meeting.

2. As it was the first meeting of the reconstituted Board it  
began with the self-introduction by the members.

3. After the self-introduction by the members, Dr. R.P. Singhal,  
Chairman extended a warm welcome to them. He apprised the Governing  
Body about the busy schedule of work that the Board has had since its  
last meeting in November, 1977. He enumerated the following important  
tasks accomplished by the Board during the period:-

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- i) On March 1, 1978, the Board held its Annual Function at New Delhi where the Union Education Minister, Dr. P.C. Chunder was the Chief Guest and Mrs. Leena Chunder gave away the prizes and merit-certificates. It was presided by Shri K.N. Sahni, Chief Executive Councillor, Delhi. Thirty five medals and a large number of certificates of Merit were awarded to the meritorious candidates who had come from all over India. There was one candidate from abroad as well.
- ii) On 2nd May, 1978, Mrs. Renuka Devi Barkataki, Union Minister of State for Education was good enough to pay a visit to the Board's Office. She was presented a cheque of Rs.21,946.60 which was sent by the Students of the Indian High School, Dubai as their contribution to the Prime Minister's Relief Fund for the benefit of the Andhra Pradesh Cyclone Victims.
- iii) During the period the Board also conducted its annual examinations. About 1,15,000 students took different examinations of the Board at more than 750 Examination Centres spread all over the country and abroad.
- iv) Before the commencement of the examinations, the Teachers Association of Delhi demanded that the rates of remuneration for marking scripts and for invigilation work be increased and they simultaneously gave a call for boycotting the examinations. They also met the Chairman and the Secretary of the Board and withdrew their call for strike on an assurance that the matter would be considered by the Board sympathetically. The matter is receiving the attention of the Finance Committee of the Board.
- v) During the period, the Board added the Indian School of Addis Ababa (Ethiopia) to its family. The application of the Indian School in Muskat for affiliation is receiving attention. The Board also assisted the Indian School, Kabul, which is affiliated to it, in making selections of teachers for History, Geography and Mathematics.
- vi) The major task before the Board has been curriculum reconstruction in the light of the recommendations of the Patel and Adishesiah Committees. As decided in the last meeting of the Board, the Curriculum load for classes IX and X has been lightened. The 1978 examinations at the end of class X were held on the basis of pruned syllabi & text books. From 1979 examinations Economics and Commerce have been deleted from the course for classes

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16. Further the recommendations of the Patel Committee were considered by the Annual Meet of the Conference of the Boards of Secondary Education in India (Cobse) held at Chandigarh in February last. The Board also set up two Working Groups to consider the implementation of the recommendations of the Review Committees. The recommendations of the Working Groups are being placed before the Governing Body for consideration.

vi.) The Government of India has allotted one award under their scheme of National Awards for Primary and Secondary Teachers. This would enable the Board to cover independent schools which were not so far covered by any Union Territory/State Administration or Organisations like Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan. The Board has already written to the schools calling for nominations for 1978 award.

viii) As in the past, Summer Institutes in various subjects for the teachers of class XII are being organised this year in collaboration with the NCERT, K.V.S. and Delhi Administration etc.

ix) The Board is also planning to take up the Open School Project in collaboration with the NCERT and the British Council. This would supplement the formal system of education and would provide an alternative strategy to meet the situation when elementary education is universalised in pursuance of the Government's decision.

Chairman also referred to various programmes for the training of teachers and paper-setters that the Board has taken up in collaboration with the British Council. Ten teachers are already in England at the moment under Project Technology Programme.

4. The General Body then took up the Agenda for discussion:

ITEM-I To confirm the minutes of the last meeting of the Governing Body of the Board held on 26.11.1977.

The Minutes were confirmed.

ITEM-II To report the follow up action on the minutes of the last meeting of the Governing Body of the Board.

The report was received.

ITEM-III To receive the Annual Report of the Board for the year 1976-77.

While receiving the report, there was a discussion whether the Board should arrange periodic inspections of schools once in 5 years to see whether proper standards of education

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are being maintained. While it was agreed that there are other agencies already doing this work like the Administrations of Union Territories and K.V.S., it was felt that the Board could also arrange periodic inspections of schools including those permanently affiliated, but it may ensure that there is no unnecessary duplication of work.

ITEM-IV

To consider the report of the Board's Working Group appointed to consider the implementation of the recommendations of the Patel Review Committee for curriculum for Secondary Classes.

Minutes of the Working Group were approved after discussing the various recommendations made by the Group. The Board also approved the Scheme of Studies given in Annexure-I. This would come in operation from the admission in class IX beginning academic session 1979-80. In the meantime the Board may reconstruct its syllabi & courses and take other steps necessary for the purpose. The Chairman was authorised to take suitable action in this behalf.

The General Body also decided that the scheme of examination which is a part of the scheme of studies mentioned above be made applicable to the examinations to be conducted in 1979 itself. This will provide the necessary link and smoothen the change over. It will also resolve difficulties which students are facing in getting admissions to some Universities, like M.S. University, Baroda because of the adoption of no-pass-no fail system by the Board in the recent past.

ITEM-V

To consider the report of the Board's Working Group appointed to consider the implementation of the National Review Committee (Adishesiah Committee) for Higher Secondary Curriculum (classes XI and XII) with special reference to Vocationalization.

There was considerable discussion on the scheme of studies prepared on the basis of the recommendations of the Working Group especially with regard to whether one language should be made compulsory or two languages should be made compulsory at this stage. The general feeling was that the present scheme, although it makes only one language compulsory, is flexible enough to allow a student to study one more language. It was, however, agreed that in order to provide a greater scope for the study of languages wherever necessary, the Board may allow the students to offer upto two additional subjects besides the minimum 3 elective subjects. The scheme of studies as given in



Annexure-II was, therefore, approved and Chairman was authorised to work out the details regarding the subjects to be included in the Curriculum, re-organisation of syllabi & courses including Vocational Courses etc.

The General Body also decided that as in case of the secondary stage, the scheme of examinations for the +2 stage may be made applicable to the +2 examinations of 1979 while the rest of the scheme of studies should become operative from the admission to class XI beginning session 1979-80.

ITEM-VI ~~To advise regarding the future policy to be adopted by the Board for text book preparation and selection.~~

The policy enunciated in the joint meeting held in the Ministry of Education on 17.4.1978 was approved.

ITEM-VII ~~To review admission requirements for class XI.~~

The Board was of the view that the schools may admit students on the basis of comparative merit and the seats available for different courses.

ITEM-VIII ~~To approve qualifications for the post of Assistant Secretary (Vocationalization) as recommended by the Board's Establishment Committee.~~

The following modified qualifications were approved for the post of Assistant Secretary (Vocationalization):-

ESSENTIAL:

- i) At least 50% marks in the master's degree from a recognised University.
- ii) Degree or Diploma in Education or Training in some Vocational area.
- iii) At least 5 years experience of teaching of Socially Useful Productive Work/Work-Experience/ Crafts or other Vocational Course.

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DESIRABLE:

Some experience in the field of curriculum construction and development of textual material.

The General Body also suggested that the above qualifications may be relaxed by the Chairman on the recommendation of the selection committee if so needed.

✓ ITEM-IX

To advise regarding the composition of a Tribunal to consider an appeal from an employee of the Board.

*Adm. / Pr.*

The following decisions were taken in this regard:

- a) The Board nominated Shri J.A. Kalyanakrishnan, Financial Adviser, Ministry of Education on the Tribunal.
- b) Controlling Authority may be requested to appoint its nominee.
- c) As regards the appointment of an independent member and the procedure for appointment, it was decided that since the Rule was not very clear legal advice may be sought through the Ministry of Education and Chairman may then act in accordance with the legal advice so given.
- d) It was also generally felt that the Rule for setting up a Tribunal needs to be re-examined. The General Body authorized the Chairman to set up a Committee to go into the matter.

ITEM-X

To approve the minutes of the Finance Committee meeting held on 8.5.1978.

The minutes of the Finance Committee were approved.

With regard to revision in the payment of remuneration to Examiners, Centre Superintendents etc. it was desired that after the matter has been scrutinized by the Finance Committee it may be placed before the Governing Body at its next meeting.

The General Body also resolved that the Board has no objection to its accounts being audited by the C.A.G.

Secondary School Examination  
Scheme of Studies for Classes IX & X  
(from Class IX of academic session 1979-80)

I. SUBJECTS OF STUDY

The following are the subjects of study for Classes IX & X under the 10-year pattern of School Education:-

(1) & (2) Two Languages out of:-

Hindi, English, Assamese, Bengali, Gujarati, Kannada, Marathi, Malayalam, Manipuri, Oriya, Punjabi, Sindhi, Tamil, Telugu, Urdu, Sanskrit, French, German, Russian, Arabic, Persian, Nepali, Portuguese and Tibetan.

- (3) Mathematics
- (4) Science
- (5) Social Science
- (6) Socially Useful Productive Work and Community Service.
- (7) Physical and Health Education

Notes

(i) In addition to the <sup>above</sup> subjects, a student may offer one additional subject (not compulsory) from out of the following:

- (a) Any one language from the given list other than the ones offered under the compulsory group.
- (b) Economics
- (c) Commerce
- (d) Home Science
- (e) Painting
- (f) Music

(ii) It is expected that students should have under-gone courses/activities aimed at moral and spiritual values. The schools may draw up their own programme for the purpose but this will not be subject to examination.

(iii) It is expected that all the students would have studied three languages upto Class VIII. Those students who could not clear the third language in Class VIII, and have been promoted to Class IX shall be examined by the schools concerned at the end of Class IX in the same syllabus and textbooks as are prescribed for Class VIII. Those who are still unable to clear the third language at the end of Class IX may be given another opportunity in Class X. No student shall be eligible to appear at the Secondary School Examination of the Board at the end of Class X unless he has cleared the third language.

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(iv) Of the three languages to be offered, as stated above, Hindi and English must have been studied at least up to Class VIII.

(v) Both in the case of Hindi and English, two kinds of courses are provided to meet the needs of the students having varying background of studying these languages. A student may choose English Course A or B and Hindi Course A or B. He may thus offer A Courses in both English and Hindi or B Courses in both English and Hindi or A Course in one and B in the other.

(vi) In each of Mathematics & Sciences, there are alternative Courses A and B. A student may choose either of the two courses subject to availability of facilities in the school.

## II. INSTRUCTIONAL HOURS

Assuming minimum 45 periods per week and the duration of a period to be 40 minutes for instructional work in the schools, the following may be the broad distribution of periods per week for teaching of different subjects. The member-schools may, however, make suitable modification in it, if necessary.

- Notes: (1) Time allocated for Socially Useful Productive Work may be pooled if necessary, depending on the nature of work. Time outside school hours, vacation and holidays may also be fruitfully utilised for the purpose.
- (2) For instruction in additional optional subject, the school may make suitable adjustments in its time-table or provide extra time according to its convenience.



### III. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

- (1) For third language, Socially Useful Productive Work and Community Service, Health and Physical Education, assessment will be internal. Evaluation will be continuous and the schools will maintain a cumulative record of each pupil which will be open to inspection by the authorities of the Board and of the schools concerned. The Board may also appoint supervisors if necessary.
- (2) In Socially Useful Productive Work/Community Service, there will be Practical test. The result of internal assessment shall be expressed in terms of Grades on a seven point scale as follows:  
A- Excellent, B- Very good, C- Good, D- Average, E- Fair, F- Marginal, G- Poor.
- (3) The Board will conduct Secondary School Examination at the end of Class X in the following subjects. Numbers of papers, duration of examination and maximum marks for each subject/paper are noted against each:

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- (4) The result of the Secondary School Examination will be furnished in terms of marks for each subject at the external examination. However, for internal examination viz. Socially Useful Productive Work, Physical and Health Education result will be furnished in terms of grades.
- (5) A student shall be deemed to have passed the examination if he gets at least grade E in Socially Useful Productive Work and at least 3 $\frac{2}{3}$ % marks or grade E in 5 out of the remaining 6 compulsory subjects. Additional subject shall not count for the purpose but if a student passes in a subject, it will be mentioned in the Board's certificate.
- (6) If a candidate fails in any two compulsory subjects, he may be allowed to reappear in either of the two at the Compartment Examination depending upon his choice, which he may indicate while submitting application form for the compartment examination to be held in July/August. A candidate failing in compartment examination may be allowed another chance to reappear in the 2nd compartmental examination to be held in March/April.
- (7) A student wishing to improve his performance in a subject or subjects other than in which he is placed in compartment, may reappear at the annual examination.

- b) Vocational Course: The Syllabi are being reviewed and will be broken up into units and modules so as to be offered as electives. Student may offer 1-3 subjects from the list of Vocational Courses.

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Notes:

1. A student can offer all the elective subjects from the General Education Course or the Vocational Course or a combination of subjects from the two.
2. In place of the Core language a student may offer an elective language in that event a student will have the freedom to opt for another language under the elective group.
3. In addition to 3 elective subjects a student may offer upto two additional subjects, if he so wishes.
4. If a student has taken up subjects which are predominantly vocational he will have to offer General Foundation Course subject to the condition that if he takes two or more general education subjects he will have to offer Socially Useful Productive Work in its place.
5. General Foundation Course may also be offered as an additional subject if the student has taken all the subjects under the General Education Course.

B. INSTRUCTIONAL HOURS

Assuming a minimum of 45 periods per week and the duration of a period to be 40 minutes for instructional work in the schools, the following may be the broad distribution of periods per week for teaching of different subjects. The member-schools may, however, make suitable modifications in it, if necessary.

- B. (i) The time allocated for SUPW may be pooled if necessary taking into account the time spent on it outside school hours, including holidays.
- (ii) The schools may make suitable adjustments in the time table for teaching the additional electives.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION:

1. Socially Useful Productive Work and General Foundation Course will be internally assessed. Evaluation will be continuous and the schools will maintain a cumulative record of each pupil which will be open to inspection by the authorities of the Board and of the schools concerned. The result of internal assessment shall be expressed in terms of Grades on a seven point scale as follows:- A- Excellent, B- Very Good, C- Good, D- Average, E- Fair, F- Marginal, G- Poor.
2. The Board will conduct Senior School Certificate Examination at the end of Class XII in the following subjects in the courses prescribed for Class XII in the respective subjects. Number of papers, duration of examination and maximum marks for each subject/paper are noted against each. The annual examination at the end of Class XI will be held internally by the schools. The candidates will have to qualify in Class XI examination before being eligible for the final examination.

3. In subjects requiring practical examination theory paper will be consist of 70 marks and Practical 30 marks. Unless otherwise specified.
4. The result of the Senior School Certificate Examination will be furnished in terms of marks for each subject at the external examination. However, the performance in Socially Useful Productive Work/General Foundation Course which will be assessed internally will be indicated in letter grades.
5. A minimum of 33% marks in each subject (or Grade E in case of internal assessment subject) is required to pass in the Senior School Certificate Examination. No overall division will be awarded.
6. The existing facility of compartment examination will continue.
7. Any one desiring to improve his performance in any subject or subjects at the Senior School Certificate Examination may reappear in these at the next annual examination.

Prof. S.K. Mitra, Dr. C.R. Mitra, Shri Kanti Chaudhari, Dr. Ravi Prakash, Dr. D.B. Bisht, Shri H.K. Hanu, Shri J.N. Dayal, Shri G.C. Vats, Dr. (Miss) S. Dutt, Pr. T.V. Kunnankal, Smt. A.K. Sandhu, Shri A.P. Bosker, Dr. U.B. Krishnan, Prof. Mohan Khokar, Shri V.K. Haruany and Sri Mahinder Singh could not attend the meeting.

2. In his opening remarks the Chairman welcomed the members to the meeting particularly Mrs. Rajinder Kaur, Mr. Kanwal Sud and Swami Gopeshnanda who attended the meeting for the first time.

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3. The Chairman recalled his visit to West Germany and Denmark in July 1978 to study Vocationalisation of Education in these countries as a nominee of the Govt. of India under a bilateral cultural exchange programme. He presented a written report of the visit and gave an overview of the educational system in West Germany and Denmark with special reference to Vocationalisation. The Governing Body congratulated Dr. Singhal for his very useful report and desired that there are many issues in the vocationalisation of education, especially in the context of his experiences in West Germany and Denmark which need to be considered further. They recommended that the Chairman may set up a committee to take up the follow up of the report.

4. The Chairman also gave an account of his visit to Andaman & Nicobar Islands in September 1978 as Chairman of Committee set up by Government of India to examine the falling standards of school education in the islands. All the Secondary and Higher Secondary Schools of the islands are affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education. The report of the Committee is being submitted to the Govt.

5. He also informed the Governing Body that the Board hosted the Special Session of the Conference of Boards of Secondary Education on 28th and 29th September, 1978. It was a joint session of the Chairmen and Secretaries of the Boards and the Directors of Education of the States and Union Territories. The main theme of this Session was Vocationalisation of Education. The Conference has generally agreed with the thinking of the Central Board of Secondary Education. A report of the Conference will be submitted to the Board when ready.

6. The Governing Body was also informed regarding the training and extension programmes organised by the Board since its last meeting. Special mention was made of the following:-

- i) A pre-departure seminar for school principals who were proceeding to U.K. for training in school management.
- ii) Two C/MET Workshops - one at Raj Kumar College, Rajkot and the other at Delhi Public School, Delhi to acquaint Mathematics teachers with the latest trends in Mathematics teaching under the guidance of Prof. Bajpai of C/MET, Loughborough, U.K.

- iii) A Workshop on Socially Useful Productive Work organised at Daly College, Indore with a view to preparing guidelines for teachers regarding the activities which could be taken up under various situations and tools and techniques of evaluating student performance in the same.

7. The Chairman also informed the Governing Body that model question papers in the major subjects for Senior School Certificate Examination, 1979, (Class XII) are under preparation and will be issued to the member-schools by the end of November, 1978.

8. The Governing Body expressed its happiness over the various actions taken by the Board in the recent past.

#### ITEM I

To confirm the minutes of the last meeting of the Governing Body held on 15.5.1978.

9. The minutes were confirmed. One member, however, wanted that the agenda and memoranda papers should reach the members of the Governing Body at least a fortnight before the meeting.

10. There was also a suggestion that the Board should be represented on the National Apprenticeship Council in the interest of collaboration between planning of curriculum in the vocationalised spectrum and its implementation.

#### ITEM II

To receive a report of the follow up action on the minutes of the last meeting.

11. While discussing the report of the follow up action presented by the Secretary, Central Board of Secondary Education, the Governing Body again discussed the question of declaring students pass or fail in the Board's examinations, particularly whether aggregate marks should be indicated on the certificate. The general consensus was that the previous decision is both practicable and educationally sound. Reiterating the previous decision, the report was adopted.

#### ITEM III

To consider for approval the Open School Project and to approve the consequential amendment in the Constitution of the Board.

12. The proposal given in Annexure-I was approved. Additional posts as recommended by the Finance Committee for

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the purpose were also approved. The Governing Body authorised the Chairman to take further action as he may consider necessary. The Board may also organise a seminar in collaboration with the Centre for Educational Technology, NCERT and the British Council in November 1978 to enable it to design a scheme for Open School and to take appropriate measures for its implementation.

ITEM IV

To consider the appointment of an Executive Committee of the Board.

13. The Governing Body appreciated in general the idea of improving the decision taking process in the Board by setting up an Executive Committee which could exercise some powers of the Board. They, however, felt that there are certain issues like whether its setting up is possible within the present constitution of the Board, its status vis-a-vis the Governing Body of the Board and other Standing Committees and the nature of its composition which need detailed examination. The Governing Body, therefore, authorised the Chairman to set up a working group to consider these matters and then to take further action including amendment of the Constitution if necessary. In the meantime the Chairman may continue to exercise powers in terms of the Board's present constitution.

ITEM V

To approve the minutes of the Examination Committee held on 22.9.1978.

14. While considering the minutes of the Examination Committee, the Governing Body expressed concern about the non-availability of certain textbooks of the NCERT particularly for Class XII. They desired that the Board should convene special meetings of the Committees of Courses to examine the non-availability of text-books in their respective areas and to recommend which books or portions thereof should not be covered in the 1979 Examination. They also felt that the schools should be informed of the position as early as possible and authorised the Chairman to issue a suitable circular on the basis of recommendations made by the Committees of Courses.

15. The Governing Body also desired that the Board should prepare a status report regarding the non-availability of textbooks for secondary and senior secondary classes and sent it to the Controlling Authority. The position about plus-two syllabuses may also be communicated to Delhi University as early as possible so as to enable it to plan its undergraduate courses in the light of plus-two.

16. The minutes of the Examination Committee were approved and the Governing Body inter-alia resolved that:

- i) The adult women who are imparted instructions by Arunachal Pradesh Advisory Board be allowed to appear at the All-India Secondary School Examination as private candidates.
- ii) The senior secondary stage students may be allowed to offer an additional language at the core-level in order to meet the admission requirements at the universities.
- iii) The dates of commencement of various examinations of the Board as given in Annexure II be approved.
- iv) The rules for the award of Board's merit Scholarships as given in Annexure III be approved.
- v) The rules for the appointment of Asstt. Superintendents, invigilators at the Board's examination centres as given in Annexure IV be approved.

#### ITEM VI

To consider the request of the Ministry of Education to conduct the Merit Scholarship Examination.

17. The Governing Body endorsed the decision of Examination Committee and the Finance Committee that the proposal may be accepted in principle. They also agreed with the Committees that it is too late for the Board to take up the responsibility for the 1978 examination. They requested the Chairman to inform the Ministry of Education on these lines.

#### ITEM VII

To approve the minutes of the Finance Committee meetings held on 11.8.78 and 26.9.78 along with the revised estimates for 1977-78 and budget estimates for 1978-79.

18. The Governing Body approved the minutes of the meetings of the Finance Committees. They also approved the enhanced rates of remuneration for various items of work connected with the examinations as given in Annexure V.

19. The Governing Body also approved the award of 46 Merit Scholarships on the basis of the results of the secondary school and senior secondary school certificate examinations from the year 1979, as recommended by the Finance Committee.

20. The Committee also approved the revised estimates for 1977-78 and budget estimates for 1978-79 as given in Annexure VI.

ITEM VIII

To approve the minutes of the Affiliation Committee held on 17.6.1978.

21. The minutes were approved.

ITEM IX

To receive a report regarding the regular appointment of Dr. R.P. Singhal, as Chairman of the Board.

22. The Governing Body congratulated Dr. R.P. Singhal on his regular appointment as Chairman of the Board w.e.f. 7th June, 1978, for a period of 3 years.

ITEM X

To approve the staff car rules of the Board.

23. The Staff Car Rules of the Board as given in Annexure VII were approved.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

OPEN SCHOOL PROJECT1. NEED FOR THE PROGRAMME

In recent years, there has been a phenomenal increase in the facilities for elementary education. In 1974-75, 83.5% of the total population in the age group of 6-11 were enrolled in the primary classes. In classes 6-8, this percentage had a sudden fall from 83.5 to 35.6. Majority of the students drop out on account of various economic and social factors: chief among them is the inability of the parents, particularly those belonging to backward classes, to finance the education on a long term basis. The children are also needed to help their parents in their pursuits as for example agricultural operations. Geographical remoteness is another factor. The middle schools are not easily accessible and the child has to walk a long distance to get education. Furthermore, the girls' education has been the worst sufferer partly on account of the above factors and partly due to other social reasons such as child marriage, unequal status of women etc.

There is a growing realisation that formal schooling system with its limited resources may not be able to cope with the new demands. Necessary efforts, therefore, will have to be made to make Secondary Education available through non-formal channels to as vast a population as possible, particularly to disadvantaged groups like backward classes and girls.

2. OPEN SCHOOLS AND THE SECONDARY BOARDS

The Boards of Secondary Education in the country have a crucial role to play in extending the facility of education through non-formal channels for they already possess a machinery for preparing syllabi and text-books and conducting examinations. With the infra-structure already existing, it would be easy for the CBSE to run an Open School. The schools of the CBSE are located in different parts of the country both rural and urban. These schools can act as frontier agencies of the Board in extending the benefit of non-formal education to needy people and girls.

3. PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAMME

CBSE has a large clientele in the form of wards of transferable and migratory employees of the Central Government and other public undertakings. Besides this the Indian community settled abroad in various countries wishes to provide education to their children on the CBSE pattern. Such a clientele, therefore, looks towards a syllabus of all-India character and channels other than formal schools.

The CBSE is already examining students who have taken correspondence course for Secondary (Class X) and Higher Secondary (Class XI & XII) examinations for the last few years. These courses are provided by the Patrachar Vidyalaya (School of Correspondence) of the Directorate of Education, Delhi Administration and the syllabi and courses are laid down by the CBSE. At present the lessons are sent only in Hindi. The Board wishes to expand the scope of the programme with a view to covering a large population on a national and international scale, by making the courses available both through the medium of English and Hindi.

Further, the CBSL is in a much advantageous position to bring about qualitative changes in the Courses and processes of non-formal education. By operating on a larger scale, it may also be in a position to provide more enriched inputs and thereby raising the quality of lessons and other programmes it envisages to make available.

The purpose of the programme will be to provide a course of general education outside the formal system. The broad objectives would be as follows:

- (a) To impart a body of knowledge so that the citizens may become more enlightened and well informed citizens.
- (b) To develop the habit of self-learning and thereby to generate confidence in themselves so that they are brought back to the main stream of education.
- (c) To enable them to link up the acquired knowledge with their own background and observations so as to develop ability to utilise knowledge for their own personal growth and profession.
- (d) To develop some positive attitudes towards self, community, nation and humanity at large.

#### 4. TARGET POPULATION

The Open School is aimed at covering the following categories of persons above the age of 14 :-

- (a) Male students who have cleared the elementary stage from a school.
- (b) Girl students who can demonstrate their competence to undertake the course through a procedure to be laid down by the Board.

#### 5. NATURE OF COURSES

- (a) The courses at the secondary stage would be the same as prescribed for Delhi/All-India Secondary School Examinations except for that the students will be exempted from Physical & Health Education and Work Experience. Among the languages, only English and Hindi will be offered.
- (b) At a later stage when the scheme is extended to the senior secondary stage, the Board would offer the courses only in the General Education Spectrum preferably non-science areas.

#### 6. DURATION OF COURSES

The duration of these courses will normally be 2 years. At the end of each course the candidates will appear at the Secondary or Senior Secondary Examinations of the Board, as the case may be, and the successful candidates will be issued certificates by the Board. In order to attract the students and allow them to learn at their own pace, they will be given opportunity to enrol themselves at any time of the year, but they can take the examination only after a period of not less than 2 years.

## 7. CONTACT PROGRAMMES AND USE OF MULTIMEDIA

The main quantum of knowledge will be provided through a well organised correspondence-cum-contact programme. Initially four contact centres will be set up at Delhi, Bombay, Calcutta & Madras with library and other facilities. As the programmes gather momentum, more centres may be opened at smaller towns and villages.

Although the printed material supplemented through contact programme would be the main tool to be used in the Open School, other media like Cassettes, radio and T.V. would also be used.

## 8. PHASING OF THE PROGRAMME

The Programme would be phased as follows:-

### 1978-79 - Preparation for the Open School at the Secondary Stage.

- (a) Organizational and administrative steps for setting up the machinery.
- (b) Training of Board Officers.

### 1979-80 - Further Preparation

- (a) Training/Orientation of lesson writers and tutors.
- (b) Preparation of lessons for class IX.

### 1980-81 - Starting the Open School

- (a) Admission and Correspondence Education of students for class IX.
- (b) Preparation of material for class X.
- (c) Setting up of contact centres.

### 1981-82 - Further Consolidation

- (a) Providing correspondence education to the second batch of class IX and first batch of class X.
- (b) Analysis of the feed-back received from the students and the exercises attempted by them. Review of the lessons and evaluation exercises in the light of this and reprinting of the lessons for class IX.
- (c) Preparation of materials for class XI for the next session.

### 1982-83 - Extension to Senior Secondary Stage

- (a) Admissions to Senior Secondary students.
- (b) Providing education for Secondary School Examination.

- (c) Review of the lessons of class X.
- (d) Preparation of new lessons for class XII.
- (e) Opening more contact centres.

1983-84 - Use of multi-media

- (a) Planning Radi & T.V. Programmes
- (b) Review of the class XI lessons
- (c) Consolidating the centres and the contact programmes.

9. STAFFING

Additional posts needed initially would be

- i) Officer on Special Duty/Academic Officer - 1  
(Officer of Reader's rank to be taken on deputation)
- ii) P.A. (Rs. 425-700)

10. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The Programme would be carried out in collaboration with the British Council and the NCLRT. But for this assistance, the Board would try to design the programme so as to become self-financing in the course of time.

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RULES FOR AWARD OF BOARDS' MERIT SCHOLARSHIPSConditions of award

- (a) Merit Scholarships as determined by the Board for its various examinations from time to time shall be awarded on the basis of the results of the examinations conducted by it.
- (b) Value of each scholarship shall be Rs.30/- p.m. for the Secondary Examination and Rs.40/- for the Senior Secondary Examination.
- (c) If the last eligible candidate in the merit list is bracketed with some other candidates all the bracketed candidate(s) will be treated eligible for the scholarship provided they fulfil other conditions.
- (d) If any scholarship holder ceases to be eligible for a scholarship it shall lapse to the Board.
- (e) If a candidate otherwise eligible for the award of Board's scholarship is unable to seek admission to a higher course of study immediately after passing the Secondary/Senior Secondary Examination because of some valid reasons, like, underage, the scholarship may be held in abeyance that year and awarded to him/her next year when he/she gets admission to the course.
- (f) If no reply is received even after two regd. reminders, the case will be closed and the next candidate(s) in order of merit will be considered for the same.
- (g) The decision of the Chairman shall be final in all matters pertaining to the award of the Board's scholarships.

Eligibility

An awardee shall be eligible for the Board's merit scholarship provided he/she

- (a) joins some recognised \*school, college, universities or other teaching institution in India for prosecuting higher studies;
- (b) has secured at least 60% marks at the examination of the Board. This condition may be relaxed in case of scheduled caste candidate, if necessary;
- (c) maintains good conduct and satisfactory progress in studies in an Institution certified by the Head of the Institution;
- (d) Continues to be on the rolls of the institution;

\*Applicable for scholarship of secondary school examination.

contd....

- (e) is not in receipt of any other scholarship.
- (f) Will cease for the Board's merit scholarship if he/she fails in an examination during the course of studies.

Mode of payment

- (a) The payment of scholarship shall not be made direct to the awardee but it will be made through the Head of the institution concerned on submission of bill on the prescribed proforma duly signed by the awardee and countersigned by the Head of the institution.
- (b) The payment of scholarship shall not be made less than one quarter at a time.

Tenure

The scholarship will be tenable for the entire duration of the course of study upto (a) 1st degree (2 or 3 years in the case of B.A./B.A. Laws. and 4 or 5 years in the case of professional course, like medicine, engineering) in the case of Senior Secondary Examination and (b) first public examination (1 year or 2 years duration) after the Secondary School Examination.

Continuation/Termination

The scholarship shall commence from the month the awardee joins the institution and shall continue upto the month of his/her leaving the studies.

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RULES FOR APPOINTMENT OF ASSTT. SUPERINTENDENTS/INVIGILATORS  
AT THE BOARD'S EXAMINATION CENTRES.

1. No person whose near relation is appearing at the examination of the Board should be appointed as an Asstt. Superintendent at the examination centre. A near relation includes son, daughter, brother, sister, grandson, grand-daughter, nephew, niece and wife/husband and first cousin.
2. No person other than a teacher should ordinarily be appointed as an Asstt. Superintendent at the examination centre if he/she is not a graduate with some experience in teaching or degree/diploma in education.
3. No person should ordinarily be appointed as an Asstt. Superintendent at the examination centre if he/she is less than 21 years of age.
4. No person whose book has been prescribed or recommended for the examination be appointed as an Asstt. Superintendent at the examination centre. Similarly, persons who have written notes, help-book or guide-books for preparation of the examination of the Board shall not be eligible for appointment as Asstt. Superintendents at the examination centres.
5. No person should be eligible for appointment as an Asstt. Superintendent at the examination centre unless his application has been made in the prescribed form and duly recommended by a Head of an institution affiliated to the Board. In case the application has been recommended by other than the Head of the institution, the same will not be entertained. While submitting application forms, a person will be required to enclose attested copies of the Degrees/Diplomas in support of qualifications. In no case the application will be entertained without the documents.
6. Ordinarily no male Asstt. Superintendent if he is not a teacher in a school should be appointed as an Asstt. Superintendent at the examination centre.
7. No person who is teaching in an unrecognised coaching institute shall be eligible for appointment as an Asstt. Supdt.
8. As far as possible, a person should not be deployed as an Asstt. Supdt. for another examination of the Board on the same day. Chance should be given to another person for the other examination.

Staff Car Rules of the Board

The following Staff Car Rules which are largely based on the corresponding rules for the use of Staff Cars in the Government of India with necessary modifications according to the nature of work in the Board may be considered by the Governing Body of the Board for approval.

Use of the Staff Car on duty:

1. The staff car may be engaged on bonafide official duty within Headquarters including peripheral towns. For this purpose the following journeys may be considered as performed on bonafide official duty:-
  - a) Journeys by the Board's officers/officials for attending meetings or other official work.
  - b) Inspection of schools or examination centres by the Chairman/Secretary. Officers below the Secretary may also use the staff car for this purpose provided it is available and Secretary feels that it is necessary to go in the staff car and the officer concerned does not draw any conveyance allowance for the said visit/inspection.
  - c) Distribution/delivery/collection of examination material to examiners/examination centres/presses/computer centres/tabulators/schools etc.
  - d) Picking and for dropping back of non-official members of various Committees or officials of other Departments/Organisations visiting the Board's office to attend meetings etc. from/to their official place of work or residence provided they do not claim conveyance allowance for the same.
  - e) Journey performed when senior officers have to be picked up from their residence or dropped back in cases when they are required to attend meetings or other official work

outside their normal place of work or outside normal working hours, or on holidays.

- f) Journeys in connection with invitation to parties/receptions to officers of the Board not below the rank of the Secretary when the invitations are in their official capacity;
- g) Taking an official who falls sick during office hours to Hospital or his residence;
- h) Journey in connection with approved official tours of Senior Officers from residence/office to the Airport/Railway Station and vice-versa in lieu of mileage allowance;
- i) Journeys performed by the Private Secretary/Personal Assistant from his residence/office to the residence of an officer not below the rank of Secretary and back, for official purposes.
- j) Journeys performed by Private Secretary/Personal Assistant from his residence or the residence of an officer not below the rank of Secretary to the railway station or airport and back in order to receive or see off the officer with official papers or messages.
- k) Journeys to Airport or Railway Station and back in connection with the official visit of persons connected with the Board work in lieu of road mileage.
- l) Journeys in connection with carrying of official papers/dak or "bages" to the residence of the Chairman/Secretary for disposal at home.

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- m) Journeys to transport officers of the Board between the Main Offices and the Branch Office/Stores and vice-versa.
- n) Any other official work not mentioned above with the written permission of the Secretary.

Note: I) In addition to the above journeys for staff cars, the journeys performed by the van in connection with the carrying of goods/answer-books/stationary/paper/articles of furniture shall be treated as official.

- II) Staff cars can also be used for official visits to places outside the Headquarters by the Chairman or in case of other officials with the specific permission of the Chairman.

Use of Staff Car on non-duty journeys:

2. Staff car may also be used by senior officials not below the rank of Dy. Secretary on non-duty journeys on payment basis provided official requirements are not interfered with. The following journeys on non-duty purposes may be permissible on rates of payment to be decided by the Chairman from time to time;

- I) Occasional journeys from residence to office and vice-versa during normal office hours;

II) Urgent visits to Hospitals;

III) Any other journey with the previous permission of the Secretary.

Control of the staff cars of the Board:

3. Dy. Secretary ( Admn.) will be the Controlling Officer for all the Staff Cars in the Board. He should be responsible for their proper use, care and maintenance. For this purpose he shall maintain in respect of each car:

- a) A Log Book in the prescribed form;
- b) A record of repairs and replacements indicating the cost and dates on which carried out and of spare parts;
- c) A register showing cost of petrol consumed and all incidental receipts and expenditure;
- d) An inventory of the equipment.

He should also report half yearly to the Secretary, the expenditure incurred on the maintenance of each of the Staff Cars. The Controlling Officer should close the entries in the Log Book every month, which may be scrutinised by the Secretary to ensure that there

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is no misuse of the Staff Cars.

4. In all matters concerning the use of Staff Car/Van and the interpretation of these rules, the decision of the Chairman shall be final. -

In his opening remarks the Chairman welcomed the members especially Wing Commander P.M. Saran, Principal, Sainik School, Rewa, who has recently been nominated to the Board by the Indian Public Schools Conference, in place of Shri J.K. Kate. The Governing Body also appreciated the contribution made by Shri Kate during his association with the Board and resolved to put it on record. The Chairman also welcomed Shri Mohinder Singh, from the Ministry of Defence, Mrs. Madhok, D.P.I., Chandigarh and Shri Gulati, Acting Commissioner, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, who were attending the meeting for the first time.

The Chairman reported about the Annual Function of the Board held on 8.3.1979 in which 3 Gold Medals and 17 Silver Medals besides 71 Certificate of Merit were awarded to the meritorious candidates of 1978 examinations. The Union Education Minister, Dr. P.J. Chunder, was the Chief Guest while Mrs. Leena Chunder gave away the medals and certificates of merit. Dr. Shib K. Mitra, Director, NCERT, presided over the function. The Union Education Minister was all praise for the work done by the Board. The members who were present in the function stated that the function was very impressive and successful. The Governing Body resolved to put on record the appreciation of the work done by the Chairman, Secretary and other staff of the Board during the previous year.

The Chairman recalled that the Board at its last meeting had approved the Open School Project and stated that consequently a seminar was held in November, 1978 in collaboration with the Centre for Educational Technology, NCERT where foreign experts from Australia, England and British Council, Delhi also participated, besides some Chairmen of other Boards of School Education in India. He informed that the Ministry of Education in their capacity as the Controlling Authority has since conveyed the approval in principle to the Blueprint of the Open School proposed to be launched by the Board from the next session. While conveying the approval, the Ministry has stated that the Open School should be set up on a self-financing basis and as a self-contained separate activity of the Board. It is also desired that before the project is put into operation the financial aspects of the project may be finalised in consultation with the Financial Adviser of the Ministry.

The Chairman reported that the issue of establishing Delhi Board of Secondary Education has been considered in detail by the Ministry of Education as Controlling Authority of the Central Board and they have communicated to the Delhi Administration that it may set up its own Board subject to the following conditions:-

- i) The Delhi Administration should agree to take 60% of the staff of Central Board of Secondary Education, the modalities of which can be sorted out by a Committee consisting of the officers of the Ministry of Education, Central Board of Secondary Education and the Delhi Administration.
- ii) The Central Board of Secondary Education has already made arrangements for the 1979 examination (both for classes X & XII) for Delhi Schools. The proposed Board should, therefore, take up the work from 1980 onwards.
- iii) Some of the schools in Delhi are taking examination under All-India Scheme while others take it under the Delhi Scheme. The proposed Board should be responsible for the schools which at present take examination under the Delhi Scheme only. Rest of the schools in Delhi would continue to be affiliated with the Central Board of Secondary Education for the All-India Examination.
- iv) When Delhi Board of Secondary Education is set up, the Patrachar Vidyalaya of Delhi Administration should confine itself only to candidates in the Union Territory of Delhi.

The Chairman also informed that in view of the decision of the Governing Body at their last meeting a Working Group has been set up to consider the issues connected with the establishment of an Executive Committee of the Board. The Working Group has already held two meetings on 19.2.1979 and 3.3.1979. In view of the setting up of a separate Board for Delhi the Working Group has thought it advisable to amend the Constitution of the Board itself rather than taking up the question of setting up of an Executive Committee in piecemeal. The Governing Body appreciated the progress of work done by the Working Group and desired that its report may be placed before the Governing Body at the appropriate time.

The Chairman also gave an account of work done in the area of Socially Useful Productive Work. As a follow up of the Workshop held in July, 1978, at Indore, to identify various issues in this new curriculum area and also with a view to identifying activities which the teachers can organise in this connection, the Board set up a Working Group in which officials from the NCERT were also invited. They have drafted a Teachers Manual which is being edited for publication purposes.

The Chairman informed the Governing Body that two Committees were set up to make an on the spot study of the schools of Andaman and Nicobar Islands and of Central Tibetan Schools Administration, both affiliated to

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the Central Board of Secondary Education. While the first one was set up by the Ministry of Education itself, headed by the Chairman, C.B.S.E., the other one was set up by the Board at the instance of the Ministry, headed by Dr. A.N. Bose, Jt. Director, NCERT. The reports of both the Committees have been submitted to the Ministry. The Committees have made wide ranging suggestions for improvement of education in these schools.

The Chairman also informed that although the Governing Body had approved the dates for the commencement of examinations under All-India and Delhi Schemes as 2.3.1979 and 7.3.1979 respectively, representations were made by some students to the Prime Minister, Education Minister as also to the Chairman of the Board that there would be hardship to the students because of floods in various parts of the country and late availability of a few textbooks for class-XII. These representations were considered and examinations for All-India and Delhi Schemes were postponed by a fortnight to 16th and 21st March, 1979 respectively. Efforts will, however, be made so that the declaration of results is not delayed.

Some members raised the question of reported threat by some Teachers Associations of Delhi to boycott the examinations beginning from 21st March, 1979. The Chairman informed that no such communication was received by the Board although reports to that effect were published in some papers. Moreover, none of the demands of the teachers related to the Board as they referred to revision of pay scales, etc. The Governing Body felt that they were not in a position to suggest any action at that stage. They authorised the Chairman to take necessary steps in consultation with the Ministry of Education if the threat materialised.

Some members referred to the question of reported mass-copying in the examinations of certain other bodies and desired that the Central Board may take precautionary measures so that this malady may not affect it. The Governing Body felt that the problem may not be as serious as it appears and may at the most be confined to only certain pockets. What is needed is vigilance. Schools should not be allowed to defy Board's alertness for the purpose. It was felt that the inspection of Examination Centres of the Board may be further strengthened besides seeking the assistance of Police. The Chairman requested the members of the Board to assist in the inspection of Examination Centres for which purpose proformas of inspection reports will be supplied to those who wish to undertake inspections. It was also agreed that in addition to individual surprise inspectors and flying squads the Board may appoint whole time Observers, if necessary, for difficult Centres and for such days on which

large number of students take the examination or in such subjects which are more amenable to copying. The Observers should stay in the Examination Centres for the whole duration of the paper and should even get the answer-books despatched in their presence.

The Chairman then invited the members for an itemwise discussion of the Agenda.

The Governing Body approved the recommendations of the Curriculum Committee including the syllabi and courses for Secondary and Senior School Certificate Examinations to be held in 1981 (i.e. for classes IX & XI beginning academic session 1979-80). The Governing Body authorised the Chairman to approve the syllabi and courses in certain subjects where the recommendations of the Committees of Courses are still awaited, when they are received.

On the question whether the Governing Body could make any modifications in the syllabi and courses recommended by the Curriculum Committee, it was felt that while the body was competent to make any modifications, it would be advisable to accept the recommendations as the Committees of Courses which were constituted by the Board and which consisted of subject experts and teachers had duly gone into them and they had been further looked into by the Curriculum Committee of the Board. This should truly be the convention to avoid delays in the processing of the curriculum. However, if any member

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wished to make any suggestion for any subject, he/she could send the same to the Secretary of the Board who would have it considered by the Committee of Courses concerned for the 1982 examinations.

The Governing Body appreciated the work done by the staff of the Board in timely processing the curriculum for the coming academic session.

ITEM-V

To approve the recommendations made by the Examination Committee at its meeting held on 17.1.1979

The Governing Body noted the typographical error in item III of the minutes where music should be replaced by 'Painting'. Subject to that correction the recommendations were approved.

3. The Chairman, in his opening remarks, extended a hearty welcome to all the members. He extended special welcome to new members Dr. D.N. Mishra, Joint Educational Adviser to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Education & S.W., Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi, Dr. Ravi Prakash, Vice-Chancellor, Bhopal University, Bhopal, Swami Sudhananda, Principal, Ramakrishna Vidyalaya, Deogarh and Shri Arvindam, Senior Scientist, Animal Science Education, Indian Council of Agricultural Research, Krishi Bhawan, New Delhi. He appreciated the contributions made by the outgoing members viz., Shri G.C. Vats, Swami Gope-shananda, Prof. Mohan Khokar, Dr. (Mrs.) Usha Chandrashekhar, Shri V.K. Harurey in the deliberations of the Board. He mentioned a special word of thanks to Smt. J.A. Dayanand, formerly Joint Secretary (Schools), Ministry of Education & S.W., for taking keen interest in the growth and welfare of the Central Board. She was good enough always to extend her full support and cooperation in the various activities of the Board. The Chairman also expressed appreciation for the work done by the outgoing Secretary, Shri H.S. Singha, during his brief tenure. The House endorsed these observations and desired that the appreciation be recorded.

4. The Chairman then reported that the Education Secretary to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Education & S.W., Shri P. Sabanayagam, who is also the Controlling Authority of the Board, <sup>was</sup> kind enough to pay a visit to the Board on 18.7.1979. Shri Sabanayagam was happy to go round the office and have a first hand acquaintance with the working of different sections of the Board. He also met some heads of member-schools and the officers of the Board.

5. The Chairman further informed the House that since the last meeting of the Governing Body, the Board organised a series of academic programmes as a follow up of the projects taken up by it in collaboration with the British Council and other connected agencies in the United-Kingdom. These programmes were arranged to have a multiplier affect so that the teachers trained in U.K. could disseminate the new knowledge to teachers belonging to other schools of the Central Board of Secondary Education. The programmes were highly successful in which British Consultants were also associated apart from the CBSE teachers who served as resource persons. Eminent Educationists like Dr. D.S. Kothari, Prof. M.V. Mathur and Dr. Ravi Prakash were also associated with some of

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these programmes. He made a mention of the Educational Management Workshop held in Delhi in the month of June; Summer Institute in Project Technology held at Rai (Haryana) in June - July; CANET Workshops held at Udaipur and Kanpur and Science Education Workshop held at Bhopal in September and the Workshop in Evaluation for paper-setters and head-examiners in English held in May this year. A pre-departure orientation programme was also held in September this year at the National Institute for Educational Planners and Administrators, New Delhi, for the Principals going to Sheffield under the School Management Programme.

6. The Chairman also reported that the Govt. of India has been pleased to extend the Project Technology Programme for 3 years and the programme for training of Head Examiners & Paper-setters for another year. The CANET programme has been extended to other states by the Government of India keeping in view its success in the Central Board of Secondary Education.

7. Shri H.R. Sharma and Shri R.C. Gupta officers of the CBSE have returned after a short term study visit of U.K. in the fields of Open learning and Evaluation procedures respectively.

8. The SUPW came into effect in the schools affiliated with the CBSE both at the secondary and senior secondary stages from the current academic session. The Board, in order to help the teachers and the schools choose their activities appropriately and plan them judiciously keeping in view the requirements of the community and the resources available with them, has published a brochure entitled 'Socially Useful Productive Work - Guidelines for Teachers' containing comprehensive guidelines on various aspects related to it. A copy of the brochure was placed on the table of the House.

9. Regarding curriculum the Chairman informed that the prospectuses containing syllabi and courses for secondary and senior school certificate examinations, 1981, effective from the current academic session of Classes IX & XI were brought out and published in time. The Board this year invited books from private publishers in some of the selected subjects for class XI in view of its decision in the previous meetings. The lists of the recommended books have been circulated to all the schools for use in Class XI of the present session. The work of review of the syllabuses for the next academic session relating to the examinations to be held in 1982 is in progress. The Committee of Courses in English has taken up the task of preparing the new sets of text books for Course A and Course 'B' of the Board's Secondary School Examination in collaboration

with the N.C.E.R.T. and the Central Institute of English & Foreign Languages, Hyderabad. These books are proposed to be made effective in class IX from the next academic session i.e. 1980-81.

10. The House then took up the Agenda for discussion:-

ITEM I

To confirm the minutes of the last meeting of the Board held on 9th March, 1979.

The Secretary, CBSE, presented a report of the follow up action.

It was resolved that the report be recorded.

ITEM-III

To report issue of Notification dated 1.9.1979 by the Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Education & S.W., New Delhi, designating the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi as 'Appropriate Authority' under sub-clause (i) of clause (e) of section 2 of the Delhi School Education Act, 1973 in respect of schools in the Union Territory of Delhi which prepare or may hereafter prepare, students, for and present them to all or any of the following public examinations namely:-

- i) All-India Secondary School Examination conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi.
- ii) All-India Senior School Certificate Examination conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi.

The House welcomed the decision of the Government designating the Central Board of Secondary Education as the Appropriate Authority under the Act in respect of the schools situated in the Union Territory of Delhi and following the All-India pattern. It was observed that the notification under reference placed the schools following All-India pattern and situated in the Union Territory on the same footing as other schools affiliated with the Board and situated outside the Union Territory.

It was resolved that the report be recorded.

ITEM IV

To approve the recommendations made by the Examination Committee at its meeting held on 10th July, 1979.

It was resolved that the recommendations be approved.

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Some members observed that the residential schools are facing difficulty because of practical examinations being held after the theory examinations are over as the students have to remain in the school for a few days when they have no examination. It was proposed that an option may be given to the schools to either take the practical examination before commencement of the theory examination or after the theory examination. A question was also raised about counting the result of the additional elective subject for class XII Examination at least for passing the examination. The Board desired that the matter may be examined and the Chairman be authorised to take suitable action.

ITEM V

To approve the recommendations made by the Affiliation Committee at its meetings held on 4.4.1979 and 4.7.1979.

It resolved that the recommendations be approved.

ITEM VI

To approve recommendations made by the Advisory Committee for the Open School Project at its meeting held on 15th September, 1979.

In this connection the minutes of the meeting taken by the Controlling Authority of the Board on 28.7.1979 were also reported.

It was resolved that the recommendations of the Advisory Committee which has already taken note of the proposals which emerged in the aforesaid meeting be approved with the suggestion that the affiliated schools of the Board may be involved for working as extended arms of the Open School. The structure of the Open School may be developed in a manner that it enlists the cooperation of other State Boards for the programmes and courses of the Open School.

ITEM VII

To approve the recommendations made by the Finance Committee at its meetings held on 25.7.1979 and 20.9.1979 respectively, including the Revised Estimates for 1978-79 and the Budget Estimates for the year 1979-80 (1st October, 1979 to 30th September, 1980).

It was resolved that the recommendations along with the revised estimates for 1978-79 and budget estimates for the year 1979-80 be approved. The proposals regarding the Open School were also approved.

To report receipt of a copy of letter No. 79-Planning/18138 dated 17.9.1979 from the Director of Education, Delhi addressed

Additional Item I

To report the record of discussions held on 17.4.1979 under the Chairmanship of the Secretary, Ministry of Education & Social Welfare (Controlling Authority of the Board) concerning the review of examination procedures of the Central Board of Secondary Education.

It was reported in this connection that a review of the examination procedures was made in a meeting with the Education Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Education & S.W.: In the meeting the Joint Secretary(S), Ministry of Education & S.W., Director, NCERT and

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Head, Examination Reform Unit, NCERT were also present, besides the Chairman and Secretary of the Board. The meeting appreciated various reforms already introduced by the Board. However, it made some suggestions for further improvement of examination procedures such as setting up of a panel of two paper-setters, developing designs of the question-papers etc.

The suggestions made were noted and it was resolved that they be referred to the Examination Committee of the Board.

Additional Item II

Admissions to higher courses of study in some States.

Some members pointed out that the students passing the CBSE examinations, particularly Senior School Certificate Examinations, are facing difficulty in getting admission to professional and other colleges in some States. They stated that the CBSE students are treated with prejudice vis-a-vis the students of the local School Boards and, therefore, steps should be taken to ensure that this does not happen. The House expressed its serious concern over this matter and observed that it is unfortunate that the CBSE students, though studying in the States concerned, should be discriminated against in the matter of admission to higher courses of study. It desired that a status report be prepared to find out the exact position. Dr. C.R. Mitra, President of the Association of Indian Universities and Shri Baldev Mahajan, Commissioner, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, were good enough to extend their help in this matter.

Additional Item III

To report the statement showing particulars of examinations and results declared during the period October, 1978 to October, 1979 (copy enclosed).

In his opening remarks the Chairman welcomed the members especially Wing Commander R.L. Saran, Principal, Sainik School, Rewa, who has recently been nominated to the Board by the Indian Public Schools Conference, in place of Shri J.K. Kite. The Governing Body also appreciated the contribution made by Shri Kite during his association with the Board and resolved to put it on record. The Chairman also welcomed Shri Mohinder Singh, from the Ministry of Defence, Mrs. Madhok, D.P.I., Chandigarh and Shri Gulati, Acting Commissioner, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, who were attending the meeting for the first time.

The Chairman reported about the Annual Function of the Board held on 8.3.1979 in which 3 Gold Medals and 17 Silver Medals besides 71 Certificate of Merit were awarded to the meritorious candidates of 1978 examinations. The Union Education Minister, Dr. P.C. Chunder, was the Chief Guest while Mrs. Leena Chunder gave away the medals and certificates of merit. Dr. Shib K. Mitra, Director, NCERT, presided over the function. The Union Education Minister was all praise for the work done by the Board. The members who were present in the function stated that the function was very impressive and successful. The Governing Body resolved to put on record the appreciation of the work done by the Chairman, Secretary and other staff of the Board during the previous year.

The Chairman recalled that the Board at its last meeting had approved the Open School Project and stated that consequently a seminar was held in November, 1978 in collaboration with the Centre for Educational Technology, NCERT where foreign experts from Australia, England and British Council, Delhi also participated, besides some Chairmen of other Boards of School Education in India. He informed that the Ministry of Education in their capacity as the Controlling Authority has since conveyed the approval in principle to the Blueprint of the Open School proposed to be launched by the Board from the next session. While conveying the approval, the Ministry has stated that the Open School should be set up on a self-financing basis and as a self-contained separate activity of the Board. It is also desired that before the project is put into operation the financial aspects of the project may be finalised in consultation with the Financial Adviser of the Ministry.

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The Chairman reported that the issue of establishing Delhi Board of Secondary Education has been considered in detail by the Ministry of Education as Controlling Authority of the Central Board and they have communicated to the Delhi Administration that it may set up its own Board subject to the following conditions:-

- i) The Delhi Administration should agree to take 66% of the staff of Central Board of Secondary Education, the modalities of which can be sorted out by a Committee consisting of the officers of the Ministry of Education, Central Board of Secondary Education and the Delhi Administration.
- ii) The Central Board of Secondary Education has already made arrangements for the 1979 examination (both for classes X & XII) for Delhi Schools. The proposed Board should, therefore, take up the work from 1980 onwards.
- iii) Some of the schools in Delhi are taking examination under All-India Scheme while others take it under the Delhi Scheme. The proposed Board should be responsible for the schools which at present take examination under the Delhi Scheme only. Rest of the schools in Delhi would continue to be affiliated with the Central Board of Secondary Education for the All-India Examination.
- iv) When Delhi Board of Secondary Education is set up, the Patrachar Vidyalaya of Delhi Administration should confine itself only to candidates in the Union Territory of Delhi.

The Chairman also informed that in view of the decision of the Governing Body at their last meeting a Working Group has been set up to consider the issues connected with the establishment of an Executive Committee of the Board. The Working Group has already held two meetings on 19.2.1979 and 3.3.1979. In view of the setting up of a separate Board for Delhi the Working Group has thought it advisable to amend the Constitution of the Board itself rather than taking up the question of setting up of an Executive Committee in piecemeal. The Governing Body appreciated the progress of work done by the Working Group and desired that its report may be placed before the Governing Body at the appropriate time.

The Chairman also gave an account of work done in the area of Socially Useful Productive Work. As a follow up of the Workshop held in July, 1978, at Indore, to identify various issues in this new curriculum area and also with a view to identifying activities which the teachers can organise in this connection, the Board set up a Working Group in which officials from the NCERT were also invited. They have drafted a Teachers Manual which is being edited for publication purposes.

The Chairman informed the Governing Body that two Committees were set up to make an on the spot study of the schools of Andaman and Nicobar Islands and of Central Tibetan Schools Administration, both affiliated to

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the Central Board of Secondary Education. While the first one was set up by the Ministry of Education itself, headed by the Chairman, C.B.S.E., the other one was set up by the Board at the instance of the Ministry, headed by Dr. A.N. Bose, Jt. Director, NCERT. The reports of both the Committees have been submitted to the Ministry. The Committees have made wide ranging suggestions for improvement of education in these schools.

The Chairman also informed that although the Governing Body had approved the dates for the commencement of examinations under All-India and Delhi Schemes as 2.3.1979 and 7.3.1979 respectively, representations were made by some students to the Prime Minister, Education Minister as also to the Chairman of the Board that there would be hardship to the students because of floods in various parts of the country and late availability of a few textbooks for class-XII. These representations were considered and examinations for All-India and Delhi Schemes were postponed by a fortnight to 16th and 21st March, 1979 respectively. Efforts will, however, be made so that the declaration of results is not delayed.

Some members raised the question of reported threat by some Teachers Associations of Delhi to boycott the examinations beginning from 21st March, 1979. The Chairman informed that no such communication was received by the Board although reports to that effect were published in some papers. Moreover, none of the demands of the teachers related to the Board as they referred to revision of pay scales, etc. The Governing Body felt that they were not in a position to suggest any action at that stage. They authorised the Chairman to take necessary steps in consultation with the Ministry of Education if the threat materialised.

Some members referred to the question of reported mass-copying in the examinations of certain other bodies and desired that the Central Board may take precautionary measures so that this malady may not affect it. The Governing Body felt that the problem may not be as serious as it appears and may at the most be confined to only certain pockets. What is needed is vigilance. Schools should not be allowed to defy Board's alertness for the purpose. It was felt that the inspection of Examination Centres of the Board may be further strengthened besides seeking the assistance of Police. The Chairman requested the members of the Board to assist in the inspection of Examination Centres for which purpose proformas of inspection reports will be supplied to those who wish to undertake inspections. It was also agreed that in addition to individual surprise inspectors and flying squads the Board may appoint whole time Observers, if necessary, for difficult Centres and for such days on which

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large number of students take the examination or in such subjects which are more amenable to copying. The Observers should stay in the Examination Centres for the whole duration of the paper and should even get the answer-books despatched in their presence.

The Chairman then invited the members for an itemwise discussion of the Agenda.

This should truly be the convention to avoid delays in the processing of the curriculum. However, if any member

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wished to make any suggestion for any subject, he/she could send the same to the Secretary of the Board who would have it considered by the Committee of Courses concerned for the 1982 examinations.

The Governing Body appreciated the work done by the staff of the Board in timely processing the curriculum for the coming academic session.

ITEM NO. I:

To confirm and report follow up action on the minutes of the meeting of the Examination Committee held on 11.1.1979.

Resolved that the minutes be confirmed and the report be recorded.

ITEM NO. II:

To consider d.o. letter No. 4133 dated 12th June, 1979 from Shri P.P. Chauhan, Education Secretary, Delhi Admn., Delhi requesting therein to hold Supplementary Examinations in August, 1979 for Delhi Secondary School (class X) and Delhi Senior School Certificate (class XII) Examinations in full subjects for failures on account of teachers strike and floods in Delhi in some parts of the city during the session.

The Committee considered at length the request of Delhi Admn. to hold a full-fledged examination for the failed candidates. They also noted that March examinations had already been postponed by a fortnight so as to obviate the difficulties of the students due to floods. The teachers went on strike only at the time of commencement of examination and therefore did not disturb the studies. The Committee also felt that holding the full examination for failures in August/September does not help the students in saving a year. They were not, therefore, in favour of the Board arranging a full-fledged examination in August/September.

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The Committee however resolved to extend the following additional facilities to the candidates who have been placed in compartment at the Secondary School (class X) Examination, 1979.

- i) Candidates who have failed to obtain atleast Grade E in Work Experience/Community Service and have been declared in-eligible to appear at the All India and Delhi Secondary School Examinations, 1979 may appear in the concerned Work Experience/Community Service in July/August, 1979 at the Secondary Examination again. The results of these candidates will be declared if they secure atleast Grade E in Work Experience/Community Service. Examination in Work-Experience/Community Service will be conducted by the schools themselves during the first week of August, 1979 on the date(s) as may be convenient to the schools and their results intimated to the Board at the latest by 20th August, 1979. Candidates who may be placed in compartment at the external examination will be allowed to appear at the 2nd chance compartmental examination to be held in March/April, 1980. No further chance of compartment will be allowed to them.
- ii) Candidates who have passed the Delhi Secondary School (class X) Examination, 1979 but have failed in one subject may be allowed to appear at the compartmental examination to be held from 7th August, 1979 in case they wish to appear at the aforesaid examination.
- iii) Candidates who have been placed in compartment in two subjects at the Delhi Secondary School (class X) Examination, 1979 but are required to appear only in one subject of their choice may be allowed to appear in both the subjects in case they wish to appear for the same.

Secretary informed the Committee that in order to avoid hardships, the candidates who have passed the All India Secondary School (class X) Examination, 1979 but have failed in one subject have been allowed to appear at the compartmental examination to be held from 7th August, 1979 in case they wish to appear at the aforesaid examination.

Resolved further that in case of Delhi Senior School Examination, 1979, no additional facility was necessary as the Delhi University does not allow candidates to seek admission into higher courses of studies to failed candidates.

ITEM NO. III:

To consider laying down separate pass marks in practical and theory in Sciences at the Secondary School (class X) Examination of the Board.

Resolved that it was rather premature to change the scheme as it was introduced only last year. It may be advisable to analyse the results of one or two years on the basis of marks obtained by the candidates in Sciences in practical as well as theory at the Secondary School (class X) Examination of the Board and then consider the matter. In the meantime, status-quo be maintained.

ITEM NO. IV:

To consider whether separate marks in theory as well as practicals in science subjects be shown in the statement of marks issued to the candidates for Secondary School and Senior School Certificate Examinations of the Board.

In this connection, Secretary reported that this year the Board had supplied separate marks in theory as well as practicals for the candidates of Gujarat State in view of their admission requirements for higher courses of studies.

Resolved that separate marks be issued to the candidates in theory as well as practicals in Science subjects at the Senior School Certificate Examinations of the Board from next year. In so far as Secondary School Examination is concerned, status-quo be maintained.

ITEM NO. V:

To consider request from the Principal, Govt. Boys Hr. Secondary School, B-Block, Janak Puri, New Delhi-18 requesting to allow to use Electronic Calculators in Physics in theory/practicals papers of Senior School Certificate Examination of the Board.

Resolved that the request to allow to use Electronic Calculators in Physics be not acceded to.

ITEM NO. VI:

To consider appointment of paper-setters/moderators, examiners for the examinations to be held in 1980.

Resolved that the Chairman be authorised to approve the names of paper-setters, examiners, moderators of question papers, for the examinations to be held in 1980.

ITEM NO. VII:

To fix dates for the examinations of the Board to be held in 1980.

Secretary reported that a few Principals of Residential Schools have desired that the practical examinations be held prior to written papers. The Committee felt that it may not be advisable to hold practical examinations before the written papers as it may adversely affect hill schools and other schools.

ITEM-2 :-

To report the follow-up action on the minutes of the last meeting of  
the Affiliation Committee.

While presenting a report of the follow-up action, the Secretary  
informed the Committee that qualifications for teachers of primary classes have  
since been received from various agencies. The Committee may, therefore, consider  
laying down minimum qualifications for teachers of primary classes for the inde-  
pendent schools having composite affiliation with the Board.

After considering the qualifications laid down by the Kendriya Vidyalaya  
Sangathan, N.D.M.C. and M.C.D. for teachers of primary-classes, the Committee  
resolved that the following qualifications be prescribed for teachers of primary  
classes in the independent schools affiliated with the Board:-

" Senior School Certificate Examination (12-year-course) with a two  
year's teaching certificate or its equivalent. "

(Note- The schools may, however, give preference to graduates as far  
as academic qualifications are concerned.)

It was further desired that the above qualifications be made applicable  
only for fresh recruitments and may not affect the teachers already employed till  
the date of notification of the new qualifications.

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ITEM III:-

To consider desirability of making B.Ed. degree as an essential qualification for teachers of M.I.L./Life Science for classes IX and X in order to bring uniformity in qualifications of teachers for teaching different subjects in classes IX and X.

It was resolved that minimum qualifications be modified to make B.Ed. degree or its equivalent Training degree essential for teachers teaching Modern Indian Languages, Sanskrit and Life Science in Classes IX and X.

ITEM IV:-

To consider relaxation from training degree in respect of those who are holders of a Master's degree in first division for purpose of teaching Classes XI and XII and they may be required to obtain a training degree within three years of appointment, as is done by Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan.

Resolved that the minimum qualifications for PGTs be so modified that a person holding first class Master's degree with 60% marks or above be considered eligible to teach classes XI-XII provided he gets training degree within a period of three years from the date of appointment.

ITEM V:-

To consider if the Post Graduate teachers in Commerce be granted exemption for a further period of three years i.e., upto February, 1984, in view of dearth of trained PGTs in Commerce.

Resolved that keeping in view the shortage of trained Post-Graduate teachers in Commerce and a considerably increased demand for them, M.Coms. may be exempted from training degree for a further period of three years for being eligible to teach classes XI-XII.

ITEM VI:-

To consider matter regarding uniformity and flexibility in the rules for creating Reserve Fund in respect of Schools granted affiliation by the Board.

The Committee noted that the application of existing rules for Reserve Fund involves some invidious distinctions in schools belonging to different States and Union Territories. The Committee, therefore, recommended that the Board may follow its own rules in the matter without reference to the relevant rules of the State Government. It further resolved that the quantum of Reserve Fund by the member schools should be governed as follows: -

(11) The Secretary also placed before the Committee:-

- (a) Inspection Report received in respect of Jyoti Nilayam Ursuline Convent School, Trivandrum, regarding its affiliation for Secondary Classes. It was noted that the school has since already been granted approval of middle-classes syllabus and the Inspection Committee has recommended its affiliation for Secondary classes, the committee, therefore, resolved that affiliation to Secondary classes be granted to the school w.e.f. 1.5.1979 to 30.4.1981.
- (b) The case of Mowbray's Higher Secondary School, Madras, regarding its composite affiliation. It was noted that the school was inspected on 7.2.1978 in respect of its approval of middle-classes syllabus. It was not granted approval due to adverse Inspection Report. The school has since made good a number of deficiencies pointed-out by the Inspection-Committee, the Affiliation Committee was requested to see if the approval for the middle-classes syllabus be granted to the school in the light of representation made by the school about fulfilment of conditions. Looking into the statement made by the School, the Committee recommended that the school be granted approval of middle-classes syllabus and the Inspection of the school be arranged to find out its suitability for affiliation for Secondary classes.
- (c) Matter regarding affiliation to Secondary Classes in respect of Pukhram Higher Secondary School, Madras :-  
It was informed that the school has since been inspected and as per the observations made by the Inspection-Committee, the school has made good all the deficiencies. The only lacuna was that the



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school was granted a 'No Objection Certificate' by the State Government for middle-classes with the remarks that another 'No Objection Certificate' would be needed for Secondary classes from the State Education Department. The Committee observed that the school has since started Class-IX and made good all deficiencies pointed out by the Inspection-Committee and as such may be granted affiliation to Secondary-classes subject to submission of another 'No Objection Certificate' from the State Government for Secondary classes.

ITEM VIII:-

To consider applications received in respect of some schools regarding extension of affiliation/affiliation in additional subjects.

Resolved that (a) Extension of Affiliation and (b) Affiliation in Additional Subjects be granted to the Schools for the period as specified in the list of Schools at Annexure-1.

ITEM IX:-

To consider requests received from some member schools regarding exemption from minimum qualifications in respect of teachers teaching Secondary and Senior Secondary classes.

After exam<sup>ing</sup> each case on merit, it was resolved that exemption from minimum qualifications be granted to the teachers enlisted in Annexure-II as per remarks given against each case.

To consider the recommendations made by the Inspection-Committee of the Board in respect of Morning Star Higher Secondary School, Madras, regarding upgradation of the school w.e.f. 1.5.1979.

Resolved that provisional affiliation for Senior Secondary classes be granted for two years w.e.f. 1.5.1979 subject to the conditions as modified by the office.

ITEM XI:-

To consider the request received from Bhartiya Vidya Bhawan Public School, B.H.E.L., Ramachandrapuram, Hyderabad, for upgradation to classes XI and XII w.e.f. 1.5.1979.

Resolved that the provisional affiliation for Senior Secondary classes be granted to the school for two years w.e.f. 1.5.1979.

As regards request of Dr. Mahale Trust Matriculation School, Ayeravaram, Madras for approval of middle classes syllabus, the Committee noted that the Inspection Committee which visited the school had pointed out a number of deficiencies as for example that the trust running the school is a private family trust; the building is not suitable; the laboratory and library have been housed in a temporary structure; the Head Mistress is not qualified; the source of income is mainly fee and the teachers are not paid as per scale of pay in Tamil Nadu. The Committee accepted the findings of the Inspection team and recommended that school may not be granted approval of middle classes syllabus.

Item-IV

To consider applications received in respect of some schools regarding extension of affiliation/affiliation in additional subjects.

Resolved that (a) extension of affiliation and (b) affiliation in additional subjects be granted to the schools for the period as specified in the list of schools at Annexure-I.

Item-V

To consider requests received from some members schools regarding exemption from the minimum qualifications in respect of teachers teaching Secondary and Senior Secondary Classes.

After examining each case on merit, it was resolved that exemption from minimum qualifications be granted to the teachers/ Heads of institutions listed in Annexure-II as per remarks given against each case.

Item-VI

To report action taken by the Chairman in granting provisional affiliation/extension of affiliation/approval of middle classes syllabus and upgradation of schools etc.

The report of the action taken by the Chairman was received.

Item-VII

To consider granting of autonomy to selected schools affiliated with the Board.

The Chairman explained the background in which the present request for grant of autonomy to RishiValley School Rishivalley and Rajghat School Varanasi run by The Krishnamurthy Foundation has been received. The Committee discussed the proposal and agreed in principle that the Board should grant autonomy to certain institutions so as to allow freedom for experimentation, raise the quality

of education, and to enable the institutions to play a more useful role in the service of the community/neighbourhood. It also discussed briefly the implications for the Board in case certain institutions affiliated with it are made autonomous. It also realized that the linkages of the autonomous institution with the Board in the matter of curriculum and examinations, the extent of supervision required to be exercised by the Board and the criteria to be satisfied before an institution is granted autonomy are matters which need detailed examination. The Committee, therefore, authorized the Chairman to constitute a small working group to consider these parameters of autonomy and to evolve suitable guidelines for the Board in this connection.

The Committee, however, felt that in the meantime the Rishi Valley School may be advised to apply for affiliation with the Board.

#### Item-VIII

To consider letter No. CS/EDN/79 dated 23rd May, 1979 received from the Chief Secretary, Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh, Itanagar requesting that R.K. Mission school P.O. Narottam Nagar, Vile Mahar Kotia, Distt. Tarep, Arunachal Pradesh be upgraded w.e.f. 1.5.1979.

In this connection, a telegram received from the school intimating that all the nine students who appeared in the class Xth examination of the Board had passed was also placed before the Committee. The Committee noted that the school is reputed one and has excellent physical facilities possessing 250 acres of land, well equipped laboratories and library and 8 post graduate teachers. It was resolved that the school be upgraded w.e.f. 1.5.1979 for a period of two years.

The meeting then ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

Record of discussion of the First Meeting of the Advisory Committee of the Open School held on 15th September 1979 at 3.00 p.m. in the Chairman's Room of the Board.

Prof. (Smt.) Madhuri Shah, Shri J.A. Kalyanikrishnan, Shri Anil Bordia, Dr. D.N. Mishra, Brig. D.N. Chibber and Shri A.K. Jalalluddin had expressed their inability to attend the meeting.

The Chairman, Dr. R.P. Singhal welcomed the members and informed them about the steps taken by the CBSE in setting up the Open School viz:

- organized a two-day seminar on Open School system (November 22-23, 1978). Besides Indian participants, the following 3 UNESCO experts also participated:-
  - Dr. Kevin Smith
  - Mr. D. Sewart
  - Mr. Peter Dye
  - Mr. George Culling from British Council also attended the Seminar.
- prepared the Blue Print on Open School.
- appointed Director, Open School on deputation.
- discussed the objectives, target groups etc. of Open School in the meeting taken by the Education Secretary to the Govt. of India on 28th July, 1979.
- prepared a draft of scheme of studies for the Open School.

2. The members of the Advisory Committee discussed at length the draft of the scheme of studies (Annexure 1) for the Open School. They approved the draft with the following

suggestions:

(a) Although the courses of the Open School may not be identical with the existing courses offered by the C.B.S.E., they should be equivalent so that the Open School Certificate may not be looked at as a second-rate certificate.

(b) With respect to entry requirements, the Open School need not restrict admission to such students who are VIII pass. It was felt that it is not advisable to put such a restriction as it does not go well with the Philosophy of Open School.

(c) In the list of subjects, the words 'More subjects can be added to the list as and when considered necessary' may be added. In the beginning, however, the Number of subjects may be limited to about seven in view of the limited time available for making necessary preparations.

(d) Central Board of Secondary Education should conduct separate examination for the students of Open School so that special requirements of the learners are met. (There was a suggestion that there should be a time ceiling for students to qualify Secondary School Examination but the general opinion was that putting such a time ceiling would not be keeping with the Open School ideology.

3. The programme suggested for developing self-learning material for pre-primary teachers on know your students was discussed. It was felt that although the programme is good and useful, the present strength of the Open School may not permit it to take up this programme. It was, therefore, proposed that the programme may be dropped.

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4. The members were of the opinion that before taking up other programmes given in the working paper it will be better if the Open School examines some of the material, the Centre for Educational Technology has.
  5. It was suggested that material which may help lesson-writers may be developed by the Open School.
  6. The members discussed the institutional structure of the Open School. The general consensus was that the requirements of staff and institutional set up will have to be related to the enrolment which at the moment was rather uncertain. It may not be necessary to have all the staff in one go. It was decided that the proposals for 1979-80 may be considered by the Finance Committee of the Board.
  7. It was suggested that to streamline the future course of action the C.B.S.E. may think of preparing a project document on the Open School.
  8. Throughout the meeting a suggestion which constantly came up was that all care should be taken to see that instructional material, prepared by the Open School, should be of high quality. The Open School should invite the best possible persons to write courses and should also seek the help of graphic artists in developing the course material.
- The meeting then ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

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It may, therefore, be advisable that the CBSE should think of developing a curriculum for the Open School which is relevant to the target groups. Instead of fitting the new target population of students/learners into the existing mould of curriculum, it may be educationally sound if the curriculum is flexible and is able to meet the characteristics of the Open Learning System.

## II. Age

Admission shall be open to a learner who has completed the age of 14 years on 30th September of the year in which one gets enrolled oneself for the Open School. There would be no upper age limit.

## III. The Proposed Scheme of Studies.

It is proposed that a scheme of studies for the Open School should give students an opportunity to choose the subjects of their liking from a given list of subjects.

The students may be asked to select for the Secondary School Examination five subjects, one of which will be a language, from the following, subject to the condition specified under N.B.

1. Hindi
2. English
3. Mathematics
4. Science
5. Social Science
6. Economics
7. Commerce
8. Home Science
9. Agriculture
10. Military Science.

N.B. If a student offers two languages i.e. English and Hindi, he will be required to offer three other subjects. If a student offers only one language out of English and Hindi, he will be required to offer four other subjects.

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Annexure

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DEVELOPING A SCHEME OF STUDIES  
FOR THE OPEN SCHOOL

1. Introduction

The Open School has been set up under the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi. Its objective is to offer distance teaching to off-campus, drop-out students and working adults, through printed material and occasional personal contact programmes, etc.

The first batch of the students will be enrolled with the Open School in 1980. The first Secondary Exam. may be held in March 1982.

The Ministry of Education, Government of India while approving the Open School Project has desired that the curriculum for the Open School learners should be suitably designed keeping in view their special needs.

It is feared that the existing scheme of studies of the CBSE for Secondary School Examination which is meant for the regular and institutional students may not be very suitable for the students of the Open School. That scheme was conceived for:

- a) regular students getting face to face teaching in the formal system of education.
- b) for equipping them for university education;
- c) for students who are not yet in the world of work; and
- d) for students who must cover the course within a fixed time.

The Open School students, on the other hand, would largely come from the neglected and economically deprived sections of the community. Some of them may be working adults having experience in particular trade or vocation. Further, these students will not receive regular face to face teaching, and most of them may not join universities. Because of certain constraints on them, they may like to pursue their studies at their own pace and convenience.



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Proposed Scheme of Examination

1. A student/learner may appear at the Board's examination in one or two subjects, subject to a limit of five subjects at a time. When he passes any five subjects he will get a certificate of having passed the Secondary School Examination of the Board. The pass in five subjects may be obtained simultaneously or in part. In the latter case the credits subjectwise obtained will be accumulated until a pass in five subjects is reached within a period not more than five years.
2. If a student wants to take an additional subject after having passed 5 subjects he may be permitted to do so. An additional certificate of pass in such a subject will be issued in the event of the student being declared successful in that subject.
3. The taking up of the Secondary School Examination should depend upon the time, a student can devote on his studies. A VIII class pass student may clear the Secondary School Examination in 2 years of having passed class VIII, or he may take more time in clearing the examination (5 subjects). He may also be allowed to take it in one year depending upon his age, experience and capacity to undergo the studies.
4. If a student fails at the March examination, he may be allowed to re-appear in one or two subjects at July/August examination in each year.
5. A student will be deemed to have passed in a subject if he gets at least 33% marks at the Board's examination.

V. Proposing Bridge Courses

The philosophy of the Open School is to build as much flexibility and openness in the system as possible. While it is expected that normally the students/learners who seek admission to the Open School

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will have passed at least class VIII, the Open School may admit such students also who have not passed VIII class or such students who do not have any formal qualification, or qualification less than class VIII. For such students the Open School would develop some bridge/entry/preparatory courses to enable them to take up the course meant for class VIII passed students.

**VI. Fees**

A student will be required to pay a sum of Rs. 25/- per subject as tuition fees subject to a maximum of Rs 125/-

The fees can be paid in two instalments, if the student is appearing in more than one subject.

If a student wants to appear in an additional subject he will be required to pay an extra fee of Rs. 25/-. A student will also be required to pay an enrolment fee of Rs. 5/-. Suitable fee may be prescribed for the preparatory courses depending upon the number of units the individual requires.

Scheduled Caste/Scheduled tribe candidates appearing from States/Union Territories may seek exemption from payment of tuition fees subject to getting reimbursement from the concerned States/ Union Territories.

Overseas candidates will be required to pay Rs. 200/- as tuition fee (Rs. 40/- subject) plus postal charges.

**VI. Remuneration to Lesson Writer**

A sum of Rs. 100/- per lesson may be paid to a lesson writer. An honorarium of Rs.200/- may be paid to the Course Team Chairman who will edit and vet the lessons of the course.

The Chairman welcomed the members and invited them for a discussion on various items of the Agenda.

Item No. I

To receive a report of the follow up action on the minutes of the last meeting of the Finance Committee held on 1st March, 1979.

Report of the follow up action was recorded.

Item No. II

To consider re-appropriation of funds for 1978-79:

- (i) Rs. 85,000/- (Rupees Eighty five thousand only)

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under head 'I' and sub-head '10' (Leave Travel Concession and Excursion-Cum-educational trips).

- (ii) Rs 500/- (Rupees five hundred only) under head 'II' and sub-head '14' (Hosting of COBSE Conference and Subscription).

The committee resolved that an additional allocation of Rs 85,000/- under the head 'I' and sub-head '10' (Leave Travel Concession and Excursion-Cum-Educational trips) be made out of the savings from other heads of expenditure. The committee also approved an increase in the budget head II sub-head '14' by Rs 500/-.

Item No. III

To consider allocation of funds upto Rs 5 lacs for the initial expenditure on Open School Project which has been approved by the Board/Ministry of Education.

The committee resolved that an allocation of Rs one lakh may be made for the Open School Project in the Board's budget for the current year. The Budgetary units may be worked out at the time of Revised Estimates. The committee desired that Open School Project should have a separate budget head as well as separate accounting. The committee desired that the project be launched only after formal approval of the Ministry of Education has been received. They were, however, informed that the Ministry has already approved the project in principle vide their letter no. F 2 13/78-Sch.5 dated 7.3.1979.

Item No. IV

To consider adoption of Government of India Rules for retirement benefits to the employees of the Board.

The committee desired that the matter may be referred to the Financial Adviser, Ministry of Education on file.

Item No. V

To consider adoption of Government of India Rules for Gratuity to the employees of the Board.

As in case of item IV, the committee desired that the matter may be referred to the Financial Adviser on file.

Item No. VI

To consider adoption of Govt. of India Rules for advances for the purchase of conveyance to the employees of the Board.

The Finance Committee was informed of the existing ceilings imposed by the Board on the grant of advance for the purpose of conveyance by the employees of the Board. The committee recommended that the limits for conveyance advance as in force in the Govt. of India may be followed by the Board.

Item No. VII

To consider grant of special pay to Upper Division Clerks, as is permissible in Government of India.

The committee felt that there is no need to grant special pay of Rs 35/- to a limited number of Senior clerks in the Board particularly because, unlike Government of India, the promotion at this level in the the Board is much faster and there is seldom any case of stagnation.

Item No. VIII

To consider the representation of class IV employees of the Board for revision of rates of remuneration for assisting in the handling of answer books at the time of checking and secrecy work.

After considering various aspects of the situation and the recent increase of 15 to 20 per cent in some other rates of remuneration for various item connected with examinations of the Board, the committee resolved that class IV employees of the Board may be paid @ Rs 9/- instead of the existing Rs 7.50 per 100 candidates.

Item No. IX

To consider representation of Shri S. N. Gupta regarding filling up the posts of Superintendents through direct recruitment.

The committee was not convinced that there is sufficient ground for changing the existing recruitment rules for the post of Superintendents.

Item No. X

To consider the request of the Indian Adult Education New Delhi for enhancement of rent for the first and second floors of the building occupied by the Board from Rs 6,000/- to Rs 12,000/- per month.

The committee felt that no addition in rent could be made till the Indian Adult Education Association provides necessary facilities. They desired that the Board may request the Association to provide the same before their request for increase in the rent is considered.

Item No. XI

To consider recommendations of the Ministry of Education regarding encadrement of Posts in the Board for the purpose of promotion.

The committee agreed largely with the recommendations of the Financial Adviser regarding encadrement of posts in the Board. The recommendations of the Committee are as follows:

- (i) LIBRARIAN: As the qualifications needed for the post are quite distinct from the post of Superintendent or P.S. to Chairman it may not be encadred with the post carrying similar scales.
- (ii) STATISTICAL ASSISTANT: In view of computerisation of examination processing there is no need for the category of Statistical Assistant. The present incumbent may be considered eligible for promotion to the post of Superintendent alongwith Head Asstts./Technical Asstts., as per recruitment rules of the Board and the post may be abolished when the present incumbent vacates it.
- (iii) PROOF READER: As in the case of Statistical Assistant, the present incumbent in the post of Proof Reader may be considered eligible for promotion to the post of Head Assistants alongwith Senior Clerks in accordance with the recruitment rules of the Board and the post may be abolished when he vacates it.
- (iv) LIBRARY CLERK: May be encadred with Junior Clerks for purposes of promotion.
- (v) ELECTRICIAN CUM ASSTT. CARE TAKER: May remain as a single man cadre. The Board may, however, consider giving him a higher scale personal to him subject to his being found deserving after assessment when he reaches the stage of stagnation.
- (vi) TECHNICAL POSTS LIKE P.S. TO CHAIRMAN P.A. TO SECRETARY, STENOGRAPHERS, STENO-TYPISTS

As long as seniority overwhelmingly determines promotion the cadre of personal staff comprising Steno-typists, Stenographers, P.A. & P.S. may be kept separate from the general cadre. However, for such of the general cadre posts where promotion by selection is provided in the recruitment rules, persons holding corresponding posts in the personal staff cadre may be considered eligible for consideration alongwith the general cadre posts.

To report Chairman's orders:

  3. The Chairman in his opening remarks extended  
a warm welcome to all the members. He specially welcomed

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the new members viz. Shri S. Sathyan, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Education and Culture, New Delhi, Sh. H.H. Pawar, Commissioner, Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, New Delhi, Sh. A.N. Dhawan, Secretary, Sangeet Natak Academy, New Delhi, Shri K.S. Gramopadhye, Principal, G.H.S. School, Panaji, Goa, and Shri K.N. De, Director (Trg), Ministry of Defence, South Block, New Delhi. He introduced Fr. T.V. Kunnunkal who was attending the meeting of the Board for the first time after having taken over as Vice-Chairman of the Board, and extended him a hearty welcome.

He then informed the House of the outgoing members viz. Dr. D.N. Misra, Prof. U.N. Singh, Shri Mohinder Singh (Delhi University), Shri H.S. Guleti, Smt. Rajendra Kaur, Shri Joseph Barrios, Shri Mahendra Singh (Defence) and Shri J.N. Dayal. He appreciated the contribution made by them in the deliberations of the Board from time to time. The Board desired that the appreciation be recorded.

#### Seminars

4. The Chairman then apprised the members of the salient activities of the Board since the last meeting of the Governing Body. He informed the House that under the programme of curriculum development a number of seminars and workshops were organized by the Board in the preceding months and some were planned to be organised in the near future. He gave a brief report

about the seminar on School Management organized for Principals of Schools in collaboration with the National Institute for Educational Planning & Administration in Delhi, a workshop for Science Teachers held in Lovedale and a seminar for teachers of English held in Delhi with the help of the N.C.E.R.T. He also made a mention of the seminar for Science Teachers to be held in September in which 3 British Experts would be participating; 2 Seminars for teachers of Mathematics in which 2 British Experts would be participating under the approved programme and a seminar on Project Technology and a workshop for training of paper-setters.

Advance Training for Teachers & Officers.

5. The Chairman further added that the Board has always been eager to take advantage of the innovations going on currently in the field of education particularly in the advanced countries. The officers of the Board are being deputed to get training in these fields from time to time. Two officers of the Board Shri D.L. Nangia and Shri H.K. Gupta were sent to the United Kingdom this year who were undergoing training in England in the field of curriculum development and evaluation techniques respectively. Besides a number of teachers are also being sent abroad by the Board for getting advanced training in the respective areas. In this regard, he informed that nine additional Head-examiners were sent to U.K to get training in the modern methods of evaluation. 10 teachers of Science went to U.K in

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February 1980 under the Science Teaching Improvement Programme. Besides, the next batch of Mathematics teachers is due to go to U.K for getting training in Maths. Education under the CMET programme. This time, he added, the Board has also selected on behalf of the Ministry of Education Mathematics teachers from other States for training under CMET programme abroad who will be proceeding to U.K in September next.

#### Publications

6. Since the last meeting of the Governing Body of the Board, a number of publications have been brought out by the Board, chief among them were 'Project Technology', 'How to Manage School Efficiently', 'Towards Improving Evaluation', and Folders on CBSE and Open School.

#### Open School

7. The Chairman further informed that the open school has been set up and started functioning at H-24, Green Park Extension, New Delhi. Tutors have been appointed and work of curriculum development is in progress. A six-day orientation course was being organised for training of lesson writers in August, 1980.

#### Visitors

8. The Chairman further informed the House that visitors from abroad and also from sister organisations in the country paid visits to the Board's office and exchanged views on various issues relating to school education.

In this connection, he gave a brief account of the visits of Mr. P. J. Collister, Educational Adviser to Overseas, D.V. & Co., U.K., London, Mr. Gaston D. V. & Co., Indo-Belgium Cultural Exchange Programme, Mr. T. A. Royal, Principal, Wellington High School, New Zealand. A study team from the Board of Secondary Education, Rajasthan consisting of its Secretary and other educationists visited the Board and studied its examination system and organizational set up to revamp their own.

9. With a view to sharing the experiences of each other, the Board is also organising a seminar on "Management of Examinations" for the Secretaries of all the Boards of Secondary Education in the country in August, 1981 in collaboration with the M.T.S.P.A. and the CBSE.

#### Autonomy to Schools :

10. About the proposal to grant autonomy to certain schools the Chairman added that a Working Group of the Board met in February, 1980 and chalked out a draft outline of the Autonomy programme. He added that further work was in progress.

11. The Chairman also informed that a meeting of Principals of South Indian independent schools affiliated to CBSE was held in Coimbatore which was attended by him. He informed that the meeting was helpful in

clarifying the various issues/doubts of the schools.

12. He added that a new school in Doha has come to the fold of the Board recently. During the course of his visit to Doha and Dubai, the Indian High School, Dubai has submitted a Bank Draft of Rs. 23,944.10, for the Prime Minister's Relief Fund. The draft was later on presented to the Prime Minister by the Union Education Minister.

#### Seminars & Workshops

and

The Council of Boards of Secondary Education in India with the support of Central Board and expertise of the National Institute of Educational Planning & Administration, New Delhi organised a three-day seminar from August 4-6, 1980 on Managerial Aspects of School Education Boards in India for Chairmen and Secretaries of the Boards. 22 Chairmen and Secretaries from 18 Boards participated in the seminar. The main objectives of the seminar were to discuss managerial aspects of school education Boards; and to identify academic and management problems relating to school examination system etc.. Prof. M.V. Mathur, Director, NIEPA inaugurated the seminar. Shri P. Sabanayagam, then Secretary, Union Education Ministry & Culture was good enough to preside over the closing session wherein participants discussed issues connected with role identification of the Boards for qualitative improvement of education which is going to be the prime theme of the next Annual Meet of CBSE. In this connection a detailed report of the seminar has also been brought out.

#### Courses for the OPEN School

A Six day Orientation Course was organised for Writers of Instructional material from August 6-12, 1980 at the Open School of the Board. Shri P. Sabanayagam inaugurated the Course. The Course was attended by 19 participants besides Tutors of the Open School. Two delegates from the Board of Secondary Education, Assam also attended the course. Another Programme for the Chairmen of the Course Teams was held on 15th & 16th September, 1980 wherein their role in preparing instructional materials were discussed in the light of the objects of the Open School.

#### Workshop for Science Teachers at Hyderabad Public School

and

As a follow up of the Science Education Training that some teachers of the Board received at Chelsea, United Kingdom, a workshop was organised at Hyderabad Public School, Ramanthapur, Hyderabad, from September 1 to 11, 1980. The Education Secretary of Andhra Pradesh inaugurated the workshop. Thirty eight Post Graduate Teachers in Science from all over India attended the workshop. Three British Experts and Indian teachers who had earlier got training under CBSE Sponsorship served as resource persons.

#### Workshops for Mathematics Teachers

Mathematics teachers from the Northern Region, as a follow up of the CAMET Mathematics Education Programme in U.K. are attending a workshop at B.S.F. Hr. Sec. School, Jullundur from 22nd to 26th September, 1980. Prof. A.C. Bajpai, Director, CAMET.,



U.K. in addition to Indian Resource Persons who had earlier been trained, are attending the workshop.

A Second Workshop also under the direction of Prof. A.C. Bajpai will take place in Bhubaneswar at the Regional College of Education from 29th September to 3rd October, 1980. Mathematics teachers from U.P. Bihar, West Bengal are expected to participate in the aforesaid workshop.

#### Meeting with the Principals of the Schools

A meeting with some local Principals was held in the Ministry of Education on 1.8.1980. Shri P. Sahasrayagam, Education Secretary, Govt. of India presided over the meeting. The matters of common interest with a view to having a better co-ordination were discussed. About 20 Principals besides the Director of Schools, Ministry of Education <sup>Chairman</sup> and Secretary Central Board of Secondary Education took part in the meeting.

#### Other Academic Activities

The SUPW was introduced last year in the schools affiliated with the Board. With a view to judging its effective use the Board has circulated a questionnaire amongst all the member-schools. The responses when received will be analysed and the results placed before the House in due course.

A Working Group is meeting from September 29 to October 3, 1980 at Delhi Public School, Mathura Road, New Delhi to develop Sample Question Papers in Science 'A' and Mathematics 'B' for Class X examinations of the Board in collaboration with the NCERT.. 20 teachers including NCERT experts participated in the Working Group. The Sample Question Papers will be made available to the schools as soon as these are printed.

Action has been initiated to develop Instructional objectives for different subjects in the curriculum with the help of NCERT..

#### Use of Board's syllabi & Courses and Text Books

At the request of Nagaland Board of School Education, the Central Board has allowed the use of its syllabus and text-books in English and a few other subjects for classes I-X & X in the Nagaland Schools.

#### Publications

The Board has brought out two publications on Application of Mathematics viz; Mathematics-Biology Inter-relations and Applications of Calculus in Economics etc., which are being circulated to the member-schools for their benefit.

A report of the Seminar on Science Education held at Bhopal, entitled "Imparting Science Education Effectively" has also been published and being circulated to the member-schools. It includes a few chapters on Curriculum Guide which is being prepared by the CBSE Science Teachers at Chelsea College, London.

'Guided Reading' a collection of stories has been newly brought out in collaboration with CIEFL for students of Class XII, taking the new course in English.

Syllabi & Question Papers for Senior School Certificate Examinations 1982 have been published and made available to the schools.

#### Eleventh Meeting of COBSE

The Board is also helping COBSE, through its Secretariat placed in the Board to organise its Eleventh Annual meeting from October 8-11, 1980 at Mainital, U.P.. The Conference is being hosted by the Board of High School & Intermediate Education, U.P. Allahabad.

#### Merit Scholarship Examination

The Second Merit Scholarship Examination was held on 25th September, 1980 at 17 centres throughout India. This examination was previously conducted by the Govt. of India. Under this scheme, 500 scholarships are awarded every year to the students of age group 11-12 years whose parents income does not exceed Rs 500/- per month.

#### Autonomy to Schools

A few members of the Working Group set up to consider grant of autonomy to some of the schools affiliated to the Board visited Banasthali Vidyapith (an autonomous institution) affiliated to the Rajasthan Board of Secondary Education and later had discussions with members of the Rajasthan Board of Secondary Education at Ajmer. The Vice-Chairman, Fr. T.V. Kunnunkal, gave general impressions about the discussions had with the Vidyapith and the Rajasthan Board authorities by way of an interim report.

#### Item III

Resolved that the recommendations made by the Affiliation

Committee at its meeting held on 6th September, 1980 be approved. However, under resolution no. XI of the Affiliation Committee, it was desired that while communicating the decision to Indo-Tibetan Border Police, Air Headquarters and Border Security Force about recognising their Unit Schools as feeder schools it may be clarified to these organisations that this provision does not confer any right on the parents or candidates to claim automatic admission to Kendriya Vidyalayas and other schools affiliated with CBSE. They, however will be considered eligible for admission subject to the rules operative in these institutions/organisations.

Item IV

To approve the recommendations of the Examination Committee made at its meeting held on September, 9, 1980.

Resolved that the recommendations made by the Examination Committee at its meeting held on 9th September, 1980 be approved. However with reference to its Resolution no. IV it was observed by some members that Science Course A was found to be very tough by the students. In view of the fact that it is general education/the Secondary stage, the question of having two types of courses in Science and Mathematics be reviewed. The matter may be referred to the Curriculum Committee for further examination.

Item V

To approve the revised Budget estimates for 1979-80 (1st October 1979 to 30th September 1980) and Budget estimates for 1980-81 (1st October 1980 to 30th September 1981) including those for the Open School and other recommendations of the Finance Committee made by it at its meeting held on 22.9.1980.

Secretary informed the House that as per the observations of the Finance Committee vide resolution no. III, the provision for allowances of different categories of staff shown at items 4, 5 and 6 of the sub-head Establishment has since been re-checked and has been found to be correct. He further informed the House that the provision for cost of paper shown under item 20 of the sub-head II has also been re-assessed in the light of the existing stock of paper with the Board together with the future requirements of the paper and has been found to be in order.

Resolved that the revised budget estimates for 1979-80 (1st October to 30th September, 1980) and budget estimates for 1980-81 (1st October 1980 to 30th September 1981) as recommended by the Finance Committee including those for the Open School be approved.

While considering the other recommendations of the Finance Committee, the House took note of the demonstration staged by some members of the Board before the start of the meeting of the Board on 10.9.1980 at the premises of Indian Medical Association where the meeting was held. It also took note of their demands for increased facilities in regard to W.C., Medical Facilities, Service Rules etc..

Chairman informed the House that the representatives of the staff earlier been given very patient and sympathetic hearing by him, Vice-Chairman and Secretary from time to time. The Board too had been very considerate in recently granting additional House Rent Allowance as also other benefits. He requested the House to consider the demands of the staff sympathetically. The House felt that since it has always been sympathetic and will always be considerate to the demands of the staff, the agitational attitude adopted by the staff was not appreciable. Shri S. Sathyam, Joint Secretary (Schools), Ministry of Education & Culture had a talk with the representatives of the members of the staff and fixed up a meeting with them in his office.

After discussing the recommendations of the Finance Committee made by it at its meeting held on 22.9.1980 and the demands made by the staff, the Board resolved that the recommendations of the Finance Committee be approved subject to the following modifications:

- (i) The recommendation relating to enhanced rates of conveyance allowance under resolution no. IV of the Finance Committee be approved. The question, however, may be further examined by the Finance Committee in the light of O.T.A. rules of the Government.
- (ii) ✓ The recommendation relating to drafting of service rules was approved. However it was desired that till such time new rules are framed, the Govt. Rules in respect of suspension, punishment and dismissal may henceforward be followed. ✓
- (iii) ✓ Ministry of Education be requested to re-consider the grant of increase in H.R.A. by 5% to the employees of the Board with retrospective effect i.e. from the date of issue of the relevant order by the Govt. instead of making it effective from 10.9.1980 as decided by it.
- (iv) ✓ As regards rationalisation of length of service and other conditions required under various categories of posts in the Recruitment Rules of the Board, Chairman was authorised to appoint a committee including one or two members of the Board to look into the matter and give its recommendations.

Resolved that the report be recorded.

Item VII

To report action taken by the Chairman regarding introduction of Insurance as an elective subject in the Academic/Vocational stream from the academic session 1980-81 at plus two stage.

A few members wanted to know the position regarding eligibility of Physical Education teachers who are D.P.Ed's with 10 years experience to teach Physical Education in classes XI & XII.

It was explained that at the instance of Ministry of Education the matter was considered by the Board's committee of courses in Physical Education which observed that M.P.Ed., should be the basic qualification for a P.G.T. in Physical Education. This was communicated to the Ministry of Education. If the Ministry of Education desires the Board to reconsider the matter, the same will be done.

Resolved that the report be recorded.

The meeting then ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

(ii) Examiners' Reports of All-India/Delhi Senior School Certificate Examinations and All-India/Delhi Secondary School Examinations in 1980 were compiled and edited and they have also been published.
