The Chairman, CBSE expressed gratitude of the House to the outgoing members and welcomed the new members and requested all the members for self introduction. Thereafter he briefed the House about the position of the CBSE in various States and UTs in India and Abroad and made an elaborate presentation covering the following:

PRESENTATION ON CBSE INITIATIVES Ì۷

The Chairman, CBSE, made a presentation giving extensive picture on progress achieved in various areas during the last 3-4 months.

ACADEMIC WEBSITE: A new micro Site www.cbseacademic.in has been internally developed and integrated to the main web site of CBSE www.cbse.nic.in with the objective to provide information to the stake holders on various academic activities of the Board. The web site also contains a periodic Newsletter.

- ii. **AFFILIATION**: The Number of schools affiliated with the Board as on 31.05.2012 was 12832 and this number has increased to 13296 as on 1st September, 2012; as such 464 new schools were added to the list of affiliated schools with the Board during said period.
- iii. **EXAMINATION:**The presentation covered the total number of candidates registered, appeared, passed, pass percentage and number of schools sponsored their students in the secondary school (Class X) and Senior School Certificate Examination (Class XII) 2012 as well as the Class XII compartment and Class X improvement examinations 2012.

The activities introduced for 2013 examination such as extension of CCE Scheme to the schools affiliated to the Board upto Secondary level, Problem Solving Assessment in classes IX & XI with the scheme of 'PSA' was elaborately narrated in the presentation.

The Examinations of Class X & XII will commence from 1st March, 2013 and the list of candidates will be accepted from schools online. The registration of students of Class IX & XI are also made only online. The Board will provide separate question papers without visual input in subjects Physics, Chemistry, Biology & Mathematics for Class XII in 2013 examination for visually impaired candidates.

- iv. NATIONAL ELIGIBILITY CUM ENTRANCE TEST (NEET)-UG 2013: The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India, entrusted the CBSE with the responsibility for conducting NEET-UG from the academic session 2013-2014. The CBSE will conduct the first NEET-UG examination for admission to 100% seats in the Medical & Dental Colleges under the jurisdiction of Medical Council of India and Dental Council of India on 05th May, 2013. This Examination will be held at about 80 cities in India and Abroad based on a common syllabus prescribed by the Medical Council of India.
- v. JOINT ENTRANCE EXAMINATION (JEE)-2013: JEE for entrance to under graduate programs in Engineering will be held in two parts from 2013. All candidates are required to appear in JEE (Main) and top about 1,50,000 candidates will appear in JEE (Advanced) for admission to IITs. The scheme of examination and qualifying/ selection criteria of JEE was also elaborated during presentation.
- vi. CENTRAL TEACHER ELIGIBILITY TEST (CTET): The Examination was held on 29th January, 2012 and 05th May, 2012 at 1269 centers in 72 cities in Indiaabout 8.16 Lac candidates

registered for this examination. The next CTET Examination will be held on 18th November, 2012.

vii. ACADEMICS AND TRAINING:

To enhance the academic competence the CBSE has undertaken the following steps:

a. English Novels have been incorporated in the syllabi and course of Secondary and Senior Secondary Classes from the academic session 2012-13 and 2013-14.

- b. Assessment of Speaking and Listening Skills (ASL) has been introduced at Secondary and Senior Secondary Levels from the academic session 2012-13 with 10% weightage in Summative Assessment—I and Summative Assessment-II. CBSE will run a Pilot Project of ASL in the selected schools from NCR.
- c. Value Education: To integrate Value Education with the Syllabus in each class and include specific activities to be undertaken at an age appropriate level, CBSE has introduced Value Education in schools. The Board has developed teaching material for Value Education in the form of a kit based on the framework of 'Education for Values in Schools' brought out by NCERT. The Values Education Kit comprises of A Handbooks for Teachers, Value Card and a CD of compilation of songs highlighting contemporary social issues and concerns.

During presentation, the Chairman requested the Director (Academic) as well as Mrs. Ameeta Mulla Wattal, Principal, Springdale School, Pusa Road, New Delhi, Who is one of the key players in developing the Kit to give a detailed presentation on the work done by them. The Chairman informed the House that the Central Vigilance Commission had also advised the Board for developing the material on Value Education and the Board will introduce value based questions in the Summative Assessment –II in classes IX to XII from the session 2012-13. After watching their presentation, the House appreciated the ideas and efforts put in by all those involved.

d. Life Skills Manual and New Course 'Knowledge Traditions & Practices of India': As part of Academic initiatives, CBSE has revised Life Skills Manual for teachers of Classes VI to VIII. Also, a new course titled 'Knowledge Traditions and Practices of India' has been introduced, on a pilot basis, as an elective for classes XI & XII. The objective of the Course is to provide a broad overview of Indian Knowledge Traditions which in

turn would engage students with a sense of exploration and discovery.

As this course aims to introduce knowledge in various disciplines; a trans-disciplinary approach in many fields has been adopted in the course.

- e. Vocational Education: The CBSE is offering 33 Vocational Packages consisting of 97 subjects in 313 affiliated schools in India and 11 schools in 05 countries abroad. The coverage of student is 37,095 approx. In the light of NVEQF, CBSE has initiated a process of reframing its existing Vocational Courses to ensure mobility of students and their demand in industry. In this direction, Curriculum of many Vocational Courses has been revised with new scheme of studies. New courses have also been introduced. Also, the Board is working for the promotion of short term skill based programmes, on pilot basis, for the drop outs and female students in collaboration with professional organizations.
- f. CBSE Group Mathematical Olympiad and Heritage India Quiz: The 16th CBSE Group Mathematical Olympiad will be held on 2nd December, 2012 at selected venues in different parts of the country. Any student studying in classes IX to XII can participate in the competition. Top 30 students selected from CBSE Mathematical Olympiad will participate in Indian National Mathematical Olympiad.

The Heritage India Quiz,2012 will be conducted in three phases from October to December, 2012. This year, the event is being coordinated with AETN 18 Media Private Limited. The CBSE has also initiated a micro site on Heritage Education at http://heritage.cbseacademic.in to help teachers to explore, learn and empower their students with local heritage and connect them to National and World Heritage Sites.

g. IGNITE- 2012 & Student Global Aptitude Index (SGAI) – 2013:

To harness the creative and innovative talent of school children, CBSE in collaboration with National Innovation Foundation and Honey Bee Network will conduct a National Level competition of students in the year 2012. The awards will be announced on October 15, 2012, the birthday of Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam which is also celebrated as Childrens' Creativity and Innovation Day.

SGAI-2013 will be held on Sunday, 20th January, 2013. It is a tool of assessment with the purpose of empowering adolescents with 'Self Knowledge in terms of Aptitude, Interest and Personality for class X students'. In the year 2012 the Himachal Pradesh Board of Higher Education also approached the CBSE to conduct SGAI-2012 for its Secondary School Students in 12 Districts.

- h. Training Programmes: For improving Standards of Education, the Board has organized the following Training Programmes:
 - i) Introduction Programmes for the Principals of newly affiliated schools
 - ii) Training Programmes on the use of the Formative Assessment Manuals
 - iii) Mentoring and Monitoring Training Programmes
 - iv) Capacity Building Programmes on CCE for the teachers in collaboration with various private agencies.
 - v) Strategic Leadership and Management Training programmes in collaboration with various management institutes like IIM, IIFT, ETMA, NUEPA as well as by CBSE independently.
 - vi) Parents Advocacy Prorammes.

Besides above, CBSE is also proposed to continue Training Programme on Effective School Management and Leadership.

viii. MENTORS & TEACHERS AWARDS 2011:

The CBSE honoured 15 Mentors and 32 teachers for their excellent contribution in the field of education on the eve of Teacher's Day. The Mentors Award was introduced by the Board for the first time for educators for their efforts to promote Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation.

ix. PUBLIC RELATIONS:

Activities of Public Relations Unit which included monitoring of public grievance redressal, RTI Cases and CBSE Counseling Programme were informed to the members.

x. SCHOOL QUALITY ACCREDITION AND ASSESSMENT:

To assess schools through standardized instruments and process of internal and external assessment for encouraging sustained qualitative enhancement, the CBSE has decided to introduce School Quality Accreditation and Assessment (SQAA). The Board has empanelled 12 agencies for the pilot project and

each agency will assess one school each to complete the pilot project. After completion of the pilot, these agencies will be further shortlisted before starting the Accreditation Programme for all the Schools. The schools will be assessed on the 07 domains and sub-domains of SQAA and on completion of the project, each agency will come out with School Quality Enhancement Report (SQER) and School Quality Assessment and Accreditation Report(SQAAR).

xi. CBSE-i

The CBSE-i has 24 schools in 08 countries. The CBSE-i curriculum was extended to classes II, VI and X in the academic year 2011-12 in continuation to classes I and IX in the academic year 2010-11.

For the session 2012-13, the Board has extended the CBSE-I curriculum for the classes III, VII and XI.

It will be further extended to Classes IV, VIII and XII from the next academic year.

Looking at the success of CBSE Curriculum, the Board has decided to offer CBSE-i Curriculum in India also, on pilot basis, to about 70 schools representing all regions of CBSE and the Curriculum will be offered in Primary (I/II/III) Classes in India.

- V. The Chairman concluded the presentation on the initiatives already undertaken by the CBSE and invited attention of the House on the following new initiatives to be undertaken by the Board and also opened the House for discussions:
 - a. Commencing of Advanced Courses in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Mathematics at Senior Secondary level to identify skill and aptitude in students who want to pursue higher studies in these subjects.
 - b. Establishment of an Institute for School Leadership Programmes and Training.
 - c. Produce Activity Manuals for the teachers and students of classes I to VIII.
 - d. To institutionalize CCE, making provision for appointment of a CCE Coordinator in every affiliated school with an honorarium of Rs.2000/- p.m. to be paid by the CBSE.
 - e. Pilot online assessment of co-scholastic areas.
 - Starting assessment processes for elementary classes.
 - g. Commencement of Excellence awards to schools.
 - h. No detention policy under Right to Education Act and its impact on quality.
 - i. Introduction of Open Book Exam as part of CCE.

j. Giving Certificate of affiliation to all Independent schools affiliated to the Board.

k. Introduction of video lectures for students of Secondary and Senior Secondary Classes with the help of IITs and NITs.

I. Identification of Skill Knowledge Partner under National Vocational Educational Quality Framework.

Commencement of Advanced Courses:

Dr. Savita M Dutta, Director, Campus of Open Learning, University of Delhi welcomed all the positive steps planned to be taken up by the CBSE. She, however, wanted to know the level of Advance Courses planned in the subjects Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Mathematics.

The Chairman, CBSE clarified that the Board is planning to introduce Core as well as Elective Courses in consultation with IITs and other premier educational institutions in these subjects to help student avail more choices at these levels. This will also bridge the gap between requirement at graduate level and level at Senior Secondary stage.

Mrs. Vidushi Chaturvedi, Directorate of Education, NDMC, New Delhi pointed out that students are not able to compete and succeed in the entrance examinations without attending coaching classes and the CBSE may find out the reasons of the same and address the issue.

The Chairman, CBSE replied that with the introduction of Advance Courses, talented students are expected to succeed in the entrance examinations without the help of coaching institutions as these courses are meant to encourage students in these subject areas.

Dr. Dinesh Kumar, Additional Commissioner (Academics& Admn.), Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan was of the opinion that the present courses in the subjects Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Mathematics are not upto the level of IITs and if Advanced Courses are introduced, students of right aptitude may opt for those.

Mr. Chanchal Singh, Deputy Director (Sch.Edu.), Chandigarh stated that syllabus revision is required at +2 level to make the courses more objective.

Mr. Apurva Chandra, Joint Secretary, MHRD expressed the opinion that it is not because of the syllabi or curriculum, the students are not able to compete and succeed in the higher level competitive examinations. The courses based on the curriculum framed by NCERT and Text-books are excellent but due to the level of examination and standard of question paper, real talent could not be segregated out of the masses. Due to current situations prevailing in the country, the CBSE is not able to raise the standard of question paper as that might affect the pass percentage and marks obtained

by its students and it has a direct impact on the present admission process adopted for under-graduate courses offered by the Universities and other institutions.

Mrs. Jyotsana Brar, Hony. Secy., IPSC pointed out that the colleges may not be aware about the two level courses already offered by the CBSE at +2 level and, therefore, steps may be taken to inform the content of these advance courses to the higher educational institutions and universities.

Mrs. Usha Ram, Principal, Laxman Public School, New Delhi, raised a doubt that whether offering of courses at two level at Senior Secondary Classes will create confusion? She also wanted to know the practices followed by other Examination Boards across the country. She welcomed new initiatives proposed by the CBSE.

The Chairman, CBSE replied that already a practice of offering language at different levels at Senior Secondary Classes exists in the Board and there are different practices followed by different Boards according to the need of their students. He also clarified that everyone may not follow same practice across the country.

Participating in the discussion, Mrs. Jyotsana Brar, Hony. Secy., IPSC commented that educational institutions located in metro cities and NCR may be aware of two level courses at Senior Secondary Level but institutions and universities in the interior parts of the country may not be aware of the same.

Mr. Apurva Chandra, Joint Secretary, MHRD and the Chairman, CBSE further clarified that the matter of creating awareness about advanced courses in Science and Mathematics can be taken up with the Association of Indian Universities and UGC. He also stated that advanced courses are required only at Senior Secondary Classes and the same is not required at Secondary Classes.

Ms. Gurmeet Bindra, Principal, Welham Boys School, Dehradun expressed concern whether advanced courses need to be taught to everyone choosing the subject at +2 level to which the Joint Secretary, MHRD replied that advanced level is not required for all courses. He cited the example of Commerce students choosing Mathematics. The level of Mathematics required for students wanting to pursue careers in Engineering and Accountancy is different.

Dr. Shyama Chona, Former Principal Dethi Public School, was of the opinion that advanced courses may not be limited to Science and Mathematics subjects only, and the same may be considered for subjects like Liberal Arts, Social Science, Commerce, Economics, as well. She further welcomed the new initiatives of the CBSE.

Quality of Teachers:

Dr. K.P. Gopala Krishna, Senior Principal, National Public School, Bangalore pointed out that there is a gap between the courses offered by the CBSE at Secondary level and Senior Secondary level and as a result, students joining Senior Secondary Classes find it difficult to cope-up with the sudden increase of workload at +2 level. He also pointed out that there is shortage of quality teachers in the country and it is too difficult for a school conscious of quality to get good teachers. He invited the attention of the House on the above issues to find solutions.

Replying to the issues raised by Dr. Gopala Krishnan, the Chairman, CBSE informed that the Board is doing its best in the areas of teacher empowerment. In order to empower teachers in a short span of time, the Board has involved Private Agencies in teacher training programmes, in addition to Board's own training programmes. Besides, the quality gap of teachers is being addressed through mentoring and monitoring programme under CCE. The CBSE has proposed to open two Teachers' Training institutions in the country and is also working in coordination with NEUPA in school leadership programmes. The Chairman further stated that attention of NCTE may be invited on the issue to look into the need for revising the curriculum of Teacher Training Courses.

Further, commenting on the gap between Secondary and Senior Secondary Courses of the Board, the Chairman stated that some of the students, without real aptitude or interest, may be choosing some subjects at +2 level, and as a result they later on find it difficult to cope up with the demand of these subjects.

He also stated that the Board will invite feedback and suggestions on the issue and also explore the possibility of introducing bridge courses to reduce the gap if such a gap really existed. He also proposed to constitute a Committee to look into the whole issue and submit a comprehensive report to further proceed in the matter.

- Prof. Rama Mathew, Head, Department of Education, University of Delhi was of the opinion that without quality teachers, education cannot be imparted the way it is expected to. To improve the quality, she has suggested that Universities may introduce two years Teacher Education Programme instead of the present one year programme.
- Shri S.S. Minhas, Principal, Guru Harkishan Public School, Delhi, stated that integrated courses are already existing in various universities in the country which has not helped improve the overall quality of teachers.
- Dr. K.C. Satapathy, Principal, DAV Public School, Bhubaneshwar was of the opinion that the dearth of talent in school sector is due to its failure to attract the brightest. The best students are choosing medicine, engineering,

civil service and other areas as their career and only average and below average are choosing their career in teaching. He also stated that if CBSE introduced advanced course in Science subjects, school may find it still difficult to get talented and capable teachers to teach these subjects. Therefore, he suggested simultaneous teacher empowerment programme in these areas.

Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation:

Dr. J.D. Bhardwaj, Deputy Education Officer, Govt. of Delhi, informed that due to the strength in government schools of Delhi, they are finding it challenging to implement CCE effectively and the system needs improvement. He suggested that under CCE scheme, more weightage be given to Summative Assessments before promoting a student to the next higher class.

Mrs. Usha Ram also opined that weightage be given to Summative Assessment I & II for promoting students to the next higher class. She also suggested that attaining fixed percentage of marks at SA-II be made compulsory.

The Chairman, CBSE clarified that challenges in implementing CCE cannot be attributed to the scheme. The shortcomings in implementing CCE in Government schools may be due to their internal issues like student teacher ratio, lack of teacher training, old performance criteria of teachers, shortage of classrooms etc. and immediate steps need to be taken by the state government to tackle such problems internally. He also pointed out that gap in the curriculum of class X and XII existed even before implementing CCE. With the implementation of CCE, the syllabi and course has not changed; only the mechanism and method of assessment has changed. This requires a change in teaching methodology, which may not be happening in some schools. In fact, CCE is helping us to find out the shortfalls in the teaching learning processes followed by schools for generations.

Problems of Schools:

Dr. Gopala Krishnan, Senior Principal, National Public School, Bangalore further invited the attention of the House on the problem faced by the schools in Tamil Nadu. He has informed that the Government of Tamil Nadu has appointed a Committee to fix the fee charged by all the schools in Tamil Nadu. He has stated that with the amount of fee fixed by the said Committee, the schools cannot function efficiently.

The Chairman, CBSE replied that CBSE has its limitations in interfering in such issues involving Court directions. He further stated that the Board is of the view that fee should be commensurate with the facilities provided by each educational institutions affiliated to the CBSE and the right of fixation of fee be left with the schools concerned. He also maintained that while there is a need to provide freedom to schools on this issue, the schools should also prevent commercialization of education.

Assessment of Speaking and Listening Skills:

Prof. Rama Mathew said that the initiative of CBSE towards assessment of speaking listening skills is a welcome step and suggested that the weightage of assessment be raised to 25% instead of 10%. She pointed out the importance of developing speaking and listening skills in teaching languages as learning will be incomplete without such skills. She also stated that CBSE will be making a good reform in teaching English by introducing ASL; she also offered every support of Delhi University in this novel endeavour of CBSE.

Participating in the discussion, Dr. Sadhana Parashar, Director (Academics & Training), CBSE stated that CBSE will go step by step in implementing ASL in schools and gradually the Board may consider increasing weightage of ASL upto 25%.

Value Education and CCE:

Dr. AfshanaYashmin, Assistant Director, Directorate of Education, Delhi informed that due to non-detention policy and liberal ways of assessment under CCE pattern, weak students are also wanting to take Science subjects at +2 level. Commenting on introducing value education in schools, she opined that value cannot be taught through books but it is something to be practiced by everyone especially the teachers. She also requested that CBSE may issue a Circular on the qualification criteria of teachers at various levels in schools due to introduction of CTET.

Mr. Chanchal Singh, Deputy Director (Sch.Edu.), Chandigarh stated that syllabus revision is required at +2 level to make the courses more objective:

The Chairman, CBSE while replying to the above concerns stated that CBSE is only an agency to conduct CTET and all policy matters relating to CTET is decided by the NCTE and the MHRD.

He also pointed out that the formative assessment data of qualified candidates of class X under CCE pattern from Delhi Government schools shows a better picture than the private schools in Delhi. He suggested that to improve the functioning of Delhi Government schools internal remedial actions are required at their end. He further clarified that no detention policy does not mean that marks be given to everyone. The Assessment Report of every child should reflect her real performance.

The House, thereafter, unanimously appreciated the work done by the Board in past six months. It also resolved to immediately start work on new initiatives keeping in mind the above observations of the members.

The Chairman further proposed before the House that for bringing further efficiency and expertise, permanent committees be constituted in the following areas also for giving recommendations to the Board:-

- i. Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE).
- ii. E-Governance.
- iii. Introduction of ICT in Academics.
- iv. Value Education.
- v. Inclusive Education
- Vi. Vocational Education.
- vii. CBSE-i

These Committees will have at least one member of the Governing Body and expert members from outside the Governing Body in their composition. One Head of the Department will act as Convener. These Committees may be formed 'mutatis mutandis' other permanent committees of the Board.

The House deliberated on the issue and unanimously resolved to authorize the Chairman CBSE to nominate members and constitute committees in the above areas.

DISCUSSIONS ON AGENDA ITEMS:

TO CONFIRM THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOARD HELD ON 4TH JUNE 2012

The Chairman CBSE appraised the numbers about the minutes of the meeting of the Governing Body held on 4th June, 2012 and after deliberations the house resolved to confirm the same.

TO RECEIVE A REPORT ON THE FOLLOW UP ACTION TAKEN ON THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY HELD ON 4TH JUNE 2012

The Chairman informed the House that action has been taken on all the Items as per resolution passed by the Governing Body at its last meeting held on 4th June, 2012 except in the case of Additional Item VII, regarding the Proposal to conduct the Assessment for Speaking and Listening in English. As far as the said item is concerned, it has been proposed to conduct first a Pilot Test on Assessment for Speaking and Listening in English in around 120 schools in Delhi and NCR in the current year before undertaking Regular Testing in 'ASL'.

The members deliberated on the Action Taken Report on the last meeting of the Governing Body Meeting held on 4th June, 2012 in detail

and noted the follow up action taken on the minutes of its last meeting.

ITEM III TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE 3RD ADVISORY AND IMPLEMENTATION COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 27TH JULY 2012 FOR CONDUCT OF CENTRAL TEACHER ELIGIBILITY TEST (CTET) – NOVEMBER 2012

The Director Special Examinations appraised the members about the decisions of the committee. After deliberations the House approved the recommendations of the Advisory and Implementation Committee of CTET at its meeting held on 27th July, 2012.

ADD ITEM I TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON NEET MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 22ND AUGUST, 2012

The Joint Secretary (OSD) appraised the members about the recommendations of the Committee. The Chairman CBSE informed that the CBSE will be conducting National Eligibility cum Entrance Examination 2013 in place of All India Pre-Medical/ Pre-Dental Entrance Examination. NEET-UG 2013 will be held on Sunday, the 05th May, 2013 and CBSE is in the process of conducting the examination in English, Hindi and Regional Languages of Assamese, Bengali, Gujarati, Marathi, Tamil & Telugu. The states of Assam, West Bengal, Gujarati, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh are presently conducting their State Medical Entrance Examination in their respective Regional Languages hence to facilitate students from these states the Board has undertaken the task as per request of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India.

It was informed that from the academic session 2013-14 onwards, admission to Medical/ Dental Colleges under the jurisdiction of MedicalCouncil of India and Dental Council of India will be based on the merit position of candidates appearing in the NEET.

The House after deliberations resolved to approve the recommendations of the Advisory Committee on National Eligibility cum Entrance Test meet at its meeting held on 22nd August 2012.

ADD ITEM II TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE EXAMINATION COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 10TH SEPTEMBER, 2012

The Controller of Examinations CBSE, appraised the members about the decisions of the committee. Mrs. Usha Ram, Principal, Laxman Public School, Delhi, raised the issue of payment of

remuneration, conveyance and other charges for the teachers involved in framing question papers for Formative Assessment and Summative Assessment of CCE. Dr. K.C. Satapathy, Principal, D.A.V. Public School, Bhubaneshwar, suggested that detailed guidelines may be framed for payment of remuneration for all examination related work. Mr. Bhardwaj, Deputy Director, Directorate of Education, Delhi suggested that remuneration applicable for examination centre visit may also be revised.

The Controller of Examination informed that rates of remuneration for examination work are revised from time to time and to look into the need for any further revision in rates a Committee may be constituted for submission of recommendations. The House after discussions resolved to approve the recommendations of the Examination Committee held on 11th September, 2012. The House also authorized the Chairman, CBSE to constitute the Committee.

ADD ITEM III TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 11TH SEPTEMBER, 2012 AND 20TH SEPTEMBER, 2012

The Secretary, CBSE, appraised the members about the recommendations of the Finance Committee. After considerable discussions the House resolved to approve the recommendations of the Finance Committee at its meetings held on 11th September, 2012 and 28th September, 2012.

ADD ITEM IV TO CONSIDER THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE AFFILIATION COMMITTEE MADE AT ITS MEETING HELD ON 11TH SEPTEMBER, 2012

The Secretary, CBSE, appraised the House about the recommendations of the Affiliation Committee held on 11th September, 2012 and after deliberations the House resolved that the decisions of the Affiliation Committee held on 11th September, 2012 be approved.

ADD ITEM V TO CONSIDER RECONSTITUTION OF THE RESULT COMMITTEE OF THE BOARD

The Governing Body unanimously resolved and authorized The Chairman, CBSE, to nominate members to the Result Committee of the Board taking into account the conventions and practices followed in the past.

ADD ITEM VI TO DISCUSS VARIOUS ISSUES RECEIVED FROM SMT. SUNITI SHARMA, CHAIPERSON, IPSC THROUGH SMT. JYOTSANA BRAR, HONY. SECRETARY, IPSC AND MEMBER OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOARD

Mrs. Jyotsana Brar, Secretary, IPSE presented the following issues before the House:

- I. CCE grading in Co-Scholastic Areas: Mrs. Brar explained that the five point grading scale adopted for Co-Scholastic Areas is very elastic and there is very wide variation in grades seen across schools hence there is a need to bring standardization and clearly defined criteria for awarding each grade in Co-Scholastic Areas. The Chariman CBSE, clarified that the Board is in the process of bringing online assessment of Co-Scholastic Areas. The CCE Manual also prescribes descriptors for awarding grades for each Co-Scholastic Area, which makes grading less subjective.
- 11. Introduction Value Based Question in All Major Subjects: Mrs. Brar explained that value education should be implicit and overriding in every class room transaction that takes place in every activity in the curriculum, IPSC strongly doubts that values can develop through a mechanical exercise by including value based questions to the tune of 3-5 Marks in a question paper or they can be effectively assessed. Dr. Sadhana Parashar, Director Academics informed that value education is an initiative of CBSE towards inculcating values among new generation. Chairman, CBSE emphasized that the marks are just initial means to encouraging discussions around values and in every class room. The CBSE firmly believes that values are across curricula cannot be isolated. Also, limiting it to marks only is not the idea. It has been done due to the practical reason that nobody values any initiative under it is graded. After sometimes, when people appreciate these larger issues, the practice may be discontinued.
- III. Elective English and English Core: It has been brought to the notice of the House that only vary few colleges acknowledge the different in level of English Elective and English Core and as a result students shy away from opting English Elective. Most universities treat both courses on par and therefore the lower percentage of marks in Elective English is a disadvantage for the students. IPSC requested CBSE to take initiative in making universities aware of the course content of the two.

The Chairman CBSE, replied that the Board will request the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) and UGC to write to all the Indian Universities informing them about the difference in the course content of the two. IV. Conduct of PSA: Mrs. Brar informed the House that winter bound boarding school conduct their exams in the first week of December and then close for a minimum of two months. The students therefore will be unable to write the PSA in January, she, hence, sought intervention of the Board. The Chairman CBSE informed the House that for winter closing schools separate dates for conduct of PSA in class IX & XI will be announced by the Board.

Mrs. Jyotsana Brar also pointed out that there is a need for CBSE to improve its infrastructure to handle its functioning effectively in all areas including affiliation & examination. She raised a doubt whether CBSE can function effectively without expansion in a situation where 400 new schools are added to its fold in every six months.

The Chairman CBSE informed that the Board has taken various steps to handle the increasing work pressure. Following steps are taken by the Board for bringing efficiency:

- i. Improve manpower in all essential areas.
- ii. Simplification of process in the activities of the Board such as simplified processes for extension of affiliation, up-gradation of schools, introduction of additional subjects etc.
- iii. Involving private agencies like KPMG to bring efficiency in affiliation work and to reduce permanent liability on the Board.
- iv. Opening of more regional offices of the Board and a Committee has already been appointed by the Board for the same.
- v. Use of Technology in all core areas such as affiliation, academics and examination.

ADD ITEM VII TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN CREATING A FRAMEWORK FOR ACCREDITATION FOR ICT BASED EDUCATIONAL CONTENT

The House noted the action taken by the CBSE in creating a framework for accreditation for ICT based educational content as per directions of HRD Ministry and resolved to approve the same. The House also resolved that the Board may initiate further action to operationalise the same.

ADD ITEM VIII TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN CREATING AN INTEGRATED TEST MANAGEMENT SYSTEM.

The members of The House were appraised by the Chairman on the action taken by the Board in Creating an Integrated Test Management System. Sh. Naveen Maini, Research Officer, CBSE, gave a detailed presentation on the functioning of the system. The House after discussions resolved that the action taken by the Board be approved.

ADD ITEM IX TO APPROVE RFP FOR COMPREHENSIVE ONLINE (AND OFFLINE) LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM FOR CONTINUOUS AND COMPREHENSIVE EVALUATION (CCE)

The Chairman CBSE informed the House that Board is in the process of developing one stop portal for all schools for providing various information and solutions on CCE. Dr. Sadhana Parashar, Director Academics, explained the features of the Comprehensive Online (and Offline) Learning Management System for CCE.

The House discussed in detail the proposal and resolved to approve the same.

The Chairman finally thanked all the members of the House and other participants for their valuable contributions.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

BACKGROUND

The Deptt. of School Education & Literacy, Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India vide letter No. F.1-2/2011-EE-4 dated 28.02.2011 (Annexure-1) has conveyed the approval of Hon'ble HRM that the CBSE shall be the examining body for conducting the TET on behalf of the Central Govt.

The Chairman, CBSE has constituted an Advisory and Implementation Committee of Central Teacher Eligibility Test comprising of the following members from all the stakeholders i.e. representatives from MHRD, Govt. of NCT of Delhi, Chandigarh Administration, Andaman & Nicobar Administration, Dadra & Nagar Haveli Administration, KVS, JNV, CTSA, and Principal of Private/Public School and reputed Educationists to consider and recommend on all matters for the smooth conduct of the Test.

The Board has proposed to hold the 3rd CTET Examination on 18th November, 2012 (Sunday). Accordingly the Chairman, CBSE has called the 3rd Meeting of the Advisory and Implementation Committee which was held on 27th July, 2012 at 11.00 A.M. in the Conference Hall, 2nd Floor, Shiksha Kendra, 2, Community Centre, Preet Vihar, Delhi for discussion and consideration on the status report of CTET –JAN 2012, Information Bulletin of CTET – NOV 2012 and to decide issues / modalities for the conduct of CTET- NOV 2012 Examination. The meeting was also attended by the Head of Divisions of the Board.

The Advisory and the Implementation Committee after due consideration and deliberation on the (i) Brief Report of CTET-NOV 2012, (ii) Provisions of RTE Act-2009, (iii) NCTE Guidelines dated 11.02.2011 regarding conduct of Teacher Eligibility Test by the respective State/UT Government, (iv) NCTE Gazette Notification dated 23.08.2010 and 29.07.2011, regarding minimum eligibility criteria for appointment of teacher under RTE Act-2009, (v) Minutes of 2nd Advisory & Implementation Committee, (vi) Draft Information Bulletin and Application Form for CTET-Jan 2012 and (vii) Press Advertisement for CTET-Jan 2012 made the following recommendations;

- 1. The committee ratified the decision to conduct the CTET on 18th Nov. 2012.
- 2. The Committee approved the Draft CTET-NOV 2012 Information Bulletin and Application Form along with the changes, addition and deletion of examination centre cities and the Press Advertisement for CTET-NOV 2012.

- 4 The Committee after analyzing the result of CTET-JAN 2012 recommended that an item analysis of response marked by the candidates against all the questions may be done and questions from areas of syllabus where the response of the candidates has not been satisfactory may be re-assessed.
- The Committee recommended for seeking only on-line applications for CTET-NOV 2012 Examination and desired that CBSE may open facilitation centres in the country to assist candidates who face problems in submitting their online applications.
- 6 The committee recommended the following fee structure for CTET- NOV 2012 proposed in CTET-NOV 2012 Information Bulletin.

In accordance with the provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 23 of the RTE Act, the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) had vide Notification dated 23rd August, 2010 laid down the minimum qualification for a person to be eligible for appointment as a teacher in classes I – VIII. It had been interalia provided that one of the essential qualifications for a person to be eligible for appointment as a teacher in any of the schools is that he/she should pass the Teacher Eligibility Test (TET) which will be conducted by the appropriate Government in accordance with the Guidelines framed by the NCTE.

- 2. The NCTE has issued guidelines for conduct of TET on 11.2.2011, a copy of which can be downloaded from the website www.education.nic.in. The TET conducted by the Central Government shall apply to schools under the Central Government and UTs without legislature. Further, Managements of schools affiliated to Boards such as CBSE, ICSE etc may also opt for the TET conducted by the Central Government.

Accordingly, Chairman, CBSE has decided to hold the 2nd CTET Examination on 29th January, 2012 (Sunday). The Chairman, CBSE has called the 2nd meeting of the Advisory and Implementation Committee which was held on 11th October, 2011 at 11.00 a.m. in the Conference Hall, 1st Floor, CBSE, Shiksha Sadan, 17, Rouse Avenue, New Delhi for discussion and consideration on the status report of CTET – June 2011, Information Bulletin of CTET – Jan 2012 and to decide other issues / modalities for the conduct of CTET-2012. Background and Rationale

The implementation of right of children to free and compulsory education (RTE) Act — 2009 requires the recruitment of a large number of teachers across country in a time-bound manner. In spite of the enormity of the task, it is desirable to ensure that quality requirement for recruitment of teachers is not diluted at any cost. It is, therefore, necessary to ensure that persons recruited as teachers posses the essential aptitude and ability to meet the challenges of Teaching of the primary and upper primary level. As such, in accordance to the provisions of Sub-Section 1 of Section 23 of the RTE Act, the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) vide Notification dated 23.08.2010 had laid down the minimum qualifications for a person to be eligible for appointment as a teacher in classes I to VIII. It had been inter-alia provided that one of the essential qualifications for a person to be eligible for appointment as a teacher in any of the schools referred to in clause (n) of section 2 of the RTE Act is that he/she should pass the Teacher Eligibility Test (TET) which will be conducted by the appropriate Govt. in accordance with the Guidelines framed by the NCTE.

Accordingly, Deptt. of Sch. Education & Literacy, Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India vide letter No. F.1-2/2011-EE-4 dated 28.02.2011 has conveyed the approval that the CBSE shall be the examining body for conducting the TET on behalf of the Central Govt.

- i) The CTET shall apply to schools of the Central Govt. (KVS, NVS, Tibetan Schools, etc.) and schools under the administrative control of UT of Chandigarh and Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu.
- ii) CTET may also apply to the unaided private schools, who may exercise the option of considering the CTET.
- iii) Schools owned and managed by the STATE Govt. /local bodies and aided Schools shall consider the TET conducted by the State Govt. However, a State Govt. can also consider the CTET if it decides not to conduct the State TET.

The rationale for including the TET as a minimum qualification for a person to be eligible for appointment as a teacher is as under:

- i. It would bring national standards and benchmark of teacher quality in the recruitment process;
- ii. It would induce teacher education institutions and students from these institutions to further improve their performance standards;
- iii. It would send a positive signal to all stakeholders that the government lays emphasis on teacher quality

The question papers contained 150 multiple choice questions each carrying one marks, (01 mark) without negative marking. The duration for examination was 1 ½ hours. The brief details of the papers held are as follows:

1. BACKGROUND AND RATIONALE

In accordance with the provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 23 of the RTE Act, the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) had vide Notification dated 23rd August, 2010 and 29th July, 2011 laid down the minimum qualifications for a person to be eligible for appointment as a teacher in classes I to VIII. It had been inter alia provided that one of the essential qualifications for a person to be eligible for appointment as a teacher in any of the schools referred to in clause (n) of section 2 of the RTE Act is that he/she should pass the Teacher Eligibility Test (TET) which will be conducted by the appropriate Government in accordance with the Guidelines framed by the NCTE.

The rationale for including the TET as a minimum qualification for a person to be eligible for appointment as a teacher is as under:

- It would bring national standards and benchmark of teacher quality in the recruitment process;
- ii. It would induce teacher education institutions and students from these institutions to further improve their performance standards;
- iii. It would send a positive signal to all stakeholders that the Government lays special emphasis on teacher quality

The Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India has entrusted the responsibility of conducting the Central Teacher Eligibility Test (CTET) to the Central Board of Secondary Education Delhi.

2. SHORT TITLE

These rules will be called as "Central Teacher Eligibility Test Rules, 2011" (CTET).

3. DEFINITIONS

- i) "Government" means "Government of India".
- ii) "Ministry" means "Ministry of Human Resource Development, New Dethi".
- iii) "Board" means "Central Board of Secondary Education, Delhi".
- iv) "School" for this purpose means any school affiliated with CBSE.
- v) "CTET" means "Central Teacher Eligibility Test".
- vi) "Qualifying Examination" means "Examination on the result of which the candidate becomes eligible to apply for Central Teacher Eligibility Test.
- vii) "Rules" mean "The rules specified by the Central Board of Secondary Education for the conduct of CTET under the directive of Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India, New Delhi".
- viii) "Schedule Castes" means "Scheduled Castes as specified and laid down by the Government of India".
- ix) "Scheduled Tribes" means "Scheduled Tribes as specified and laid down by the Government of India".

- w) "Other Backward Classes (OBCs)" means "Other Backward Classes as specified and laid down by the Government of India or by the respective States/UTs as the case may be".
- xi) "Differently abled persons" means "Differently abled persons as specified and laid down by the Government of India or the respective States/UTs, as the case may be".
- xii) "Examining Body" means "Central Board of Secondary Education Delhi for conducting the Teacher Eligibility Test on behalf of the Central "Government".

6. ELIGIBILITY

The following persons are eligible for appearing in the CTET.

6.1 Minimum Qualifications for becoming Teacher for Classes I-V: Primary Stage

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and passed or appearing in final year of 2- year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known)

OR

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 45% marks and passed or appearing in final year of 2- year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known), in accordance with the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure), Regulations, 2002.

OR

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and passed or appearing in final year of 4- year Bachelor of Elementary Education (B.Ei.Ed).

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and passed or appearing in final year of 2- year Diploma in Education (Special Education)*.

OR

Graduation and passed or appearing in final year of two year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known).

6.2 Minimum Qualifications for becoming Teacher for Classes VI-VIII: Elementary Stage

Graduation and passed or appearing in final year of 2-year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known).

OR

Graduation with at least 50% marks and passed or appearing in 1-year Bachelor in Education (B.Ed).

OR

Graduation with at least 45% marks and passed or appearing in 1- year Bachelor in Education (B.Ed), in accordance with the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations issued from time to time in this regard.

OR

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and passed or appearing in final year of 4- year Bachelor in Elementary Education (B.El.Ed).

OR

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and passed or appearing in final year of 4- year B.A/B.Sc.Ed or B.A.Ed/B.Sc.Ed.

OR

Graduation with at least 50% marks and passed or appearing in 1-year B.Ed. (Special Education)*.

- 6.3 Note: (i) Relaxation up to 5% in the qualifying marks in the minimum Educational Qualification for eligibility shall be allowed to the candidates belonging to reserved categories, such as SC/ST/OBC/Differently abled.
 - (ii)* Diploma/Degree Course in Teacher Education: For the purposes of this Notification, a diploma/degree course in teacher education recognized by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) only shall be considered. However, in case of Diploma in Education (Special Education) and B.ED (Special Education), a course recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) only shall be considered.
 - (iii) Training to be undergone: A person with D.Ed (Special Education) or B.Ed (Special Education) qualification shall undergo, after appointment an NCTE recognized 6-month Special Programme in Elementary Education.
 - (iv) The minimum qualifications referred above apply to teachers of Languages, Social Studies/Social Science, Mathematics, Science etc. In respect of teachers for Physical Education, the minimum qualification norms for Physical Education teachers referred to in NCTE Regulation, dated 3nd November, 2001 (as amended from time to time) shall be applicable. For teachers of Art Education, Craft Education, Home Science, Work Education, etc. the existing eligibility norms prescribed by the State Governments and other school managements shall be applicable till such time the NCTE lays down the minimum qualifications in respect of such teachers.
 - (V) The candidate not having any of the above qualification shall not be eligible for appearing in Central Teacher Eligibility Test.

7. STRUCTURE AND CONTENT OF CTET

All questions in CTET test will be Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs), each carrying one mark, with four alternatives out of which one answer will be correct. There will be no negative marking.

There will be two papers of CTET.

(i) Paper I will be for a person who intents to be a teacher for classes I to V.

(ii) Paper II will be for a person who intents to be a teacher for classes VI to VIII.

Note: A person who intents to be a teacher for both levels (classes I to V and classes VI to VIII) will have to appear in both the papers (Paper I and Paper II).

- (a) School Managements (Government, Local bodies, Government aided and unaided) may consider giving concessions to person belonging to SC/ST, OBC, differently abled persons, etc., in accordance with their extant reservation policy.
- (b) Qualifying the CTET would not confer a right on any person for recruitment/employment as it is only one of the eligibility criteria for appointment.

10. APPLICABILITY

- i. The CTET shall apply to schools of the Central Government (KVS, NVS, Central Tibetan Schools, etc.) and schools under the administrative control of UT's of Chandigarh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu and Andaman & Nicobar Islands and NCT of Delhi.
- ii. CTET may also apply to the unaided private schools, who may exercise the option of considering the CTET.
- iii. Schools owned and managed by the State Government/local bodies and aided schools shall consider the TET conducted by the State Government. However, a State Government can also consider the CTET if it decides not to conduct the State TET.

11. VALIDITY PERIOD OF CTET CERTIFICATE:

- 11.1 The Validity Period of CTET qualifying certificate for appointment will be seven years from the date of declaration of its result for all categories.
- 11.2 There is no restriction on the number of attempts a person can take for acquiring a CTET Certificate. A person who has qualified CTET may also appear again for improving his/her score.
- 11.3 A candidate can get a duplicate copy of Marks Statement or Eligibility Certificate by paying the following fees by way of Demand Draft in favour of "Secretary, Central Board of Secondary Education" drawn on any nationalized bank and payable at Delhi.

Under no circumstances, the Centre once allotted shall be changed by the Board. In case the number of candidates in any of the notified City is very less for running the Examination Centre, the Board at its discretion may not conduct the Examination in that City and the Candidate who opted that city as 1st Choice may be allotted Examination Centres in other city opted as 2nd or 3rd choice.

A. PROCEDURE TO BE FOLLOWED DURING CONDUCT OF CTET

- 1. The examination rooms/hall will be opened 45 minutes before the commencement of test. Candidates should take their seat immediately after opening of the examination hall. If the candidates do not report in time due to any reason i.e. traffic jam, train/bus delay etc, they are likely to miss some of the general instructions to be announced in the Examination Hall.
- 2. The candidate must show, on demand, the Admit Card downloaded from CBSE website for admission in the examination room/hall. A candidate who does not possess the valid Admit Card shall not be permitted for the examination under any circumstances by the Centre Superintendent.
- 3. A seat indicating roll number will be allocated to each candidate. Candidates should find and occupy their allocated seat only. Any candidate found to have changed room or the seat on his/her own other than allotted, his/her candidature shall be cancelled and no plea would be accepted for it.
- 4. A candidate who comes after the commencement of the examination shall not be permitted to sit in the examination.
- 5. Candidates are not allowed to carry any textual material, Calculators, Docu Pen, Slide Rules, Log Tables and Electronic Watches with facilities of calculator, printed or written material, bits of papers, mobile phone, pager or any other device, except the Admit Card and Blue/Black Ball Point pen inside the Examination Room/Hall. If any candidate is in possession of any of the above item, his/her candidature will be treated as unfairmeans and cancel the current examination & also debarred the candidate for future examination(s) & the material will be seized.
- 6. No candidate, without the special permission of the Centre Superintendent or the Invigilator concerned, will leave his/her seat or Examination Room until the full duration of the paper is over. Candidates should not leave the room/hall without handing over their Answer Sheets to the Invigilator on duty.
- 7. Candidates are advised to bring with them a cardboard on which nothing should be written, so that they have no difficulty in writing responses in the Answer Sheet even if the tables provided in the examination room/hall do not have smooth surface. They should also bring their own Ball Point Pens (Black/Blue) of good quality. These will not be supplied by the Board.

- 11.Immediately on receipt of the Test Booklet the candidates will fill in the required particulars on the cover page of the Test Booklet with Ball Point Pen only. He/She will not open the Test Booklet until asked to do so by the Invigilator. Do not open/break the seat before the announcement.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS PRIOR TO EXAMINATION

- 12. Five minutes before the commencement of the paper the candidate will be asked to break/open the seal of the Test Booklet. He/She will take out the Answer Sheet carefully. The candidate should check carefully that the Test Booklet Code printed on Side-2 of the Answer Sheet is the same as printed on the Test Booklet. In case of discrepancy, the candidate should immediately report the matter to the Invigilator for replacement of both the Test Booklet and the Answer Sheet.
- 13. Candidate will then write particulars with Blue/Black ball point pen only on both the sides of the Answer Sheet. Use of pencil is strictly prohibited. If anybody uses the pencil, his/her answer sheet will be rejected and no correspondence will be entertained in this regard. After completing this step, the candidates will wait for the signal by the invigilator.
- 14. The test will start exactly at the time mentioned in the Admit Card and an announcement to this effect will be made by the invigilator.
- 15. During the examination time, the invigilator will check Admit Card of all the candidates to satisfy himself/herself about the identity of each candidate. The invigilator will also put his/her signatures in the place provided in the Answer Sheet on Side-2.

UNFAIR MEANS:

- 16. Candidates shall maintain perfect silence and attend to their Question Paper only. Any conversation or gesticulation or disturbance in the Examination Room/Hall shall be deemed as misbehavior. If a candidate is found using unfair means or impersonating, his/her candidature shall be cancelled and he/she will be liable to be debarred for taking examination either permanently or for a specified period according to the nature of offence.

 If any candidate is in possession of any item(s) as mentioned in Para 5 above,
 - his/her candidature for current examination will be cancelled and also liable to be debarred for future examination(s).

The candidate shall not remove any page(s) from the Test-Booklet and if he/she is found to have removed any page(s) from his/her Test Booklet, he/she will be presumed to have used unfair means and shall be liable for criminal action.
- 20. The candidates must sign twice on the Attendance Sheet at the appropriate place. Firstly, immediately after commencement of the Examination and for the second time while handing over the Answer Sheet to the Invigilator.

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and passed or appearing in final year of 4-year Bachelor of Elementary Education (B.El.Ed).

OR
Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and passed or appearing in final year of 2-year Diploma in Education (Special Education)*.

Graduation and passed or appearing in final year of two year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known).

Minimum Educational Qualification for becoming Teacher for Classes VI-VIII (Elementary Stage):

Graduation and passed or appearing in final year of 2-year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known).

OR

Graduation with at least 50% marks and passed or appearing in 1-year Bachelor in Education (B.Ed).

Graduation with at least 45% marks and passed or appearing in 1-year Bachelor in Education (B.Ed), in accordance with the NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations issued from time to time in this regard.

OR

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and passed or appearing in final year of 4-year Bachelor in Elementary Education (B.El.Ed).

OR

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and passed or appearing in final year of 4-year B.A/B.Sc.Ed or B.A. Ed/B.Sc.Ed.

OR

Graduation with at least 50% marks and passed or appearing in 1-year B.Ed. (Special Education)*.

Note: (i) Relaxation up to 5% in the qualifying marks in the minimum Educational Qualification for eligibility to apply shall be allowed to the candidates belonging to reserved categories, such as SC/ST/OBC/Differently abled.

(ii) *Diploma/Degree Course in Teacher Education: For the purposes of this Notification, a diploma/degree course in teacher education recognized by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) only shall be considered. The Advisory Committee noted the detailed report on the conduct of the All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Preliminary & Final Examinations, 2012. The Committee expressed satisfaction for the smooth and fair conduct of examination and resolved that the action taken by the CBSE be approved and recorded.

ITEM-IV: TO REPORT ACTION TAKEN BY THE BOARD FOR INSPECTION OF ANSWER BOOKS UNDER RTI ACT – 2005 ON THE BASIS OF ORDERS OF HON'BLE SUPREME COURT OF INDIA

The Committee expressed satisfaction on the action taken by the CBSE display the OMR Answer Sheets and Responses marked by candidates appeared in the AIPMT Final Stage Examination – 2012 on the website of the CBSE www.cbse.nic.in and www.cb

ITEM - V TO CONSIDER THE DRAFT INFORMATION BULLETIN, APPLICATION FORM AND SCHEDULE FOR NEET-2013

The Central Board of Secondary Education has been entrusted with the responsibility for conduct of National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test for admission to MBBS Course in India in the session 2013-14. The CBSE proposes to conduct NEET, 2013 as per details given in the Agenda and Information Bulletin.

The Chairman, CBSE requested the Representatives of all the States and AFMC to go through the draft Information Bulletin and provide feedback within a week's time.

While considering the Agenda, the following deliberations taken place in the House:

Shri D. Hazarika, Director (ME), Representative of Assam Government requested to include Assamees as a language for NEET. He has expressed concern of qualifying sufficient number of candidates in the NEET to fill up seats Reserved by the State Governments for weaker section.

Shri Susanta Kumar Bandopadhyay, Director (ME), Representative of West Bengal has sought clarification on the conduct of Counseling for State Quota Seats and the manner of constituting Counseling Committee in each State as well as details of the Authority to constitute the Counseling Committee.

Air Marshal G.S. Juneja, Director & Commandant, AFMC, Pune proposed that NEET may be conducted on the 1st Sunday of May instead of 2nd Sunday as AFMC will no more conduct the examination for UG admissions on the 1st Sunday of May. He has suggested that it will help the CBSE to advance result declaration at least for a week's time.

Shri Harut Shukla, Additional Secretary and Dr. Bharat J Shah Representatives of Gujarat Government suggested that as the CBSE proposes to accept applications online, a trial modal of the same may be given on the website to facilitate the candidates to practice filling up of application online without error. He has also suggested that since the qualifying criteria of NEET is 50th percentile, some mechanism should be developed to relax the qualifying criteria, if sufficient number of candidates are not qualifying the examination. It was also suggested by him that no negative marking may be done for NEET as it will reduce the number of qualified candidates.

Dr. Jagdish A. Cacodcar, MD, Representative of Goa State expressed concern over remaining the MBBS/BDS seats vacant in the Medical College in his State as the State is presently conducting Medical Entrance Examination on the basis of syllabus prescribed by the State Board at 12th standard whereas the proposed NEET will be based on a Common Syllabus.

- Dr. Zora Singh, Prof. & Head, Representative of Punjab State was of the opinion that if State wise percentile is generated for deciding the qualifying criteria, shortage of qualified candidates will not occur in any State. He has also pointed out that since Medical Council of India has not prescribed any age limit, candidates may be allowed to appear in the NEET irrespective of their age.
- Ms. V Rashmi, IAS, Representative of Karnataka State pointed out that the Government of Karnataka has no clear information regarding implementation of NEET and its jurisdiction. She also sought clarification as to how NEET came into existence either through Executive Order or through Judicial Order. She also stated that many private institutions are filing Writ Petition in the Court against NEET and one Dental Colleges Association has managed to obtain Stay Order against NEET, therefore, it would be better if Medical Council of India come forward to take the responsibility to accept legal notices directly on NEET to defend the cases effectively.
- Prof. S.R. Mahapatra, Prof. & HOD, Representative of Orissa State informed that the Orissa Professional Examination Board will conduct Counseling for NEET qualified candidates to fill seats under State quota. He has also suggested that all the State Governments may conduct Single Window Counseling for seats under State quota and accordingly the language in the Information Bulletin be modified. He has further suggested that CBSE may take effective steps to prevent impersonation and other malpractices during the conduct of examination.
- Dr. Santhosh S, Joint Commissioner, Representative of Kerala State requested that the application forms of candidates qualified for admission under State quota seats may be supplied to them for counseling and admission purposes. He also suggested that the actual marks scored by the candidate may be reflected in the result sheet along with the percentile rank.
- Dr. Shingare Pravin H., Director (ME & Research), Representative of Maharashtra State requested to include Marathi as one of the regional languages for NEET. He has also expressed intention of the State Government to use NEET result for admission to other UG Science Courses conducted by the Universities and Colleges under Maharashtra State Government to avoid conducting of other similar examinations by the State Government.
- Prof. G.K. Sharma, Deputy Director General, DGHS pointed out that the description of qualification under S.No.9 of the Information Bulletin needs to be redrafted in conformity with the Notification issued by the Medical Council of India.

Participating in the deliberations, Dr. Sriniwas Mantha, Consultant (Examinations), MCI informed that the Medical Council of India has undertaken extensive exercises before amending the Regulations on Graduate Medical Education making National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test compulsory for admission to MBBS Course in each academic year. The syllabus of NEET-UG was prepared by the MCI on the basis of feedback received from various Secondary and Senior Secondary Boards and COBSE. The syllabus was notified by the MCI in the first week of November, 2011 itself and the same is available on the Medical Council of

India website. He has also clarified that candidates qualifying the NEET-UG conducted by the CBSE alone will be eligible to seek admission in MBBS Course in Government and Private Medical Colleges in India.

Prof. Sanjay Srivastava, Secretary, Medical Council of India informed the House that the MCI has already filed an application before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India to transfer all pending litigations on NEET-UG before different High Courts to one bench of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India to resolve all the litigations filed against Government of India and MCI regarding conduct of NEET. He has requested all the State Government Representatives to forward the question papers used in the recent Medical Entrance Examinations conducted by them to the CBSE to understand the difficulty level of questions set by each State while preparing question paper for NEET-UG by the CBSE.

Shri B.M. Gupta, Advisor (IT) clarified that actual marks of candidates can be indicated in the result along with their rank. He also pointed out that adequate time is required for declaration of result as well as preparation of merit list separately for DGHS and each State.

Responding to the concerns and queries of Members and other participants, the Chairman, CBSE requested everyone to incorporate their suggestions in the Draft Information Bulletin circulated and send the same to the CBSE to take a final view. He has informed that the possibility of preponing the examination as well as result declaration for a week's time will be considered by the Board. Referring to the queries in respect of relaxation in the qualifying criteria, it was informed to the House that already provisions are incorporated in the Regulations on Graduate Medical Education and according to which the Central Government in consultation with Medical Council of India is empowered to relax qualifying criteria of NEET if sufficient number of candidates are not qualifying the Test.

The languages of question paper were decided on the basis of information received by the CBSE from the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India that States of West Bengal, Gujarat, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu are requested to conduct NEET in regional languages. Therefore, CBSE has agreed to the proposal of the Government to give comfort to the students. Responding to the query regarding Assameese and Marathi language, it was informed that so far CBSE has not received any information from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare and the concerned State Governments to include these languages for preparing question paper of NEET.

The Chairman, CBSE suggested that the information required by the States for allocating seats in Medical Colleges as per prevailing reservation quota may be collected from candidates directly prior to conduct of Counseling. He also informed that copy of application form submitted by the candidates and the actual marks of candidates will be provided to the States on request for Counseling purpose.

The CBSE will make all arrangements for conduct of NEET across the country. The sample question paper of NEET and the Information Bulletin-2013 will be hosted on the website of CBSE.

The Chairman, CBSE requested the Representatives of each State/UT to do the following for compiling the Information Bulletin of NEET to provide complete information to the candidates and the smooth conduct of NEET-2013:

- To appoint a Nodal Officer for coordination with the CBSE, DGHS and MCI.
- 2. Provide details of Counseling Authority with address, telephone numbers and e-mail ID.
- 3. Provide Website Addresses of State Counseling Authorities
- 4. Provide list of Medical/Dental Colleges and number of seats under various quota, viz., All India, State, NRI, Management, etc.

With the above notes, the House resolved that each State/UT may submit comments on the Information Bulletin and information sought by the CBSE within a week's time and they may also consider Single Window Counseling for State Quota Seats. Further, the House authorized the Chairman, CBSE to finalize the Information Bulletin of NEET – 2013 after considering the feedback received from the States within the stipulated time period of one week.

ITEM - VI TO CONSIDER THE PROPOSAL FOR EXPANSION OF CENTRE CITIES FOR CONDUCT OF NATIONAL ELIGIBILITY CUMENTRANCE TEST (UG) - 2013

The Advisory Committee observed that the All India Pre-Medical/Pre-Dental Entrance Examination was held in 28 cities in India and one city abroad. Now, with the implementation of NEET, CBSE proposes to conduct the examination in 73 cities in India and two cities abroad. The Advisory Committee noted that at every State and UT, at least one examination centre city is proposed by the CBSE.

Shri D. Hazarika, Representative of Assam State requested to add more centre cities in the State of Assam, particularly in upper Assam.

Dr. Susanta Kumar Bandhopadhyay, Director (ME), Representative of West Bengal State suggested that number of centre cities may be increased in accordance with the expected number of candidates to enable smooth and fair conduct of examination.

Lt. Col. Juneja, AFMC, Pune also suggested to add more cities to reduce travel time of candidates.

Dr. D.K. Bhawsar, Deputy Educational Advisor, MHRD raised a query regarding the criteria for fixation of examination centre by the CBSE.

Shri M.C. Sharma, Controller of Examinations, CBSE clarified that the Board

Select examination centre on the basis of capacity of an institution to hold the examination fairly and smoothly. Number of candidates allotted at each centre depends on the facility available in the school and in general, CBSE allot an

optimum of 700-800 candidates at a centre. If an institution is having excellent infrastructure, CBSE may fix even two centres at one Institution.

Shri Pitam Singh, Director (Spl. Exam.) clarified that the Board takes multiple centre city choice from candidates but efforts are made to allot centre as per first choice of the candidate.

The Chairman, CBSE requested all the participants to submit specific suggestions with regard to their State concerned in writing to the CBSE within a week's time so that the CBSE could look into the suggestions of all before finalizing the centre cities.

The Advisory Committee after detailed deliberations resolved that each State may submit their views in the matter within a week positively and authorized the Chairman, CBSE to take a final decision in the matter considering the suggestions received from each State.

ITEM - VII TO CONSIDER THE IMPLEMENTATION OF NATIONAL ELIGIBILITY CUM ENTRANCE TEST (UG) -2013

The Advisory Committee noted that for the smooth and fair conduct of the National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test – UG, 2013, the CBSE has to make all preparations, such as, Appointment of Item Writers, Moderators and other supporting staff, Appointment of Coordinators, Observers and other supporting staff, Fixation of Examination Centres and Appointment of Centre Superintendents, etc.

The Advisory Committee considering the sensitivity as well as the huge task undertaken by the CBSE for organizing the conduct of NEET-UG, 2013 authorized the Chairman, CBSE to take all appropriate decisions for the smooth and fair conduct of the examination.

The Advisory Committee recorded appreciation on the efforts of CBSE to undertake the huge task of organizing the NEET.

The Meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

ITEM III: TO CONSIDER THE OPINION RECEIVED FROM THE LEGAL ADVISOR FOR CORRECTION IN DATE OF BIRTH ON THE BASIS OF CERTIFICATE ISSUED BY REGISTRAR, BIRTH & DEATH, A STATUTORY BODY

Controller of Examinations apprised the Members that the Committee which met on 30.5.2012 considered correction in Date of Birth on the basis of 'Date of Birth certificate' where the same is different from what is mentioned in the school records. The Committee was also apprised that there were several court cases where the main prayer was to issue/amend the certificate issued by CBSE on the basis of Date of Birth certificate of the Municipal Authority and the courts decided most of the cases in favour of the candidates. The Committee had considered the pros and cons of permitting correction of date of birth on the basis of the certificate issued by a statutory body and had resolved to accept the same as basis for correction in date of birth. It further resolved that Legal Advisor may be requested to provide precautions to be taken while implementing it to avoid any misuse at a later date.

As resolved by the previous Committee, though the Legal Advisor had been requested to provide precautions to be taken while implementing the correction in date of birth on the basis of the certificate issued by a statutory body he has opined that it may not be advisable to make correction in date of birth on the basis of municipal date of birth certificate as there can be great scope of misuse if sole reliance is placed on the birth certificate and also once reliance on this certificate is provided in Byelaws, it may become difficult for the Board to question its authenticity since it is issued by a Statutory Body. His opinion is based on the facts that parents' at the time of admission write the date of birth on the application form which is not as per the birth certificate and later on request for correction in the same on the basis of Municipal certificate which amounts to giving encouragement to unfair practices, it is easy to secure Municipal birth certificate to suit one's requirement, it is possible to secure it many years after the actual date of birth.

The Examination Committee was apprised that the Board does not have provision for change in date of birth, it only has provision for correction in date of birth within five years of passing the examination. The Committee was also apprised thatin the year 2004 the Board has made it a rule that the date of birth be entered in the school record on the basis of the date of birth certificate issued by the Registrar of Births and Deaths. The Committee was also apprised that the Board has to carry out the change in date of birth on the basis of directions/judgements received from the Hon'ble High Courts/other Courts.

The Committee also took note of the following sections of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009

- ➤ Chapter II Section 3(4)wherein it envisages that where a child above six years of age has not been admitted in any school or though admitted, could not complete his or her elementary education, then, he or she shall be admitted in a class appropriate to his or her age.
- ➤ Chapter IV section 14(1) & (2) wherein it envisages that
 - (1) For the purposes of admission to elementary education, the age of a child shall be determined on the basis of the birth certificate issued in accordance with the provisions of the Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Act, 1886 or on the basis of such other document, as may be prescribed
 - (2) No child shall be denied admission in a school for lack of age proof.

After deliberations and in view of the above provisions of the Examination Byelaws and RTE Act, 2009, the Committee was of the opinion that discrepancy in the date of birth as per the document issued by a statutory body and that recorded in the school may decline subsequently w.e.f. 2015-2016 examination. However to consider cases relating to change in date of birth, such cases may be referred to a Committee, preferably consisting of one member of the Examination Committee. The Board would verify the genuineness of thedate of birth certificate issued by a statutory body and submit the case to the Committee for consideration. The recommendation so received from the Committee shall be placed before the Competent Authority for approval and the approval shall be placed before the Examination Committee for ratification.

ITEM IV: TO CONSIDER AMENDMENTS IN RULES OF THE EXAMINATION BYELAWS ARISING OUT OF THE DECISION TO CHANGE THE SCHEME OF CONTINUOUS AND COMPREHENSIVE EVALUATION & REDUCTION IN THE NUMBER OF ATTEMPTS FOR IMPROVEMENT OF PERFORMANCE/COMPARTMENTAL CANDIDATES

The Members were apprised that the Examination Committee at its meeting held on 30.5.2012 had resolved as under which has also been approved by the Governing Body at its meeting held on 04.6.2012:

- i) the scheme as applicable for Senior Secondary schools i.e. who wish to move out of the CBSE system after Class X (Pre-University, Vocational course, change of Board, etc.) take the Board's External Examination be also made applicable for Secondary level schools from the 2013 examination of Class X; and
- to reduce the number of attempts for Improvement of Performance/Compartment from five to one and five to three respectively and amend Rules 42(i)(a) and 42(i)(b) of the Examination Byelaws relating to Improvement of Performance/Comptt. Examination for Senior School Certificate Examination and Secondary School Examination to be effective from 2013 examination. For the candidates who have appeared upto 2012 examination, the previous rule shall remain in vogue.

The Members were informed that in view of the above resolutions certain rules of the Examination Byelaws need amendment to be in consonance with the resolution. A few rules also need amendment as the nomenclature of the Certificate issued at Secondary level has been changed to Grade Sheet cum Certificate of Performance in lieu of Certificate of Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation.

The Committee resolved to amend the rules and the amended rules are placed as Annexure I.

ITEM V: TO CONSIDER PERMITTING THE USE OF COMPUTER ENABLED WITH JAWS(JOB ACCESS WITH SPEECH) PROGRAMME TO THE VISUALLY HANDICAPPED CANDIDATES

The Committee was informed that a request has been received from Delhi Public School, Rohini, Delhi to permit Ms.Vibhu Sharma, a blind student of class XII to use computer enabled with JAWS programme for the class XII examination in the year 2013. In order to consider the feasibility of permitting visually handicapped students to use the programme a Committee was constituted which met on 19.7.2012 and arrived at the following consensus:

- this programme can be used by differently abled persons having difficulty in reading and writing;
- the programme has to be first loaded in the computer and then only can be used;
- if the question paper is available in electronic format, it can be uploaded on the computer else it can also be got typed for which time taken will be in addition to the time given to the candidate for attempting the question paper i.e. 4 hours;
- 4. use of this software will eliminate the requirement of an amanuensis;
- however, a computer literate person should be deputed at the examination centre to ensure that the candidate does not use any other programme or function from the computer while attempting the question paper.

The Committee was also apprised that this being the first year of its implementation and if implemented, number of takers for this software are also not known to the Board.

The Committee appreciated the steps being taken by the Board for facilitating the differently abled children for appearing for the class X & XII examinations. It deliberated on the issue and in order to further facilitate the visually challenged candidates resolved as under:

- a) candidate(s) desirous of using JAWS programme for appearing in class X/XII examinations may bring their computer alongwith JAWS software to the examination centre with prior intimation to the Board
- b) candidate(s) using JAWS software would not be provided with amanuensis
- c) Board may make efforts to install the JAWS software in the computers available with the Regional Offices
- d) candidates desirous of using this software may be considered allotting the Regional Office as examination centre:
- e) in case it is not feasible to allot the Regional Office as an examination centre, any school affiliated to it & situated in the vicinity of the Regional Office which is an examination centre may be considered for being allotted as examination centre for blind candidates using this software
- f) Centre Superintendents may be requested to appoint a PGT(Computer Science) to act as Assistant Superintendent/Regional Officer may appoint a PGT(Computer Science to act as Assistant Superintendent in case they are not able to spare their own computer personnel. The Assistant Superintendent appointed shall also ensure that the candidate uses only this software and not any other function of the computer
- g) concessions being extended by the Board to visually challenged candidates not using JAWS would continue to be provided as at present.

ITEM VI: TO RATIFY THE DECISION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN NOT DECREASING THE MARKS/GRADES ON ACCOUNT OF VERIFICATION OF MARKS/GRADES DONE PRIOR TO SENDING PHOTOCOPY OF THE EVALUATED ANSWER BOOK AND ALSO TO TALLY THE HANDWRITING BETWEEN THE CONFIRMATION PAGE AND THE ANSWER BOOK(S)

The Members were informed that based on the judgement dated 9.8.2011 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India it has provided photocopy of the evaluated answer book(s) to the candidates. The Members were also informed that the candidates had been directed to approach the Board in case any totalling error or unevaluated portion was detected. However, in order to ensure that such a situation does not arise, the Board had resorted to the process of verification of marks/grades before sending the photocopy of the evaluated answer book(s) to the candidate. The Committee was also informed that 2287 requests in 2012 have been received for providing photocopy of the evaluated answer book(s) and all the steps taken by the Board have been fruitful.

However, in a few cases during the process of verification of marks/grades before sending the photocopy of evaluated answer book(s), it came to the light of the Board that the marks were either increasing or decreasing and in one case the handwriting on the confirmation page did not tally with the handwriting on the answer book. In order to safeguard the interest of the candidates, Board had taken the following decisions:

- i) wherever the marks increased, the same has been intimated to the candidate(s) alongwith a letter and photocopy of the answer book provided;
- wherever the marks decreased, photocopy of the answer book has been provided as it is alongwith an intimation that though marks were decreasing, yet keeping in view their larger interest and due to the fact that admission must have been sought in some higher classes, Board has not decreased the marks:
- iii) where result changed from Compartment/Improvement of Performance to Pass/Eligible for Admission to Higher Classes, change has been allowed and photocopy provided; and
- iv) handwriting of the candidate has been tallied between the confirmation page and the answer book(s)

The Examination Committee resolved as under:

- a) ratified the decisions taken by the Board, and
- b) resolved that the marks/grades on verification be revised upward or downward as per the actual marks obtained by the candidate in his/her answer book in accordance with Rule 61(viii) of the Examination Byelaws and the status quo of the revised marks be maintained in such a case even in the event of candidate seeking photocopy of the evaluated answer book(s).

ITEM VII: TO RATIFY THE DECISION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN ENHANCING THE REGISTRATION FEE FOR CLASS IX/XI STUDENTS STUDYING IN SCHOOLS IN FOREIGN COUNTRIES

The Members were informed that the registration fee for class IX has been enhanced w.e.f. 2011 examination from Rs.50/- to Rs.100/-and the registration introduced for Class XI and fee kept as Rs.100/- w.e.f. 2011 examination. The fee was the same for all candidates being registered.

The Members were further apprised that as the examination fee being charged from candidates appearing from abroad is approx. six times that being charged from candidates from India, the registration fee from candidates from Abroad has been enhanced to Rs.1000/-(including Rs.100/- as Problem Solving Assessment) w.e.f. 2013 examination. However, the fee for candidates from India remains the same i.e. registration fee @Rs.100/- +PSA fee Rs.100/-(total Rs.200/-) per candidate.

The Examination Committee ratified the decision taken by the Board.

ITEM VIII: TO RATIFY DECISION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN KEEPING THE LAST DATE FOR RECEIPT OF LOC/APPLICATION FORM FOR PRIVATE CANDIDATE AS 15TH JANAUARY INSTEAD OF 30TH NOVEMBER WITH LATE FEE OF RS. 5000/- AND THE SCHEDULE FOR RECEIPT OF LIST OF CANDIDATES FOR 2013 EXAMINATION

The Committee was apprised that the Examination Committee at its meeting held on 30.5.2012 resolved that the last date for receipt of application form/LOC with late fee of Rs.5000/- be kept as 30th November which has also been approved by the Governing Body at its meeting held on 04.6.2012. The Committee was further informed that as the pre-examination data is compiled in the middle of January, the last date with late fee of Rs.5000/- has been kept as 15th January w.e.f. 2013 examination for private as well as regular students.

The Committee was further informed that the Examination Committee at its meeting held on 22.12.2010 has approved the schedule for receipt of data for classes IX – XII, which has also been approved by the Governing Body at its meeting held on 29.12.2010. However, due to administrative reasons, strengthening of Continuous & Comprehensive Evaluation scheme and receipt of the data online, the approved schedules for obtaining the Registration data and LOC for 2013 examinations had to be revised as under:

- 2. resolved that the date for receipt of application form/LOC of 15th January be reviewed for 2014 examination after looking into the number of application forms/LOC received for 2013 examination, if necessary.

ITEM IX: TO RATIFY THE DECISION TAKEN BY THE BOARD IN PERMITTING KUMARI POOJA TOMAR TO REAPPEAR FOR THE ADDITIONAL SUBJECT MATHEMATICS ALONGWITH COMPARTMENTAL CANDIDATES IN THE YEAR 2012 FROM REGIONAL OFFICE, DELHI

The Members were informed that Km. Pooja Tomar had appeared in the subject of Mathematics as an Additional Subject in 2012 vide Roll No. 9125864 but could not clear the subject. In the meantime she appeared for the AIEEE examination and secured 270 rank. In order to safeguard her future, her request for reappearing for improvement of performance in the subject of Mathematics alongwith the Compartmental candidates in July 2012 was considered by the Board.

The Examination Committee ratified the decision taken by the Board.

The Meeting then ended with a Vote of Thanks to the Chair.

The Committee recommended Grade Pay of 8900 for HODs and advised that the proposal should be implemented after seeking approval from the Controlling Authority i.e Secretary MHRD.

ITEM XXIII

Upgradation of the posts of Regional Officers as HODs

The Committee deliberated on the issue and approved that two largest region may be headed by a officer of the level of HOD/Director. These may be designated as Regional Directors. The Joint Secretary with three years' experience in that grade would be eligible for approval as Regional Director, subject to fulfilling other conditions for promotion. The Committee also recommended that the matter may be referred to Controlling Authority i.e. Secretary, MHRD for approval of Grade Pay of Rs.8900.

ITEM XXIV

Creation of post of Director (CTET)

The Committee approved the proposal of creation of the post of Director (CTET). Examinations like JNVST, PAT & PSA are now shifted to CTET Unit from AIEEE Unit and any other Subsequent examination introduced will also be conducted by CTET Unit. The Grade Pay of Director (CTET) will be as of HOD of CBSE.

ITEM XXV

Call centre for public enquiries and redressal of grievances

To enhance the image of CBSE as user friendly and to reduce the foot fall at offices, a Call centre for enquiries and redressal of grievances was established and work was allotted to M/S Dr. ITM Pvt Ltd. Noida @ 14400/- per seat (Taxes extra) for 20 seats and additional charges for primary rate interface (Toll free Number) at actual expenditure by Competent Authority of the Board from March 2012 to August 2012. This has been further extended up to Nov. 2012. The Item was placed before the Committee for approval. The Committee approved the proposal.

ITEM XXVI

One time relaxation in residency period for promotion

The relaxation in residency period of S.O, Asstt. Secy. and Dy. Secy. due to non-availability of eligible candidates in feeder cadre is placed before the Finance Committee for consideration. The item was withdrawn.

ITEM XXVII

Change of nomenclature from Head Assistant to Superintendent

The Committee approved the proposal of change of nomenclature of Head Assistant. to Superintendent to give recognition to an individual and to maintain parity with sister organisations such as KVS, NIOS, CTSA.

ITEM XXVIII

Introduction of Annual Medical Examination for Group A and Group B officers of CBSE of age 40 years and above

The Committee approved the proposal of introduction of Annual Medical Examination from empanelled/approved hospitals and attaching the reports with APAR. Expenditure should be as per the following package rate or at actual whichever less is:

- (a) Annual Medical Examination for Men Officers Rs. 2000/-
- (b) Annual Medical Examination for Women Officers Rs. 2200/-

ITEM XXIX

To report action taken with regard to absorption of Smt. Srijata Das w.e.f. 06.06.2012

Dr. (Smt.) Srijata Das, Lecturer, SECRT was appointed on deputation as Education Officer in the Board from 12.08.2008 to 10.08.11. SCERT extended her deputation upto 10.08.12 and requested to expedite the process of her absorption in CBSE. The Hon'ble C.M. of the Board vide order dated 07.06.12 approved the same. The Item was placed before the Finance Committee for approval. The Committee approved the proposal.

ITEM XXX

Enhancement of ex-gratia to the employees of the Board

The proposal for extending & enhancement of ex-gratia payment to the Board employees including illness leading to death was placed before the Committee for approval. The Committee required more details on the matter to be placed later on.

The proposal of granting one time reward of Rs.One lakh only each to 200 meritorious students/toppers per year of AISSE studying in school run by State Govts. in (i) NCT of Delhi (ii) Sikkim (iii) Arunachal Pradesh (iv) Andaman & Nicobar Islands (v) Chandigarh.The item is considered and approved in the Finance Committee with the following modifications:

- (i) Nos. of awards 200 (may be increased to cover all candidates at cut off marks).
- (ii) Distribution between streams: Science: 25%, Commerce: 25%, Humanities: 25%, Vocational: 25%.
- (iii) Consideration for SC/ST minimum 23% (15% for S.C. and 8% for S.T.), subject to (v) below
- (iv) 02 Toppers from Physically handicapped category are to be included.
- (v) The cut off marks for SC/ST will be 5% below the last candidate of General category.

ITEM XXXIV

To consider budgetary support for conduct of international conference on "ICT culture in education" from 27th – 29th September, 2012 at the India International Centre (IIC), New Delhi to be conducted by ETMA, Gurgaon

The proposal was dropped with the observation that the CBSE should place such proposals before a screening committee to be constituted by the Chairman.

ITEM XXXV

To provide financial support to verbattle platform, a philanthropic organization, working to promote values in children by contribution Rs.5,00,000/- to sponsor final rounds of the state level competition for school students

The proposal was dropped with the observation that the CBSE should place such proposals before a screening committee to be constituted by the Chairman.

ITEM XXXVI

To consider the formation of separate cadre for the academic wing of CBSE – academic cadre for CBSE faculty

The Committee approved the proposal of formation of separate cadre for the Academic wing of CBSE.It approved creation of 35 posts as proposed in agenda. The Committee was also of the view that proposals for creation of posts in PB-4 Rs.8700/- and above only may be forwarded to Controlling Authority i.e. Secretary MHRD for approval.

ITEM XXXVII

To report action taken by the Board to sanction two months' leave and leave salary to Smt. C. Gurumurthy, Former Director (Academic) on deputation in the Board, as availed by her immediately after her repatriation

Smt. C. Gurumurthy former Director (Academic) was relieved from the Board on 11.10.2010 with a direction to report KVS but she joined KVS, New Delhi on 14.02.11. KVS has been stressing to regularise her leave upto 13.02.2011. The Finance Committee held on 01.02.2011 already approved the leave salary w.e.f. 11.10.2010 to 10.12.2010. The Competent Authority of the Board has further sanctioned leave & leave salary w.e.f. 11.12.2010 to 13.02.2011. The matter was placed beforethe Finance Committee for consideration. The Item is approved by the Finance Committee.

ITEM XXXVIII

The Committee deliberated the issue of granting (i) GP of Rs. 4800/- to S.O. and other equivalent officers w.e.f. 01.01.2006 (ii) Non-functional pay scale of Rs. 15,600 – 39,100 with GP Rs. 5400/- after completion of four years' service in GP Rs. 4800/- as is prevailing MHRD. The Item was placed before the Finance Committee for

consideration. The item was deferred by the Finance Committee for seeking more clarification.

ITEM XXXIX

Signing of Memorandum of Understanding between CBSE and Medvarsity Online Ltd., Hyderabad for offering Medical Diagnostics course in the affiliated schools of CBSE

Considering the huge requirement of health related manpower a pilot course is introduced for offering Medical Diagnostics course in the affiliated schools of CBSE from the academic session (2012-2013). Final MOU between CBSE and Medvarsity Online Ltd. Hyderabad for offering Medical Diagnostics course (Annexure-IV) was placed before the Finance Committee. The Committee approved the proposal.

ADD. ITEM I

Restructuring of IT Deptt of CBSE in view of exponential increase in IT related and IT enabled services in the Board and change of nomenclature to bring parity with other ministerial cadre and also to attract talented IT professionals

The Committee approved the proposal of change in nomenclature of HOD (IT) to Director (IT). The Committee also approved the proposal to downgrade the five Post of programmer to Asstt. Programmer.

ADD. ITEM II

The Committee opined that such appointments should be made under overall umbrella of a policy. The Board may design a Policy for appointment of physically challenged wards of the employees of the Board on compassionate grounds. Once the policy is ready, should be placed before the Finance Committee.

The proposal of debarring CBSE staff for one year instead of three years consequent upon refusal for promotion was placed before the Finance Committee for reconsideration. The proposal was not approved by the Committee.

ADD. ITEM IV

To consider revision of rates of refreshment charges for Board's Mini/Long.

The Committee approved the rates from Rs.125/- to Rs.200/- per day per person, as proposed, in view of financial strain on employees of Board during Mini/Long Tour.

ADD. ITEM V

To consider appointment of one Resource Person on consolidated salary of Rs.20,000/- per month on contract basis in the office of the MHRD initially for a period of 6 months extendable to a maximum period of 01 year

The Committee approved the proposal of appointment of one Resource Person on consolidated salary of Rs.20,000/- per month on contract basis in the office of the MHRD initially for a period of 6 months extendable to a maximum period of 01 year. It was also recommended that such proposals need not be put to Finance Committee and can be decided at appropriate level in the Board.

ADD. ITEM VI

Starting a Benevolent Fund in CBSE

The Committee approved the proposal in principle with one time Corpus Fund of Rs. 1,00,00,000/- (Rupees One Crore) from CBSE Fund. The interest of this Corpus Fund and contributions only may be used to give financial assistance to employee/dependent family member to tide over their genuine financial stringency. However, since this interest will acquire only at the end of year, the cases of current year may finalised from the corpus to be recouped from future year's contributions. The fund will be used for cases arising from this calendar year i.e. from 1.1.2012. Modalities of the Benevolent Fund are at (Annexure-V).

ADD. ITEM VII

To consider appointment of Consultant for Vocational Cell

The Committee approved the proposal of appointment of a Consultant for Vocational Cell to handle the subject of agriculture initially for six months and to be reviewed thereafter. The remuneration would be last pay drawn i.e. (Pay + Grade Pay + DA) less pension.

ADD. ITEM VIII

Relaxation in residency period from the post of Deputy Secretary to Joint Secretary

The item in respect of Sh. M. K. Arora Deputy Secretary for granting relaxation in residency period from the post of Deputy Secretary to Joint Secretary was discussed in the Committee in detail but the item was not approved.

The Committee expressed their overall observations as follows:

- 1. The Agenda items should be despatched well in advance.
- The Agenda could have been better drafted. The Agenda should include detailed justification for proposals. The Financial implications involved in agenda should also be clearly mentioned.

- 3. The Agenda items related to change of Recruitment Rules should be prepared in the standard format having 14 columns to avoid any ambiguity.
- 4. The Committee was of the view that proposals for creation of posts in PB-4 Rs.8700/- and above should be forwarded to Controlling Authority i.e. Secretary MHRD for approval.

Reorienting and Sharpening the Role of State Boards of School Education in India in Improving the Quality of Secondary Education

Introduction

A very historic and progressive measure in the form of launching Rashtriya Madhyamic Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA) by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India to universalize secondary education (USE) has already been set in motion. Almost during the same period the country has witnessed a significant decline in the child mortality rate as well as in the dependency ratio, which has resulted in the most welcome 'Demographic Dividend'. In order to reap the fruits of 'Demographic Dividend', providing widened access of the quality secondary education especially to the girls, SCs and STs is an absolute imperative. The RMSA is a major expansion of secondary education to all, on the lines of Sarva Shiksha Abiyan. There are six objectives of RMSA¹. These six objectives are to be achieved with the help of National, State and district level functionaries. The role and activities of all types of agencies are enumerated in the RMSA document². It seeks to involve nongovernment agencies for research, monitoring and capacity building activities³.

The Council of Boards of School Education in India (COBSE) with its all India goodwill and influence through its 51 members-State Boards of School Education and international boards is uniquely poised to collectively contribute substantially to the needed conceptual design of secondary education as detailed out in RMSA. At the behest of MHRD, COBSE has prepared a project proposal to provide impetus to RMSA.

Objectives of the Project

The RMSA project entails universal observance of the prescribed standards regarding physical facilities by all secondary/sr secondary schools. There are varied state educational codes which prescribe physical infrastructure standards. These multiple prescriptions may not be suitable in the new context. To meet the target of Gross Enrollment Ratio, there is therefore a need to evolve a set of realistic norms and standards of infra-structure in consonance with the norms and standards laid down in RMSA document 2009, while keeping in mind the

concern that the right of universal access to secondary education is not compromised and regional variations are duly recognized.

The RMSA also envisages to improve the quality of secondary education resulting in enhanced intellectual, social and cultural learning. The student assessment and examination reforms consist of flexibility and adoption of CCE⁴. It also proposes portfolio approach instead of issuing mark sheets to students. In view of this, there is a need to define skills, to design assessment tools and to devise scheme for school-based assessment.

COBSE is placed at an advantageous position to take up this study.

COBSE is a voluntary association of all the Boards of School Education in India. It has the added advantage of benefiting from the experience of Associate Members from a few foreign countries. It works in close collaboration with MHRD, Government of India as well as with national agencies such as NCERT, NUEPA and NCTE. In order to respect regional autonomy and local-specific needs and requirement, COBSE operates through its six zones viz. central, Western, Northern, North-Eastern, Southern and Eastern. COBSE shall implement the Project in collaboration with national institutes and with the help of its six zonal offices.

Methodology

To achieve the objectives of the Project, the following activities would be carried out:-

- 1. To survey the norms and standards of infra-structure as laid down by different Boards and other national agencies/ Acts, if any.
- 2. To develop realistic and functional guidelines on norms and standards for recognition and affiliation.
- 3. To develop a comprehensive scheme containing guidelines for co-scholastic/ co-curricular activities and their assessment.
- 4. To conduct programmes for capacity building of State Board officials and resource persons drawn from different zones, helping zone to develop their local-specific guidelines broadly based on the COBSE guidelines.
- 5. To support Boards in implementing the guidelines. ε^{\pm}

The Project will be implemented in three years.

The Committee met on 13.04.2012 and has recommended the following:

- To restore payment of 0.20 paise per answer book to persons engaged at secrecy centres for dispatch of answer book.
- ii) To do away with the maximum limit of remuneration of Rs. 6000/- for the Chief Nodal Supervisor in view of the fact that at a number of nodal centres the number of Head Examiners is 10-12 also. However the remuneration and conveyance shall remain the same as at present i.e. Rs. 1500/- per Head Examiner and Rs. 150/- per day.
- iii) To enhance the remuneration to Rs. 700/- per day from Rs. 500/- for head Examiners because an Examiner examining class XII answer book gets Rs. 20/- per answer book and has to examine 20-25 answer books in a day meaning thereby that an Examiner gets

remuneration of Rs. 20/- X 25 answer books = Rs. 500/- per day which is equal to the remuneration of the Head Examiner as on date. However the conveyance shall remain the same as at present i.e. Rs. 150/- per day.

- To enhance the remuneration to Rs. 600/- per day from Rs. 400/- for Addl. Head Examiners because an Examiner examining class XII answer book gets Rs. 20/- per answer book and has to examine 20-25 answer books in a day meaning thereby that an Examiner gets remuneration of Rs. 20/- X 25 answer books= Rs. 500/- per day which is more than the remuneration of the Head Examiner as on date. However the conveyance shall remain the same as at present i.e. Rs. 150/- per day.
- v) To treat the Gestetner Operators of the Board as Class III staff in view of the change in nomenclature to Multi Tasking Staff and be paid conveyance charges as being paid to other Class III staff for delivery of question papers i.e. Rs. 150/- per day instead of Rs. 60/- per day. However, their remuneration may remain the same as their job remains unchanged even after change in nomenclature.
- vi) To restore the item head against Sl. No. 6(b) i.e. Supdtt. Checkers and to enhance the amount to Rs. 20/- per 100 answer books from Rs. 14/- per 100 answer books. The Officers of the Board are appointed as Supdtt. Checkers to check the mistake cases during the checking of answer books in the office.

The rates of remuneration/conveyance against Sl. Nos. (i), (v) & (vi) are w.e.f. 2012 examinations and enhancement in remuneration against Sl. Nos. (ii), (iii) & (iv) are w.e.f. 2013 examinations.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN

CENTRAL BOARD OF SECONDARY EDUCATION, DELHI

AND

MEDVARSITY ONLINE LTD, HYDERABAD

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (hereinafter referred to as 'MoU') is made on this __day of __ at New Delhi between Central Board of Secondary Education registered under the Societies Registration Act 1850 and having its Headquarters at Delhi (hereinafter referred to as "Project Institution" which expression shall unless repugnant to the context thereof include its successors, legal representatives and assigns) of the FIRST PART and Medvarsity Online Ltd, having its office at Life Sciences Building, Apollo Hospitals Complex, Film Nagar, Hyderabad - 500 096 (hereinafter referred to as 'Resource Institution' which expression shall unless repugnant to the context thereof include its successors, legal representatives and assigns) of the SECOND PART.

WHEREAS:

The Project Institution is engaged in providing and strengthening vocational education in schools. The Project Institution in order to upgrade the skills and proficiency of the young generation and to provide knowledge and awareness about Medical Diagnostics constituted a Committee to introduce new Vocational courses with joint certification and participation with relevant industry/organization.

Since the Resource Institution is a part of the Apollo Hospitals Group, it has requisite expertise and experience it will provide support for the successful implementation of a new course on Medical Diagnostics (hereinafter referred to as "MD") with effect from the academic session 2012-13 in the affiliated Schools of Project Institution for the students of class XI and XII.

Therefore the parties to this MoU are desirous of recording the terms and conditions as set forth below.

Now this MoU witnesses and it is hereby mutually agreed by the Project Institution and Resource Institution:

ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF PROJECT INSTITUTION:

The Project Institution hereby agrees to do the following:-

The Project Institution shall ensure that the students shall enroll with the concerned Regional Office of Project Institution in a prescribed proforma and shall collect the examination fee for its Class XII examination. If a student has enrolled and paid the examination fees but is unable to attend the exams for any reason he/she shall be required to fill the enrollment form afresh and pay the fees again.

The Project Institution shall ensure standardization by periodically providing qualified guidelines for question papers and examination schedule

to the schools in consultation with resource institute.

For conducting theory/ practical examination in Medical Diagnostics in Class XI & XII the Project Institution may take assistance from the Resource Institution to maintain the quality of skill competency at Sr. Sec. Level for issuance of certificate.

A format of Project Institution - Resource Institution Joint Certification shall be developed jointly by the Project Institution and the Resource

Institution.

The Project Institution shall finalize the matters of Course Design, updation, training of teachers, skill development of students, conducting practical and theory examinations, etc. by taking help from the Resource Institution whenever required.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF RESOURCE INSTITUTION: II.

The Resource Institution hereby agrees to do the following:

a) During the first phase, Medical Diagnostic shall be introduced in selected cities in the schools notified by the Project Institution adjacent to the hospitals and where Resource Institution is in a position to conduct practical classes with the help of nearby hospitals. As the course becomes popular and infrastructure in smaller cities improves, Medical Diagnostics course may be extended to the schools of those cities.

b) As a pilot, the course will be introduced in "Good Samaritan School, Masjid

Road, Jasola Vihar, New Delhi"

c) Resource institute shall provide practical training to student of Good Samaritan School at Indraprastha Apollo Hospital, Sarita Vihar, New Delhi. This practical training will be limited to a maximum of 40 hours in an academic year, for upto a maximum of 25 students. The details of the practical training are as per the annexure A

d) Resource Institution shall provide guidance to the Project Institution in Curriculum Design, session planning and academic scheduling of M D course. The Resource Institution shall also update the curriculum on yearly basis to

reflect the current trend of the industry.

e) Resource Institution shall assist the Project Institution in preparation of resource materials (Text book/ practical manual/ teacher's manual) for the subject of Medical Diagnostics.

f) Resource Institution shall provide academic support for conducting Orientation Programmes including refresher courses, seminars and workshops to the

g) The Resource Institution shall not charge any fee from Project Institution except the fees for Textbook Writing, Teacher Training and Seminar/ Workshop etc.

JOINT RESPONSIBILITY III.

When the course is introduced in other cities, Resource Institute will endeavor to provide practical training in Apollo Hospital near the school. However, it is understood that providing such training is not the sole responsibility of the Resource Institute. The Project Institution will reach out to suitable hospitals in the vicinity of the school where the course is introduced and will tie up with them for providing practical training.

FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENT:

a) The Project Institution will organize Teachers Training Programme, Seminar/ Awareness Workshop etc. in collaboration with resource institute and shall bear the T.A/ D.A and honorarium of experts deputed by resource institute as per existing norms of the Board.

b) The Project Institution will bear necessary expenditure related to the preparation of text books and practical manual @ Rs. 55,000 per book.

COORDINATION COMMITTEE: 3.

The "Resource Institution" and the "Project Institution" also agree that:

The activities envisaged under this MoU shall be co-ordinated through a Coordination Committee (CC) comprising the following:

Chairman, CBSE or his representative. (i)

CEO, Medvarsity Online Ltd or his representative (ii)

Two representatives from CBSE. (iii)

- Two representatives from Medvarsity Online Ltd
- The main responsibility of the Coordination Committee shall be to execute **b**) and coordinate all activities envisaged under this MoU.
- The Coordination Committee shall meet on a quarterly basis and review the progress of all the activities and monitor the realization of set targets and c) objectives.

The Resources Institution and Project Institution also agree that, they should approach industry associations for gainful employment after successful

completion of course.

CONFIDENTIALITY:

Whereas it is anticipated that, it may be necessary for Project Institution and Resource Institution to disclose certain confidential and proprietary information in written, oral, visual and/or physical/sample form to each of the party, and the Recipient may otherwise come into control or possession of certain information, including such information as collectively defined as Confidential Information as follows:

Confidential Information shall mean and include any information disclosed by Project Institution/Resource Institution to the Recipient, directly either orally or in writing, by inspection of tangible objects (including, without limitation, documents, prototypes, samples, media, documentation, discs and code). Confidential Information shall include, without limitation, any client information, business leads, contact information of buyers, trade secrets, intellectual property rights, know-how, formulae, processes, algorithms, strategies, inventions, data, network configurations, system architecture, designs, flow charts, drawings, hardware, software, media and the contents thereof, proprietary information, business and marketing plans, financial and operational information, information about customers (either present, past or prospective) of Project Institution/Resource Institution information regarded as confidential by such customers of Project Institution/Resource Institution all non-public information, material or data relating to the current business and operations of Project Institution and Resource Institution and analysis, compilations, studies, summaries, extracts or other documentation prepared by the Recipient based on information disclosed by Project Institution/Resource Institution and any other information considered as confidential information by Project Institution/Resource Institution. Confidential Information shall not include information disclosed to the Recipient by third parties on behalf of Project Institution/Resource Institution or that may otherwise come into the possession and/or control of the Recipient. The term Confidential Information shall also include any derivatives made out of any Confidential Information of Project Institution/Resource Institution and also any information gathered by the use or inspection of the Confidential Information of Project Institution/Resource Institution.

Exceptions.

This MoU imposes no obligation upon a Recipient with respect to the Confidential Information which was in the Recipient's possession before receipt from the Discloser; is or becomes a matter of public knowledge through no fault of the Recipient; is rightfully received by the Recipient from a third party without a duty of confidentiality; is disclosed by the Discloser to a third party without a duty of confidentiality on the third party; is independently developed by the Recipient; is disclosed under operation of law; or is disclosed by the Recipient with the Discloser's prior written approval.

5. REMEDIES:

No remedy provided by any of the provisions of this MoU shall be exclusive of any other remedy which is or may be otherwise available at law, equity, at statute or otherwise.

Each and every remedy provided under the provisions of this MoU shall be cumulative and in addition to the other remedies that may be available under law.

6. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS:

a) Project Institution shall have the copyright on all the Text Books and Practical manuals prepared for the Vocational course on Medical Diagnostics.

b) Neither party during the course of performance of this MoU desire nor intend to transfer any intellectual property rights whatsoever with respect to any information that is proprietary.

7. DURATION AND TERMINATION:

a) This MoU shall remain in force for an initial period of five (5) years from the date of signing and at the end of five (5) years this MoU shall automatically get renewed for subsequent extended term of one year each unless any or both the parties agree to discontinue.

b) This MoU may be terminated at any time by either party with one month prior written notice to the other party.

c) In case of discontinuance of this MoU the interest of the students who are in XI class shall be protected by both parties.

d) Notwithstanding any termination or expiration of this MoU the rights and obligations under clauses 'Confidentiality', 'Intellectual Property Rights', 'No Liability or Authority' and 'Representations and Warranties' shall survive and continue and shall bind the parties and their legal representatives, successors and assignees.

B. ALTERATION:

Any alteration, modification or addition to this MoU or waiver of any of the terms here of shall be valid if made by mutual consent of both the parties.

9. NO LIABILITY OR AUTHORITY:

a) Nothing in this MoU shall give either party any rights to use any trade names or trademarks or any service marks (or the goodwill associated

therewith) which are used by the other, save as may be authorized by the latter in writing.

No liability of either parties arises in contract or tort (including negligence

and breach of statutory duty) or otherwise.

The provider of Intellectual Property shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the other party from any losses, liabilities, damages, demands, suits, causes of action, judgments, costs or expenses (including court costs and reasonable attorneys' fees) in connection with any claim that the products or training material or programs supplied by the provider hereunder infringe or misappropriate a copyright, patent, trademark, trade secret, or any other intellectual property or proprietary right of any third party.

10. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES:

The Parties to this MoU represents and Warrants that:

a) It is validly formed according to the laws of India.

b) It has full power and power and authority to enter into this MoU and it has obtained all the sanctions that may be required under the laws applicable to it.

11. ASSIGNMENT:

Neither party shall assign, sub-contract or delegate its rights or obligations under this MoU without the written consent of the other.

12. GOVERNING LAW:

This MoU shall be governed by and construed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of India. In the event that any one or more of the provisions contained in this MoU should be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any jurisdiction, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions contained herein shall not in any way be affected or impaired thereby. The parties shall endeavor, in good faith negotiations, to replace the invalid, illegal or unenforceable provisions with valid provisions, the economic effect of which comes as close as possible to that of the invalid, illegal or unenforceable provisions.

13. BINDING EFFECT

All terms and conditions of this MoU shall be binding and incur to the benefit of and be enforceable by the parties to this MoU and assigns of the Parties.

14. NO PARTNERSHIP OR AGENCY

Nothing in this MoU shall be deemed to constitute a partnership between the Parties or constitute any Party the agent of any other Party for any purpose or

entitle any Party to commit or bind any other Party in any manner or give rise to fiduciary duties by one Party in favour of any other.

15. WAIVER OF RIGHTS

No waiver by a Party of a failure or failure by any other Party to this MoU to perform any provision of this MoU shall operate or be construed as a waiver in respect of any other or further failure whether of a like or different character.

16. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES:

In case of any dispute/difference of opinion in respect of any clause including interpretation thereof, decision of the Committee comprising of Secretary, CBSE and CEO, Medvarsity Online Ltd shall be final & binding on both the parties. If the dispute or the difference of opinion still persists and the parties are not able to come to a unanimous solution, the matter shall be referred to arbitration under the provisions of Arbitration and Conciliation Act. 1996. The place of arbitration shall be Delhi. The provisions of this clause shall survive the termination of the present MoU.

17. NOTICES:



CBSE BENEVOLENT FUND

MODALITIES OF THE BENEVOLENT FUND



INDEX

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1. INTRODUCTION:

Emergent and unforeseen situations, like sudden and serious illness of the employee, sometimes coupled with absence from duty without pay for long periods on account of such illness or his/her death in harness may leave the families of such employees in great financial distress. At such times, benevolence in the form of immediate financial assistance must be readily available so as to enable the dependant family to tide over their genuine financial stringency. Keeping this in view, the CBSE proposes for the setting up of a Benevolent Fund hereinafter referred to as Fund. The Fund shall be sustained by financial assistance from the CBSE and contribution from CBSE employees enrolled as members. It is therefore proposed to start a benevolent Fund in CBSE with Detailed modalities as mentioned in subsequent paras.



2. OBJECTIVE:

The broader objectives for creation of the Benevolent. Fund are to provide financial relief to the in-service employees for the following:

- (i) To any member of the fund who after the date of joining the fund, suffers from permanent disability, while on duty will be given under this as per annexure. (Page 10-11)
- (ii) To the family of a member of the fund in case of his death / To meet the funeral expenses, a sum of Rs. 1,00,000/- (One Lakh only) by cheque will be given as immediate relief to the nominee within 2 days of the death. An amount of Rs. 5, 00,000/- (Five Lakh only) for Group 'B' and 'C' employees and Rs. 8, 00,000/- (Eight Lakh only) for Group 'A' officers by cheque will be given within a period of 15 days.
- (iii) A member of the fund who suffers partial disability or prolonged illness forcing him / her to remain on leave without pay for a period exceeding one month e.g. Brain stroke, cancer, EHD or accident will be paid Rs. 25,000/- per month for a maximum period of 06 months.
- (iv) For acquiring artificial limbs, hearing aids or any such device for either a member of the fund or his dependents where no such relief is available to him under the Medical Rules of the Board, actual cost of the equipment/procedure limited to Rs. 50,000 (Fifty Thousand only) on production of Bill by cheque may be reimbursed.
- (v) The Chairman, CBSE has the discretion, on the recommendation of the Central Managing Committee, to sanction expenditure or to grant monetary relief / aid in deserving cases of individual or general welfare of the members of the fund which are not covered by the rules.

The benefits granted bender the scheme will be in addition to provisions existing Govt. / Board instruction of ex-gratia, medical aid, hospitalization reimbursement / or and similar relief granted by the Govt. / Railways etc.



3. MEMBER REGISTRATION:

- (a) For the initial constitution of the fund, all the employees who were on roll of CBSE (regular/on deputation/contract) will be deemed as registered wef 1.1.2012 and will be eligible to receive the benefits under the fund.
- (b) From the year 2013 onwards any employee, who wishes to become a member of this Fund voluntarily, shall submit his/her application to the secretary of the Managing Committee of the fund in the Application Form for membership as prescribed in 'Appendix A'; and

(c) The employee has to authorize the Board to deduct membership fee from his salary.

(d) Regular employees of the Board on deputation to Govt of India will continue to be member of the fund subject to contribution of the annual fee.

(e) Membership will cease on resignation from the fund, ceasing to be regular employee of the Board(on account of resignation/retirement/dismissal/death) or non payment of subscription

4. FUND CORPUS:

There will be a Fund Corpus for the Benevolent Fund of CBSE. To start with CBSE will contribute an amount of Rs. 10,000,000 (One crore rupees only). The benefits will be provided by the interest generated from the fund corpus and employees' contribution to the fund.

5. INCOME OF THE FUND:

Annual income of the fund will be annualized interest of the Initial corpus and the annual contributions received from the employees. The date of start of the fund will be 1st Jan 2012. All regular/deputation employees of the Board as on 1st Jan 2012 will be deemed members of the fund.

Fee for various category employees will be different. There are 2 categories of staff in CBSE which can be classified as below:-

a) Regular Employees of the Board or Deputationists: The membership of the Fund shall be open to all regular CBSE employees and officers on deputation with the Board and employees on contract. A member of the Fund shall be a person who, having been admitted as a member in accordance with the rules governing the Fund, has paid his subscription and has not resigned.



b) <u>Daily wage or contract employees who draw their wages directly from the Board and not through any agency.</u>

Enrolment Fee and Eligibility for grant of the Fund for these will be as follows:-

<u>Head</u>	Regular staff and Deputationist	Contractual Staff
Fee for membership	Annual Contribution: One day salary	Annual contribution: One day salary of the employee at the time of membership
Benefits/ Grants	Full benefits of the Fund as mentioned under "objectives" Para 2 above	Funeral Grant: In the event of death of a contract Daily Wage employee, immediate relief in the shape of grants of Rs.50000/- will be given to the dependents for meeting funeral expenses. Disability Grant: In case being permanently incapacitated and consequent inability to continue in effective service, an amount of Rs.100000/- would be paid to him or his legal heirs with an objective of facilitating their rehabilitation.

Those employees who have already paid one day salary in 2012 will be considered as founder members and will not be required to deposit one day salary again. One day salary from other members will be deducted from the pay for the month of December 2012.

6. RULES REG EMPLOYEE SUBSCRIPTION TO THE FUND:

- (i) Employees joining in the mid of year or after 1 Jan 2012 will also be charged full contribution on calendar year basis.
- (ii) Membership will be activated only after depositing the admission fee and annual contribution.
- (iii) After the issue of circular, first time the admission fee and annual contribution will be deducted in one go from the salary.
- (iv) In subsequent years, annual contribution will become due on every 1st July and will be deducted from the salary of July.
- (v) Subscription from the members will be collected by the Accounts section/Cashier by way of making deduction from the salary of the members on a written authorization given by them.
- (vi) Contribution once made to the fund shall not be refunded in any case.
- (vii) A member shall cease to be a member of the Fund in the event of Resignation from membership of the Fund, Ceasing to be employee of CBSE on account of retirement/ resignation/ dismissal/ death etc. or Non-payment of the subscription of the Fund continuously for three years. No benefit will be given to the employees in case death /disability after retirement from service.
- (viii) All employees regular and contractual/daily wage of the CBSE shall have an option to subscribe towards CBSE Benevolent Fund during the period of their stay in the CBSE.



(viii) All employees regular and contractual/daily wage of the CBSE shall have an option to subscribe towards CBSE Benevolent Fund during the period of their stay in the CBSE.

(ix) Mere being a member of the Benevolent Fund will not give any right to contractual employee for regularization. A declaration, in duplicate, in the prescribed form shall be obtained from all members of the staff of the CBSE.

- (x) A note shall be kept in the service book of the persons concerned duly signed by the Head of Office regarding the date from which the person commenced his membership of the fund/withdrew from his membership and subscription from members shall be collected at the rates fixed by the Managing Committee.
- (xi) An account of subscriptions collected in the CBSE will be maintained in the register as prescribed by managing Committee. This register will be a permanent record and the responsibility for its proper maintenance will primarily rest with the DDO of the branch, under supervision of the Head of Administration/ regional Officer. The accounts of the fund will be put up to the officer of the level of Director every month for attestation. The Dy. Secretary(Vigilance) while inspecting the branches/units, will also check these accounts and see that these are being maintained properly.

7. Application for Grant/ Assistance:

- (a) Application for assistance from the members shall be received by the Joint Secretary (A&L). These applications shall be considered by the Board.
- (b) In case of Emergency, the Chairman shall have powers to sanction amounts to the extent and for the purpose mentioned herein above, which shall be ratified by the Governing Body at its next meeting.
