Shri Raja Roy Singh, Mrs. Pushpa Mehta, Shri G.K. Chandiramani, Shri L.R. Desai and Shri S. Govindarajulu expressed their inability to attend the meeting.

Before taking up the business of the meeting, the Chairman extended a hearty welcome to all the members as it was the first meeting of the reconstituted Board. He also informed the members as to how the reconstituted Board had come into being and invited their attention to the responsible task which has been entrusted to the Board viz. setting up of an All-India Standard for the Higher Secondary Education. He said that the All-India Higher Secondary Examination conducted by the Board should be such as would command respect all over the country and be recognised as one of the best examinations all over the world. He hoped that with the joint efforts of all the members, the Board will be able to establish a high standard for the Higher Secondary education.

The Chairman then informed the members that the Scheme of Studies for the All-India Higher Secondary Examination has been drawn up by a Syllabus Committee appointed by the Board and a copy of the Scheme together with an explanatory note thereon as also a statement showing comparison of the Scheme with the recommendations of High Power Committee of the erstwhile Delhi Board have been placed

on the table. He requested the members to go through the same at their convenience and send their comments, if any, to the office of the Board as early as possible. If the comments were received in good time, they would be circulated amongst the members for consideration, so that the Scheme could be considered and finalised in the next meeting of the Board to be held in October, 1962. Thereafter, the syllabi will be drawn up in accordance with the Scheme. They will be considered and approved by the Board at its January, 1963 meeting and thus be ready for publication by March, 1963. The first examination to be conducted according to this Scheme will be held in 1966.

L. Ishwar Dass thanked the Chairman on behalf of the members of the Board for the warm welcome that he had extended to them. He, however, expressed an apprehension in the matter of control and direction of schools situated in Delhi and New Delhi because of the separation of the Board from the Delhi Administration. The Chairman explained that there was no such possibility because the Board was already working in close co-operation with the Directorate of Education. He added that Shri B.D. Bhatt, ~~the~~ Director of Education, is Vice-Chairman of the Central Board and there are also other representatives of the Delhi Administration on the Board. He hoped, therefore, that there will be good co-operation between the Delhi Administration and the Board so far as the control and direction of Delhi Schools was concerned.

The Board then proceeded to consider the various items of the Agenda.

I. The Secretary reported letter No: F.12(2)/62, dated the 23rd of June, 1962 from the Director of Education, Delhi communicating that the Delhi Administration will reimburse to the Board the amount in respect of the exemption granted in examination fees to the candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. He also explained that the said exemption has been granted for the present upto 31st of March, 1964.

RESOLVED that the report be recorded.

(c) (i) according provisional recognition for the teaching of (1) Geometrical and Mechanical Drawing, and (2) Drawing and Painting in the Higher Secondary Department of Shyama Prasad Vidyalaya (Higher Secondary School), Lodi Estate, New Delhi, with effect from the beginning of the academic session 1963-64 on the conditions as recommended by the Inspection Committee, and

(ii) refusing recognition for the teaching of (1) Biology and (2) Geography in the Higher Secondary Department of the above said school, as recommended by the Inspection Committee.

RESOLVED that the report be recorded.

III. The Board considered letter No: F.29-2/60.B.2, dated the 3rd of March, 1962 from the Adviser (Primary Education) to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Education, New Delhi, addressed to the Secretary of the erstwhile Delhi Board, requesting a reconsideration of the decision taken by that Board in not recognising the Diploma awarded by the Hindustani Talimi Sangh, Wardha as equivalent to B.Ed. Degree of the University of Delhi.

RESOLVED that a Committee consisting of Dr. P.D. Shukla, Prof. K.C. Nag, Dr. T.K.N. Menon and Shri D.I. Lall be appointed to examine the question and the matter be brought up again before the Board at its next meeting along with the recommendations of the Committee for consideration.

IV. The Board considered the question of laying down the rates of application fee for recognition to be charged from schools falling in the following categories:-

(a) PROVISIONALLY RECOGNISED SCHOOLS :

- (i) seeking provisional recognition in additional subject/subjects;
- (ii) seeking extension of provisional recognition;
- (iii) seeking permanent recognition; and

(b) PERMANENTLY RECOGNISED SCHOOLS :

- (i) seeking provisional recognition in additional subject/subjects;
- (ii) seeking permanent recognition in such additional subject/subjects in which provisional recognition was accorded earlier.

RESOLVED that a fee of Rs 300-00 only be charged, as already fixed, from institutions applying for fresh recognition

for the Higher Secondary standard. No further fee be charged for the present for recognition in additional subject/subjects or for extension of provisional recognition or for grant of permanent recognition.

V. The Board considered the draft amendments to the Regulations of the Board and RESOLVED that:

(a) the following proviso be added to clause 6 of Chapter III dealing with the powers of the Chairman:

"Provided that he may relax any of the provisions contained in the Regulations if he is satisfied that this is absolutely essential in order to avoid hardship."

(b) Chapter IV, Regulation 10(v):-

(i) The following be added as Clause 4 and the existing clauses 4 and 5 be renumbered as 5 and 6 respectively:

"4. The Chairman may grant in an emergency exemption to teachers and heads of schools, who do not fulfil the minimum qualifications laid down by the Recognition Committee, if he is satisfied that in view of the long experience and/or dearth of qualified teachers in the subject concerned, these are fit cases for grant of such an exemption."

(ii) The existing Clause 6 be replaced by the following Clauses 7, 8 and 9 and the existing Clauses 7 and 8 be renumbered as 10 and 11 respectively:

"7. The Recognition Committee shall, within three months of the date of inspection of an institution, submit all applications received by it with its recommendations thereon to the Chairman.

"8. The Chairman may, on the report of the Recognition Committee or otherwise, accord recognition to any institution as he may consider suitable. The recognition so granted shall be provisional.

"9. The Chairman may grant permission pending formal recognition after due inspection, to open classes, on an assurance by the Director of Education that the essential staff, equipment and accommodation were being arranged and that they will be available before the classes are started."

(c) Chapter VI, Regulation 2- Requirements to be complied with by institutions applying for recognition.

Clause (J) - The following words appearing in second sentence be deleted:-

"The books should be selected from the list of books supplied by the Board."

The Board, however, desired that the various Committees of Courses should prepare lists of suitable books which should be sent to the schools for guidance from time to time and the schools be advised to keep the said list in view while buying books for their libraries.

The Board considered the explanation dated the 26th of July, 1962, given by Shri Khatu Raisinghani in response to the notice issued to him to show cause why the result of his High School Examination, 1959 to which he had taken wrongful admission by producing a forged Transfer Certificate for having passed Class VIII of P.D. Tandon Higher Secondary School, Jhansi, be not cancelled.

RESOLVED that the candidate's High School Examination 1959 and the result thereof be cancelled, and due publicity be given to the cancellation.

VII. The Board considered whether the Reserve Fund of the recognised schools which was hitherto being maintained in the joint name of the Manager of the School concerned and the Director of Education who also happened to be the Chairman of the erstwhile Board, be now required to be maintained in the joint name of the Manager of the School and the Chairman of the Board.

RESOLVED that the Reserve Fund of the recognised schools situated in Delhi/New Delhi be continued to be maintained in the joint name of the Manager of the School concerned and the Director of Education who is also Vice-Chairman of the Board and that the Reserve Fund of the recognised schools situated outside Delhi be maintained in the joint name of the Chairman of the Board and the Manager of the school concerned.

RESOLVED further that clause (c) of Regulation 2 of Chapter VI dealing with Rules for recognition be amended as under:-

The following para be added at the end of Clause (c):-

"The Reserve Fund shall be maintained in the joint name of the Manager of the School concerned and the Chairman of the Board. In case of the recognised schools situated in Delhi/New Delhi, however, the Reserve Fund shall be maintained in the joint name of the Manager of the School concerned and the Director of Education, Delhi Administration."

VIII. The Board considered the proposal to sanction an expenditure of about Rs 7500-00 in connection with the preparation of a water-mark seal in the name of the Board for use on the blank answerbooks, etc.

RESOLVED that an expenditure of Rs 7500-00 be sanctioned in connection with the preparation of the water-mark seal in the name of the Board for use on blank answer-books, etc.

IX. The Board considered the question of electing:

(i) Two members of the Board to serve on the Finance Committee, under Regulation 10(i)(c);

(ii) Five persons, including two members of the Board, to serve on the Curriculum Committee under Regulation 10(ii)(c);

- (iii) Three members of the Board to serve on the Examinations Committee under Regulation 10(iii)(b);
- (iv) Four educationists from amongst its members to serve on the Results Committee, under Regulation 10(iv)(c);
- (v) Four educationists from amongst its members to serve on the Recognition Committee, under Regulation 10(v)(b); and
- (vi) Two members of the Board to serve on the Scrutinising Committee, under Regulation 10(vi)(b)

of Chapter IV of the Regulations of the Board.

The Secretary reported that according to Regulation 3 of Chapter IV of the Regulations, at least one of the members on each of these Committees must be from outside Delhi.

RESOLVED that the Chairman be authorised to nominate such persons as he may consider suitable on each of the above Committees.

X. The Board considered the question of appointment of Committees of Courses in various subjects/groups of subjects under Regulation 10(vii), Chapter IV of the Regulations of the Board.

RESOLVED that the Chairman be authorised to constitute various Committees of Courses by appointing such members on them as he may consider suitable.

XI. The Board considered the draft Rules for permitting change of group and subjects for the Higher Secondary and Higher Secondary (Multi-purpose) Examinations.

RESOLVED that the proposed Rules be not approved.

RESOLVED further that (i) Principals of the schools be empowered to permit any change of group or subject(s) to their students during the course of IX Class or upto July 31 at the beginning of the X Class, and (ii) any request made thereafter for change of group or subject(s) at the Higher Secondary/Higher Secondary (Multi-purpose) Examinations may be acceded to by the Chairman, on the recommendation of the Principal, in special cases such as transfer of parents or guardian, physical disability of the candidate to pursue the subject(s) already offered or for any other adequate reason.

XII. The Board considered the draft rules for the appointment of amenuensis at the Board's Examinations as per Appendix I.

RESOLVED that the draft Rules be approved subject to the following amendment:-

"In para 6 the words 'per day' be replaced by the words 'per session'."

XIII. The Board considered the question of laying down Rules for submission of text-books by publishers.

RESOLVED that the Rules laid down by the erstwhile Delhi Board for the purpose be followed for the present.

XIV. The Secretary reported orders passed by the Chairman in the matter of:-

(a) according provisional recognition for the teaching of Economics in the Higher Secondary Department of the Indian Higher Secondary School, Tehran (Iran) with effect from the 15th of July, 1960 to the 14th of July, 1963;

(b) extending provisional recognition of the Higher Secondary Department of the S.R.S.D. Higher Secondary School, Lajpatnagar, New Delhi with effect from the 15th of July, 1962 upto the end of the academic session 1963-64 on the conditions as recommended by the Inspection Committee; and

(c) extending provisional recognition of the Higher Secondary Department of the Delhi Kannada School, Lodi Estate, New Delhi with effect from the beginning of the academic session 1962-63 upto the 30th of April, 1963 on the conditions as recommended by the Inspection Committee.

RESOLVED that the report be recorded.

XV. The Board considered the requests of (i) General Secretary, All India Secondary Teachers' Federation, Delhi and (ii) Hony. Secretary, Delhi School Managers' Association to have their representation on the Board.

RESOLVED that <sup>the</sup> requests be not acceded to.

XVI. The Board considered the question of opening Contributory Provident Fund Accounts in respect of the employees of the Delhi office with the Bank of India, Ltd., New Delhi.

RESOLVED that the Contributory Provident Fund Accounts in respect of the employees of the Delhi office of the Board be opened with the Bank of India, Ltd., Asaf Ali Road, New Delhi.

CENTRAL BOARD OF SECONDARY EDUCATION

Proceedings of the General Meeting of the Central Board of Secondary Education held in the Conference Hall of the Ministry of Education, North Block, New Delhi, on Sunday the 24th June, 1962.

Sarvashri J.T.M. Gibson, S. Natrajan and S.D. Bahuguna expressed their inability to attend the meeting.

1. The minutes of the meeting of the Board held on the 8th of May, 1962, were confirmed subject to the modification that in the opening line of para 2 of item 2, the words "general conclusions were drawn" be replaced by the words "tentative views were expressed".

2. The Secretary reported the orders passed by the Chairman declaring the results of the Higher Secondary, Intermediate Arts and Intermediate Science Examinations of 1962.

Resolved that the orders of the Chairman be noted.

3. It was reported by the Secretary that the office of the Board had been located at 17-B, Indraprastha Marg, New Delhi, with effect from 1st of June, 1962.

Resolved that the report be recorded.

4. The Board considered the proposal to make a provision of Rs.2,500-00 for a water cooler with a storage capacity of 100 litres for the use of the office staff of the Board.

Resolved that the expenditure of Rs.2,500-00 be made for water cooler with storage capacity of 100 litres.

5. The Board considered the proposal to sanction an imprest of Rs.300-00 for Delhi Office to enable the Secretary to meet the day to day expenditure on petty items in Delhi.

Resolved that an imprest of Rs.300/- be sanctioned for the Delhi Office as proposed. Resolved further that the amount of the imprest at the Ajmer office be reduced from Rs.300/- to Rs.200/- in view of the lesser amount of contingent expenditure that would now be required to be incurred by that office.

6. The Board considered the question of opening a Current Deposit Account with the Bank of India Ltd., or the United Commercial Bank Ltd. at Asaf Ali Road, New Delhi, with an amount upto a limit of Rs.1 lakh to facilitate the day to day operation of the account owing to the proximity of the Bank to the Board's office. In this connection it was explained by the Secretary that this was necessary owing to the fact that the State Bank of India at Parliament Street where an account of the Board exists is at a distance of about 4 miles from the Board's office. Apart from being inconvenient, the day to day operation of the account with the State Bank would entail much expenditure on conveyance and consume lot of time in depositing and collecting cash because the cashier will have to visit the Bank

almost daily. It was also explained that the main business including drawal of cheques in favour of examiners and other parties will continue to be done at the State Bank of India.

Resolved that the Bank of India Ltd., Asaf Ali Road, New Delhi, be and are hereby appointed Bankers to the Central Board of Secondary Education and a Current Deposit account in the name of the Board be opened with the said Bank;

That all cheques on the bank account be signed and all bills, notes and other negotiable instruments be drawn, accepted and made on behalf of the Central Board of Secondary Education by Shri D.I. Lall, Secretary of the Board;

That all cheques, notes and other negotiable instruments payable to the Board be endorsed for the Board by Shri D.I. Lall, Secretary of the Board;

That the Current Account of the Board with the Bank be operated by Shri D.I. Lall, Secretary of the Board;

That a copy of this resolution signed by the Chairman of the Board be handed over to the Bank together with the specimen signature of Shri D.I. Lall, Secretary of the Board.

Resolved further that for the time being the credit balance in this account should not exceed Rs.50,000/-.

7. Resolved that the following posts be sanctioned with immediate effect:-

(a) P.A. to the Chairman in the grade of Rs.210-10-290-15-320-EB-15-425-EB-15-530.

(b) One Stenographer in the grade of Rs.130-5-160-8-200-EB-8-256-EB-8-280 with a special allowance of Rs.15/- p.m.

8. It was reported by the Secretary that till now the Board of Higher Secondary Education, Delhi, had been conducting the Prabodh Praveen and Pragna examinations for the Central Government employees on behalf of the Ministry of Home Affairs under the Hindi Teaching Scheme of the Govt. of India. Due to the winding up of the Delhi Board with effect from 1st July, 1962, the question of entrusting these examinations to the Central Board of Secondary Education came up for consideration by the Home Ministry. The Central Board could not, however, take over this responsibility unless all the expenditure to be incurred on these examinations was reimbursed by the Government. A statement of estimated expenditure was drawn up and the matter was discussed by the Secretary with the officials of the Home Ministry, Education Ministry and the Chairman of the Delhi Board of Higher Secondary Education. The Board has now been informed that the Home Ministry may not avail of the services of the Board for conducting these Hindi examinations.

Resolved that the report be recorded and that in these circumstances Central Board need not be concerned in taking over these examinations.

9. The Board considered the representation of Shri Khatu Raisinghani against cancellation of the result of his High School Examination, 1959.

Resolved that Shri Khatu Raisinghani be asked to show why the result of his High School Examination, 1959, be not cancelled because of his having taken admission to the examination by producing a false transfer certificate of having passed the VII class promotion examination of the Furushottam Dass Tandon High Secondary School, Jhansi, and the matter be brought again before

Board for consideration along with the explanation of the candidate.

10. The Board considered the question of payment of arrears from 1st July, 1959, to 1st April, 1961, on account of refixation of pay due to revision of pay scales, to such ex-employees of the Board who were in service on 1st July, 1959; the date from which the revised pay scales were made applicable, but were not in employment of the Board on 1st April, 1961, the date on which the Board had sanctioned the revision of the pay scales.

Resolved that no arrears be paid on account of revision of pay scales to such employees of the Board who were not in service on 1-4-1961.

11. The request of the Delhi Sanskrit Vishwa Parishad received through the Ministry of Education, Government of India, for setting the Sanskrit question papers for the Higher Secondary Examination in Sanskrit instead of English was considered.

Resolved that the question paper in Sanskrit for the Higher Secondary Examination of the Board be henceforward set in English as well as in Sanskrit in Devnagri script.

12. The Board considered the proposal of transferring from Ajmer to Delhi Office the provision for an allowance of Rs.20.00 per month sanctioned for a confidential clerk attached to the Secretary, as there was no longer any confidential work to be done at Ajmer.

Resolved that the matter be left to the Chairman for such action as he may deem necessary.

13. The question of adoption of the Government rules in the matter of over-time allowance payable to the employees of the Board was considered. Shri B.D. Bhatt explained that whenever the staff of the existing Delhi Board of Higher Secondary Education put in over-time, the nature of work was such that it entitled them to extra payment from the funds of the Board.

Resolved that the Govt. rules in respect of over-time allowance are not suitable for the purpose of the Board in view of the special nature of work involved and the same be, therefore, not adopted.

14. The question of deciding as to what should be the year in which the last Higher Secondary Examination should be conducted according to the syllabus of the Ajmer Board, was left to the discretion of the Chairman.

15. The Secretary read out letter No. F.55-11/62-SE.2(B) dated 21st June, 1962, received from the Ministry of Education communicating approval of the Controlling Authority to the Board's Regulations as finalised at its meeting held on 21st April, 1962, except with regard to the following:-

- (a) Rates of examination fee for the Board's examinations in Delhi and Ajmer syllabuses and of the ad hoc All-India syllabus; and
- (b) Admission of private candidates to Board's examinations.

In regard to (a) the Controlling Authority suggested that it would not be desirable to enhance fees for the first two years and in regard to (b) it felt that it would be impossible to maintain high standards if private candidates were admitted to the Board's examinations.

RESOLVED that (a) the fees for the Higher Secondary Examination to be conducted according to Delhi syllabus and the rates of remuneration to examiners, paper-setters, etc. be the same as provided for by the Delhi Board of Higher Secondary Education and the matter reviewed after a period of two years. A request be, however, made to the Ministry of Education for grant-in-aid to cover the resulting deficit;

(b) the fees for the Higher Secondary Examination to be conducted according to the Ajmer syllabus be continued to be the same as prescribed by that Board;

(c) the fees for the All-India Higher Secondary Examination be the same as already proposed in view of the fact that this examination will be conducted according to a syllabus different from the existing Delhi syllabus;

(d) only such categories of candidates be permitted to appear at the Board's examinations as private candidates as are being allowed at present by the Delhi Board of Higher Secondary Education, except that the concession be no longer restricted only to the residents of Delhi territory in view of the expanded jurisdiction of the Board.

16. The Board considered the question of granting medical facilities to its staff at Delhi. In this connection the Secretary apprised the Board of the practice obtaining in Ajmer office and also of the difficulties experienced in Delhi because of its large area. It was also reported that a request was made to the Ministry of Health to extend the benefit of their Contributory Health Service Scheme to the Board's staff on usual terms and conditions, but although the Directorate of Health Services had registered the Board's name with them, it had expressed its inability to extend the benefit of C.F.S. to the Board's staff at this stage because of inadequacy of available facilities.

RESOLVED that the negotiations with the Health Ministry be continued and till such time as the C.H.S. Scheme is extended to the Board, the Chairman be authorised to appoint on suitable terms one or two registered medical practitioners - preferably one in Delhi, and another in New Delhi - who may render medical assistance and certify the medical bills for reimbursement in connection with the sickness of the employees themselves and of such members of their family who are wholly dependent upon them.

17. The Board considered at length the recommendations of the Syllabus Committee appointed to draft a Scheme of Studies for the All-India Higher Secondary Examination, a discussion on which was postponed in its meeting of the 8th of May, 1962 and RESOLVED that -

- (i) the question with regard to the duration of the Secondary education course i.e. whether it should cover a period of three years or four years, be postponed pending the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Secondary Education of the Central Advisory Board of Education, which was seized of the issue;
- (ii) the question with regard to the breaking up of the total period of 11 years into two periods of 7 + 4 instead of 8 + 3 be similarly postponed pending the recommendations of the afore-said Standing Committee;
- (iii) the question with regard to the allotment of 25% marks for internal assessment be referred to the Syllabus Committee for examining it and giving a considered opinion on the same. It was felt, however, that the

results of internal assessment of the candidates may have to be moderated into standard scores to make them comparable;

(iv) the syllabuses of both the levels i.e. junior level and advanced level, be drawn up in such a way that there is enough flexibility so that they could be enforced without any difficulty and fitted in easily according to the duration and break up of the secondary education course that may be decided by the Standing Committee of Central Advisory Board of Education. It was also suggested in this connection that the syllabus of the 8th class should be so drawn up as to be capable of being integrated in either of the spans namely 7 + 4 or 8 + 3;

(v) the syllabi for the VI and VII classes be also drawn up so that they could be adopted by the Government of India in the schools opened by them for the children of the Central Government employees;

(vi) the recommendations of the Syllabus Committee with regard to the Junior level, as contained in paras 5 to 9 of the Scheme of Studies, be approved subject to the following modifications:-

(a) The compulsory part should consist of the following six subjects instead of five:-

- (1) Hindi (to be offered either at the mother tongue or non-mother tongue level)
- (2) English
- (3) Regional language/Foreign language
- (4) Craft
- (5) Elementary Mathematics and General Science.
- (6) Social Studies and Indian Culture and Civilization.

(b) The optional part should consist of a number of subjects out of which any four may be selected by a candidate and a pass in two subjects may be essential. The Syllabus Committee was requested to re-examine the list of these subjects and see if two or more optional subjects could be combined into one. The grouping of the subjects from 1 to 10 and 11 to 19 was no longer necessary in view of (a) above. The words "with emphasis on literature" appearing after the optional subject No. (2) Modern Indian Languages including English, were also referred back to the Syllabus Committee for reconsideration.

(vii) The recommendations of the Syllabus Committee with regard to the advanced level, as contained in paras 10 to 17 of the Scheme of Studies, were approved subject to the following modifications:-

- (a) In the compulsory part the words "Regional Language" appearing in 3(a) be replaced by the words "Modern Indian Language other than Hindi".
- (b) The Syllabus Committee should re-examine if Elementary Mathematics could be continued to be taught upto Class X.
- (c) With regard to the optional part; it was suggested that the syllabus committee should re-examine if the courses for Group III (Technical) and Group V (Agriculture) could be so drawn up as to provide for two levels - one to serve as a preparation for advanced courses and the other to serve as a terminal stage. This could be done in co-ordination with Prof. T.K.N. Menon and the Directorate of Extension Programmes in Secondary Education.
- (d) In Group VI (Fine Arts), Paper I be renamed as "History and Appreciation of Art".
- (e) The Syllabus Committee should re-examine the question of placing successful candidates in different divisions as at present in addition to giving credits, as it was felt that

for the purposes of employment it would be helpful to the candidates if divisions were also mentioned in the qualifying certificates issued by the Board. This was thought to be desirable because most of the employers insisted for a particular division as their minimum requirement.

18. The Secretary reported to the Board that no decision had yet been taken by the Government about the terms and conditions on which the staff of the Delhi Board of Higher Secondary Education was to be taken over by the Central Board although the crucial date of the take over viz. 1st July, 1962, was fast approaching. Since continuity in the Board's work was very essential, he sought guidance from the Board as to the manner in which he should proceed in the matter.

During the course of discussion, Shri B.D. Bhatt, Chairman of the Delhi Board of Higher Secondary Education and Director of Education, Delhi Administration, was good enough to agree to absorb in the Administration as many employees of the Board as possible and accordingly it was RESOLVED that the Secretary of the Board should contact Shri B.D. Bhatt and take over such staff as was necessary for the efficient conduct of the Board's work, on the following conditions:-

- (a) PERMANENT STAFF - Such of the staff who opt for the Central Board and are taken over by it, be paid the same pay in the same grade and allowances which they were getting immediately before their transfer to the Central Board. They be paid, in addition, deputation allowance @ 20% of their basic pay for a period of six months in the first instance.
- (b) TEMPORARY STAFF - Such staff as is taken over, be paid the same pay in the same grade and allowances, as they were getting immediately before their transfer to the Board.
- (c) The Central Board will have an option to send any person so taken, back to the Delhi Administration by giving three months notice.

19. The Chairman informed the members that it was the last meeting of the existing Board, and before concluding the meeting he thanked them for their valued services to the Board during their tenure of membership.

The meeting then came to a close with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

II. The Secretary reported the following action taken by the Chairman:-

- (a) approving on 3.8.1962, on the recommendation of the Conveners of the Committees of Courses in History and Civics of the erstwhile Delhi Board, the following amendments to the minimum qualifications laid down for teachers to teach Civics upto Class XI:-

Reference page 5 of the booklet containing minimum qualifications (1961 Edition).

(i) Item 9(1) -

Delete the words "Or History" appearing in the second line.

(ii) Item 9 (2) -

Add the word "History" after the word "Economics" in the first line, by putting an oblique line between the two words.

- (f) approving on 4th September, 1962, the following changes in the courses in Tamil for the Higher Secondary Multi-purpose and Higher Secondary Examinations 1965 so as to be in consonance with the courses prescribed by Madras University for its Pre-University Examination in the subject :-
- (i) Substitute "S.S.L.C. text Book 1963" for "S.S.L.C. Text Book 1962".
- (ii) Substitute "Selections in Poetry Part I Tamil, Pre-University Text Book, 1963 (University of Madras)" for "Selections in Poetry Part I Tamil, Pre-University Text Book, 1962 (University of Madras)".

and the grace marks would be spread over the subject or subjects in which he has failed and he shall be deemed to have passed the examination.

NOTE:- A candidate who has been given the grace of one mark in a practical, shall be eligible to get up to 4 grace marks only, in the written and/or aggregate "of one or more subjects."

(h) approving vide orders dated 13.9.1962, the date and time of commencement of the following examinations of the Board as noted against each :-

(i) requiring vide orders dated 13.9.1962, two copies of passport size photograph (instead of one postcard size photograph) from male Private candidates for the examinations of the Board to be held in the year 1963 and thereafter;

(j) allowing vide orders dated 13.9.1962, fifteen days (instead of a week) for the receipt of forms of applications (with late fee) for the Ratna, Bhushan and Prabhakar (Compartmental) Examinations after the last date fixed for receipt of fees and forms without late fee;

(k) permitting vide orders dated 13.9.1962, the failures of the Higher Secondary (Multi-purpose) - Part II - Examination 1962, to re-appear at the examination as private candidates, as is the case with the failures of the Higher Secondary Examination;

(l) approving on 28th of October, 1962, syllabus and courses in Gujarati (Mother Tongue) for the Higher Secondary Multi-purpose Examinations to be held in the years 1964 and 1965;

(m) approving on the 28th of October, 1962 with minor changes the syllabus in Physics for the Higher Secondary, Higher Secondary Technical and Higher Secondary Multi-purpose Examinations to be held in the years 1963, 1964 and 1965; and

- (n) approving on the 31st of October, 1962, certain changes in the syllabi and courses in Telugu (Group "A" or "C") for the Higher Secondary Examinations 1963, 1964 and 1965.

Regarding item (g), the Chairman further suggested that the grace marks given to a candidate should be added to the marks already earned by the candidate.

Regarding (h) it was suggested by the Secretary that the Examination for Elementary Maths. for Private candidates may be combined with the examination of regular candidates on 19th Feb., 1963 and that the Examination for Higher Secondary Multipurpose Part I, may commence on 27th Feb.'63 instead of 26th Feb., 1963, as the latter is a public holiday on account of Id-ul-Fitar.

RESOLVED that -

- (i) The report be recorded;
- (ii) In regard to item (g) the following line be added at the end of third para of the amended Rule 4:

"The grace marks shall be added to the marks already earned by the candidate." and

(iii) The examination of private candidates in Elementary Maths. be combined with that of regular candidates on 19th Feb.'63 and that the Higher Secondary Multipurpose Part I Examination be commenced on 27th Feb., 1963 instead of 26th Feb., 1963.

III. With reference to its Resolution No. III dated 18.8.1962, the Board considered the recommendation of the sub-committee appointed by it in connection with the recognition of the diploma awarded by the Hindustani Talimi Sangh, Wardha as equivalent to a B.Ed. Degree.

RESOLVED that the Teachers Training diploma awarded by the Hindustani Talimi Sangh, Wardha to graduates be recognised as equivalent to B.T., B.Ed., L.T. or Post-graduate Diploma in Basic Education issued by a recognised University or a State Government.

IV. The Secretary reported the personnel of the various Committees of the Board as appointed by the Chairman in terms of Resolutions Nos.9 and 10 passed by the Board at its meeting held on 18th August, 1962.

RESOLVED that the report be recorded.

V. The Board considered the Draft Scheme of Studies for its All-India Higher Secondary Examination.

RESOLVED that the scheme of studies for the All-India Higher Secondary Examination of the Board as per Appendix "A" be approved in principle and details about the subjects to be provided under each diversified group and other relative matters be examined by a Committee consisting of Dr. P.D. Shukla, Shri B.D. Bhatt, Prof. K.C. Nag, Shri M.N. Kapur, Shri Harish Chandra and Shri D.I. Lall (Member-Secretary).

Further RESOLVED that the Chairman be authorised to take suitable action on the report of the above Committee with a view to expedite the same and have detailed syllabi prepared at the earliest.

VI. The Board considered the question of introduction of objective type tests for the examinations of the Board. In this connection the Secretary reported that the matter had since been considered by the Examination Committee at its meeting held on 26th December, 1962 and the Committee

had recommended that the objective type tests be introduced in all the examinations of the Board with effect from the examinations to be held in 1964 and at least one question of objective type should be compulsory. The number of marks allotted to this type of test should be between 10% to 15% of the total marks allotted to a paper.

RESOLVED that the recommendation of the Examination Committee be approved and the objective type tests be introduced in the examinations of the Board to be held in 1964 and onwards.

VII. The consideration of the points raised in parts (b), (c) and (d) of starred question No. 1111 asked in the Lok Sabha on 28.5.1962, in the context of replies given by the Union Minister of Education, was postponed.

VIII. The Board considered the representation of Class IV employees of the Ministry of External Affairs received through the Ministry of Education, New Delhi, vide letter No. F.55-2/62-S.E.2/62(B) dated the 19th of Feb. '62 requesting for permission to appear at the Matriculation Examination etc., of the Board as private candidates to enable them to improve their educational qualifications, as the Punjab University which hitherto used to allow them to appear at its Matriculation Examination privately, had stopped giving this facility to them.

RESOLVED that the Government be informed that the question of granting permission to Class IV employees of the Ministry of External Affairs to appear at the Matriculation Examination of the Board as private candidates did not arise as the Board would not conduct the High School Examination after the year 1963.

RESOLVED further that the broader question of admitting private candidates to the Board's examinations be referred to a Committee consisting of Dr. P.D. Shukla, L. Ishwar Dass, Shri M.N. Kapur and Shri D.I. Lall (Member-Secretary).

IX. The question of appointing an Equivalence Committee was considered.

RESOLVED that an Equivalence Committee consisting of Shri B.D. Bhatt, Prof. K.C. Nag, Dr. B.D. Laroia and Shri D.I. Lall (Member-Secretary) be appointed to consider from time to time the equivalence of examinations of other examining bodies.

RESOLVED further that letter No. F.29-2/61-B.2, dated 10.10.61 received from the Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Education in connection with the equivalence of the Post Basic Examination Certificate of 11 years duration be referred to the above Equivalence Committee.

X. The Board considered the recommendations of the Finance Committee made at its meetings held on 24th October, and 24th December, 1962. In this connection the Secretary reported that the position of the staff in the Ajmer office of the Board was examined by a sub-committee of the Finance Committee consisting of Shri I.P. Anand, Shri N.S. Bhatnagar and Shri D.I. Lall and the position of the staff for the Delhi Office was examined by a special Committee set up by the Chairman, consisting of Shri N.S. Bhatnagar and Shri D.I. Lall. The Recommendations of both the Committees were considered by the Finance Committee and necessary provision was made in the Budget Estimates accordingly. He also explained the salient points arising out of the proceedings of the Finance Committee, e.g. the adoption of the financial year of the Board from 1st October to 30th Sept., each year instead of from 1st April to 31st March; charging from next year a nominal fee of Rs.1/- per form for the supply of blank application forms to candidates who wanted to appear at the various examinations of the Board privately; the sanction of the Government for the grant of a loan of Rs. 4 lacs to the Board bearing interest at 4% per annum; charging a fee of Rs.100/- for extension of provisional recognition, Rs.50/- for recognition in one additional subject and Rs. 75/- for recognition in more than one additional

subject; prescribing rates of honorarium to the inspectors sent for inspection of schools in connection with their examination by the Board. He also presented to the Board an abstract of the Revised Budget Estimates for 18 months from 1.4.1962 to 30.9.1962, and referred to the resolution of the Finance Committee by which it was desired that in view of the big deficit in the budget estimates a request should be made to the Ministry of Education either to give a substantial grant to the Board at the initial stages to meet the deficit or permit it to increase its examination fees. He further referred to the resolution of the Finance Committee by which the age of retirement in respect of Class IV and non-ministerial staff was to be fixed by the Board in terms of para (5) of the Audit Report for 1961-62.

RESOLVED that (i) the report be recorded and the recommendations of the Finance Committee be approved;

(ii) a request be made to the Ministry of Education either to give a substantial grant-in-aid to the Board at the initial stages to meet the deficit in the budget or permit it to increase its examination fees; and

(iii) the age of retirement in respect of non-ministerial staff be fixed at 55 and the Chairman be authorised to continue up to the age of 60 any employee whom he considers to be efficient and physically fit.

XI. The Board considered the recommendations of the Results Committee made at its meeting held on 18.12.1962 in respect of 15 candidates who were reported to have used unfair means at the 1962 examinations of the Board. The Secretary reported that the recommendation had in the meantime been approved by the Chairman and suitable action taken in order to avoid delay.

RESOLVED that the recommendations of the Results Committee be approved and the action of the Chairman be noted.

XII. The Board considered the draft rules for correction in dates of birth of candidates.

RESOLVED that the proposed rules for correction in the dates of birth of candidates be approved.

XIII. The Board considered letter No. D/1/724/62, dated 5.9.1962, from the Hon. Secretary, Rashtriya Virja Nand Ansh Kanya Vidyalaya Society, New Delhi, requesting to permit the blind girls of the institution to take up Music as one of their 5 subjects; and further to grant exemption to them from appearing in Elementary Mathematics for the Higher Secondary Examination, 1964 (3-year course) at which they wish to appear as private candidates.

RESOLVED that these blind girls be permitted to take up Music as one of their five subjects and they be exempted from appearing in Elementary Mathematics for their Higher Secondary Examination, 1964 which they will take as private candidates.

XIV. The Secretary reported receipt of :-

- (1) Letters dated 27th April and 21st July, 1962, from the Deputy Registrar, Shri-mati Hathibai Danodkar Theokerey Women's University, Queens Road, Bombay, recognising the Higher Secondary Examination of the Board as equivalent to their Pre-University Examination for purpose of admission to the next higher class i.e. first year of the Three-Year Degree Course in Arts, on the condition that candidates would be required to appear in the compulsory subjects of Biology, Hygiene and Home Science at the Pre-University Examination, in addition to all the papers of the First Year Arts Examination and that the said condition could not be waived as the courses prescribed by the Board for the subjects of Biology, Hygiene and Home Science are not completely covered by the courses prescribed by the University;

- (2) Letter No.EF.1-15/60, dated 27.5.1961 from the Registrar, University of Kerala, Trivandrum, recognising Higher Secondary Examination of the Board as equivalent to their University Previous Examination for purposes of admission to the 3-Year Degree course of the University, provided that the candidate's medium of instruction in, at least, the last class studied by him, was English, and that English was his compulsory subject;
- (3) Letter No. 13985, dated 13.12.1961 from the Asstt. Registrar, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, recognising, on reciprocal basis, the Higher Secondary School Examination of the Board as equivalent to their Pre-University Examination for purposes of admission to the 3 year degree course;
- (4) Letter No.B/44295, dated 13.12.1961 from the Registrar, Bihar University, Muzaffarpur, recognising, on reciprocal basis, the Higher Secondary and Intermediate Examinations of the Board as equivalent to their corresponding examinations;
- (5) Letter No.AC/8354, dated 4.9.1962 from the Asstt. Registrar, Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda, Baroda, recognising, on reciprocal basis, (a) Higher Secondary Examination and (b) Higher Secondary Technical Examination of the Board as equivalent to their (a) Preparatory Examination in Arts, Science and Commerce and (b) Preparatory Examination in Science, respectively;
- (6) Letter No.C/6/Delhi/62/13144, dated 7.11.1962 from the Registrar, University of Delhi, Delhi informing that the examinations of the erstwhile Board of Higher Secondary Education, Delhi, under the new management of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi will continue to be recognised for the purposes of admission to a course of study in the University on the condition that the same syllabus and standard of examinations as had been followed hitherto will continue and that any major change that might be proposed in the syllabus etc. will be made with the concurrence of the University;
- (7) Letters Nos. CR.6320 and 7822, dated 14th November and 22nd December, 1962 respectively from the Deputy Registrar, University of Madras, informing that the Higher Secondary Examinations of the Board will be recognised by the University as equivalent to their Pre-University Examination for purposes of admission to a higher course of study there, provided the candidate has passed the examination after pursuing a regular course of study as prescribed in a school/college and not as a private candidate;

(ii) the following clause be added at the end of Regulation 10(v) of Chapter IV of the Regulations of the Board.

"12. The members of the Inspection Committee shall be paid an honorarium at the following rates:

(i) Local Inspections:

- (a) If the distance of the school from the office of the Board is upto 10 miles - a fee of Rs. 25/- per member. No other allowance will be payable.
- (b) If the distance of the school from the office of the Board is more than 10 miles - a fee of Rs. 25/- plus a conveyance allowance of Rs. 7.50 nP. per member.

(ii) OUTSIDE INSPECTIONS:

## CENTRAL BOARD OF SECONDARY EDUCATION, NEW DELHI.

## SCHEME OF STUDIES FOR THE ALL INDIA HIGHER SECONDARY EXAMINATION.

1. The duration of higher secondary stage should continue to be three years, as at present, after eight years of previous schooling.

2. Similarly the break up of the secondary stage into two levels, viz. junior level and advanced level, should be left out for the present.

Therefore, as recommended by the syllabus Committee and by the erstwhile Board of Higher Secondary Education, Delhi, the Board may conduct for the present only one examination and that at the end of Class XI.

3. Pattern of the Scheme.(A) CORE SUBJECTS.(a) Three Languages.

- (i) English.
- (ii) A Language at the higher level - Hindi, Urdu, Bengali, Punjabi, Sindhi, Gujarati, Marathi, Malayalam, Tamil, Telugu, Oriya, Assamese, Kannada, Sanskrit, or a Foreign language - French, German or Russian.
- (iii) A Language at the lower level. Hindi, Urdu, Bengali, Punjabi, Sindhi, Gujarati, Marathi, Malayalam, Tamil, Telugu, Oriya, Assamese, Kannada, Sanskrit, or a Foreign Language - French, German or Russian.

(b) Other subjects.

- (i) Elementary Maths. and General Science.
- (ii) Social Studies and Indian Culture and Civilization.
- (iii) Craft.

(B) - ELECTIVE SUBJECTS.

Up to four subjects may be offered out of one or more of the following diversified groups :-

- (i) Group I - Humanities.
- (ii) " II - Sciences.
- (iii) " III - Technical.
- (iv) " IV - Commercial.
- (v) " V - Agriculture.
- (vi) " VI - Fine Arts.
- (vii) " VII - Home Science.

NOTE:- To pass in at least three elective subjects will be essential.

4. Internal and External Examinations.(a) Internal Examination.

In order to eliminate the hampering effects of a purely external examination and to distribute the work-load throughout the period of study methods of external and internal assessment will be utilised.

The examination in the language at the lower level and the craft will be held at the end of Class IX.

The examination in the subjects of Elementary Maths., General Science and Social Studies and Indian Culture and Civilization will be held at the end of Class X.

Cont'd.....

The Examinations at the end of Classes IX and X will be internal and 25% marks will be allotted for sessional work. The question papers will however be prepared by the Board.

The Students failing in one or more subjects at the internal examination may be given another chance to qualify in the same in 60% test.

No student will be admitted to the H.P. Secondary Examination at the end of XI Class unless he has qualified in all the subjects of the internal examinations.

(b) External Examination - An external examination will be held at the end of class XI for testing two languages i.e. English and the language at the higher level and at least three elective subjects out of those offered.

5. Allotment of maximum marks and papers.

(i) Four subjects of internal Examination.

One paper of 100 marks each and of 2 hours duration.

(ii) External Examination.

7. Compartmental Examination: As at present except that two chances may be provided - August/March.

Fails in one subject only - Marks (i) 25% in failed subject and 35% in aggregate of remaining subjects.

or(ii) 45% in aggregate of the subjects in which not failed.

8. Grading -

Pass	-	33% or above but below 60%.
I Divn.	-	60% or above.
Credit	-	55% or above in a subject.
Distinction	-	75% or above in a subject.

These will be indicated in the final certificate.

Lala Ishwar Das was one of the oldest members of the Delhi Board and was nominated to the Central Board on the merger of the two bodies. He rendered yeoman service to the cause of education and the improvement of the lot of teachers not only in Delhi, but also in the entire Indian Union.

The Board offers its heartfelt sympathy and condolences to the bereaved family."

RESOLVED further that a copy of the above resolution be sent to the son of Lala Ishwar Das as also to the press. The members also stood up and observed one minute's silence in the memory of the deceased.

2. (i) The minutes of the annual general meeting of the Board held on 24th January, 1963 were confirmed with the following amendment:-

Item XV - Read 24.6.1962 instead of 21.4.1962 in Controlling Authority's letter No.F.55-11/62-S.E.2, dated 27.9.1962.

(ii) The Board also considered letter dated 12.4.1963 received from Kumari S.Sen suggesting that words 'to continue' appearing in line two of item X (iii) of the minutes of the last meeting be replaced by the words "to grant extension".

RESOLVED that no change was necessary in the said resolution as the words "to continue" conveyed the same sense as envisaged by Kumari Sen.

(iii) Letter No.L.Dis.23214-B.2/62, dated 19.1.1963, from the Registrar of Annamalai University, Annamalainagar, recognising the Higher Secondary Examination of the Board as equivalent to the Pre-University Examination of the University.

(iv) Letter No.D.9/2422, dated February 8, 1963, from the Asstt. Registrar, Sardar Vallabhbhai Vidyapeeth, Vallabh Vidyanagar, recognising the Higher Secondary (Multipurpose) Examination of the Board as equivalent to their Preparatory examinations in Arts, Science, Commerce, and Agriculture of their University provided the Principals of Constituent Colleges, where the candidates seek admission, are satisfied that the subjects selected by the candidates are according to the requirements of a course they desire to pursue in their University.

(v) Letter No.Cert./63 dated 11.2.1963, from the Registrar, University of Bombay informing that Higher Secondary Examination of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi, conducted in the Syllabi of the erstwhile Delhi Board will continue to be recognised by their University on the same conditions on which the Higher Secondary examination of the erstwhile Board of Secondary Education, Delhi was recognised.

(vi) Letter No.27013 dated 8.4.1963, from the Secretary, Board of Secondary Education, Rajasthan, Ajmer recognising High School Examination of the Board as equivalent to their High School Examination and Hr.Sec., Hr.Sec. Technical and Hr.Sec.(Multipurpose) Examinations of the Board as equivalent to their Higher Secondary Examination.

(vii) Letter No.AC/105 dated 3.4.1963 from the Assistant Registrar (Academic), Baroda University, recognising the Higher Secondary (Multipurpose) Examination of the Board as equivalent to their corresponding preparatory examinations in Arts, Science and Commerce on reciprocal basis for purpose of admission to higher courses of study in the University.

(viii) Letter No.F.4-53/63/22851-G dated 16.4.1963 from the Registrar, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur recognising the examinations of the Board for purposes of higher courses of study in the University.

(ix) Letter No.C/6/Delhi/63/24489, dated 18.3.1963 received from the Registrar, University of Delhi informing, in connection with the clarification sought with regard to the recognition of the Board's examinations, that the University does not wish to insist that changes in the syllabi and courses for the Higher Secondary Examination of the Board be made with the concurrence of the University; but in the unlikely event of any major change not being agreeable to the University, it will be open to the University not to recognise the examination as a qualifying test and to hold its own test for admission to the University.

RESOLVED that the report be recorded.

4. The Secretary reported the action taken by the Chairman in permitting, at the request of the Secretary, Council of Indian School Certificate Examination, three candidates viz. (i) Parminder Singh Gyani, (ii) Kanwal Gyani, and (iii) Parvesh Kumar Bahri to take Higher Secondary Examination, 1963 of the Board in Delhi as these candidates could not take the Indian School Certificate Examination (November/December 1962) at which they were due to appear from Assam, owing to recent disturbances there. It was further reported that the action of the Chairman was approved by the Controlling Authority of the Board vide its letter No.F.55-1/63-SB.2, dated 16.3.1963.

RESOLVED that the report be recorded.

5. The Board considered the recommendations of the Committees of Courses with regard to syllabi and courses for Higher Secondary, Higher Secondary Technical, and Higher Secondary Multipurpose Examinations, 1966, and Ratna, Bhushan, and Prabhakar Examinations, 1964. In this connection the Chairman read out a letter dated 20th April, 1963 received by him from the Convener of the Committee of Courses in Hindi regarding the books to be prescribed in Hindi for the Higher Secondary, Higher Secondary Multipurpose and Higher Secondary Technical Examinations of the Board to be held in 1966.

RESOLVED that the recommendations of the various Committees of Courses with regard to syllabi and books for the Higher Secondary, Higher Secondary Technical and Higher Secondary Multipurpose Examinations 1966 and Ratna, Bhushan and Prabhakar Examinations 1964 be approved.

As regards the books to be prescribed in Hindi for Higher Secondary, Higher Secondary Multipurpose and Higher Secondary Technical examinations, it was resolved that the Chairman may kindly obtain a detailed report from the convener of the Hindi Committee about the nature of mistakes in each book proposed to be prescribed and then decide the matter.

RESOLVED further that for the subjects in which the recommendations of the Committees of Courses are still awaited, the Chairman be authorised to approve the recommendations as and when received.

5. The Board considered the Scheme of Studies for the All-India Higher Secondary Examination, 1966 as finalised by the Committee set up for the purpose. In this connection the Secretary stated that the details of the said scheme had been drawn up by the Committee after holding a series of meetings and giving full consideration to all the relevant matters. He also explained to the Board the main features of the Scheme.

The Board then took up clause by clause consideration of the Scheme of Studies. During the course of discussion, a point was raised by Shri Raja Roy Singh to the effect that the technological subjects which have now been shown under Group II - 'Science', should be distinctly shown under a separate Group, viz., Technical Group, as was the case for the Higher Secondary Multipurpose Examination of the Board. The Secretary explained the background due to which the Committee had thought it proper to combine technological subjects with the Science Group. The position was further elucidated by Shri M.N.Kapoor and Shri B.D.Bhatt who were members of the Committee. Shri Chandiramani also expressed the view that the arrangement as suggested by the Committee should be accepted. He felt that in case the technological subjects alone were given the distinct title of a "Technical Group", it might mislead the students and their guardians who could labour under the impression that by offering the Technical Group the students will specialize on the technical side and would be able to have a better footing in so far as the matter of seeking admission to the higher engineering courses was concerned. In fact the study of these technological subjects by any student did not give him any priority in the matter of admission to higher technological courses and as such it would be advisable not to put the technological subjects under a distinct group. In actual practice, the study of the subjects in question is intended only to familiarize a student with their contents so that he may, in case he desires to

P.T.O.

pursue higher studies, be able to choose as to which particular subject he should offer for specialization. It was also observed that most of the students taking these subjects at the Higher Secondary stage were doing so with a view to entering into life, soon after qualifying at the examination and the arrangement of the subjects as proposed in the Scheme offered ample choice for them to choose whatever subjects they liked.

The Chairman suggested that it may be advisable to name group II as "Science and Technology" instead of 'Science' only. The Board agreed to this and it was resolved that the nomenclature of Group II be changed as 'Science and Technology'.

Shri R.Saran said that there was no provision in the Scheme for the study of Elementary Mathematics by such Science students who did not offer Mathematics as one of their subjects. Shri Saran's view was also supported by Shri B.D.Laroya who stated that for the study of science subjects every student must be asked to study at least Elementary Mathematics.

The consensus of opinion, however, did not favour this view, specially because the Scheme was such that it offered ample choice to the students as well as to the Schools to offer whatever courses they thought best. Moreover, there was already a provision to offer Mathematics not only as one of the subjects but also as an additional subject if any student so desired.

It was, therefore, resolved that study of Elementary Mathematics need not be made compulsory for students of science.

At the suggestion of Shri Raja Roy Singh the nomenclature of the subject 'English Literature' under Humanities was changed to 'English language and literature'.

Shrimati K.Reddy suggested that Sanskrit should not be included in the three languages under the Core Subjects. Dr.P.D.Shukla stated that this was necessary in the interest of Central Schools which are situated in different parts of India and which are being affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education. The Board accordingly agreed to the provision of Sanskrit under the three languages.

Shri Raja Roy Singh pointed out that as per Scheme of Studies an internal examination will be held at the end of Class IX in the language at the lower level and the craft. He considered that a period of only one year for the study of the language at the lower level was too short. He suggested that the examination in the language at the lower level should be held at the end of Class X instead of Class IX. This was accepted and it was resolved that a necessary change be made in the Scheme of Studies.

While considering the 'Grading' Raja Roy Singh pointed out that this would render the candidates at a disadvantage. He suggested that the award of scholarships that are being awarded would not be advisable to do away with. Kapoor emphasized the importance of the practice with the India Council. After considering the matter it was resolved that the following 'Grading' be adopted for the Secondary Examination:-

The Secretary then placed on the table the syllabi and courses drawn up in the various subjects for the All-India Higher Secondary Examination of the Board. He also reported that the syllabi for the languages at the higher level and at the lower level had been drawn up by a Committee of the Conveners of the various languages and that there is a common syllabus for all the languages at the higher level and like-wise for the languages at the lower level, excluding the three foreign languages viz. French, German & Russian for which a different common syllabus has been laid down. It was also reported that it had not been possible to draw up syllabi and courses in certain subjects because the recommendations of Conveners of the respective Committees were still awaited.

RESOLVED that the report be recorded and the Chairman be authorised to approve the syllabi and books in the subjects in which they have not yet been drawn up, as and when the recommendations of the Conveners of the Committees are received.

6. The consideration of the recommendations of the Committee appointed by the Board to examine the broader question of admitting private candidates to the Board's examinations was postponed.

7. The Secretary reported receipt of letter No.F.55-11/62-SE.2, dated 28.2.1963 from the Under Secretary to the Govt.of India, Ministry of Education communicating approval of the Controlling Authority to the amendments to Regulation 10(v) of Chapter IV and Regulation 9 of Chapter VI, passed by the Board at its last meeting.

RESOLVED that the report be recorded.

8. The Secretary reported receipt of letter No.F.36/63-CSU, dated 4.3.1963, from the Deputy Educational Adviser to the Govt.of India, Ministry of Education, forwarding therewith a copy of the Central Schools Scheme and a list of 25 schools, situated in different parts of India, which will be affiliated to the Board in the first phase of the Scheme. In this connection he also stated that the Recognition Committee at its meeting held on 24th April, 1963 had recommended that provisional recognition be granted to these schools for a period of two years in the first instance pending their inspection in due course.

RESOLVED that the report be recorded and as recommended by the Recognition Committee provisional recognition for a period of two years be granted to these schools with effect from the beginning of the academic session 1963-64.

9. The Secretary reported receipt of letter No.51472/II/GS/MT 7, dated 21.3.1963, from the Chief of the General Staff, Army Head quarters New Delhi, communicating the decision of the Central Governing Council for King George's Schools to have these schools affiliated to the Board. In this connection the action taken by the Chairman in approving the request of the Chief of General Staff to conduct special examinations during December, 1963 and December, 1964 for the boys of these schools in the syllabi followed by them at present, was also reported. The Secretary further reported that the Recognition Committee at its meeting held on 24th April, 1963 had recommended that provisional recognition be granted to these Schools for a period of two years in the first instance pending their inspection in due course.

RESOLVED that the report be recorded and as recommended by the Recognition Committee provisional recognition be granted to the King George's Schools for a period of two years with effect from the beginning of the academic session 1963-64.

10. The Board considered letter No.F.8-25-/62-S.E.2, dated 18.10.62 from the Under Secretary to the Govt.of India, Ministry of Education, New Delhi, requesting that the Board may adopt for purposes of recognition the same minimum qualifications as are prescribed by the Government for teachers of Govt.Higher Secondary Classes. In this connection the Secretary reported receipt of letters No.F.55-26/62-SE 2, and F.8.17/62-SE 2, dated 27th November, 1962 and 23rd January,

1963 respectively from the Ministry of Education informing that the Govt. of India have revised the minimum qualifications of Science teachers and teachers of classical languages (other than Sanskrit) by relaxing the requirement of teaching degree or teaching experience in the case of former and adding it in the case of latter. He also read out the reply sent to the Ministry of Education on the subject vide letter No.8265 dated 12.3.1963.

1. The Secretary reported receipt of letters F.55-25/63-S.E.2, and F.55-11/61-S.E.2 dated 25th July and 8th October, 1963 respectively, from the Controlling Authority nominating (i) Shri L.O. Joshi under clause 6 (xix) of the Constitution of the Board, in the vacancy caused by the death of Lt. Ishwar Das, and (ii) Shri K. Subrahmanyam, Hony. Secretary, Sainik Schools Society and Deputy Secretary to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Defence, and Brigadier S.J. Mukund, Director of Army Education, Army Headquarters, New Delhi under clause 6 (ix) of the Constitution of the Board as new members.

The Chairman welcomed these members on behalf of the Board. He also welcomed Shri P.K. Roy, Principal, Central Institute of Education, Delhi, as an ex-officio member of the Board vice Dr. T.K.N. Menon.

Resolved that the report be recorded.

2. The minutes of the last general meeting of the Board held on 27th April 1963 were confirmed.

In this connection, it was suggested by one of the members that it would be desirable to re-consider the matter of providing compulsory study of Elementary Mathematics for those who offer elective subjects from the Science and Technological Group, under the Scheme of Studies for the 11-India Higher Secondary Examination.

Resolved that the matter may be re-examined by the same Committee which considered the Scheme of Studies for the 11-India Higher Secondary Examination and the names of Dr. B.D. Laroia and Shri G.K. Chandiramani be added to it. The Chairman could also invite, if necessary, one or two teachers teaching science subjects. The Committee be requested to submit their report as soon as possible. In the meantime the existing provisions of the Scheme of Studies be acted upon.

3. The Board considered letter No.F.47-111/61-S.E.2, dated 19th July, 1963, from the Secretary to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Education, New Delhi requesting that the Board may conduct examinations in English and Hindi media for schools affiliated for All-India Higher Secondary Examination, but as regards the schools following the Delhi syllabus of the Board, no departure from the existing practice be made.

Resolved that status-quo be maintained with regard to media of examination in the schools following the Delhi syllabus.

4. The Board considered the question of switch over of Delhi Higher Secondary Schools to the All-India pattern.

Resolved that the Chairman may appoint a Committee to go into the details of this question and make recommendations to the Board about the desirability of switching over of Delhi Higher Secondary Schools to the All-India pattern after the examinations of 1967. In the meantime, if any school desired to switch over to the All-India pattern, the request could be examined by the Chairman on its merits.

5. The Board considered letter No.F.55-3/62-S.E.2 dated 16.3.1963 from the Ministry of Education, New Delhi communicating the advice offered by the Ministry of Law in the matter of cancellation of High School Certificate of Shri Khata Raisinghani who had taken wrongful admission to High School Examination of the Board in the year 1959.

Resolved that (i) the advice of the Ministry of Law be acted upon and the order of cancelling the High School Certificate of Shri Khata Raisinghani be rescinded; and (ii) the Home Ministry of the Govt. of India/Union Public Service Commission be apprised of the unsatisfactory manner in which Shri Khata Raisinghani had been admitted to the High School Examination of the Board in 1959.

1. The minutes of the last meeting of the Committee held on 24th April, 1963 were confirmed.

2. The Committee considered letter No. D.E.20(143)/63-IS.D 2319, dated 2nd May, 1963, from the Inspectress of Schools, Zone No. II (G), Delhi, requesting to accord ex-post-facto recognition in respect of Govt. Girls Higher Secondary School, Chirag Delhi, w.e.f. the academic session 1962-63.

Resolved that ex-post-facto recognition be accorded to Govt. Girls Higher Secondary School, Chirag Delhi w.e.f. the beginning of academic-session 1962-63 upto the end of academic-session 1963-64.

3. The Committee considered the Inspection report of Govt. Resolved that ex-post-facto recognition be granted to Govt. Higher Secondary School, II Shift, Paharganj, New Delhi with effect from the beginning of the academic session 1961-62 upto the end of academic session 1963-64.

9. The Committee considered the Inspection report of Govt. 16. The Committee considered the report of the Inspection Committee dated 15th July, 1962 recommending extension of provisional recognition of Govt. Multipurpose Higher Secondary School, Najafgarh (Delhi) from the beginning of the academic session 1962-63 upto the end of the session 1963-64. In this connection the Committee also considered letter No. 3/14(4)/ZIII/63/5765, dated 30th July, 1963 from the Director of Education, Delhi, requesting grant of recognition in the additional subject of Geometrical & Mechanical Drawing w.e.f. the beginning of the academic session 1963-64 in view of the pressing demand for the subject in the locality.

Resolved that (i) the recommendation of the Inspection Committee be approved, and (ii) the school be granted provisional recognition in the additional subject of Geometrical & Mechanical Drawing for the academic session 1963-64 provided a qualified teacher is appointed in the subject immediately.

- (iii) where the Central Board agrees to hold a special examination in the course which is being followed by the students of that school, the school shall not be allowed to send up a part of the candidates of that course to the Central Board and the rest to any other examining agency. The facility is meant for only those institutions which decide to send up all the candidates of that course to the examination of the Central Board.

18. The Committee considered application for recognition in respect of the Punjab Public School, Nabha for All-India Higher Secondary Examination, 1966 and subsequent years. It also considered their request to allow their candidates to take 'Special Examination' to be held in November/December, 1964 in the same syllabus which is being followed in their school.

26. The Committee considered letter No.MEA/RR/Staff/968/63, dated 4/6th June, 1963, from the Hony. Secretary, M.E.A. Higher Secondary School, Reading Road, New Delhi, seeking approval in respect of Shri T.Rajagopalan, B.A., L.T., seniormost teacher, for appointment as Principal of the abovenamed school with effect from 1st May, 1963. In this connection the Secretary reported that Shri T.Rajagopalan had been granted permanent exemption to teach Mathematics to Higher Secondary classes by the erstwhile Delhi Board vide letter No.13449, dated 27th October, 1948.

The Committee considered application dated 24th July, 1963 from Mrs. Sushila Sharma, M.A., B.T., Ex-Principal, Benipershad Jaipuria Balika Vidyalaya, Delhi, requesting to declare her qualified to hold the post of Principal of the school by virtue of clauses 1, 2 and 3(e) of Rule 'A' laid down in the list of minimum qualifications for the heads and teachers of schools recognised by the Board.

Resolved that this case should not have been referred to the Recognition Committee as it did not come through the Management of the school.

31. The Committee considered letter No.327, dated 27th July, 1963, from the Manager, Victoria Girls Higher Secondary School, Delhi seeking exemption from minimum qualifications in respect of Miss I.M.Singh, B.A., B.Ed., to teach Economics to class XI w.e.f. 15th July, 1963 to 31st March, 1964.

Resolved that the request of the Manager, Victoria Girls Higher Secondary School, Delhi be not acceded to.

32. The Committee considered letter No.D.E.3/14(29)/Z-III-B/62-63, dated 27th August, 1963, from the Director of Education, Delhi seeking exemption in respect of Shri Dharam Singh, P.T.I., Govt. Higher Secondary Multipurpose School, Ujwa for the teaching of Physical Education to Higher Secondary classes with effect from 1st May, 1962 to 18th February, 1965.

Resolved that Shri Dharam Singh be granted exemption to impart Physical Education to Higher Secondary classes w.e.f. 27th August, 1963 to 18th February, 1965.

The Committee considered letter No.1964, dated 27th May,1963, from the Principal, D.A.V.Higher Secondary School, Daryaganj,Delhi, requesting to confirm whether a graduate from the Panjab University with English, Physics and Mathematics 'A' Course as his subjects is qualified to teach Lower Mathematics to classes IX and X.

Resolved that a graduate from the Panjab University with English, Physics and Mathematics 'A' Course as his subjects be considered qualified to teach Lower Mathematics to classes IX and X.

36. The Committee considered the question whether appointments of Headmasters/Headmistresses in schools which do not have class XI may be approved in place of Principals.

Resolved that only such persons who fulfil the minimum requirements laid down for the post of Principals of Higher Secondary Schools be appointed as the heads of Higher Secondary Schools irrespective of the fact whether the school has class XI or not.

37. The Committee considered the recommendation of the Committee of Courses in Fine Arts made at its meeting held on 19th July,1963 to the effect that the minimum qualification for the teachers to teach the subject 'Commercial and Decorative Design' may be the 'National Diploma in Art' or its equivalent with experience in interior decoration.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Committee of Courses in Fine Arts be approved.

38. The Secretary reported receipt of letter No.2438, dated 27th August,1963, from the Principal, Govt.School of Arts, Punjab,Chandigarh, informing that Govt.School of Arts,Punjab Chandigarh, is the same that was located till January,1962 at Simla and that it awards the same Diploma of Art Master's Course of 4 years duration; which is already recognised by the Board.

Resolved that the report be noted and the necessary change in the brochure of minimum qualifications be made.

With regard to para (iv) of Item IV of the minutes of the meeting of the Finance Committee dated 22nd of June, 1964, it was observed, however, that (a) it should be checked up whether Central Services (Medical Attendance) Rules, 1944 are equally applicable to Delhi and New Delhi and if so the employees of the Board residing in New Delhi should also be covered by the medical facilities under these rules; (b) steps should be taken to get the CGHS Scheme extended to the staff of the Board as early as possible.

V. The Secretary reported the proceedings of the meetings of the Recognition Committee held on 23rd June, 1964 and 16th September, 1964.

Resolved that the report be recorded and the recommendations of the Recognition Committee be approved subject to the following modifications :-

VI. The Secretary reported the proceedings of the Examination Committee held on 19th September, 1964.

Resolved that the report be recorded and the recommendations of the Examination Committee be approved subject to the following modifications :-

Ref. Item VIII: Rules for admitting private candidates to All-India Higher Secondary Examination.

a) Rule 1: Clauses (iii) and (iv) be read as (i) and (ii) and

Clauses (i) and (ii) be read as (iii) and (iv) respectively.

b) Rule 13: The following words be added in the beginning:-

"Grading shall be the same as for regular candidates, namely;"

c) Rule 20, para 1: of the Scheme of Studies be read as under:-

"The Scheme of Studies for private candidates of the All-India Higher Secondary Examination will be as follows subject to such modifications as may be made by the Board from time to time."

In this connection the Board noted that the question of permitting women candidates from different parts of India to appear at the examination privately deserved consideration but it was desired that for the present no change in this connection be made in the proposed rules for private candidates. The problem may be further studied and the question re-examined when some further experience had been gained in the matter.

VII. The Board considered D.O. letter No. F.1-10/63-SE.4 dated the 13th of July, 1964 from the Educational Adviser to the Govt. of India, requesting to consider the question of introducing the Scheme of Correspondence Courses at the secondary stage.

In this connection, Dr. P.D. Shukla explained the need for introducing the Scheme at the secondary stage and stated that the best agency for conducting the Correspondence Courses at this stage was the Central Board of Secondary Education. He also pointed out that he has already had preliminary discussions with the Chairman of the Board and a Joint Working Committee had been formed to work out the details of the Scheme. He also apprised the Board of the main features of the Scheme and said that due provision will be made for Contact Programmes so that personal contact between the teachers and the taught is not missing. He stated that the Ministry of Education would be glad if the proposal is favourably considered by the Board so that the Scheme could be implemented as early as possible. He wished that the Board should be able to accept the enrolment of students for the Correspondence Courses with effect from 1st of May, 1965 and to impart instruction with effect from the 1st of July, 1965.

In this connection Brig. Mukand stated that Army Headquarters was also keenly interested in this Scheme and he requested that one nominee of Army Headquarters may also be appointed as a member of the Working Committee.

Resolved that the proposal to introduce the Scheme of Correspondence Courses at the secondary stage be accepted and the Chairman be authorised to take such steps as may be necessary to have the scheme implemented.

It was also desired that the Ministry of Education be requested to have a nominee of the Army Headquarters on the Working Group set up for the purpose.

VIII. The Board received the Annual Report on the working of the Board for the period 1st October, 1963 to 30th September, 1964. In this connection the Secretary highlighted the main features of the report. He stated inter alia that the prospectuses for 1967 examinations had been issued in time; the results for all the examinations of 1964 were also declared by the scheduled dates which were notified in advance; and that the certificates to successful candidates of 1964 examinations also had already been issued although in past they used to be issued after December. He also informed the Board about the visit of the Union Education Minister, Shri M.C. Chagla and the Board's contribution of Rs. 12,927/- to the National Defence Fund. He further stated the main features of the examination reforms already introduced and the studies which have been taken up for research in this direction.

The Board adopted the report and congratulated the Secretary for the special achievement in putting efficiency in the work of Board and for placing an up-to-date report before them so expeditiously. It also wished to place on record its appreciation of the services rendered by the Chairman, Secretary, Deputy Secretary and other members of the staff during the period under report.

Before taking up business of the meeting, the Chairman extended a hearty welcome to all the members as it was first meeting of the Board since he took over the office of Chairman w.e.f. 25th September, 1965. He expressed the hope that with joint efforts and co-operation of all the members of the Board, he will be able to further strengthen the foundations already laid by his predecessor.

Dr. B.D. Laroia, on behalf of members of the Board welcomed Shri L.R. Sethi as new Chairman of the Board. He stated that it was indeed a pleasure to have him as Chairman of the Board. Shri Sethi has not only had his association with the Board for the last 25 years but he had also been Chairman of both Delhi as well as Ajmer Boards. His knowledge and experience of the working of the Board has been very deep and it was hoped that under his able guidance, the Board will make rapid and steady headway in the advancement of secondary education in the country. Dr. Laroia further assured on behalf of the members of the Board that fullest co-operation will be extended to him and that the work of the Board will continue most harmoniously as in the past.

Chairman then thanked Dr. Laroia and all other members for the kind gesture and the confidence so reposed in him.

1. The minutes of the last meeting of the Board held on 29th May, 1965 were confirmed.
2. Secretary reported the proceedings of the meeting of Finance Committee held on 9th September, 1965.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Finance Committee be approved subject to modification that the four scholarships newly created for the All-India Higher Secondary Examination of the Board be awarded in order of merit of the successful candidates provided that at least one scholarship out of the four be awarded to a female candidate securing highest marks at the examination.

(vi) Two members of the Board to serve on Scrutinizing Committee under Regulation 10(vi) of Chapter IV of the Regulations of the Board.

Resolved that Chairman be authorised to nominate such persons as he may consider suitable on each of the above Committees.

The candidate may, of course qualify, if he so desires in the fourth subject in which he has failed at a subsequent examination according to the rules of the Board.

Resolved that the report be recorded and this practice be continued also for the Examinations beyond 1966.

11. Secretary reported receipt of:

(i) Letter No.PAU/Recog/Exams/18479, dated 8.6.1965 from the Registrar, Punjab Agricultural University, Ludhiana recognising All-India Higher Secondary Examination of the Board (Science and Agriculture Groups) for purpose of admission to B.Sc.(Agriculture) Course of the University;



- I. The minutes of the last meeting of the Board held on 30th September, 1964 were confirmed.
- II. The Secretary reported the proceedings of the meeting of the Equivalence Committee held on 7th January, 1965.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Equivalence Committee be approved subject to the following modifications :-

(a) Item II : The Inter-University Board, New Delhi be requested to furnish the information with regard to the recognition of the examinations of Varanaseya Sanskrit Vishwavidyalaya together with the equivalence accepted by it.

(b) Item III: An enquiry be made from the Inter-University Board, New Delhi, if they have accorded the desired recognition to the Diploma in Rural Services and the Post-graduate Diploma in Rural Economics and Co-operation awarded by the National Council for Rural Higher Education as equivalent to the First Degree and M.A. Degree respectively for purposes of employment.

(c) Item VI: The Army Higher Secondary Certificate Examination be recognised as equivalent to Higher Secondary Examination of the Board and that the Chief of the General Staff, Army Headquarters be asked to intimate to the Board any changes made in the courses and syllabi from time to time.

(d) Item VII : In view of letter No. A 1/6678/1602/(5)/ 1960 dated 21st January, 1965 from the Deputy Secretary to the Government of Uttar Pradesh regarding withdrawal of recognition of Vidya Vinodini Examination of Prayag Mahila Vidyapith, Allahabad by the Government, the recognition accorded to Vidya Vinodini Examination by the Board be also withdrawn with immediate effect.

- III. The Secretary reported the proceedings of the meeting of the Recognition Committee held on 16th January, 1965.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Recognition Committee be approved subject to the following modifications :

(a) Section 'A' Item 40: The name of the school be read as ' Govt. Boys Higher Secondary School, Model Town, Delhi'

(b) Section 'C' Item 4: The opinion of the Convener of Committee of Courses in Hindi to the effect that (i) it is difficult to say whether B.A. through Prabhakar can be considered as equivalent to B.A. (Full) plus Prabhakar for eligibility to the scale of Rs. 170-380 although for teaching of Hindi, there is not much of difference except that such a candidate had not done Hindi at the B.A. Examination and (ii) B.A. through Prabhakar is easily equivalent to B.A. with elective Hindi for the purpose of recognition for Hindi teaching, be further considered by the Committee of Courses in Hindi before making necessary changes in the list of Minimum Qualifications for teachers.

IV. The Secretary reported that the meeting of the Finance Committee could not be held on 18.1.1965 for want of quorum.

Resolved that the report be recorded.

V. The Secretary reported the proceedings of the meeting of the Examination Committee held on 23.1.1965.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Examination Committee be approved subject to the following modifications :-

(a) Item II : Changes if any, made by the Chairman and Vice-Chairman while scrutinising the list of examiners be intimated to the Convener of the Committee of Courses concerned.

(b) Item III: As suggested by Shri S.C. Sen, Principal, Delhi Polytechnic the duration of examination for woodwork craft for Higher Secondary Multipurpose Examination be reduced to 4 hours and that for leather work craft the existing duration of four hours be allowed to continue. This should be made effective for the Part I Examination to be held in 1966.

(c) Item VII : Shri P.K. Roy be also appointed as a member of the Committee which is to consider the nature and mode of conducting Objective Type Tests at the examinations of the Board.

The Board further desired that in future a copy of the communication like the one received from Dr. P. Maheshwari (Ref: item IV of the proceedings of Examination Committee) should be forwarded along with the proceedings for information of the members.

VI. The Secretary reported the proceedings of the Curriculum Committee held on 25th January, 1965.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Curriculum Committee be approved.

The Board, however, desired with reference to item II of the proceedings that in the syllabus of " Social Studies" which was recommended by the Committee of Courses for 1968 Examination but was postponed by the Curriculum Committee for the present because of lack of availability of suitable books, the topic of ' The origin of Science and development of Civilization' be also added as and when the new syllabus is adopted. The Board further desired that as the Department of Curriculum, Methods and Text-books of NCERT was preparing a text-book on this syllabus, the above suggestion may be brought to the notice of the Department.

VII. The creation of post of Director of Correspondence Courses in the scale of Rs. 900-50-1400 was considered. In this connection the Secretary reported that the proposal to introduce the Scheme of Correspondence Courses at the secondary stage was accepted in principle by the Board at its meeting held on 30th September, 1964 and the Chairman was authorised to take such steps as may be necessary to have the Scheme implemented.

Dr. B.D. Laroia pointed out that there was no provision in the Revised Constitution of the Board for introduction of Correspondence Courses at the secondary stage and if the scheme was to be implemented, necessary provision should be made to that effect in the Constitution of the Board.

It was felt, however, that since the Board at its last meeting held on 30th September, 1964 had already agreed in principle to introduce the scheme, the matter need not be held in abeyance; but it may be examined if the proposed Scheme could be covered by the extended meaning of existing sub-clause (xvi) of clause 9 of the Constitution and, if required, necessary steps be taken to have the Constitution amended for the purpose.

As regard the post of the Director, Correspondence Courses, it was resolved that the said post be created in the grade of Rs. 900-50-1400.

VIII. Dr. B.D. Laroia proposed that the post of Deputy Secretary should not be adversely affected by the creation of any new posts. The Chairman explained that the creation of the new post did not adversely affect the status or emoluments of officers previously appointed. We shall have to make a distinction between administrative and academic posts.

The Board felt that the existing scales of the staff of the Board required to be reconsidered and accordingly appointed a Special Committee consisting of Prof. G.C. Chatterji (Chairman), Shri L.O. Joshi, Shri B.D. Bhatt, Dr. B.D. Laroia, Prof. K.C. Nag and Shri D.I. Lall (Secretary) to review the whole structure and make its recommendations to the Finance Committee and the Board for consideration.

IX. The question of enhancement of Dearness Allowance for staff of the Board in accordance with the enhancement of Dearness Allowance for Central Government Servants sanctioned vide Government of India, Ministry of Finance O.M. No.1 (i)-Eii(d)/65 dated 6th January, 1965 was considered.

VI. The Board considered letter No.3/13/65-c/32602 dated 15th March, 1965 from the Registrar, University of Delhi, requesting to nominate a member of the Board to represent the Board on the Court of the University.

Resolved that Prof.K.C.Nag be nominated to represent the Board on the Court of the University of Delhi.

VII. The Board considered letter dated 19.2.1965 from the Vice-President, Mizo Students Association, Imphal(Manipur) requesting that Lushai Vernacular which is the mother tongue of Mizo students and Tribal students of Manipur District and is recognised by Gauhati University in High/Higher Secondary Schools in Manipur be recognised as one of the languages in the schools recognised by the Board for its All-India Higher Secondary Examination.

The Board also considered letter dated 27.2.1965 from the Director of Education, Government of Manipur, Imphal, requesting that for a period of five years the tribal candidates who do not

have Manipuri as their mother tongue be allowed to offer both Manipuri and Hindi at lower level, instead of offering one language at the higher level and the other at lower level.

The Board noted that it was not advisable to entertain direct requests from any Students Association. The Board further desired that the Ministry of Education be apprised of the proposal of the Director of Education, Manipur and it be requested to appoint a suitable committee to examine the feasibility of accommodating schools of Manipur Administration owing to their regional difficulties, and submit its recommendations to the Chairman of the Board who might take such action thereon as he deemed proper.

VIII. The Board considered letter No.F.1.3(50)/ZIII-B/65/61-63 dated 29.3.1965 from the Director of Education, Delhi informing that the recognition of primary and middle departments of Chander Bhan Higher Secondary School, Delhi Cantt. had been withdrawn by him w.e.f. 1.5.1965 and suggesting that the recognition of the Higher Secondary Department be also withdrawn by the Board with effect from the same date.

The Board also considered the reply received from the Chairman of the School in response to the Board's letter No.13353 dated 7.1.1965 giving him an opportunity to show cause as to why the recognition of the Higher Secondary Department of the school be not withdrawn w.e.f. 1.5.1965.

In this connection Prof.K.C.Nag pointed out that according to the rules for recognition, no private institution shall be recognised or continue to be recognised by the Board unless the middle section of the school, if it has any, is recognised by the Education Department of the State. As the recognition of middle department of Chander Bhan Higher Secondary School had been withdrawn by the Director of Education Delhi, the withdrawal of the recognition of its Higher Secondary Department followed automatically.

Resolved that the recognition of the Higher Secondary Department of Chander Bhan Higher Secondary School, Delhi Cantt. be withdrawn w.e.f. 1.5.1965.

IX. The Secretary reported the following orders of the

A/S { 1) Agreeing to Government of India, Ministry of Education's proposal to hold Merit Scholarship Examination on its behalf with effect from 1965 examination to be held in December subject to the condition that the expenditure incurred in this connection will be re-imbursed by the Government.

Sydat. (Exo) { .ii) Allowing one more chance in August, 1965 to the failed candidates of the All-India Higher Secondary Examination of the Board for King George's Schools in the same syllabi and courses which they studied for the examination held in 1964.

In connection with (ii) above the Secretary further

reported that the examination will now be held in June instead of August in order to enable the students to seek admissions to higher courses of study.

Resolved that the report be recorded.

iii) Letter No. CC.3/9614/63 dated 17.3.1965 from the Registrar, Andhra University, Waltair, recognising the All-India Higher Secondary Examination of the Board as equivalent to the Pre-University Examination of the University for purpose of admission to the First-Year of their Three-Year Courses;

iv) Letter No. 11213 dated 25.1.1965 from the Secretary, Board of Secondary Education, Rajasthan, recognising the Higher Secondary (One-Year Course) Examination as equivalent to the Higher Secondary Examination of their Board on reciprocal basis.

Resolved that the report be recorded.

XI. The Chairman informed the Board about the position with regard to the proposed Scheme of Correspondence Courses and stated that the Controlling Authority has approved the suggestion of locating the Department of Correspondence Courses in Ajmer instead of in Delhi in view of building and other facilities available in Ajmer.
