees should be appointed and a common member could be there in both of the committees otherwise there will be un-necessary repetition of material in CBSE-i.

F. To consider and approve CBSE – *i* training programme for teachers in India affiliated to CBSE- *i* schools.

A two days training programme is planned and teachers from the selected schools will be updated about CBSE-i and activity based teaching. They will also be informed about CORE areas and how to guide

children in these areas. They will also be trained about CBSE-i portal so that they are able to use CBSE -- i portal comfortably.

G. To consider and approve French Curriculum and availability of units for the schools affiliated to CSBE –i

French curriculum is ready and will be uploaded on the CBSE-i portal. Resource persons were also requested to develop units as per the curriculum.

H. To consider and approve on Tamil Curriculum and availability of units for the schools affiliated to CSBE ~i.

Tamil curriculum is ready and will be uploaded on the CBSE-i portal. Resource persons were also requested to develop units as per the curriculum.

I. To consider and approve Engineering Graphics Curriculum and Units for CBSE i for classes XI and XII.

Revision of **Engineering Graphics Curriculum** (CBSE i) was taken up to prepare a curriculum which could meet international standards and requirements. Resource persons were requested to write units for this revised curriculum. Development of these units is underway.

J. To consider and approve revised Bio technology Curriculum and Units for CBSE *i* for classes XI and XII.

A need was felt to revise **Bio technology Curriculum** (CBSE i) to prepare a curriculum which could meet international standards and requirements. The curriculum should be competitive and must have elements that could make it truly international. Hence, revision of **Bio technology** curriculum was taken up.

K To consider and approve the printing of available Student's Manual in all subjects

In order to support schools and students, the Board has developed material such as CBSE – i Handbook, Flyer, FAQs, Curriculum Documents, Affiliation Bye-laws, Examination Bye-laws and support material for teachers and students. The resource material for students is available in all the subjects offered. However, the student resource material is available only on CBSE- i portal.

There has been a consistent demand from parents as well as students that all the student resource material should also be available in printed version.

Therefore, an RFP has been floated to invite interested firms for printing all the student-resource material. The Board is in process of short-listing the agencies.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.34

CBSE-i Examination

B. To consider and approve the assessment structure and Report Card/Mark Statement-cum-Certificate in respect of students of Class XII appearing first time under CBSE-i Curriculum in Examination 2014.

The format of assessment structure and Report Card/Mark Statement-cum-Certificate in respect of students of Class XII were tabled in the house. The following three schools have registered candidates for appearing in Class XII examination 2014, which is being conducted for first time under CBSE-i Curriculum:-

- 04. M.E.S. Indian School, Doha-Qatar
- 05. Shanti Niketan Indian School, Doha-Qatar
- 06. Alpha Private School, Ras Al Khaimah, UAE

To approve evaluation of Answer Scripts of Class X/XII B.

> The Board proposed that the Answer Scripts of Class X students will be evaluated in schools itself and the Answer Scripts of Class XII students will be called at Delhi, India for evaluation. The procedure being followed regarding evaluation of Answer Scripts will be adhered to.

To approve custodians for the confidential material (Class X/XII question papers) and mode of delivery of Question Papers for Examination 2014

The Board proposed that the Head/Centre Superintendent of respective Examination Centres may be considered as custodians of the confidential material. The question papers for Class X will be sent to examination centres through Integrated Test Management System (ITMS) software. The confidential material for Class XII will be dispatched through Embassy/pòst to examination centres.

To approve appointment of observers for CBSE-i Class X/XII Examination 2014 D.

The Board proposed to appoint CBSE officials and senior school principals of CBSE affiliated schools as observers to supervise the conduct of Class X/XII CBSE-i Examination/PAT 2014.

To approve finalisation of Date Sheet for CBSE-i Class X/XII Examination as well as PAT E. 2014.

The Board proposed to hold the CBSE-i Class X/XII Examinations 2014 in the month of March/April 2014 and PAT in the month of February 2014. It has also been proposed to hold the above examination in a row (without any gap) and finish all scheduled papers in 5-6 days time period. :

To consider and approve the chances for appearing in compartment examination for class XII

The Board proposed that a candidate placed in compartment at the CBSE-i Senior School Certificate Examination may reappear at the compartmental examination for three subsequent attempts. Compartmental examination that a student can take up for improvement are:

- First Chance: Compartment examination in July the same year _ ... o
 - Second Chance: in March/April next year with the regular students
 - Third Chance: Compartment examination in July of next year

To consider and approve provision of External Examiners for the practical examinations in G. class XII

The Board proposed that the subject teachers from the other CBSE-i/ CBSE schools from the local country be made the external examiners for the practical based subjects of CBSE-i.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Centre for Assessment Evaluation and Research

Agenda item – 4.35

To consider and approve accreditation of empaneled agencies by CAER

The accreditation of agencies will enable empanelled agencies to successfully deliver outcomes based education programmes and award the empanelled agencies appropriate certification upon meeting the standards and criteria framed under the triple framework of input, process and outcome. The Agencies will be evaluated against the rubrics. Rubrics will be provided to map the rating. The process will be transparent, open and formative in nature. The cost for accrediting an agency is proposed to be rupees fifty thousand.

Chairman, CBSE informed the house that it is of the paramount importance that the agencies empanelled by CBSE must deliver the quality training programmes as per the criteria laid down by CBSE. In absence of any structured quality assurance mechanism based on objective criteria.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.36

To consider and approve the Assessment Training Programme Cadre of 200 CBSE Assessments Mentors

The CAER will train and certify 200 CBSE trainers as master trainers of the ATP. This will allow these certified trainers to reach out to a large number of teachers across the country and enable the maximum number of teachers to get trained in the area of assessment. This will also build a cadre of qualified and competent trainer community for the CBSE and allow them to be valuable assets to the CBSE.

Chairman, CBSE highlighted the acute of dearth of competent trainers for the various training programmes conducted by the Board. The Board is evolving objective criteria for selecting assessment mentors. The criteria involves willingness and assessment literacy test. The mentors will be selected from across the country to suit the regional needs.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.37

To consider and approve the teacher resources of CAER

The CAER aims to publish a rich source of information and knowledge on assessment and evaluation and provide a platform to be able to disseminate research work and publications to the larger education community. The CAER Bulletins are theme based articles containing both theoretical content as well as practical samples and activities for educators to read and understand concepts related to assessments and evaluation. Bulletins will be brought out on a monthly basis by CAER. The CAER Assessment Monographs are specialized publications on specific topics on assessment. These provide sufficient details and are adequately supplemented with examples consisting of detailed and in depth writing on a particular theme in educational assessment.

Chairman, CBSE shared with the house that valuable inputs has been received from CAER

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.38

To consider and approve the manual for the conceptual framework for the CCE

One of the key objectives of the CAER is to strengthen school based assessments with the large purpose of improving quality of students learning in the country. The focus areas which the Centre has identified to make classroom based assessments successful are:

- to develop an understanding of the nature of child and process of learning
- to understand recent trends and developmental paradigms of assessments
- to enhance teachers abilities and augment their roles and accountabilities in context of the recent reforms
- to develop CCE/FA manuals in order to achieve the above will be the guiding principles of the framework.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.39

To consider and approve the international benchmarking of the CBSE-i curriculum

The CAER is well qualified in school based assessments and will guide the CBSE-i in developing the content and performance standards for K-12.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda item - 4.40

To consider and approve Qualitative analysis of quality of question paper of JEE 2013

The Board has conducted Joint Engineering Eligibility Test for the first time in 2013. The quality of the question papers of JEE has wider implications as it is directly associated with the quality of technical education in the country. In order to select appropriate candidates, it becomes imperative to analyze of the question papers for this test. The feedback obtained can be used to further improve the quality of question papers for selecting the more appropriate candidates for engineering colleges. The Centre for Assessment, Evaluation and Research proposes to do a study to analyze the question papers of this test so as enable the Board to prepare more reliable, objective and valid question papers for the future such tests.

Ms. Lata Vaidayanathan requested for the a small committee to analyse the gray areas in the implementation of CCE by the schools. The committee may comprise of members from different subjects so as to provide guidelines in different subjects. The committee may exclusively focus on how to assess and the requirements of the assessment. The committee may also focus on structural requirements for physically challenged students in the implementation of CCE.

Director (Arti) proposed that the coming up Inclusion Cell may take up this issue. Director cited an individual case where the parents requested for a prompter and not a scribe for their special child.

Prof. Chand Kiran Saluja highlighted that there are some issues with the RTE like for primary schools, no sports teacher is provided. There is a provision for the part-time teacher for Arts and Music. This implies that the assessment of students cannot be done as per the spirit of CCE.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item - I

To consider and approve the agenda for focusing on 68 schools which have more than 50% students with CGPA-10

It was proposed that multiple ways of reaching out to these schools need to be explored such as:

- a) Conducting CBSE training programmes in these schools and asking heads to showcase their best practices.
- b) Visit of senior Mentors to such schools to observe and send detailed reports.
- c) Visit of CBSE Officials in teams to conduct an academic audit.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item - II

To consider and approve the replacement of Foundation of Information Technology (FIT) curriculum with approved information and Communication Technology (ICT) curriculum for grades IX and X.

It was proposed that FIT curriculum may be replaced by ICT curriculum. In this regard, a feedback form is also uploaded on the CBSE website to take feedback from concerned stakeholders.

Prof. Om Vikas asserted that the connotation ICT is not an appropriate one.

Chairman, CBSE desired that a feedback will be taken in this regard.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

Agenda Item - III

To consider and approve the revision of e-type writing curriculum and its inclusion under vocational stream

The e-type writing curriculum for grades IX and X needs revision. This curriculum is obsolete. The purpose of this curriculum is to develop basic Desk Top Publishing (DTP) skills in students. However the curriculum is not able to achieve this objective as it is very basic and after the completion of two years course, the students cannot achieve DTP skill sets which are mandatory to get a job or start their own venture. Hence it is proposed that revision of this curriculum may be taken up.

Seeing the content and learning objectives of this curriculum, it is also proposed that it is more suitable to be included under vocational stream than academics.

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

At the outset, *Director (VE & Edusat)*, *CBSE* welcomed all the members to the meeting and initiated the discussions. Thereafter with the permission of the Chair, Programme Officer placed all agenda before the house one by one for kind consideration.

Section I:

Minutes of the first meeting of Vocational Committee held on 25th June, 2013 was accepted unanimously by the house with the following recommendations:

- 1. In reference to Agenda Item 1 Board may develop separate parameters to offer Vocational Course for the drop-outs and 10+2 passouts.
- Feasibility of the offering Vocational Course through online mode may be explored properly and services of PSUs may be taken to concretize the implementation.

Section II:

Director (VE & Edusat) elaborated on the Action Taken Report to the agenda items of last Vocational Committee meeting as follows:

2.1 To report Skill Certification for the drop outs and 10+2 pass out students.

To be implemented from the next academic session

2.2 To report the development of modules for providing skill education training in online/distance mode.

M/S Veda online Chennai has been asked to identify few schools wherein online Skill Technical Training can be imparted. In addition, Board is also exploring the feasibility of Skill Certification of drop outs and 10th pass out students through some SKPs from the coming academic session.

2.3 To report the proposal of making one/two vocational courses mandatory for Senior Secondary level

Proposal has been moved for review of next GB meeting.

2.4 To report the Research and development on vocational pedagogy and development of relevant curriculum.

Cell has interacted with the multiple experts of industry, Sector Skill Council and from various other Department and accordingly it has already revised same of its curriculum based on the present industry requirements and in regard to the development of data base for skills and identifying appropriate pedagogical method is in process.

2.5 To report the Signing of Memorandum of Understanding between CBSE and ICAR, 8 New Delhi for offering Agriculture based courses in the affiliated schools of CBSE.

MoU not yet signed and the agenda will be placed in the next Finance Committee Meeting.

2.6 To report for constituting Sectorial Committee for Vocational courses.

As per suggestion of the curriculum committee the Sectorial Committee some new Members has been included in the various Sectorial Committee.

2.7 To report for printing of Curriculum Document for Secondary and Senior Secondary School for the year 2015 and printing of Books for various vocational courses.

The curriculum document for Sr. Secondary 2015 and Secondary 2015 has been sent printing.

2.8 Global Conference on "Skilling in Schools" in collaboration with PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

Global Conference on "Skilling in Schools" has been organized in collaboration with PHD chamber of Commerce on 18th July 2013, wherein more than 250 Principals has attended.

2.9 To report implementation of German Model (Dual system) of Vocational Education on pilot basis in schools of Delhi-NCR, Chennai and 5 schools in Bangalore.

In this regard approx. 20 schools in India has been selected where technology based courses namely Mechatronics will be introduced from class IX to class XII from next academic session. Also Max Muller Bhavan, New Delhi has agreed to develop the curriculum with the help of German Embassy and PFCET. The study material will be prepared by another well -known publisher in Germany namely Christiani and same will be reframed & published by Indian publisher as student handbook.

In regard to setting up of laboratory for the pilot schools, the lab facilities will be provided by Festo and gradually school has to develop their own laboratory with the help of Festo and Christiani or any other suitable organisations. It is assumed that curriculum will be ready by December 2013 and its content will be develop by April 2014 and thereafter a teachers training programme on Mechatronics and allied field will be organized in India by CBSE with the help of two German experts, who will impart the training of two weeks each.

2.10 To report the proposal to increase remuneration/ honorarium for authors and acquiring ISBN for every publication of Vocational Cell, CBSE.

Action being taken as decided.

2.11 To confirm the winner of logo competition.

Commendation letter with a cheque of Rs. 25,000/- is ready for handing over.

Section III (New Agenda):

3.1: To consider and approve the proposal of implementing STAR (Standard Training Assessment and Reward) scheme in CBSE school.

V. Vijayalaxmi, Joint Commissioner asked whether NVEQF subjects can be bring under STAR (Standard Training Assessment and Reward) scheme

Chairman, CBSE informed that all NVEQF courses can be brought under STAR Scheme and it should be approved by sector skill council, and trainers / agencies should be accredited by NSDC.

Vocational Committee granted approval for the same.

3.2: To consider the proposal of translation of books of Health & Beauty Services, Fashion Design & Garment Technology for class XI in to Hindi.

All members of Vocational Committee agreed and approved the proposal.

3.3: To consider the proposal for conducting teachers training / awareness programme in various cities

It was suggested by *Dr. Om Vikas*, ex-director of IIITM, Gwalior and *Mr Ravinder Kumar*, Director, AICTE to organize more number of trainings in multiple locations, so that more number of stakeholders can be covered. It was also suggested by Dr. Om Vikas to organize special workshop inviting parents to sensitize about the requirement of Vocational Education.

The Vocational Committee granted approval for the same.

3.4: To consider and approve the proposal of setting up of a question papers for SA I and SA II both for the academic subject (rationalized curriculum) and all vocational subjects of class IX and class X

Dr. Om Vikas, ex-director, IIITM, Gwalior enquired about the impact of vocational course on the Academic course.

Chairman, CBSE mentioned that Board is offering vocational courses under NVEQF in three modes viz Compulsory, Additional and no Vocational at secondary level and Board will analyse the impact and also see their growth when such students subsequently take admission in class XI and XII by analysing the result of 10+2 examination. Thereafter the Board will decide the suitability of such option.

The vocational Committee approved the proposal.

3.5: To consider and approve the proposal of preparing assessment guidelines for Vocational courses under CCE:

It was suggested by the curriculum committee members that assessment guidelines for vocational courses under CCE should be prepared in such a manner that uniformity and quality of vocational courses can be maintained and initiative of separate assessment guidelines for the secondary level for vocational courses viz. Retail, Information Technology, Security, Automobile and Travel and Tourism for class IX and Class X was appreciated

The Curriculum Committee granted approval for the same.

3.6: To consider and approve the proposal of printing student handbook of following vocational courses: Health the Beauty Services, Electronics Technology, FMM, Travel & Tourism, Banking & Insurance and Teachers Manual of Geospatial Technology etc.

The curriculum committee members agreed to the above agenda and suggested to consider the demand of stake holders and with availability of NOS/ Jobroles of public sector as prepared by various sector skill council for

developing new curriculum/ revising existing curriculum to align with the NVEQF requirements. The committee members also appreciated the financial aid of Rs22 lakhs approved by MHRD for the aforesaid purpose.
